The "B" team coached by Mr. Guest and Mr. Krimmel sported a 4-0 record, while Mr. O'Keefe's J.V. team finished with a 3-3 record.

In the first game, the Cowboys, after building a half-time lead of 16-0, fell to a late Clifford Scott rally, 19-16. Then the Panthers

of East Orange handed the Cowboys a 34-0 defeat.

Returning home, the Johnson men gained their first victory in a bowl of mud, shutting out Kearny 11-0. The Cowboys suffered their second Inter-Oranges league loss at the hands of Orange, 12-6. The Cowboys rebounded, however, and scored a fine 26-0 victory over the Bengals of Bloomfield.

The strong Montclair team then conquered West Orange 36-14. In the following game the Cowboys edged Morristown 19-14. In blizzardy weather, the Cowboys and Irvington fought to their fourth

consecutive tie, 6-6.

On Thanksgiving Day, ten thousand spectators saw the season draw to a close, as the Cowboys and the Cougars of Columbia battled to a 13-13 tie. West Orange took an early lead on two Hal Behar-to-Don Oberg touchdown passes, only to have Columbia rally in the waning minutes.



In his second year as head basketball coach, Mr. Guest was forced to use a large number of sophomores in the 1955-1956 lineup. The lack of rebounding strength and the overall inexperience led to a 4-13 record. High spirit and fine sportsmanship, however, more than made up for lack of success.

After losing their first three contests to Columbia, Bloomfield, and Montclair, the Cowboys conquered Livingston 53-29. Though this victory was followed by losses to Belleville and Orange, hopes of the Cowboy's qualifying for the Essex County Tournament grew as Senior Arne Anderson and Soph Bill Miller led the courtmen to successive victories over Morristown 50-46 and West Side 57-51. 



Panel discussions, presentations, and debates made each club meeting interesting and educational for every







Art lovers of all phases have found many ways in which to express their ability through the Art Workshop, Drawing, Opera, and Dancing Clubs.










