BOARD OF TRUSTEE MEETING

SEPTEMBER 24, 1975

The meeting was called to order at 8:05 P. M. by William Sagosz, President. Present were Board members Eileen Flanagan, Albert Kupferer, Phyllis Lopis, Nancy Herman, Andrea Grover and Anita Strauss consituting a quorum. Also present were Lola N. Reed, Director, Stewart Manheim, Board Accountant, Irving Ostrow, Board Attorney, and several citizens of West Orange.

MINUTES

Miss Flanagan made a motion to accept the minutes from the August 27, 1975 Board of Trustee meeting as presented. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT

1. Bills Presented for Payment:

Mr. Sagosz requested Mr. Ostrow to contact the Curtis Service Co., Inc. for a clarification of the warranty on the new Mobilibrary engine.

Mr. Kupferer questioned vouchers #9292 (Dramatist's Play Service), and #9211 (Samuel French). Mr. Sagosz explained that in some cases books must be prepaid in order to insure shipment.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the Bills Presented for Payment be accepted with the exception of voucher #9198 to Curtis Service, Inc. until the warranty is clarified. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

2. Financial Statement:

Mrs. Herman made a motion that the Board of Trustees deposit the 4th quarter allocation from the Town of West Orange to the checking account #5987 to meet proper accounting procedures, then to transfer the amount of \$72,876.25 into the Carteret Savings and Loan account #3-2-5589. Mrs. Lopis seconded, and it was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Strauss made a motion that the Board withdraw from Carteret Savings and Loan Association account #3-2-5589, the amount of \$37,521.70; and to transfer from West Orange Savings and Loan account #3422 the amount of \$9,091.08 plus interest to the checking account #5937. Mrs.Grover seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mrs. Lopis seconded it, and it was passed unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

In response to Mrs. Reed's request for a policy dicision in her Director's Report (see attached Damage Claim Form), Mrs. Herman made a motion that the Board of Trustees permit West Orange artists to display their work in the library. Mrs. Reed will set policy as to time of showings and liability factors. Mrs. Strauss seconded it, and the motion was passed unanimously.

Mrs. Reed reported on the repeated abuse of the bookdrop, and at the request of Mr. Sagosz, she will investigate various ways of installing a new bookdrop to prevent further vandalism.

BUDGET PROPOSAL FOR 1976

In accordance with the auditor's request in their report of 1974, Mr. Sagosz made a motion that the Board of Trustees accept the \$491,505 Budget for 1975. \$200,000 to be provided from library funds, and \$291,505 to be allocated from the Town of West Orange. (See attachment of Proposed 1975 budget).

The Board of Trustees discussed and established budgetary requirements for the West Orange Free Public Library for 1976. (See attached budget proposal for 1976).

Mrs. Grover made a motion that the Board of Trustees accept the proposed 1976 budget of \$512,797. The motion was amended to include a provision for \$50,000 for a new Mobilibrary for a total of \$562,797. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

COMMITTEES

1. Personnel Committee:

Mr. Sagosz read a letter from the staff of the West Orange Public Library stating that they are in favor of being paid twice a month.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion that the employees be paid twice a month with payment dates to be the 10th and the 25th of each month. The program will be initiated as soon as possible. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the Board of Trustees accept the reinstatement of Carmine Juliano after a leave of absence of six months at a starting salary of \$3.87 as a Jr. Library Assistant commencing Sept 2, 1975. The following Jr. Library Clerks have been hired at \$2.00 per hour: Shelly Bromberg-Sept. 9, 1975; Maria Pavlou-Sept. 3, 1975; Michael Molle-Sept. 8. 1975; and Michael Wilk-Sept. 8, 1975. Mrs. Grover seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Manheim stated that as of January 1, 1976, an hourly rate for Jr. Library Clerks was set by the United States Department of Labor at \$2.10 per hour.

NEW BUSINESS

Mrs. Reed reported that the Friends of the Library would like the Board to purchase library bags, and would reimburse the library for the amount spent. Mr. Ostrow suggested that an agreement be drawn up in which it would state that the Friends agree to reimburse the West Orange Public Library for the amount expended.

Mrs. Reed has informed the Board of Trustees that in communities over 10,000 it will be a state law that libraries remain open three evenings a week in order to receive their State Aid Funds. She indicated that State Aid has been cut 29% from last year.

