THAT it's September 8, 1975 and you are bussed, driven, or walked to an imposing brick structure for your first school experience. Whether they call this place Gregory, Hazel, Fairmount, St. Cloud, Mt. Pleasant, Washington, Redwood or P.S. 14, you will come to know it as your home away from home for the next six years. As you struggle to make friends among a myriad of expressionless six year olds, you feel a transformation coming on. They call this place West Orange High School. In previous years you knew the majority of your classmates by name. In this recently consolidated high school, you rub elbows with more than 1300 students who remain nameless for the majority of this phase of your life. Your semi-nomadic experience produces anxiety. Group identity is non-existent as where you are is as mind-boggling as who you are. You attend dances, parties, and sporting events in an effort to expand your circle of friends and increase your sense of belonging. It doesn't feel any different referring to yourself as a freshman, a sophomore, or a junior. You start to anticipate graduation as an escape, and you eagerly count the days.

Then on September 8, 1987, something dramatic occurs. You are able to drive for the first time, and you have a place to go to where you will be instantly recognized and completely accepted. You are now a SENIOR! In the parking lot at Caldor's, you find yourself decorating cars for a motorcade to school. There are no strangers here, only friends you haven't met. You sense that the transformation, begun in 1975, is almost complete. As you ride along Eagle Rock Avenue, you are filled with the exuberance of your new identity as a member of the class of 1988. You possess pride and a new level of enthusiasm. There's a visible confidence in your step as you walk through the hallways — your hallways — in a manner which you never thought possible.

Just one year ago you couldn't wait to get out of high school. Now you want to slow the clock so that you can enjoy every moment of your memory-filled senior year.

Alternative School Broadens Students HORIZONS.

HORIZONS, a new edition in the fall of 1987, was specifically designed for bright sophomores who did not perform to their potential in the past. The program was developed in order to provide these students with more attention, so that they could gain positive attitudes towards school and achievement.

Dr. Donovan, Superintendent of Schools, proposed HORIZONS, and for fourteen months during the 1986-1987 school year, the program was developed by Mr. Feula, Mr. Mirandi, and Mrs. Perry.

There were four teachers who ran HORIZONS on a daily basis: Mrs. Shutkin taught Algebra and Geometry; Mr. Feula taught English; Mr. Krimmel taught Biology, and Mrs. Perry taught U.S. History 1. These four teachers worked as a team to reinforce what each was doing in the classroom, in order to benefit the students who participated in the HORIZONS program. "The team's efforts were rewarded by the progress and the accomplishments of the students," Mrs. Perry commented.

While HORIZONS' academic goals didn't differ from the mainstream of the school, it provided a more casual atmosphere, a varied, rotating schedule, and smaller classes. This allowed the students to have flexibility and individuality, while holding them increasingly more accountable. "In HORIZONS we have the freedom to combine counseling and teaching to better help our students," Mrs. Perry stated.

Homeroom ran from 7:55 to 8:25 a.m. During this time the students drank coffee, tea, or hot chocolate, in order to better prepare themselves physically for the rest of the day. Also, during this time, members of the teaching team were making phone calls to check on students who had not yet arrived and to express concern to parents. Finally, this time period was utilized for program extras such as, working with guidance or the health office. At 8:25 a.m., homeroom came to an end, and the academic classes began. At 11:15 a.m., Physical Education class was conducted. Mr. Jung was in charge of the gym period, and HORIZONS teachers participated in the activities. After gym, the sophomores moved on to their electives. Their school day was completed at 2:12 p.m.

HORIZONS was a pilot program designed to challenge previously unmotivated sophomores. Forty students volunteered for the program in 1987. One goal which these students followed was "To become what we are capable of becoming; to broaden our HORIZONS." All who participated felt that the first run of the innovative program was a success.

Something in Commons

A New Twist to Study Hall

The Commons was a new study hall option open to students in the fall of 1987. It was located in room 255, adjacent to the cafeteria. The function of the Commons was to give the student body a place of their own. This gave them an opportunity to get away from the academic side of school. The Commons was also used as a central meeting place for senior class officers and advisors, and as a senior class lounge before and after school.

