DIRECTOR'S

MONTHLY REPORT

January 28, 1976

We started the New Year as busy as ever. Special programs and events have been well attended during the month. Our Tuesday night hours started on January 6th. The 3½ additional hours gives us a total of 61 hours of opening time per week

In an effort to keep our vacation time balanced later in the year, we have asked employees to use up all left over 1975 annual leave time during this month. By so doing we can minimize the extended vacation days when the summer comes. This arrangement is working smoothly.

A general staff meeting was held on Thursday, January 8, 1976. We discussed a number of points which concerned the smooth operation of the library and a closer working relationship between staff and Director. Through the open discussion we believe that the lines of communication are open and is conducive to an all around harmonious understanding, a relaxed atmosphere which creates a more desirable working relationship.

On display in the Adult area are beautiful pieces of woodwork in celebration of the Bicentennial. These art works were made by students in the Shop classes of Mr. Emmons of the West Orange High School.

The Art Department of the schools of West Orange will have on display in the library art done by students on all grade levels. Beginning February 10 art from the elementary schools will be exhibited. The junior high schools will follow and then the high schools.

Formica on the Adult desk and on the shelves in the Young Adult Department are all peeling. We need to engage the services of a person knowledgeable in this type of work to mend them before they are too far gone for repair.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

MEETING OF JANUARY 28, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by William Sagosz, President. Present were Board members Eileen Flanagan, Andrea Grover, Albert Kupferer, Phyllis Lopis, Nancy Herman and Anita Strauss. Also present were Lola N. Reed, Director, Stewart Manheim, Board Accountant, Irving Ostrow, Board Attorney, and several citizens of West Orange.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976, in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of the meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "Star-Ledger, the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle", the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk and that copies of all notices sent shall be recorded in the minutes of this meeting.

MINUTES:

Correction in the Minutes of the December 22, 1975 meeting: Page 2, paragraph 4--typographic error in the word religious. Mrs. Strauss made a motion to accept the minutes of the December 22, 1975 Board of Trustees meeting as corrected Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

The nominating committee presented the following slate of officers for 1976:

President - Anita Strauss
Vice President - William Sagosz
Treasurer - Nancy Herman
Secretary - Phyllis Lopis

No other nominations were offered. Mr. Kupferer made a motion that the Secretary cast one ballot for the slate of nominees as presented. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

Mrs. Strauss thanked Mr. Sagosz and Mr. Kupferer for their dedication and efforts made on behalf of the library during the past year. A meeting will be held with the Director, staff, and Board members to discuss how the library can best serve the community without overexpenditures in the budget, considering the cut in state aid.

Mrs. Strauss requested the following Board members to serve on committees for 1976:

Building and Grounds - Mr. Sagosz, Mr. Kupferer Finance - Mrs. Lopis, Mrs. Herman Personnel - Miss Flanagan, Mrs. Grover

TREASURER'S REPORT:

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1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mr. Manheim explained that the bills for December are extensive due to an influx of book orders. Also, included are the Petty Cash accounts for October, November, and December.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

2) Financial Statement:

Mr. Manheim discussed the final report summerizing the year's accounts. This report, known as exhibits A, B, C, and D stated in detail: A) The final budget modifications for 1975; B) Statement of fund balances as of 12/31/75; C) A comparative balance sheet for 12/31/75 and 12/31/74; D) A Statement of Accumulated Revenues for the year ended 12/31/75. The mayor was sent a copy of the end of the year expenditure report.

Mrs. Herman suggested that a coverning letter be sent to the Town explaining why the Salary Contingency Fund will be used.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mr. Sagosz seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed informed the Board that the staff has been using annual leave hours left over from 1975.

A survey of hours most frequently used by library patrons is being taken in hopes of accumulating information in regard to staff hours and salaries needed.

Mrs. Reed will get exact specifications for the reference area shelving from Bro-dart, American Commercial Equipment Company, and the W. B. Wood Company.

The library no longer needs a separate building to store flammable equipment. The town rents storage space in a Main Street garage and Mr. Refinski has taken the equipment there to be stored. In addition, shelves have been ordered to house the paper materials in the garage.

Mr. Sagosz will contact Mr. Leo Handel in regard to the removal of the outdated Civil Defense supplies stored in the garage.

Mr. Sagosz and Mr. Kupferer will investigate boiler problems. Mr. Sagosz will summarize the letters received from Deputy Chief Cohrs and will forward this information to the fire detection equipment companies suggested by the Fire Department.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mrs. Lopis presented an amendment to page 9 of the Staff Manual in regard to the use of annual leave and/or personal days for religious holidays (see December 22, 1975 minutes). This amendment will be added to the Staff Manual.

The personnel committee will meet with the staff to obtain their views on sick leave payment at time of retirement. This issue will be taken up at the next meeting after the personnel committee reports their findings.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mrs. Herman made a motion that the Board of Trustees: 1) Change the designation of all savings accounts to read: West Orange Free Public Library.

2) Combine West Orange Savings and Loan account #3848 and #10085 into one account. The motion was seconded by Mr. Sagosz and it was carried unanimously.

