






























# EXPLORES PROBES PUZZLES

































In the fall of 1952, Joseph Tylus came from Trenton State University to teach English at West Orange High School. In the fall of 1967, he assumed the reins of leadership in the school when he was appointed principal. Through the years, he advised the yearbook, directed the guidance department, and became a dynamic force in the school in his position as assistant principal. Now, with his first year at the helm drawing to a close, he took time out to reflect on the WOHS scene. He cited the Liaison Committee of the Student Council as exemplifying a "sincere attempt in opening avenues of communication between students and faculty . . . a medium for free exchange of ideas." He added, "School is a teaching and a learning process. Those listening and those speaking need a mutual respect. It is in this understanding that the tremendous potential in our student body is displayed. It is here that we can accomplish what other schools cannot."
