Based on the report of the requirements made by the state for State Aid Funds, Mrs. Strauss made a motion that the West Orange Public Library be open three evenings a week. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

The next Board of Trustees meeting will be held on Wednesday, October 22, 1975. The meeting was adjourned at 11:30 P. M.

DIRECTOR'S MONTHLY REPORT

SEPTEMBER 24, 1975

With the exceptions of preparing a "proposed" budget, completion of the Annual Report and getting programs in line for the new school year, the functions of the library were normal this month.

Several local artists have contacted me during the past few months about hanging their work in the library. The idea is appealing but there are drawbacks so far as guarantee of the safety of these works. A check on our 'Personal Property' insurance policy reveals that we are covered for property belonging to others should they be damaged or stolen while held by the library. What, then, is your collected opinion on permitting local artists exhibit their crafts in the library?

We purchased a new Royal standard typewriter for Mr. Chow. He is very pleased and has thanked me several times (and I thank you too).

There are four additional old typewriters which we are anxious to replace with new ones, three manuals and one electric. As trade-ins these could bring prices down somewhat.

Because of the lack of regular police surviellance around the library our book drop has been tampered with on numerous occasions. Each time the custodian has made an effort to "bang" it back in shape and we continue to use it. Recently, however, a patron complained about injuring her arm while trying to place books in the receptacle.

To avoid future complaints, it is suggested that you consider having the glass cut on an outside door large enough for books to be slipped through. This could possibly be done at both the Gaston Street and Mt. Pleasant Avenue entrances.

The First Mountain Crafters have their Bicentennial display in the Adult area. The exhibit will remain through October 9th.

The entire Children's Room staff is busy preparing for the Fall Story Hour sessions which will begin on October 6th. Although five classes are being set up for the Main library and one for our Tory Corner branch, we are not able to accommodate all on the waiting list. Strict adherence must be given to the age rule in order to afford fair treatment to all applicants.



BOARD OF TRUSTEE MEETING

OCTOBER 22, 1975

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by William Sagosz, President. Present were Board of Trustee members Eileen Flanagan, Andrea Grover, Albert Kupferer, Phyllis Lopis, Nancy Herman, and Anita Strauss constituting a quorum. Also present were Lola M. Reed, Director, Stewart Manheim, Board Accountant, Irving Ostrow, Board Attorney and two citizens of West Orange.

MINUTES

1. Bills Presented for Payment:

Mr. Kupferer made a motion that the Bills Presented for Payment be accepted as presented. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

2. Financial Statement:

Mrs. Herman made a motion that due to the fact that the fourth quarter allocation from the Town of West Orange in the amount of \$72,876.25 arrived later than expected, it was not transferred to Carteret Savings and Loan account #3-2-5589 from the checking account #5937 at Midlantic National Bank. The Board of Trustees approves this non-transfer for the reasons stated above. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Lopis and passed unanimously.

Mrs. Strauss made a motion that the Board of Trustees transfer the funds from the Midlantic National Bank, account #51658 to a statement savings account (day of deposit, day of withdrawal) at Midlantic National Bank in order to increase interest yield. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mrs. Grover seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mrs. Reed presented the Director's Report for the month of October, 1975. She informed the Board of Trustees that two Jr. Library Clerks have been hired to replace Dana Larson who resigned as of October 14, 1975, and Carmine Juliano who is resigning as of October 31, 1975. The new employees are: Linda Hirschmann and Alice Anderson who will begin work on October 27 and 14 respectively. Both employees will begin at an hourly wage of \$2.10 per hour.

Mrs. Reed noted that the staff has been busy attending various seminars and workshops, and that she is presently in the process of obtaining more information in regard to the installation of a bookdrop.

Mrs Reed made a request for a display board and audio/visual cabinets. Mr. Sagosz reminded her to bring in estimates and materials to present at the next Board of Trustee meeting.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Mrs. Lopis read a letter sent to Mrs. Helen Benjamin of the West Orange Public Library Employees' Association stating the Board's policy on "selling within the library" and "sick leave time for medical appointments" discussed at the September 24, 1975 Board of Trustees meeting.

Mrs. Grover reported on the meeting held on October 3, 1975 of the New Friends of the Library. Mr. Sagosz suggested that Mr. Ostrow, a former member of the group, contact Mrs. Meyers to discuss the aims and objectives of this organization.