A motion was made by Mr. Kupferer that the Board of Trustees approve the transfer of \$25,000 from the Statement Savings account #073-0000177-0, Midlantic Bank to the checking account. This motion was seconded by Mrs. Lopis and passed unanimously.

Following Mr. Manheim's recommendation, Mr. Sagosz motioned that:

COMMUNICATIONS:

1) Jonas Case:

Mr. Ostrow explained that a petition for certification, which is a request to the supreme court to review the judgment of the apellate division, had been filed by Mr. Solomon on January 10,1976. He indicated that he will rely on the appellate brief in presenting the library's case as there are no new points to consider. It should take approximately eight weeks for the Supreme Court to review these briefs.

2) Jonas Letter:

Mr. Ostrow read a second letter from Mr. Jonas in which he asks for reimbursement of goods and claims. Mrs. Strauss asked Mr. Ostrow to draw up a letter in reply denying any such claims and indicating that as yet, no decision has been reached on "sick leave".

3) Buoye Letter:

Mr. Ostrow reviewed the letter sent by the parents of Cathleen Buoye, who was injured at the library picnic. He stated that a mere happening of an accident does not create a case of negligence. Mrs. Strauss recommended that a letter be sent to Mr. and Mrs. Buoye stating that all information will be sent to our insurance agency for their determination.

After opening up the meeting to public participation, the meeting was adjourned at 10:00 P. M.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

FEBRUARY 25, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by Anita Strauss, President. Present were Board of Trustee members Eileen Flanagan, Albert Kupferer, Phyllis Lopis and Andrea Grover constituting a quorum. Also present were Lola N. Reed, Director, Stewart Manheim, Board Accountant, Irving Ostrow, Board Attorney, and a few citizens of West Orange.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Miss Flanagan made a motion to accept the minutes of the January 28, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting. Mrs. Grover seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to pay voucher #1112 to Superior Engineering in the amount of \$261. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Miss Flanagan seconded, and it was carried unanimously.

2) Financial Statement:

Mr. Manheim informed the Board that if the Town budget is passed, the library will be \$62,144 short of funds. He suggested that the Board modify the budget when the Town budget is passed.

Mrs. Grover made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed reported that the front door of the library had been accidently broken by two boys. Library insurance only covers the contents of the building, therefore, Mrs. Strauss requested Mrs. Reed to contact the Fowler Insurance Agency to obtain an estimate for premiums on plate glass insurance for 1 and 3 years.

Mrs. Reed stated that the Statistical Report, upon which state aid to libraries is based, was sent to Trenton on February 12, 1976.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mr. Kupferer representing the Building and Grounds Committee reported on his meeting with Mr. Shultz of Honeywell. He indicated that it would be necessary for an engineer from Honeywell to go through each part of the mechanism for corrections, replacements and deletions within the boiler system.

Mirs. Grover presented a report of the Personnel Committee and their meeting with the Employees' Association officers concerning accumulated Sick Leave at retirement. The staff requested that sick leave be paid upon retirement and indicated that there will be no retirements in the near future. They favor the following benefits: 1) a half day's pay for each day of sick leave accumulated at time of retirement. 2) additional benefits for part-timers who work in some instances up to 25-28 hours per week. These benefits would include a) a personal day or mourning day (or both) for a death in the immediate family. b) to have more equitable annual leave time in line with the professionals. c) when the library is closed due to weather conditions or a holiday, a part-time worker who is scheduled to work that day, would like to be paid for it.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the Sick Leave Committee Report be tabled. Miss Flanagan seconded, and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to table the reference area equipment issue until the next meeting. Miss Flanagan seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Reed received a list of eight companies to contact for fire detection equipment. All companies will be contacted for estimates. Each will be given exact specifications recommended in Deputy Chief Cohrs' letter of January 8, 1976.

Mr. Handel requested that the Board of Trustees hold the Civil Defense equipment stored in the garage for a longer length of time as he is investigating places to move the supplies.

NEW BUSINESS:

The survey of library hours will be continued for four more weeks.

Mr. Bullman, director of East Orange Free Public Library asked that letters be written to representatives and assemblymen in regard to the cut in state aid. Mrs. Strauss suggested that a notice be posted requesting patrons to write letters.

COMMUNNITY PARTICIPATION:

A member of the staff indicated that the employees would welcome a study of the Staff Manual in regard to different points which lack clarity.

After a short recess, the Board heard a report from Mr. Shultz, Honeywell representative. He stated that the net result of his investigation of the boiler system indicates that the system needs a check-out by a Honeywell technican. A technican can be hired on the basis of \$25.00 per hour plus traveling expenses and equipment charges. After this is done, an organized preventive maintenance system is needed. This can be obtained through a) a contract for the temperature control system only at a cost of approximately \$408 per year providing all equipment is in order. b) a total mechanical maintenance for a total of \$8,000 per year.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:05 P. M.

MONTHLY REPORT

February 25, 1976

There is never a dull moment at the West Orange Free Public Library! Things which happened today, Friday, February 20th, should have taken place on Friday the 13th. A disgruntled patron called to complain about not being able to get the cookbook she wanted through "Interlibrary Loan". It took all of one half hour of listening before she finally finished by stating her daughter has given her the book as a St. Valentine's gift.