Two years ago, plans for the Commons were formulated. Mr. McCarthy felt that students needed a place of their own, with a less formal atmosphere. Then, in the summer of 1987, Mr. McCarthy met with Mr. Prendergast, Miss Damiano, Mr. Tylus, Mr. Tarnoff, Mr. LaSapio, Mr. Lorenzo, and Mr. Mirandi, in order to make plans to have the Commons situated for the upcoming

school year. They realized that the Commons could not be just for seniors, and that during school hours it would have to be open for the entire student body. They also realized that the Commons would not be just a lounge. It would be divided, so students would have the option to do homework and study, or to use the time to relax and socialize.

The money used to fund the Commons came from a grant of \$1,000 that Mr. McCarthy received in 1986 for being Teacher of the Year. The Commons also received individual donations of furniture that were helpful in establishing a relaxing atmosphere.

"My hope for the Commons is that ultimately the students will assume responsibility for the management of the room. I hope that it will be used by seniors more

extensively before and after school," Mr. McCarthy stated.

The Commons differed from study halls in the past, because it was spacious and furnished. Also, in contrast to past study halls, talking was permitted in the Commons. "It makes study hall more sociable," Tommy McGovern stated. The design of the room was to give a study hall option, so students could learn to manage their own time. It enabled students to get away from the academic pressures, and to socialize without being disciplined by teachers.

The Commons was created so that it would eventually be a permanent part of West Orange High School. The students appreciated the new study hall option and the Commons turned out to be a welcomed change.

Publications Make a Difference

Every teenager knows the importance of being different. Students who worked on the publications were no exception. Student staff members of the literary magazine, the newspaper, and the yearbook, all felt the need to create publications that showed their individuality.

The yearbook's first stride towards originality was naming the book, "The Mountaineer." The staff also worked to create a different style in each section, thereby making the book as unique as possible. These changes included original graphic designs and tilted pictures.

Pioneer staff members were also determined to make the newspaper a different and better publication. For the first time, "Desktop Publishing" allowed them to literally print the newspaper themselves. Something For Everyone

"Something for everyone," was the best way to describe the extracurricular activities offered to students. They could choose from clubs and activities which would enrich their educational experiences, afford them an opportunity to pursue a career interest, or involve themselves in community services. Others could gain further knowledge of government.

Perhaps the broadest based activity offered was Interact, a newly formed club. Interact members donated their time at many functions and events during the year, including sponsoring a fundraiser for Polio Plus, writing letters to children from Santa, attending the tree lighting at Town Hall and acting as elves for the children at the Community House.

Career-oriented students were also able to find clubs to suit their interests, such as the Health Careers Club. Members of this organization gained hands-on experience in health-related activities, most notably the Great American Smokeout. Other career-oriented clubs were the Mock Trial Team and Model Congress.

Foreign Language enthusiasts could participate in the French, Italian, or Spanish Clubs, or in the S.A.L.E. Program. Those who participated in S.A.L.E. taught French, Spanish, or Italian to elementary-school children.

Activities were also available for students who wanted to extend their academic experience. Math and Science team memberships were offered to interested students. Places on the Academic Quiz team were filled by trivia buffs, and chess enthusiasts found fellow players during club meetings.

Lean On Me was a part of the Student Assistance Program which began in September of 1987. In July of 1987, Maria Damiano, Martin Lorenzo, Thomas Prendergast, and Lori Vargo organized the program. Lean On Me consisted of peer counselors helping students who needed someone to talk to. All students who were interested in becoming peer counselors had the opportunity to participate. Of the four hundred students who originally signed up for the program, sixty applications were submitted, and thirty-two students were chosen to become members of the program. The students chosen had extensive training, beginning with a retreat weekend to the Stillwater Y-Camp in Newton, N.J. The weekend featured discussion of communication techniques, decision making skills, "wellness", existing referral sources, drug and alcohol awareness, and problem identification.

Lean On Me not only benefited the peer counselors with personal growth, but it also benefited those whom they touched. The peer counselors were able to see anyone who wanted to talk, anytime of the day. Many students had problems recognizing their feelings. The counseling helped the students to learn that it is okay to have feelings. They then learned how to handle them.

The Lean On Me Program differed from the service provided by the guidance counselors, and the school psychologist in that it was

students reaching out to help other students. Everything was kept confidential, except in threatening circumstances. Students who felt they couldn't turn to an adult for advice finally had the option of turning to an objective peer counselor. "If I can touch these students in a special way, that's what matters. To me that's what success is," Lori Vargo the Student Assistance Counselor stated.