OLD BUSINESS

To improve stack lighting, Mr. Sagosz requested Mrs. Reed to experiment with a mirror of a reasonable size by placing it on top of one of the stacks to reflect the light into the aisle.

Mr. Sagosz reported on the Seminar on Continuing Education and the Public Library which he attended on October 3, 1975 in Jamesburg. He indicated that it would be feasible for the library to prepare programs for Cable TV transmission in the future. One or two session seminars could be offered featuring a specialist in various fields of interest. Mrs. Reed indicated that additionalhelp would be required to investigate and prepare such a program.

Mr. Ostrow reported that he obtained a letter from Curtis Service Inc. giving a one year warranty for the new Onan engine, and a ninety day warranty covering labor and maintenance. Based on this report, Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the bill to Curtis Service Inc. #9198 be paid since the Board is satisfied with the warranty requirements being met. Mrs. Strauss seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Ostrow presented a Damage Claim Limitation form that he prepared. It explains the limit of liability the library has to exhibitors of art work displayed in the library.

NEW BUSINESS

Mrs. Reed was notifed by the Fowler agency, that their inspectors recommend installation of a product combustion alarm system in the main library. Recommendation was also made that the fire extinquisher at Tory Corner be inspected annually and that the branch should have a product combustion alarm system installed. Mrs. Reed will meet with Town Safety Inspector Cohrs on October 28, 1975 to discuss this matter. She indicated that it will soon be a state law to have a smoke detection system installed in public buildings.

Mrs. Reed notified the Board of Trustees that Mr. Refinski, the library custodian is seriously ill. Therefore she assigned Mr. William Toohey to perform custodian duties at the library, at his current wage, whenever he has time available.

The November Board of Trustee meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 25, 1975 at 8:00 P. M. The December meeting will be held on Monday, December 22, 1975 at 8:00 P. M. The public will be notified of the change in meeting dates.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:00 P. M.

DIRECTOR'S MONTHLY REPORT

OCTOBER 22, 1975

October seems to be the month of many mini meetings attended by members of our staff. Included were the following-Seminar on Continuing Education and the Public Library attended by Mr. Sagosz; retirement dinner meeting in honor of James W. Clayton former Town Comptroller attended by Mr. Donnelly and Mrs. Reed; meeting on Social Services attended by Mr. Donnelly; Media File Collection, Miss Cushing and Mr. Donnelly; Committee on Vandalism--Mrs. Reed; Southwest Essex Area Children's Librarians--Mrs. Coffman and Mrs. Lepore; Gaylord Circulation Control System for Libraries--Mrs. Reed; Central Reviewing Committee--Mrs. Coffman; Organizational Meeting of the New Friends of the Library ateended by Donnelly, Meyers, Grover, Reed and Sagosz; Bicentennial Committee meeting--Mr. Donnelly; Cable Television Committee meeting attended by Mr. Kupferer; and the automation meeting on "The Catalog--its Nature and Prospects" in New York attended by Mrs. Czarnecki.

Despite our involvement in the many mini conferences and seminars our regular routines were not neglected, and the library was as busy as ever. Pre-school classes are underway and are well-attended. Mrs. Coffman is conducting five classes per week here at Main and Mrs. Lepore has one class per week at our Tory Corner branch.

Carmine Juliano has given notice that he will be leaving the library at the end of this month to devote more time to a full-time position and to return to school. Dana Larsen resigned on October 14th to begin work on a full-time job.

Two young ladies were hired during the month as Junior Library Clerks (Pages) at an hourly rate of \$2.10. They are Alice Anderson and Linda Hirshmann.

There have been smiles all around since our new pay system went into effect. Practically everyone seems pleased with the results. Adjustments are being made without a great many problems as some had envisioned. The consensus is it is a good thing to happen to us.

Mr. Ostrow received a new warranty proposal from Curtis Service Company which he read to me over the telephone. We felt that it covered sufficiently the question of a clarification of warranty. On the basis of what was received it was suggested that the check to the company could be released.

In accordance with the instructions of the Board of Trustees, Mr. Ostrow has prepared and presented to me a "Damage Claim Limitation" for artists who might want to exhibit their works in the library.

