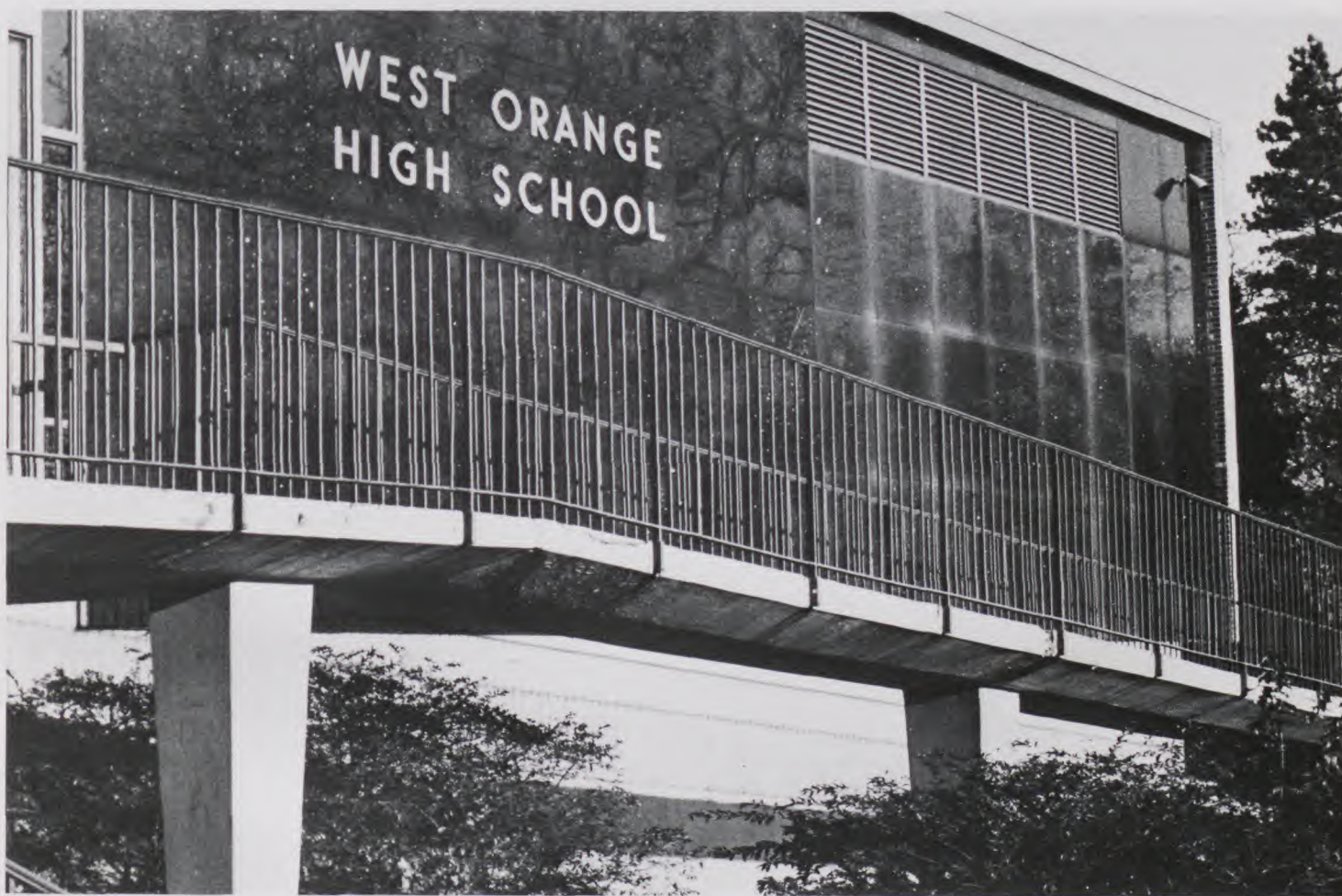

expression.