After a two-hour meeting of Department Heads our order of vouchers arrived from the printers loose in two huge boxes. A quick call to the printer caused him to retrieve the boxes to have the vouchers packaged as they should have been before delivery. Having solved the immediate problems we decided to get involved with other duties. Then an urgent call came downstairs saying "you must come upstairs at once." Upon reaching the scene we found two young boys had been "horsing" around and managed to break the double plate glass door at the Mt. Pleasant Avenue entrance. No one was hurt. The culprits were caught and brought to me for their punishment. After getting their names and addresses and an explanation of what really happened effort was made to contact parents of the youngsters, Robert Maurizi and Jeff Gunning-to no avail:

Since Robert has no telephone, he accompanied me to his home. A conversation was held with his mother who promised to relate the message to the father so he could pay half of the cost of replacement. The Gunnings were not at home but a neighbor called to get the details because Jeff was quite shaken. A hurried call to our insurance agent revealed that we do not have coverage for damage to the building, only its contents. Mrs. Gunning called and agreed to share half of the cost.

Publicity about the doll houses that were on exhbit in the library during the Christmas holidays has caused an upsurge in requests about them and for literature on miniature houses, furniture, etc.

The Statistical Report which was due in Trenton by February 15th was sent by Certified mail on Thursday, the 12th and received on the 13th. Also, one copy was sent to East Orange, our area library.

We have been in touch with a postal employee who believes we can obtain two discarded mail boxes (for free) which can be used as book drops. As soon as the postmaster signs the release, we can pick them up.

A box labeled "For Trustees Only" has been placed behind the Circulation desk with pieces of mail addressed to each Trustee. If you will inquire about mail each time you visit the library we could save on postage. However, if mail is not picked up we have no alternative but to send it through the mail.

On Friday, February 20, Mr. William Jervey, past president of the now defunct Friends of the Library, gave us a check in the amount of \$1,155.38 to cover the cost of the new library bags. He also stated that the "Friends" has a balance of \$334.81 which they would like to contribute toward the purchase of a new projector. The cost of a 16mm Kodak projector is \$685.00. Since Mr. Donnelly has expressed a need for an additional projector, we feel that the library should pay the difference of \$360.19.

Beginning Thursday, February 26th I would like to take a long overdue two-weeks' vacation. Arrangements have been made with Mrs. Czarnecki to be in charge while I am away. Miss Cushing will assist, if needed. Mrs. Goss is very capable of handling routine office procedures. If any problems arise during this period, they have been instructed to contact Board President Anita Strauss. If unable to reach Mrs. Strauss other Trustees should be notifed of the problem.

We have just completed a survey of persons entering the library at certain hours of library opening. The survey lasted for four weeks, excluding the holiday we were closed. The study was made between the hours of 9:00 A.M. to 10:00 A.M.; 10:00 A.M. to 12:00 Noon and 5:00 P.M. to closing. (see attached survey.)

My staff and I have been able to iron out some of our differences, and have, what I believe, an amicable working relationship and a good relaxed atmosphere. It is my desire to have the same kind of rapport with Trustees. If, at any time, you feel the need to discuss any matter with me, I am available. Or, if there is any information in my possession in which you are interested, please feel free to request this of me. Full cooperation on all matters has always been accorded you (Board of Trustees) and I hope the same courtesy will be extended to me as Library Director. Please feel free to offer criticism, where they are warranted, as well as suggestions. This is very instrumental to the continuous growth and successful operation of our library.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

MARCH 24, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 P. M. by President Anita Strauss. Board of Trustees members present were: Andrea Grover, Eileen Flanagan, Phyllis Lopis and Albert Kupferer constituting a quorum. Also present were Director Lola N. Reed, Board Attorney, Irving Ostrow, and Board Accountant, Stewart Manheim. Several residents of West Orange were present.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Minutes of the February 25, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting. Mrs. Grover seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mr. Manheim stated that vouchers #1115 and 1116 to the Cheese Shop and Postmaster, respectively, were paid on earlier dates than the bills presented at the meeting.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Miss Flanagan seconded, and it was carried unanimously.

2) Financial Statement:

A letter will be sent to the Town Council informing them that the Salary Contingency Fund has been placed in the Accumulated Reserves Fund.

Mrs. Grover made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed has informed the Board of Trustees that the Department of Civil Service has approved the permanent appointment of two part-time professionals, Dawn Coffman and Elsa Meyers, and one full-time professional, Mark Donnelly.

Mrs. Reed reported that there has been a cut in hours of part-time employees who work over 25 hours per week. The Children's Room will have one employee only working in the evenings.

Mrs. Lopis reviewed each line of the 1976 Amended budget which results in a depletion of all library reserves with the exception of \$5,356.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion that the proposed amended budget be approved as of the Board of Trustees meeting of March 24, 1976. It was seconded by Mrs. Grover and passed unanimously.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to transfer \$96,851 from Accumulated Reserve Fund to cover the current 1976 budget. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Board of Trustees acted upon the following benefits for employees:

- 1) Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the part-time employees be given one day of mourning for a death in the immediate family (father, mother, spouse, child, sister, brother, or other relative residing in the employee's household) based on hours worked on that day.
- 2) It was the opinion of the Board of Trustees that part-time workers should not be paid for holidays when the library is closed.
- 3) The Board of Trustees minutes of March 24, 1975 grants payment to part-time workers scheduled to work on a day that the library is closed due to weather conditions.
- 4) Mrs. Lopis made a motion that Sick Leave at Time of Retirement be tabled. It was seconded by Miss Flanagan, and passed unanimously.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to table the Reference Area Shelving issue until the next meeting. Miss Flanagan seconded, and it was carried unanimously.