In the Spring of 1988, the Lean On Me members visited the middle and elementary schools of West Orange, to make presentations about the Lean On Me Program. With the cooperation of the West Orange High School staff, the advisory committee (Maria Damiano, Thomas Prendergast, and Lori Vargo), and Lean On Me participants, intended to organize other activities for the student body.

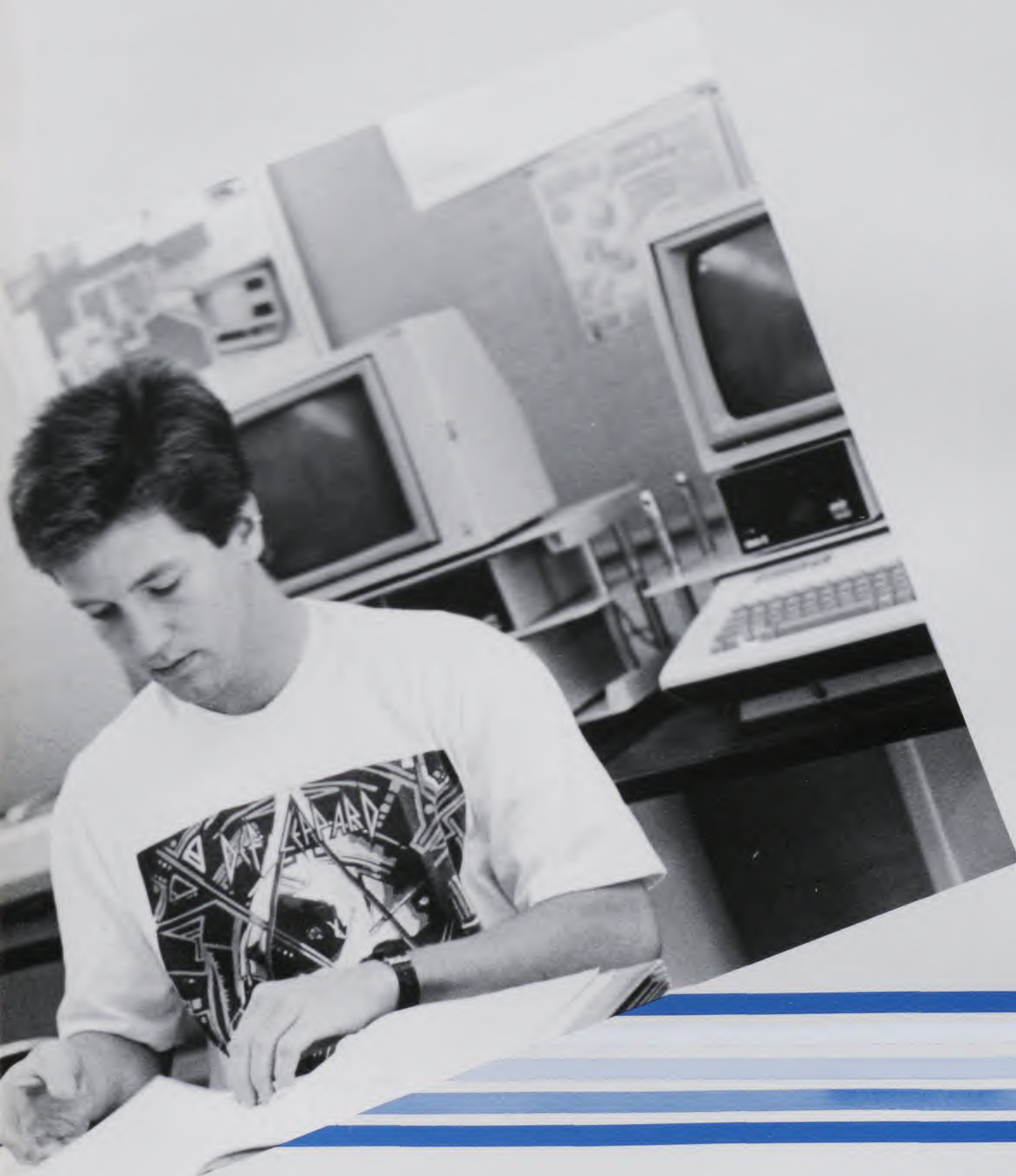

She believed that "the only way to change things is to get involved," and practicing what she preached. She was a political activist for much of her adult life.