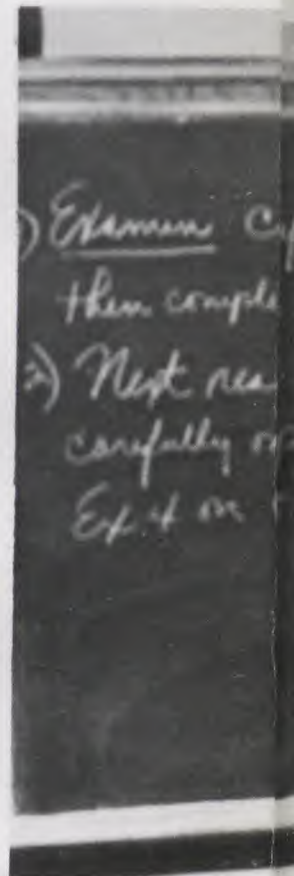
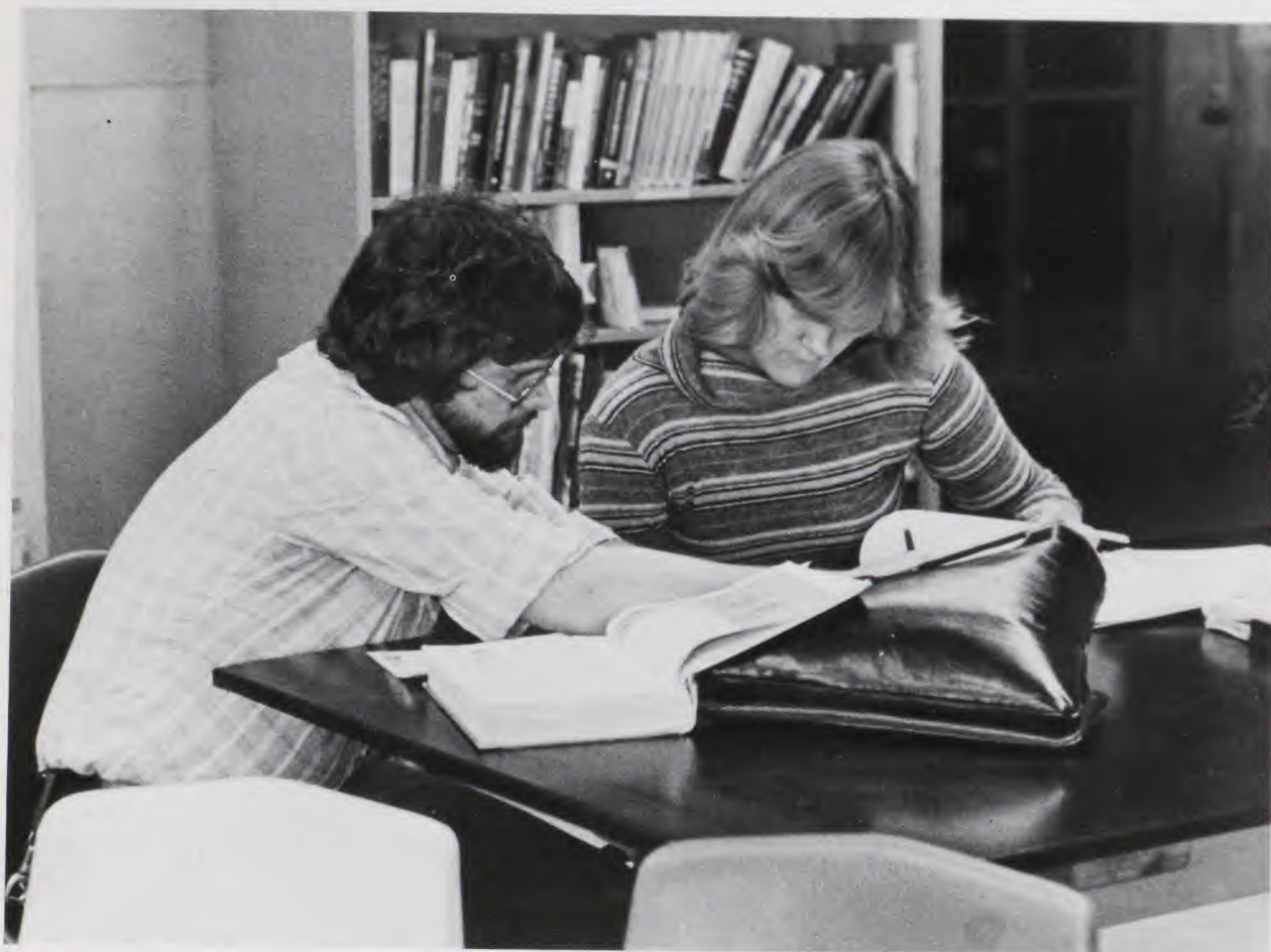
Just as each of us is a product of these influences, and

SIS, of literary and graphic crystallizations of this past year.

