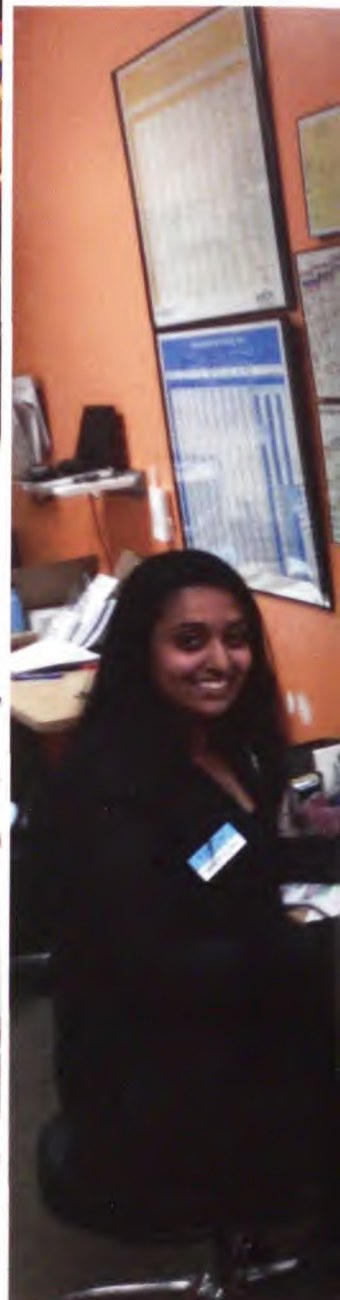

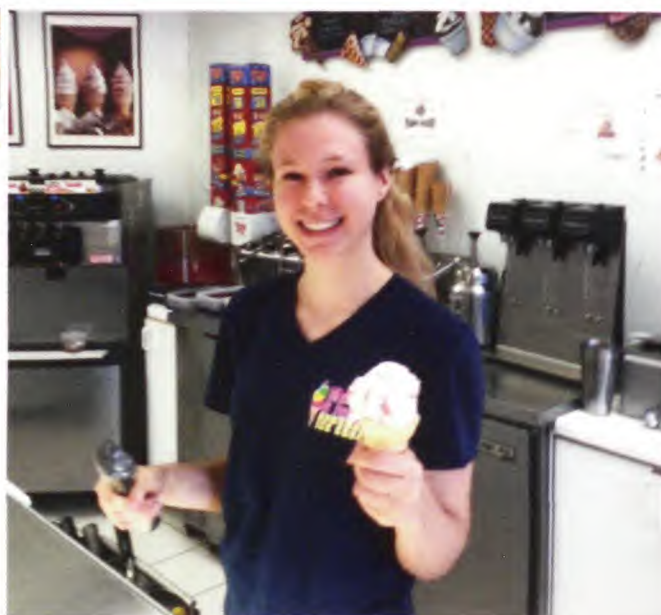

Dress Code Violation

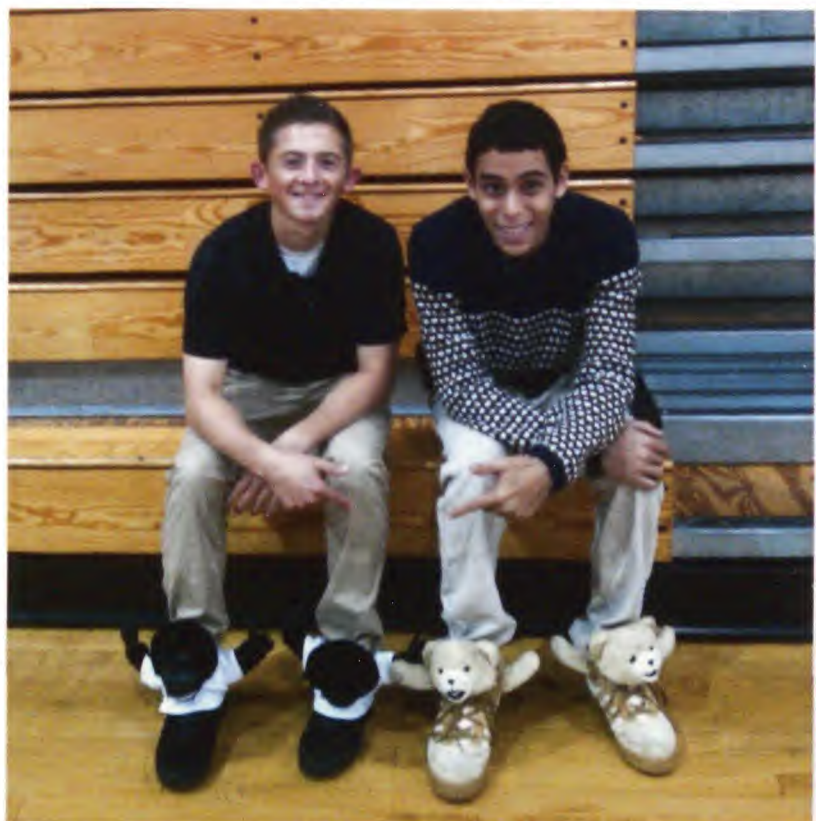