A check with several libraries in the area reveals that there are several types of book drops being used. One library has two old fashioned mail boxes at the front entrance. Others have chutes extending from a hole cut in the wall or door (brick or glass). Still another has a hole cut through glass and a cart inside to catch books as they fall. One librarian gave me the name of Mosler Safe Co., in Irvington, who is experienced in this type of work.

Movies at the library are beginning to be very popular. There have been large crowds at each of the last few movies shown.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

NOVEMBER 25, 1975

Prior to the regular Board of Trustees meeting, Deputy Chief James J. Cohrs spoke to the Board about the inspection made by the Fire Prevention Bureau. His recommendations are as follows: 1) elimination of flammables within the garage by obtaining an outside storage shed or construction of a Fire Rated Room within the garage area. 2) The building should be protected by a combination Smoke and Rate of Rise detection system. He will give Mrs. Reed a list of acceptable systems and companies from which the Board may receive estimates.

The meeting was called to order at 8:05 P. M. by William Sagosz, President. Present were Board of Trustee members Andrea Grover, Albert Kupferer, Phyllis Lopis, Nancy Herman, and Anita Strauss constituting a quorum. Also present were Lola N. Reed, Director, Stewart Manheim, Board Accountant, Irving Ostrow, Board Attorney and several citizens of West Orange.

MINUTES:

Mrs. Strauss made a motion to accept the minutes from the October 22, 1975 Board of Trustees meeting as presented. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Grover and passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

The purchase of microfilm was discussed and the Board agreed that in the future, microfilm purchases would be moved from line item-Materials and Supplies/Audio-Visual, to line item-Materials and Supplies/Books.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. It was seconded by Mrs. Strauss and carried unanimously.

2) Financial Report:

Mrs. Grover made a motion to accept the Financial Report for the month of October, 1975. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed informed the Board that a new Jr. Library Clerk, Barbara Siesputowski was hired on November 6, 1975 at a rate of \$2.10 per hour.

In a communication from the Employees' Association, Mrs. Reed informed the Board that the following people will serve as officers for 1976: Mark Donnelly, President; Jackie Lepore, Vice President; Ada Berger, Treasurer; Elizabeth Springsteel, Secretary.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the library close on December 24, 1975 at 1:00 P. M. and on December 31, 1975 at 1:00 P. M. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Sagosz appointed Mrs. Lopis and Mrs. Strauss to investigate and report on the use of annual leave and personal days in regard to religious holidays for 1976.

Acting on the report made by Mrs. Reed that there are repeated losses of borrower's cards by patrons, Mr. Kupferer made a motion that the cost of replacing borrower's cards be established at 50¢. Mrs. Strauss seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

After a brief discussion of payment of sick leave time upon retirement, Mr. Sagosz made a motion that the Board table the item of Sick Leave until the next meeting. Mrs. Strauss seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously. Mr. Ostrow will look into Civil Service laws in regard to retirement benefits.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Ostrow reported on his appearance in the appellate court in Hackensack on November 17, 1975 in regard to the Jonas appeal. He indicated that the panel of three judges would take four to six weeks to make a decision.

Mr. Sagosz read a letter from the West Orange Public Library Employees' Association in which concern was shown in regard to the voluntary work policy. The Association would like to have guidelines established for any volunteer workers. Mr. Sagosz appointed Mrs. Grover to meet with Mrs. Reed and the Association officers to formulate a policy to present to the Board.

Mrs. Reed presented estimates for various pieces of equipment. Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the Board of Trustees approve the expenditure of \$500.00, taken from line item-Equipment, for the purchase of chairs for the Children's Room. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously. The Board will consider future purchases in priority order as indicated by the Director.

NEW BUSINESS:

Based upon the request for additional shelving for the Reference Area, Mr. Sagosz suggested that Mrs. Reed contact a furniture representative to make an estimate and floor plan for that department.

Mr. Sagosz informed the Board of Trustees that according to the Open Public Meetings Act, the library must publicize all meetings in two newspapers at least 48 hours before the date of the meeting, and that notice must be posted within the library indicating the date and time such a meeting will be held. This policy must be put into effect by January 19, 1976.

Mrs. Strauss made a motion that the Board of Trustees close out savings account #3848, West Orange Savings and Loan Association, in the amount of \$41,646.05 plus interest and to transfer it to the checking account at Midlantic Bank for November expenditures. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Stewart Manheim informed the Board of Trustees that the A. Eisenberg and Company will continue to provide professional services to the library.