The specifications submitted by Mr. Sagosz will be sent to Deputy Chief Cohrs for his approval before they are submitted to several Fire Detection Equipment companies.

Mrs. Strauss reported that Mr. Lehman will send a representative to inspect the boiler room.

Mrs. Strauss reported on the New Jersey Library Trustees Seminar held in North Brunswick on March 13 which she attended. The round table discussions dealt with Management Procedures and Effective Library Services. Some of the topics covered were: Directors and Officers Liability Insurance, a survey of technical services, services for shut-ins, two shelf lists in case of damage, and the possibility of having a single state library card for N. J. residents which would be used at the library.

NEW BUSINESS:

The Town of West Orange will send someone to evaluate the condition of the roof in hopes of repairing the leak that leads into the main reading room of the library.

Mrs. Strauss made a motion to transfer \$35,000 from Carteret Savings and Loan Account #3-2-5589 to the checking account at Midlantic Bank to meet operating expenses. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mr. Ostrow informed Mrs. Reed and the Board of Trustees that the Supreme Court denied Certification to Mr. Jonas. Mr. Ostrow pointed out that Mr. Jonas has applied for relief from court costs based on his claim of indigency.

The court unanimously reversed the judgement in the case of the Town of West Orange versus Groves which favored the library with an award for flood damages. Mr. Malkin, Town Attorney, does not recommend an appeal. Mr. Ostrow agrees with his recommendation. No money will be forthcoming.

Mrs. Lopis read a letter sent by Mrs. Reed to Mr. Michniewski, Head of the Library Development Bureau, informing him of the library's Tuesday evening hours. This is in reply to a letter asking for proof of hours for State Aid.

The Board of Trustees has decided that the insurance premiums for the plate glass windows and doors is not warranted at this time because of the expense.

Mrs. Lopis read a note from Mr. Sagosz thanking the Board for their thoughts and gift to his son Timothy.

Mrs. Zeitlin sent a thank you note to the Board in regard to the gift she received in appreciation of the years she spent as a Board of Trustee member.

Mrs. Strauss referred to a communication from the employees (see WOPLEA minutes of meeting--March 8, 1976, pages 4-5) requesting a change in the policy of handling copy machine monies. After discussion by the board, Mrs. Reed requested that the board set a policy regarding this matter. Mrs. Strauss made a motion that the money from the copy machine be collected on a daily basis; the number of copies be recorded daily; and the money to be counted by two people as it is taken from the box. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

The Board of Trustees dinner will be held at Libretti's Restaurant at 5:00 P. M. before the next Board of Trustees meeting on April 28, 1976.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Mark Donnelly, President of the Employees' Association asked the Board of Trustees to consider the equity of vacation time alloted to professional and non-professional full-time employees.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:50 P. M.

MONTHLY REPORT

March 24, 1976

During my absence the first two weeks of this month Mrs. Czarnecki supervised the operations in the library. She reported everything went smoothly. She did a very splendid job.

Some of us went to Florida to "thaw" out and somehow contacted the "flu" bug and generously spread it around the library upon our return which resulted in several employees being out sick for a few days. We are gradually coming out of it and returning to our respective duties. Only some of my duties are being performed in the Jury Control Room 410 at the Essex County Court House in Newark because I have been called to Jury Duty for two weeks beginning March 15, 1976.

Regretfully, it must be reported that the Mobilibrary was inoperative beginning February 26th through March 15th. It returned to its schedule on Tuesday, March 16th.

The art exhibit from the elementary schools of West Orange has been replaced by art from the junior high schools. Senior high art will replace the current exhibit in two weeks. These exhibits continue to attract many non users as well as users of the library.

After many months of "hassle" with the Department of Civil Service about the permanent appointments of two part-time professionals and one full-time professional, I am proud to advise that Messrs. Dawn Coffman and

Elsa Meyers and Mark Donnelly have finally been approved. All three are now permanent employees.

Like all other libraries and most businesses, we are the victims of a drastic budget cut and are compelled to function within the means provided, and still remain open an extra evening each week for the sake of state aid.

We are now in the process of cutting hours through attritions and re-scheduling. By the end of May, it is anticipated that four or five of our part-time employees will be leaving our employ for various reasons. There are no plans for immediate replacements.

Scheduled programs will continue as long as we are able to fiance them. However, if appeals made to the Legislature by libraries are not adhered to, there is a strong possibility of a reduction of library hours, services and programs.

Since my jury duty will not end until Friday, March 26th, Mrs.