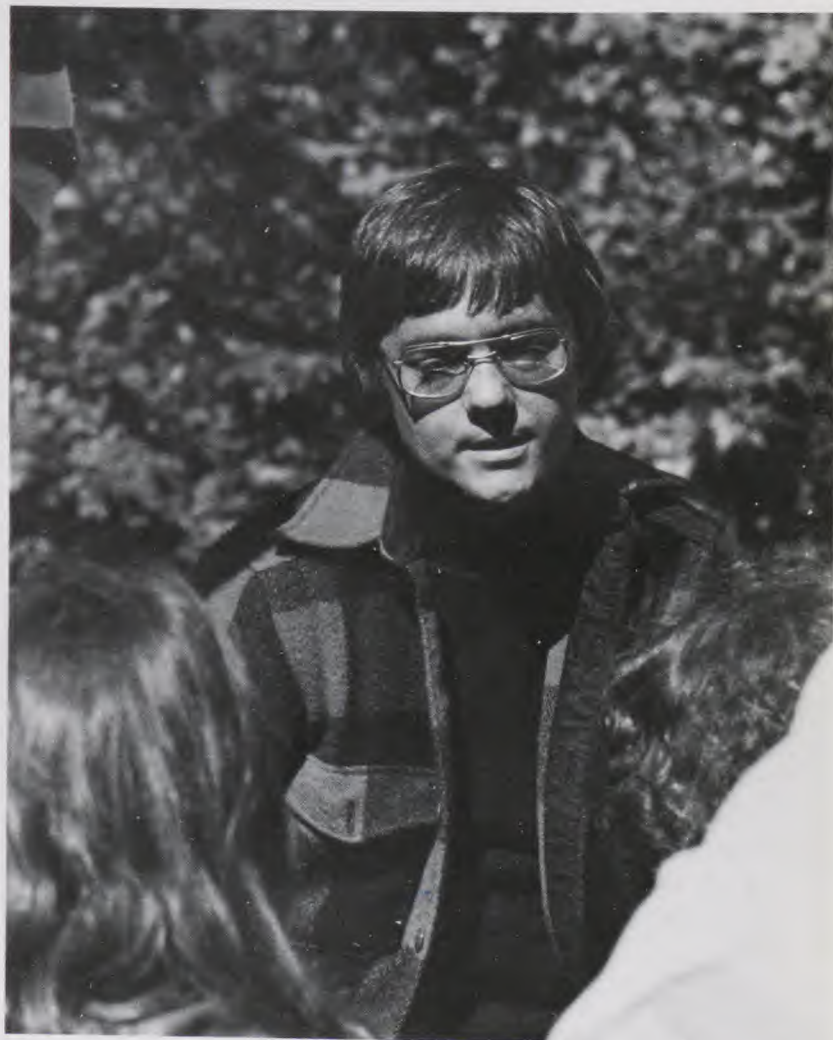
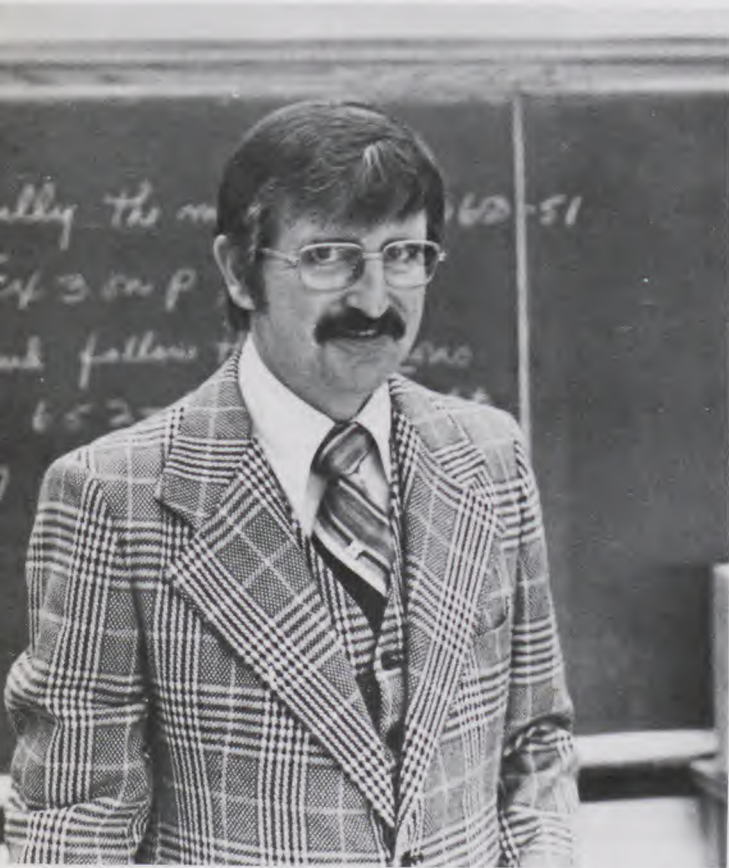

On Thanksgiving Day, our Cowboys trounced the Dayton Bulldogs, 27-7, to climax an incredible season. In completing their 5-4 record, West Orange amassed their highest victory total in 35 years, and set new standards for future Cowboy teams.