Ms. Sebold first became involved with politics through her attendance at local, state, and federal meetings on issues that were important to her. In 1980, Ms. Sebold became a delegate for Ted Kennedy at the Democratic National Convention in New York City. Kennedy was also directly involved in one of Ms. Sebold's most interesting political experiences. Before going in to meet with him, not only was she frisked, but a background check was made and Ms. Sebold and the other guests were constantly watched by Secret Service agents determined to protect Kennedy's life. More recently, while taking a leave of absence from teaching in 1984, Ms. Sebold ran for the office of Free-

holder in New Jersey's District Four.

Often in Washington, Ms. Sebold was able to meet former President Jimmy Carter, his Vice-President and 1984 Democratic candidate for the presidency, Walter Mondale, and many other important political figures. During 1987, Ms. Sebold spent much of her time deciding which Democratic candidate she would support to represent the party in the 1988 presidential elections. Among those whom she had met with were Governor Michael Dukakis, Senator Paul Simon, Senator Albert Gore, Representative Richard Gephardt, and Representative Pat Schroeder, who dropped out of the race early on.

As of November, 1987, Ms. Sebold was a member of the New Jersey Democratic State Committee and head of the Democratic party in Livingston. Considering the possibility of someday running for office again, she sounded much like a politician avoiding a direct response in saying, "In politics, you leave your options open."

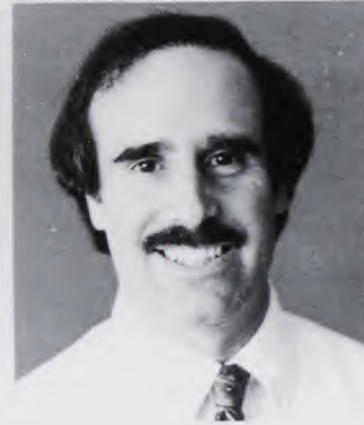

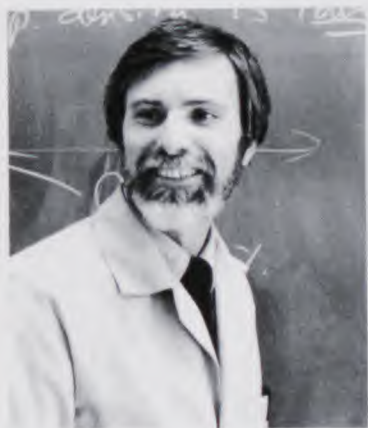

When most people think of ways they would like to spend a weekend, they think of relaxing activities such as reading the newspaper or watching television. Not many people would include working as a corrections officer in a county corrections facility on their list of relaxing weekend activities. Surprisingly, Mr. Comune used thirty-two hours of each weekend, as well as each summer, on the weekend squad at the Essex County Jail Annex in Caldwell, NJ. He worked as a corrections officer in charge of inmates whose crimes included breaking and entering, drunk driving, and shoplifting. Mr. Comune also came into contact with some inmates who were awaiting trial for having committed violent crimes. Fortunately, he never witnessed, or was involved in, any violent incidents at the corrections fa-

cility.

Mr. Comune began work at the Essex County Jail Annex after he passed a civil service test in 1973. There he used his educational skills to aid prisoners. He started and ran an educational program for inmates. This program allowed inmates to acquire their G.E.D. (General Education Diploma) for high school equivalency. For more ambitious prisoners Mr. Comune was also able to develop a college program through Essex County College in Newark, NJ. Through this program, inmates could obtain a college education, and possibly a college diploma.

Mr. Comune's efforts aided many inmates and he was pleased that the program he designed had worked so well for so many — quite an accomplishment for someone who was only working on weekends!