Czarnecki will represent me at the Essex County Directors meeting at Newark

Public Library on Tuesday, March 23rd.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

APRIL 28, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by President, Anita Strauss. Present were Board of Trustees members Andrea Grover, Eileen Flanagan, Albert Kupferer, Phyllis Lopis, Nancy Herman and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Director Lola N. Reed, Board Attorney, Irving Ostrow, and Board Accountant, Stewart Manheim. Several residents of West Orange were also present.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to accept the Minutes of the March 24, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting as presented. Mrs. Grover seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Mrs. Herman seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

2) Financial Statement:

Mr. Manheim pointed out that for the three months ending March 31, 1976 there has been \$8,412.24 deposited in the Fines and Reserves Fund.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed reported to the Board of Trustees that the library has not been receiving proof of the monthly visits made by Superior Engineering Company. Mr. Ostrow will send a letter to Mr. Rappaport asking that proof be submitted after each monthly visit as the contract has indicated.

Mrs. Reed reported that three Jr. Library Assistants and two Jr. Library Clerks will be leaving before summer. She would like to hire four Jr. Library Clerks to replace these five people and to cover the areas needed as the staff takes vacations. Mr. Manheim stated that there is provision in the budget for the hiring of summer help.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz reported that the fire department has approved the specifications for the fire detection equipment. Letters have been sent to the eight companies listed in the letter submitted by Deputy Chief Cohrs. Four out of the eight companies have responded.

Mr. Ostrow has reviewed the existing statutes in regard to regulating purchases by libraries. They are 40:54-12.1 entitled Free Public Libraries-Purchases Without Advertising, and Free County Libraries 40:33-8.1. He is of the opinion that the cited statutes appear to control our purchasing procedures. Mrs. Reed will check with the State Library to find out the proper procedures. Mr. Sagosz will compose a letter to be sent to the newspaper advertising bids for the fire detection equipment.

The Board of Trustees reviewed the staff request for sick leave at time of retirement, and after discussion, Mrs. Grover made a motion that the Board of Trustees not remunerate employees for accumulated sick leave at time of retirement. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion, and it was passed with four votes cast against remuneration and three in favor.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mrs. Reed reported that Mrs. Joan Bojsza, a new "Friend of the Library" has worked diligently in assisting Mrs. Czarnecki in preparation with the book sale to be held May 15.

Responding to Mrs. Reed's request, Mr. Kupferer made a motion to approve the book sale on May 15, 1976-rain date, May 22, 1976. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mrs. Lopis read a letter received from George A. Freeman of Vogelbach and Baumann in regard to their survey taken of the automatic temperature control system. After reviewing their recommendations, the Board of Trustees decided that more investigation is necessary.

Mrs. Lopis read two letters, addressed to Mr. Sagosz, from Mrs. Cora Zalme, West Orange resident, and Richard Buoye, member of the local PBA in which they condemn the contents of <u>Inner City Mother Goose</u>, by Eve Merriam and request that it be removed from library shelves because of its access to children. A letter from Eileen Lurie was also read in which Mrs. Lurie praised the book and was in favor of it being kept on the shelves.

Mr. Sagosz replied that he sympathizes with the feelings expressed in the letters. However, this book depicts certain situations that exist in life and that removing the book from the shelves will not remove the existing situations. Mrs. Herman added that there are books written about people from all walks of life and occupations that could be found derogatory. She noted that the book has never been placed in the Children's Room as the letters have indicated.

Mrs. Strauss commended Mrs. Reed on the position she has taken in defense of the book. She noted that the book had been purchased several years ago.

Mr. Kupferer said that in reading the book, he felt that it should definitely be kept out of the Children's Room, but he is in favor of keeping it in the adult section of the library. Mrs. Grover stated that it is a good piece of literature and has had good reviews.

Miss Flanagan said that the book deals with life in the ghetto and tells it like it really is. People have the right and freedom to read whatever they wish. Mrs. Lopis commented that the books were put in the adult section and that the parents must accept the responsibility for the child checking out the book with an adult card.

Mr. Sagosz moved that the Board of Trustees affirm its policy of non-censorship, specifically applying this policy to the book titled <u>Inner City Mother Goose</u> by Eve Merriam. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

Mrs. Strauss suggested that the secretary reply to the letters sent to Mr. Sagosz particularly responding to the fact that the book has never been placed in the Children's Room.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Mr. Ostrow commended the Board for their stand on non-censorship. As a West Orange resident he wanted to express his appreciation. Mrs. Coffman, Children's librarian, added that on the application cards, parents can give their children permission to take books out of the adult section and that they assume the responsibility for this action.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 P. M. The next Board of Trustees meeting will be held on Wednesday, May 26, 1976.

DIRECTOR'S

MONTHLY REPORT

April 28, 1976

The busiest month of the year sofar for the library is April. Maybe because Spring is in the air everybody is itching to show what he/she can do.

Another attempt has been made to revive interest in the "Friends" organization. A meeting was held on April 13, but only one person came and the possibility of the "Friends" sponsoring a book sale during the month of May was discussed. With your permission, we would like to have a book sale on May 15, 1976 and another during the month of September. No September date has yet been set.

With the presence of the many displays in the library we minimized our library exhibits for National Library Week. However, our observation of the occasion was extended to almost a full-page advertisement in the "Chronicle" on April 8. Also, we purchased a publication by the New Jersey Library Association called the Library Almanack which were distributed to patrons during National Library Week. Our Public Relations person, Mark Donnelly worked closely with a staff member of the West Orange Chronicle in soliciting patrons for our National Library Week advertisement. We would like to thank all of our sponsors, including our CPA Stewart Manheim and our Attorney Irving Ostrow, for making the publicity possible.