Quarterback Darren Dawson spearheaded the attack, and his receivers included Mike Mellilo and Sam Santomo. More than once, the tandem broke open a close game with a long reception. John Casolaro, Larry Castoro, Greg Cuccinello, and Anthony Dorey formed a potent backfield, giving West Orange a variety of offensive weapons.

The defense played well all year, not relinquishing a single point through the first two games. With ten seniors starting, this was an experienced group of athletes which learned to play as a unit, and play well. Steve Avedian filled the position of nose-guard, and flanked by tackles Steve Binney and Rich Hughes (the leading Cowboy tackler) formed a solid line. Dan Parisi and Al Tangretti were the linebackers, and the secondary included Dawson, Castoro, Casolaro, and Don Puffer, who shared punting duties with Parisi.

Other seniors on the squad include Guy Lytle, Mark Simmons, Ron Bennett, Rich Tarentino, Dave Alcock and Wayne Riker.

Perhaps the team's finest moment came not in victory, but in defeat. West Orange gave Madison Borough, the number 2 ranked team in the state, it's toughest game of the year and came within a referee's whistle of pulling off the major upset of 1978. They may not have come away from Madison with a victory, but the 13-7 setback gained an enormous amount of respect for the Cowboys. Pride was evident that day in the eyes of Coach Miller and the coaching staff. The players, the managers, the student body and the faculty also displayed a sense of pride which lasted the entire season.

From the first day of practice through the season-opening 34-0 victory over arch-rival Valley right through the final ticks of the clock on a chilly Thanksgiving Day, there was an enormous amount of self-esteem and respect.

