The highlight of the season was the 15-13 win over Caldwell. West Orange scored the winning touchdown with 17 seconds left to play. The game was dedicated to Dom Casalaro who was injured the week before.

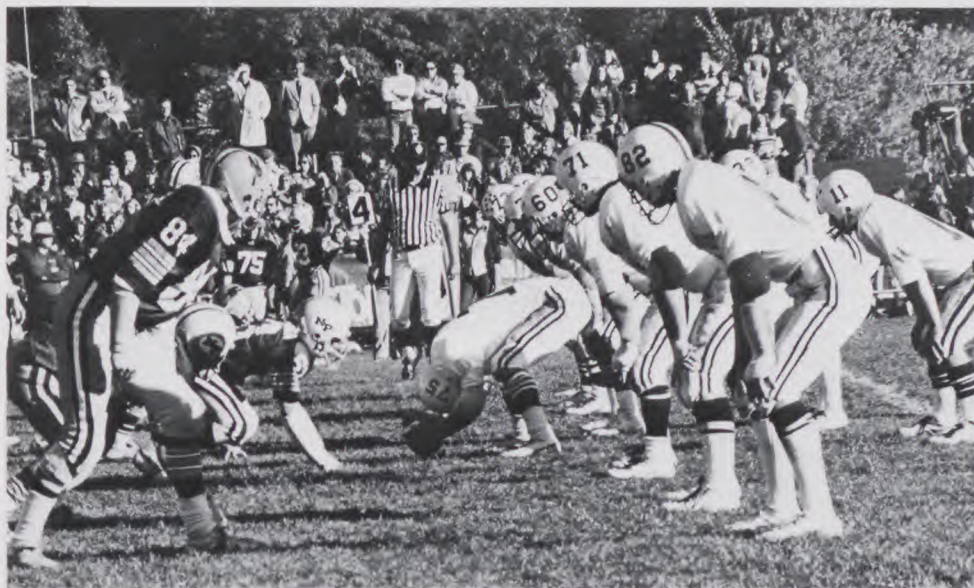

Defensive tackle John McBride made First Team All-State, First Team All-County, First Team All Suburban Conference and First Team All Orange. The team was characterized by great hustle and fine team play. Greatly missed will be seniors Joe Rella, Dan Melnick and John Roellke.





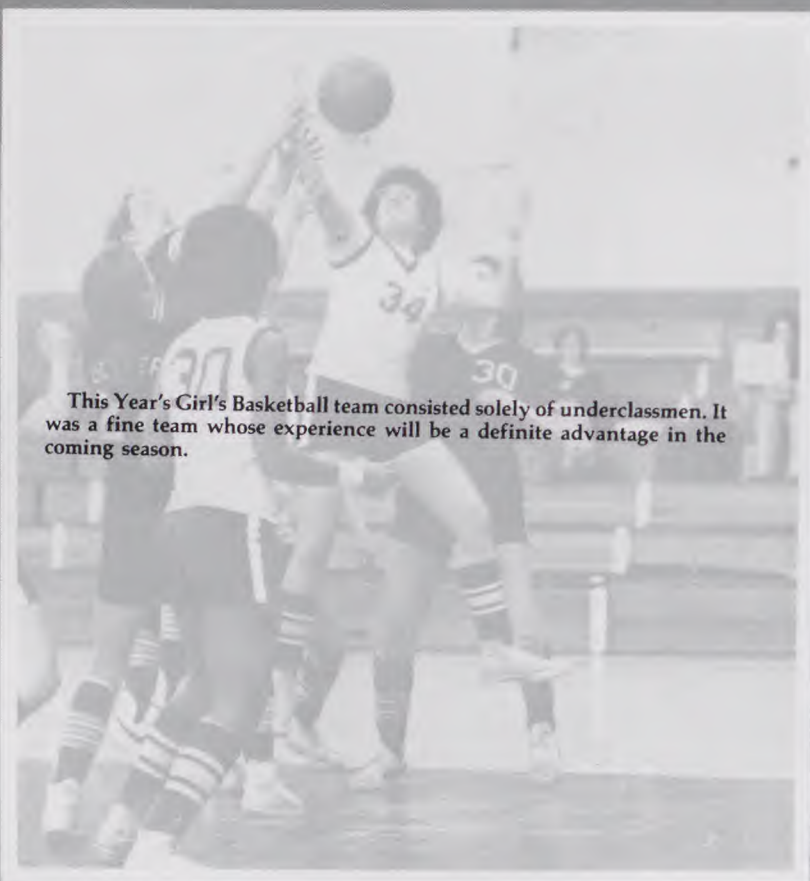

Led by Co-Captains Jeff Wilks and Jeff Goldfinger, the team finished fifth out of ten teams at the Essex County Swim Meet held at the New Jersey Institute of Technology. The team was represented in the finals by a third place in the 100 yard Butterfly swum by Jeff Wilks; fourth place in the girl's 100 yard Butterfly by Freshman Laurie Saporito; and other finalist positions by Keith Mazurek in the 100 yard freestyle, and the medley and 400 yard freestyle relay teams.

Senior members included Joe Kelly, swimming Breaststroke, Jeff Goldfinger, swimming Backstroke and Freestyle, and Jeff Wilks, Swimming Butterfly.

With the cooperation and commitment of all those involved, this year's team was able to finish the season with a winning record.

With six of the seven members of the squad returning, next year's team hopes to capture the conference championship.



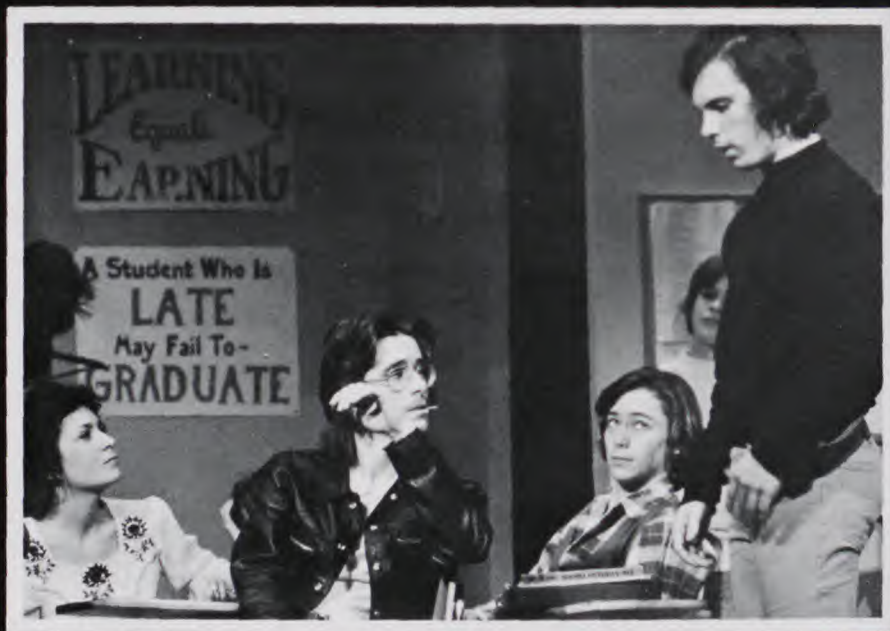