A Calendar of Events in recognition of famous people, events, holidays and happenings at the library is being made and exhibited monthly. Our calendar for this month includes two puppet shows by Ralph Kelly from the Community House on Saturday, March 27th which were very well attended; a photographic display by Mr. James Waxman, President of the Vailsburg Camera Club, for which he had quite a write up in the Newark Sunday News; a miniensemble folk pageant called "A Junior Bi-Centennial" was presented by the New Dimensions Learning Center.

Donated to the library during the month were the following: a check in the amount of \$122.00 by the West Orange Junior Womans' Club, three copies of Uncle Sam-The Man-The Legend by Alton Ketchum from the Board of Realtors of the Oranges and Maplewood; the book of poetry called The Theomachia donated by the author, William Charles Beller, a book Pioneering the Union Pacific by Charles E. Ames, and two discarded postal mailboxes by the Livingston Postmaster. These are being readied to serve as additional bookdrops.

Among meetings attended by staff personnel were the following:

- 1) Circulation Section Spring Workshop at Livingston Public Library by Messrs. Ericsson, Lepore, Longo and Springsteel.
- 2) A workshop on Young Adults and Senior Citizens in Bordentown--Mark Donnelly.
- A Civil Service Workshop at Cranford Public Library--Messrs.
 Czarnecki and Reed

Services rendered by Superior Engineering Company are very poor and inadequate. We have no proof of monthly service from the time the company was engaged. They are never prompt as promised by Mr. Rappaport, Sr. Instead, we are often given excuses as to why our problem has to be put off.

As an economic measure, we have instituted a policy of making purchases for supplies on a quarterly basis. We find that by combining as many small orders as possible our discount is greater and shipping charges are at a minimum.

Pre-school story sessions ended on Thursday, April 15. After a few weeks, the Children's Room staff will be getting set for their Summer Reading Program.

Two new exhibits are up in the library. One is in honor of a local resident, Mrs. Rita Edelman, who has authored a new cook book called You Don't Have to Be Chinese to Cook Great Chinese Food. The second exhibit, which is only partially complete, are photographs by Worrall Publications.

Several of our student workers will be leaving during the month of May. Their departure will leave us very short-handed. Since we do have money in the salary line for summer help, I would like the Board's permission to hire at least four Junior Library Clerks. These persons would replace two clerks and two Junior Library Assistants. Also, the help is needed to fill-in for regular workers who will be on vacation.

The chairs for the Children's Room have arrived. They are lovely sturdy chairs and we are pleased with most of them. Four chairs are being returned in exchange for four larger ones to fit the large table in that area.

Some of the tables were too tall to accommodate the chairs. Mr. Sagosz was kind enough to come in during his spare time and cut down the legs of some of the table in order to adjust them to the size of the chairs. They fit perfectly and children adore them.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

MAY 26, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by President, Anita Strauss. Present were Board of Trustees members Andrea Grover, Albert Kupferer, Nancy Herman and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Director, Lola N. Reed, Board Attorney, Irving Ostrow, and Board Accountant Stewart Manheim. Several residents of West Orange were also present..

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Minutes of the April 28, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting as presented. Mr. Sagosz seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mrs. Strauss will inquire about the payment for roof repairs, voucher #1324 to S. J. Carney, roofing contractor.

Mr. Manheim informed the Board of Trustees that check #1306 is a transfer of \$50,000 from the checking account to the statement savings account in Midlantic Bank so that interest will accrue.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

2) Financial Statement:

Mr. Manheim noted that salaries and wages are in line as of this date.

Mrs. Reed stated that more than half of the Supply line has been spent. Mrs. Herman inquired about bulk buying and suggested that Mr. Flynn be called at Town Hall in regard to the cost of paper. Mrs. Reed added that at the Essex County Library Directors' Group meeting held on April 25, bulk buying of books was discussed. There are 21 libraries involved in this, and they are going to investigate the possibility of bulk buying.

Mr. Sagosz questioned the cost of management and professional services. Mr. Manheim explained that the fee includes retroactive payment and at no time will the fees be more than the budget.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed received a letter from Sara L. Siebert, Coordinator of the Young Adult Services at the Enoch Pratt Free Library in Baltimore, in which she enclosed information pertaining to The Inner City Mother Goose. Mrs. Reed also informed the Board that she has thanked Mr. Vogt and the New Jersey Library Association for their vote of confidence in this matter.

As the result of the break-in which occurred early on May 18, the Toshiba Fax photocopy machine was badly damaged and the entire coin collecting unit must be replaced. Mrs. Strauss suggested that a copy of the police report be secured for our records.

As a result of local and state budget cuts, the East Orange Free Public Library, our area library, has been forced to eliminate 22 of its employees and to close all branches. There has been a cut of hours, and all summer and fall programs have been discontinued.

Mrs. Chirico, of the State Library, will send Mrs. Reed information on the new bills determining procedures for bidding. We have up to 90 days to make purchases without obtaining three bids. This supplement to the "Local Public Contracts law", Senate #1377 was approved as of May 11, 1976.