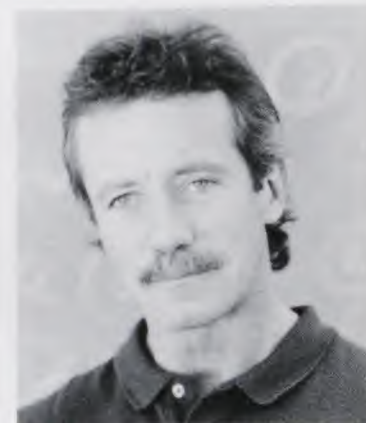

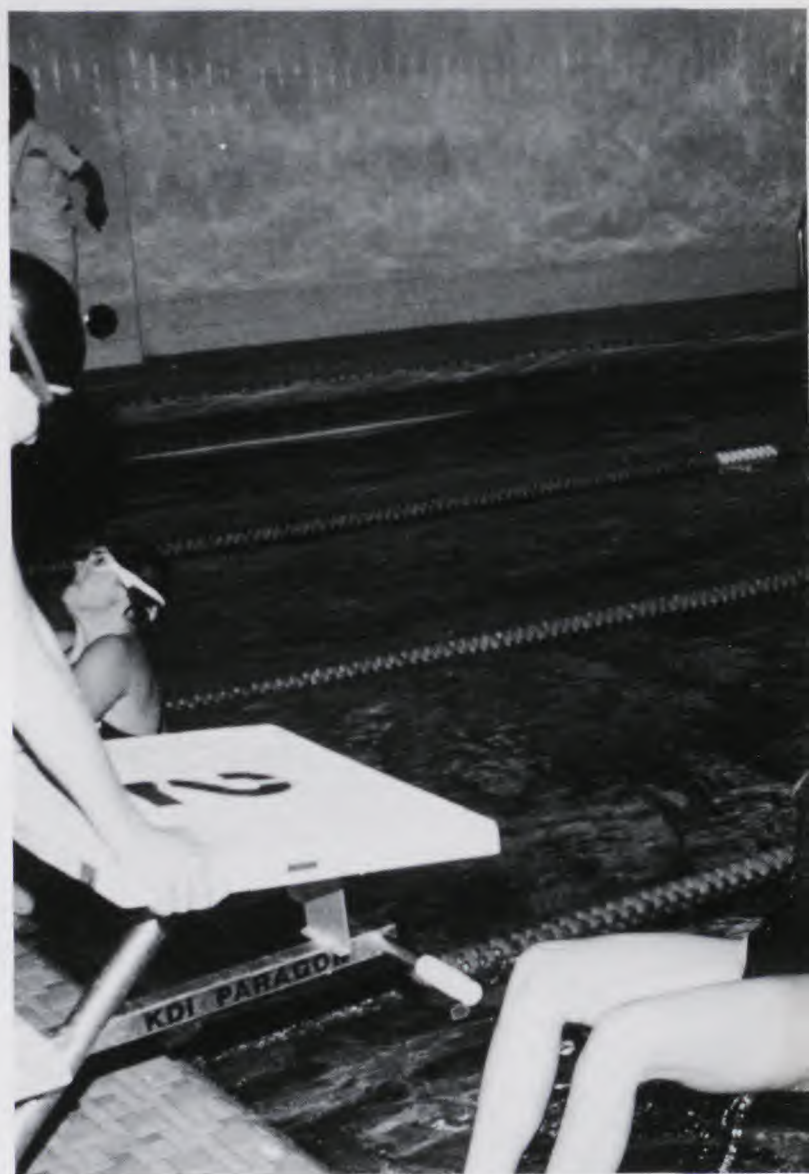
Swimmers Top Columbia