Mr. Manheim informed the Board of Trustees that the State Aid check has been received from the Town of West Orange and deposited in a savings account. Acting upon this information, Mrs. Herman made a motion to approve the deposit of the State Aid check in the amount of \$40,000.00 to the Carteret Savings and Loan Association account #3-25589. Mrs. Strauss seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

Mr. Sagosz read a letter from Mayor Cuozzi appointing Mrs. Anita Strauss to serve on the Board of Trustees for the period 1976-1980.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the Board of Trustees approve the expenditure of \$256.00, line item-legal for services rendered in regard to the Jonas appeal. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

ADJOURNMENT:

The next Board of Trustee meeting will be held on Monday, December 22, 1975. The meeting was adjourned at 10:45 P. MM.

DIRECTOR'S

MONTHLY REPORT

November 25, 1975

The month of November seems to have been one for many happenings here at the library. On two occasions our hearts were made to feel sad because of the loss of someone dear to library-connected personnel.

An unusually large number of classes from local schools toured the library and were given lectures on its operation and how to use it. A series of movies were shown to children on holidays which were well attended. Bicentennial and other exhibits are continually on display. One very interesting display, in the Children's Room, is from a class from one of our schools.

On the evening of November 13, a retirement party was given in honor of Mrs. Isabel Dickinson at Solano's Restaurant. There was almost 100% attendance by staff members and the Trustee Board was represented by Mr. Sagosz. Mrs. Dickinson, one of the oldest employees, (16 years) retired on November 15.

According to the 1972 Revised Ordinances of West Orange, and the Business Manager's Office in Town Hall, a retiring employee is entitled to 50% of his/her accumulated sick leave at the time of retirement. Exerpts on retiring from Town of West Orange Ordinances and the booklet "Public Employees' Retirement" prepared by the New Jersey Division of Pensions (1973) are enclosed. Mrs. Dickinson should receive a lump sum pro-rated as defined by sources supplied.

We are experiencing problems with patrons misplacing or losing their borrowers' card. Since they seem to be the same people time after time, it has been suggested by the staff at the Circulation Desk that we propose to you a change of cost from \$.25 to \$.50. This way, we feel, will discourage patrons from requesting new cards and, at the same time, caution them to be more careful in keeping their cards in a safe place.

One new Page has been added to our staff. Her name is Barbara Siesputowski. She has had experience in school libraries in elementary, junior high, and now, senior high school. Barbara started work on November 6, 1975 at a rate of \$2.10 per hour.

Because of the volume of library business at this time, we would propose to you that the library remain open on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve until 1:00 P. M. We have arranged for those of the Christian religion to work on the holidays of people of the Jewish faith and Jewish personnel to work on the two half days of the Christian holidays.

Frank Refinski has returned to work but is not yet up to par. He is still being assisted by Mr. Toohey. In about another week, we hope he will be able to take on full duties.

The Employees Association gave me a list of the new slate of officers for the coming year. Mark Donnelly has been selected as President.

The Employees Association has expressed concern about volunteer workers, a matter brought up by Mr. Sagosz. According to a letter which I received from their President, they feel very strongly that definite line of distinction be drawn separating the duties of volunteers as opposed to jobs given to salaried workers.



MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

DECEMBER 22, 1975

Due to inclement weather, the Board of Trustees meeting was held on Tuesday, December 23, 1975 at 8:00 P. M.

Prior to the regular meeting, Mr. Frank Refinski, Custodian, spoke to the Board of Trustees about the boiler room. He requested that the Board look into the possibility of updating the control panel putting the pumps on automatic control, also to replace the circulating pump, repair the modulating stck, and to uncover radiators in the Children's Room which are hidden behind bookcases.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by William Sagosz, President. Present were Board of Trustee members Eileen Flanagan, Nancy Herman, Albert Kupferer and Anita Strauss constituting a quorum. Also present were Lola N. Reed, Director, Stewart Manheim, Board Accountant, and several citizens of West Orange.