Mrs. Reed informed the Board that the book sale earnings amounted to \$442.78.

OLD BUSINESS:

a) Fire Detection:

Mr. Sagosz reviewed the bids received for installation of fire detection equipment. There is a big difference from company to company depending upon the number of heat and smoke detectors specified by each company. Costs range from a low of \$2,435 to \$9,907 with various options. Mr. Sagosz will contact Deputy Chief Cohrs for his approval. The library will select the lowest responsible bid, and a decision will be made at the next Board meeting.

b) Heating System:

Mr. Sagosz reported on his talk with Mr. Freeman of Vogelbach and Baumann. Mr. Freeman pointed out that the library could update its system in steps as specified in his letter of April 26, 1976. Mr. Sagosz has a list of three companies recommended by Mr. Freeman, who could do the job. However, we need to advertise for bids. If action is taken on the first step as presented in the letter, it should normalize the problem.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Manheim suggested that the library obtain a copy of the police report and submit this with the reports on the income of the Toshiba Fax so that there will be an accounting of the missing monies.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion that all of the locks on the doors leading into the library be changed immediately. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously. This action was based on the fact that a key was reported missing from the Adult Circulation desk.

The Board suggested that Mrs. Reed give a portion of the books left over from the book sale away to Brandeis University or a similiar institution.

Mr. Ostrow reported that Mrs. Joan Bojsza has been active in helping in setting up the book sale and in getting in contact with members. Mrs. Meyers is working on a letter to get more Friends interested in the activities. There are meetings scheduled for the future.

Mark Donnelly and Elsa Meyers have been working on the possibility of having a square dance. Seventy-five dollars is needed for a caller. Mr. Donnelly has contacted Mr. Charlie Beck, a square dance caller, and the Recreation Department in hopes that a caller can be obtained for the dance. Possible dates would be July 16 or July 23. A small fee of \$1.00 would be asked. Factors such as lighting, safety conditions, ground surfaces must be investigated before a final decision is made.

Mr. Sagosz suggested that the Board consider the possibility of installing a burglar alarm system on the outside of the building. This issue will be tabled at the present time.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mrs. Strauss read a copy of the letter sent to Council President Rosen In regard to the Salary Contingency Fund dated May 18, 1976. Also a letter was read from Mr. Corwick, dated May 20, 1976 in which he informed the Board of Trustees that a storage shed will be built to house the grounds keeping equipment. Work will begin shortly in the back corner of the lower rear parking lot eliminating two employee parking stalls.

ADJOURNMENT:

The meeting was adjourned at 9:35 P. M. The next meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 23 at 7:30 P. M.

MONTHLY REPORT

May 26, 1976

The month of May has been a super active one in more ways than the routine activities. Interests in The Inner City Mother Goose soared to tremendous heights. The matter was discussed at the New Jersey Library Association where a resolution, in support of the West Orange Board of Trustees and Director was read by the President, Howard Vogt, voted on and passed unanimously by the Association at its Business Meeting on Saturday, May 8th. Messrs. Czarnecki and Reed attended the Association.

Our library was the victim of a break-in on Monday night, May 17th.

We are not able to determine the extent of damage done monetarily until
a price is given us by the Toshibafax repairman. Both photocopying machines
were damaged and approximately \$26.00 taken from them. The Toshibafax
was badly damaged and a new unit will have to replace the old one. The
safe was tampered with but the prowlers were unable to open it. Nothing
is missing from the safe. A window as broken in the Children's Room which
could have been the way the building was entered.

Frank Refinski found the door to the employee entrance open when he came to work. He called the police, who came over and inspected the damage. Later, the Detective Bureau was called by me and two detectives came over and made prints. No further word has been heard from them at this writing.

Although our "Book Sale" was not a big success as the one last year, we feel the amount of \$343.78 was worth all the work and efforts of everyone

who assisted. We even had volunteers who worked very diligently.

We have received from the Public Schools of West Orange a "Certification of Participation" for our contribution to the Cooperative Education Program during the current school year.

Your library director is presently enrolled in a refresher series of seminars in Administration which meets for four consecutive Wednesdays at the Graduate School of Library Service at Rutgers University in New Brunswick.

According to a report from the East Orange Public Library, the staff has been reduced by 22 employees because of a 27% cut by the State and an 18% cut by their Council. Many services have been curtailed or cut off completely. All of their branches were closed on May 10th. Also, hours of opening have been reduced.

We have received six bids from companies for the installation of the fire detection equipment.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

JUNE 23, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by President, Anita Strauss. Present were Board of Trustees members Andrea Grover, Nancy Herman, Phyllis Lopis, Eileen Flanagan and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Director, Lola N. Reed, Board Attorney, Irving Ostrow, Board Accountant Stewart Manheim, and several residents of West Orange.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mrs. Grover made a motion to accept the Minutes of the May 26, 1976 meeting with the following correction: Page 3, paragraph 6, under heading of New Business to read: 'Mr. Sagosz suggested that the Board consider the possibility of installing a burglar alarm system. This issue will be tabled at the present time.' The motion was seconded by Mrs. Herman and passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mr. Manheim explained that voucher #1496 to Worrall Publications in the amount of \$270.00 will be credited to the checking account in next month's report as payment from the various subscribers have been deposited.

