We ask you to keep this idea in mind in the years to come. Reach beyond your grasp and you will discover that man's ability is nearly infinite.

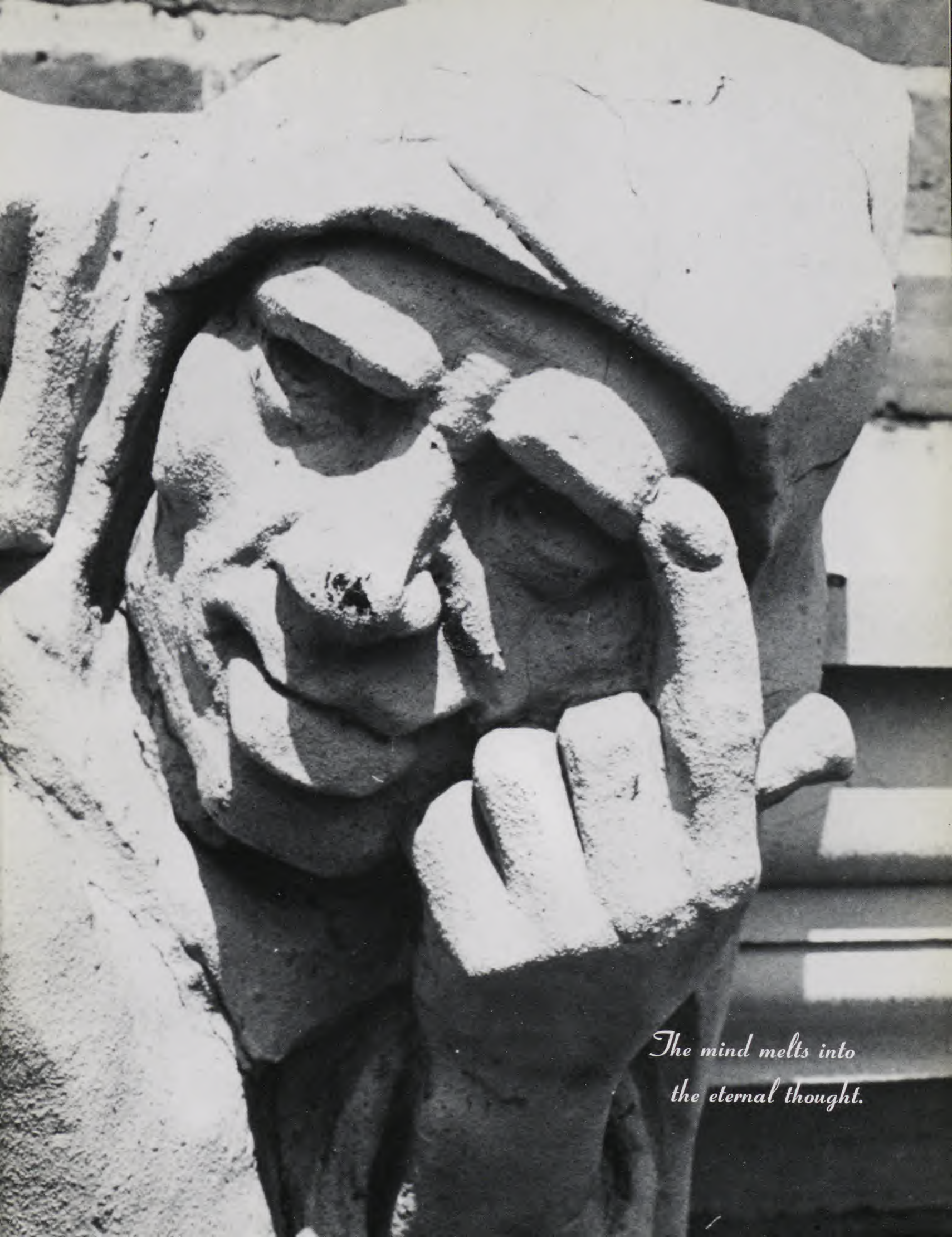