MINUTES:

Mrs. Strauss made a motion to accept the minutes from the November 25, 1975 Board of Trustees meeting as presented. The motion was seconded by Miss Flanagan and was passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

Bills Presented for Payment:

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to approve payment of Check #9541 for \$22.00 to the League of Women Voters. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

Mrs. Herman made a motion to accept the bills presented for payment. Miss Flanagan seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

2) Financial Statement

Mr. Manheim indicated that budget balances for the month of December should be approximately \$15,000 in unexpended monies after December bills are paid. Utilities, Service Contracts, Legal Services, and Hospitalization are line items that are overexpended as of December 22, 1975.

Mrs. Strauss made a motion that \$45,000--Reserve for New Mobilibrary be transferred to the 1975 Budget Fund to cover December expenditures. Mrs. Herman seconded it, and the motion was passed unanimously.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the financial statement as presented. Mrs. Strauss seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

2)

Mrs. Reed informed the Board that Mary Jean McGraw was hired on December 10, 1975 at a rate of \$2.10 per hour as a Junior Library Clerk.

Mrs. Reed presented a letter from Mr. Robert Jonas in which he enclosed an application for his pension and requested to be paid for his vacation and personal days. Reimbursement was requested for a radio valued at \$17.00, and shoes valued at \$20.00.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to send the letter prepared by Mrs. Reed and amended by the Board in response to the Jonas' letter. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORT:

Mrs. Lopis and Mrs. Strauss, a committee appointed to investigate the use of annual leave and/or personal days or religious holidays, recommended that religious holidays should be taken as annual leave or personal days; 1/2 day be allowed to be taken the day before a holiday if so desired. Mrs. Lopis will present a list of recognized religious holidays issued by the State Department of Education at the next Board of Trustees meeting to be used as a criterion for religious holidays. Mr. Sagosz asked the committee to draft a passage to amend the Staff Manual to include regligious holidays.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mrs. Herman amended the motion from the November meeting to state that the Board of Trustees authorize closing West Orange Savings and Loan Account #3848, leaving \$50.00 in that account in order for interest to be paid. The Board approves that action. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Lopis and passed unanimously.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the "Open Public Meetings Act" resolution as presented. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously. See attachment to minutes.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz thanked the secretary, accountant and attorney for their service and assistance throughout the past year.

Mr. Sagosz requested Mrs. Strauss and Mrs. Herman to serve on the nominating committee. Mrs. Strauss will head the committee and conduct the elections at the January meeting. The elections will be the first order of business following the reading of the minutes.

The Board of Trustees agreed that a check submitted to the New Friends of the Library be returned to the donor until the organization makes provision for such funds.

Mrs. Herman made a motion that pay day for employees be changed to the 15th of the month or the last working day before the 15th, and the last working day before the end of the month. Changes to be effective as of February, 1976. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion. It was passed with an abstention cast by Mrs. Strauss.

COMMUNICATIONS

Mr. Sagosz presented a letter from Mr. Ostrow concerning the successful conclusion of the Jonas' appellate case appeal.

ADJOURNMENT:

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 P. M. The next Board of Trustees meeting will be held on January 28, 1976.

MONTHLY REPORT

December 22, 1975

Several important holidays were observed during the past month which made the library seem busier than ever. Because of our recognition of the various holidays, exhibits were changed grequently to fit the celebration activity.

During the present yuletide season on exhibition in the Children's Room are three doll houses, one each belonging to Mrs. Goss and Mrs. Lepore. The third house is the property of Mr. Ralph Kelly of the Community House. They are a great attraction and many citizens have made special trips to the library to see these exhibits. We hope you will not miss the opportunity to see these exhibits. Also, on exhibition in the Adult area are lovely crocheted Revolutionary Dolls loaned by Mrs. Blanche B. Johnson, a local resident. Continuing our Bicentennial recognition is a New Jersey Declaration on which West Orange residents are encouraged to sign. Holiday safety is the theme of the bulletin board display presented by the local Health and Consumer Protection Department. In two display cases are a selection of old mail order catalogs.

Linda Hirschmann has terminated her employment with us. The reason given for the resignation is inability to keep up with school assignments. She has been replaced by Mary Jean McGraw who began work on December 10, 1975 at an hourly rate of \$2.10.

Nancy Rubinstein, a recent library school graduate, has resigned to accept a full-time professional position. Since we are already using the services of our present staff to the maximum, it is necessary that we hire another junior library clerk.