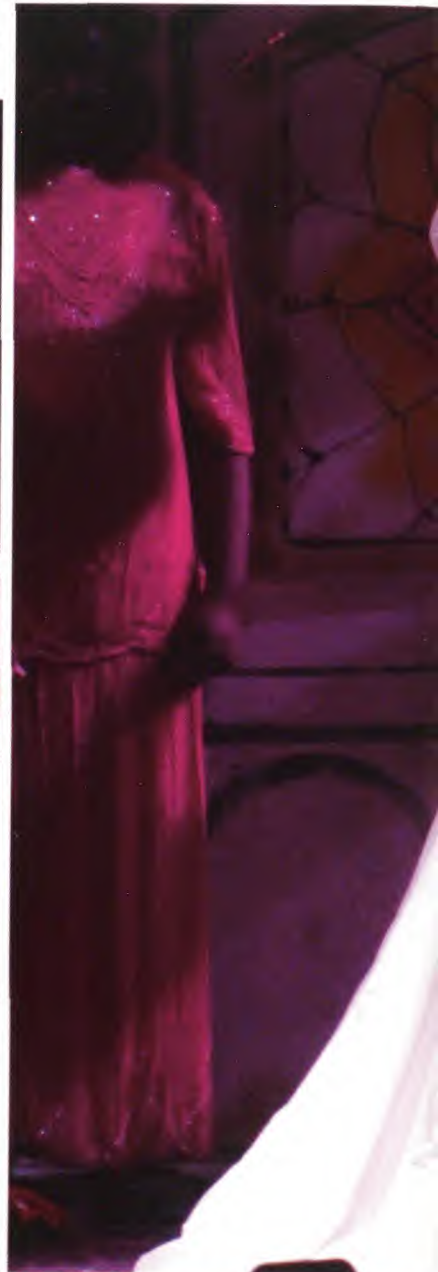

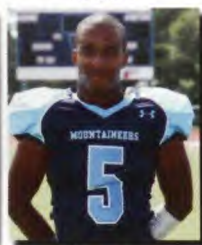

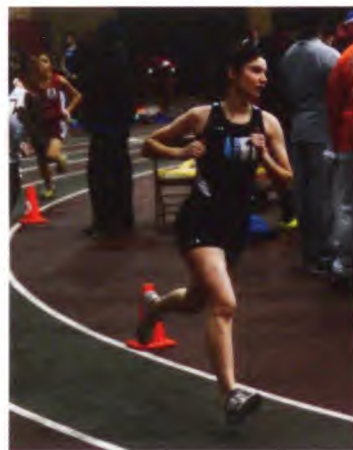
