







"Why is it like this for us?" It's 1909 and the young girls who endure brutal conditions working at Johannsen's Shirtwaist Factory for four dollars a day, six days a week, ask themselves this very question every single day. Struggling to survive, the girls band together under the leadership of seventeen-year old Russian immigrant, Anya Rosen, to organize an industry-wide strike and fight for a better life. Though the girls' cries for help are rejected by the maledominated union, their chants of "justice and fairness" are never silenced. Despite being beaten, starved, and even imprisoned, the shirtwaist girls ultimately triumph as they win the first industry-wide strike in American labor history. However, To See The Stars is much more than a moving story about overcoming adversity: this play embodies true historical events. Moreover, it is a play that makes the audience take a step back to look at themselves and others, to discover the power of dreams and the importance of "[doing] what you believe in."