Individuals Excel

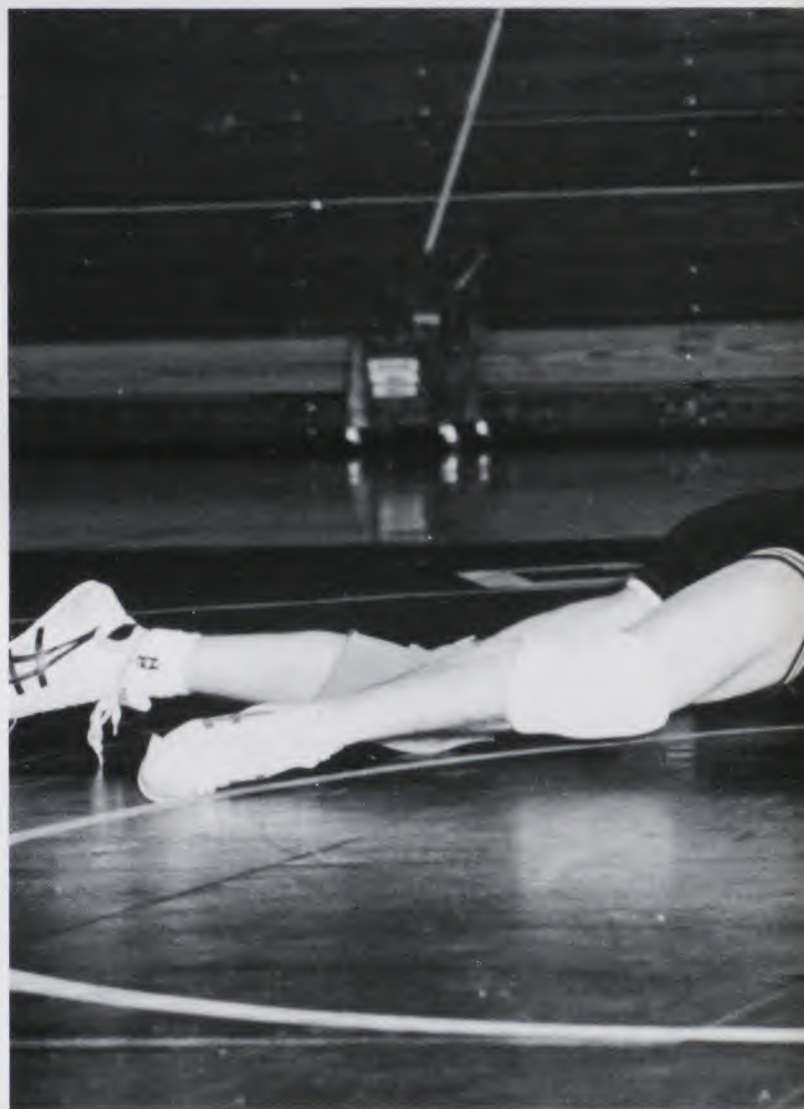

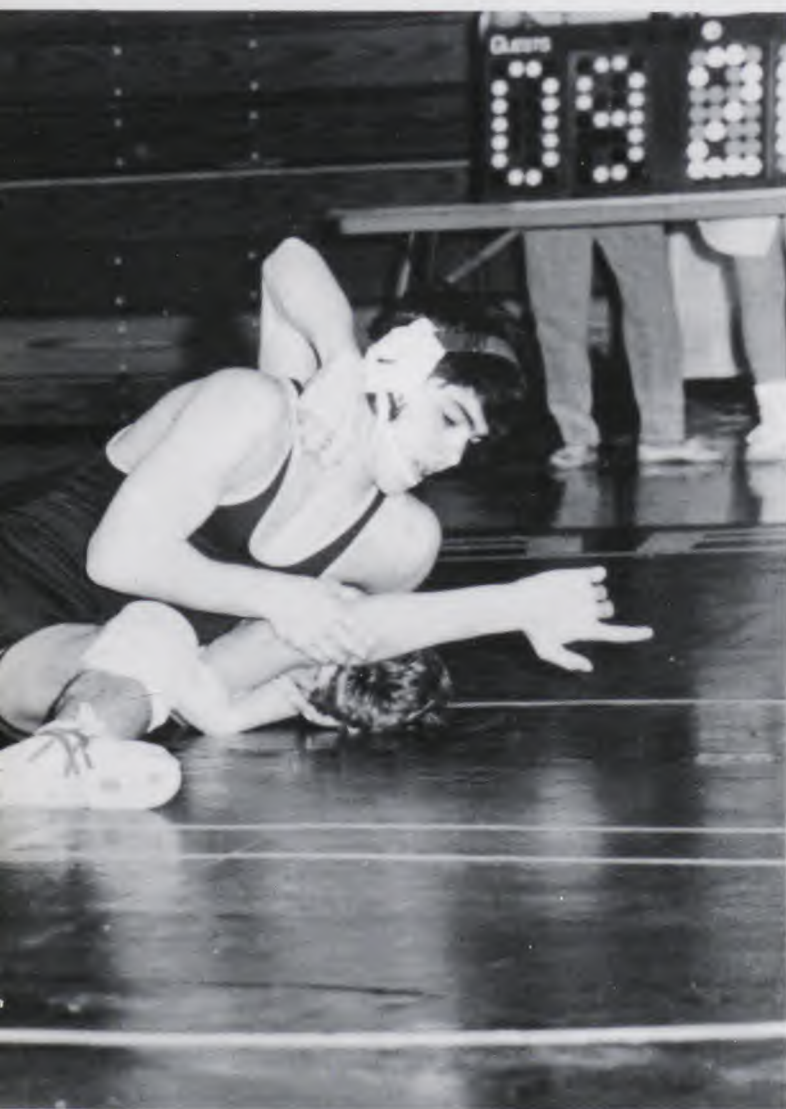