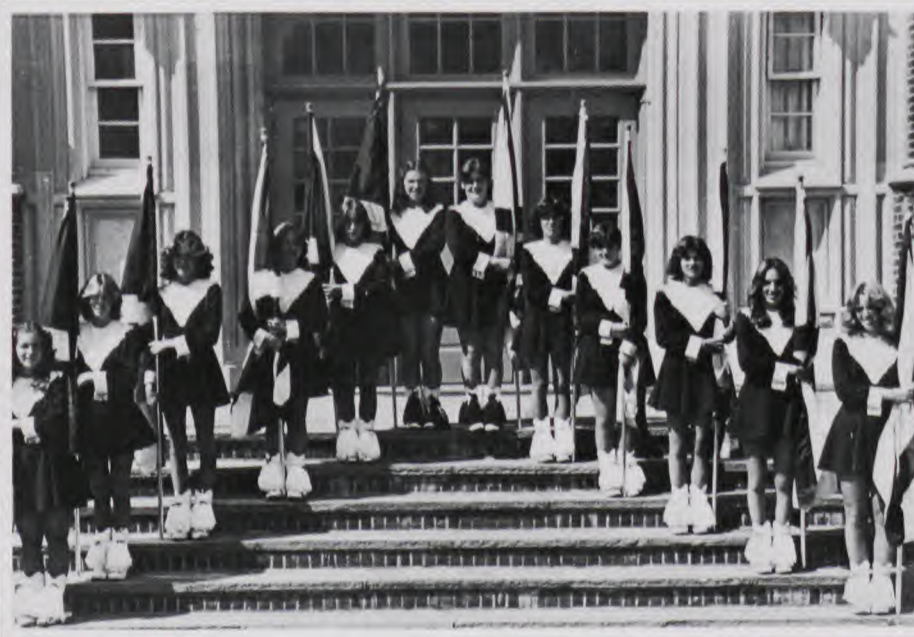

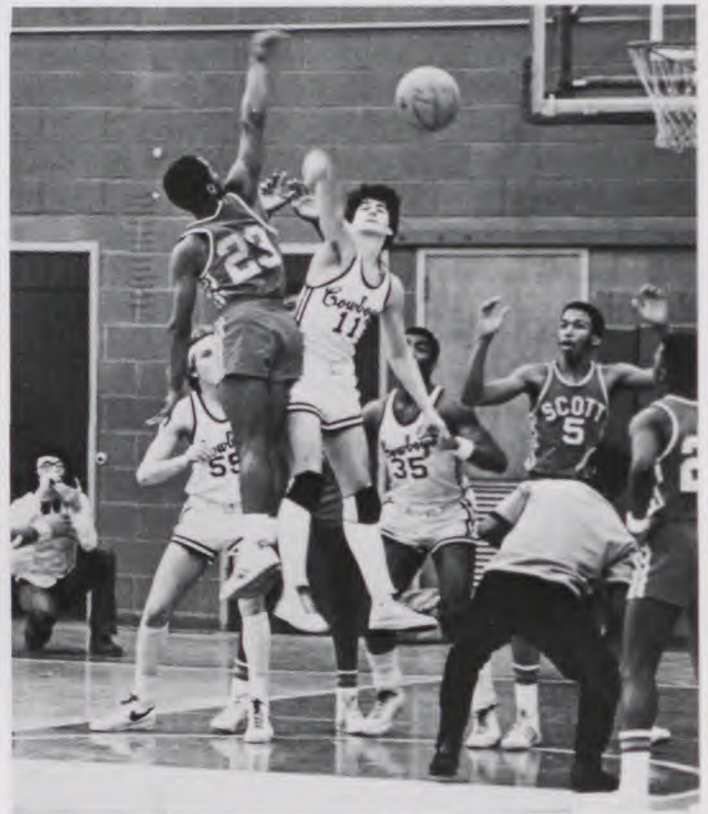

Mike Roberts was chosen to the 1st team All Conference, while Darrin Dawson and Pete DiGiore were selected to the 3rd team.









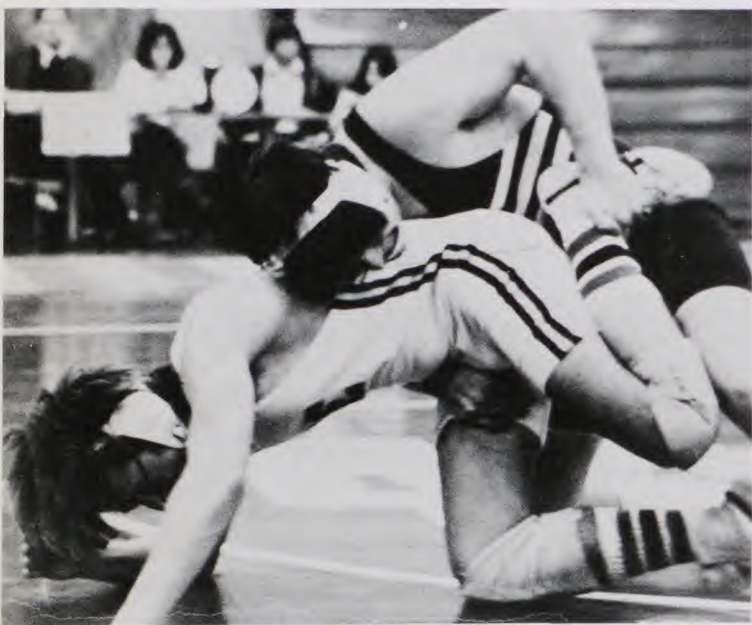
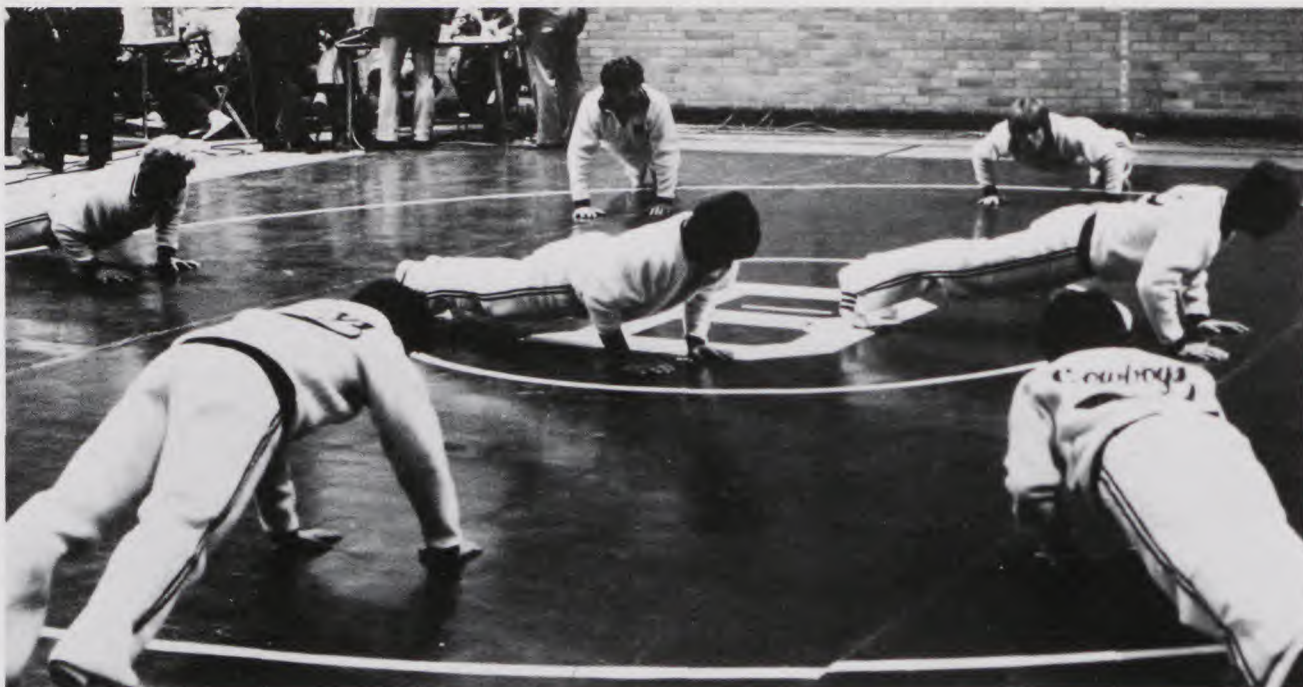

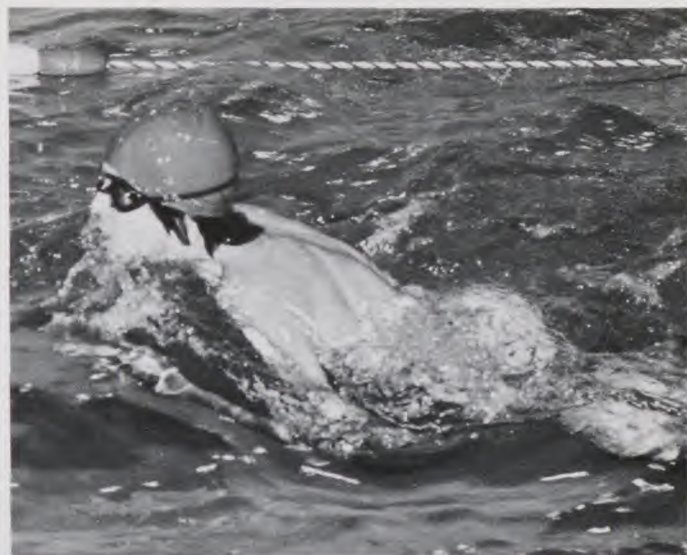
BOWLING

Coach Kirk agreed that the involvement of a large number of freshmen and sophomores promise to make the swim team stronger in the next few years.







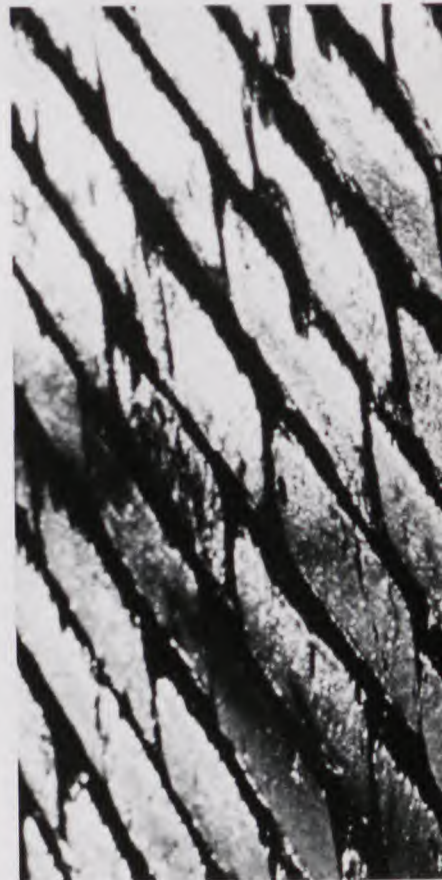