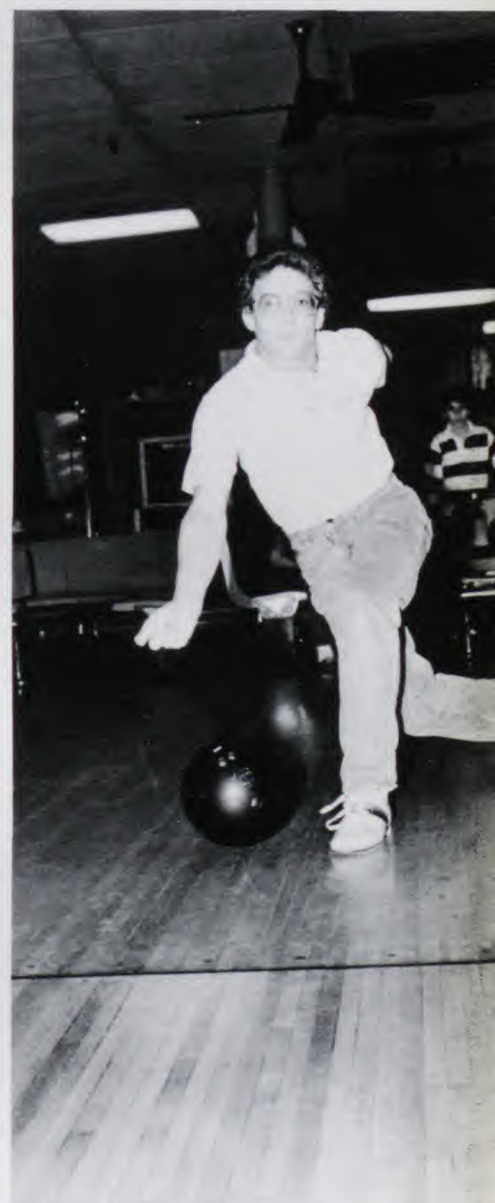

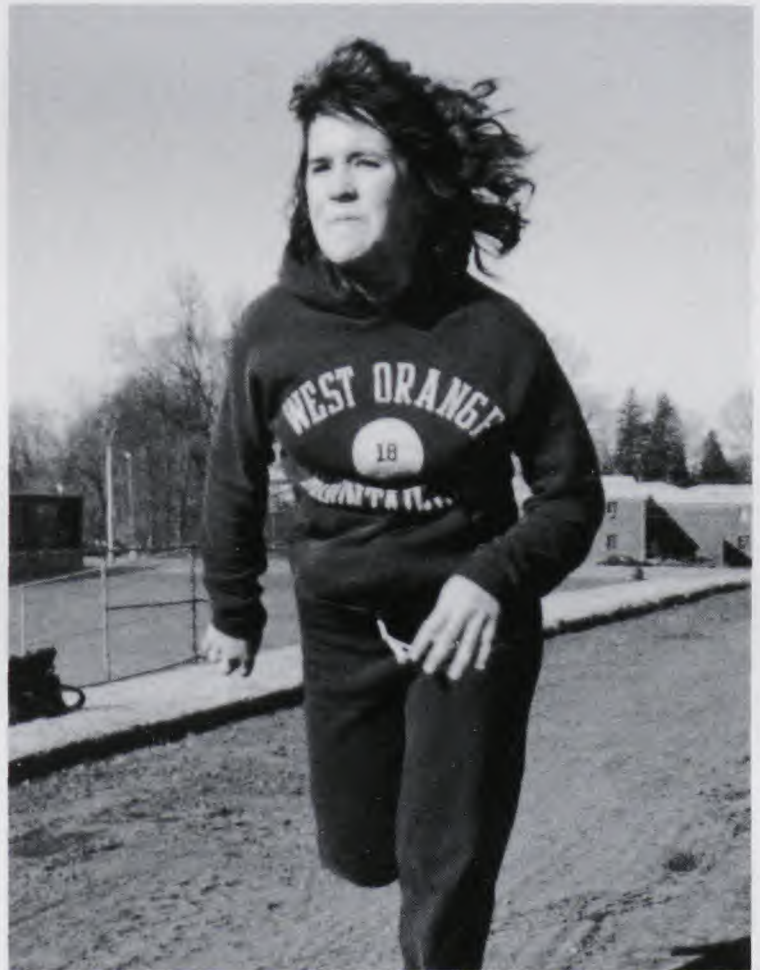