Mr. Manheim stated that it is difficult to estimate the amount needed for the Public Employees Retirement System until the bill is received from Trenton. The increase in this line item is for employees who have left the library and are now collecting pensions. This reflects a cost of living increase.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Miss Flanagan seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

2) Financial Statement:

Mrs. Herman made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mr. Sagosz seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

The following employees will be leaving the library at the end of June: Alice Anderson, Betty Betz, Shelly Bromberg, Betty Carras, Mary McGraw, and Elizabeth Portuese. Mrs. Reed has hired the following Jr. Library Clerks: Aileen Bordman, Thomas Prior, and Terry Rucker. Maria Pavlou will be transferred from Tory Corner.

The library will be closed Monday, July 5, 1976. Summer hours will begin on July 3, when Saturday hours will be 9:00 A. M. to 1:00 P. M.

The Board of Trustees has requested Mrs. Reed to collect all keys from the employees. One door will be kept open until 9:00 A. M. for the staff to gain admission to the building.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mrs. Reed reported that she has been in contact with Deputy Chief Cohrs of the Fire Department regarding the bids on the fire detection system. She has received a letter indicating which companies have submitted the most responsible bids for the fire detection system. Mr. Sagosz will contact the J. W. Signal Company about their maintenance fee. Approval of a contract will be tabled until the next meeting.

Chief Cohrs also indicated that the Fire Department Alarm System is being replaced with a telephone system. Connection to this new system should wait until it is completely installed. The portion of each bid designated for this purpose should be kept in escrow until the connections can be made.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Ostrow reported that he has sent a letter to Superior Engineering Company asking them to report to Mrs. Reed whenever a monthly service call is made.

Mr. Sagosz will prepare a preliminary specification for the heating and air conditioning unit so that a request for bids may be advertised for the servicing of this system.

Mr. Ostrow, as acting president of the Friends of the Library will open a bank account so that checks received in their name may be deposited.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to close out Account #3-25589, Carteret Savings and Loan Association in the amount of \$6,293.68 plus interest to be deposited into the checking account; and to transfer from the Statement Savings Account #02-073-0000177-0 at Midlantic Bank the amount of \$30,000 to the checking account for operating expenses. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Herman, and was carried unanimously.

The square dance will be held on Friday 23 at 8:00 P. M. to 10:00 P.M. (rain date is Saturday, July 24) at Lafayette Park. Admission will be free. Mrs. Reed will check on the rest room facilities.

COMMITTEES:

Mrs. Strauss requested that the Personnel Committee review the Staff Manual.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mrs. Rabinowitz presented a report to the board on the reluctance of Mr. Barry Jaffe to pay fines on overdue books because he had been hospitalized. Mr. Ostrow recommended that a letter be sent to Mr. Jaffee stating that although the fines would be waived in this matter, any future violations will require payment. Failing to do so would result in the suspension of borrowing privileges. Mrs. Strauss requested Mrs. Lopis to send the letter from the Board of Trustees.

ADJOURNMENT:

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 P. M. The next meeting will be held on July 28, 1976.

MONTHLY REPORT

June 23, 1976

Compared to the bulk of activities going on in the library last month, we have had a relatively quiet and almost uneventful month of June. Our circulation has dropped noticeably this month which is normal for this time of year. Students are busy with school closing activities and are not checking out as many books as usual. However, we have started our "summer loan" program which will be in effect through September 13. This will boost our circulation somewhat.

We have been selected by New World Records as one of the organizations designated to receive as a gift from the Rockefeller Foundation a 100-record collection of American Music produced by the Recorded Anthology of American Music. The records will be issued over the next three years on the New World Records label in ten-record units. Our only obligation is to include the records in our circulating collection. American music of all idioms and from all periods will be represented.

Our latest art exhibit is the work of the husband of one of our employees, Elizabeth Springsteel. He has a very attractive watercolor arrangement now on display in the adult area.

Vacations are now underway. Very few are scheduled for June. During the months of July and August, however, our staff will be scaled down to the minimum because of vacationing employees. Additional hours will be allocated to non-vacationing personnel during this two-month period to assure adequate coverage at all times.

Afterwards a telephone call was made to the mother who expressed deep regret and offered to make restitution.

Our Summer Reading Program for 1976 will get underway on July 6th.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

JULY 28, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by President Anita Strauss. Present were Board of Trustees members Andrea Grover, Nancy Herman, Phyllis Lopis, Albert Kupferer, Eileen Flanagan and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Director Lola N. Reed, Board Attorney, Irving Ostrow and three residents of West Orange.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES: -

Miss Flanagan made a motion to accept the minutes of the June 23, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting as presented. Mrs. Grover seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Voucher #1527 issued to Charlie Beck will be voided as another check has superseded it.

Mrs. Herman made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Mrs. Lopis seconded it, and it was passed unanimously.

2) Financial Report:

Mrs. Herman made a motion to transfer \$40,000 from the checking account at Midlantic Bank to the Statement Savings Account #02-073-0000177-0. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Financial Report as presented. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Herman and carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed informed the Board that because of the lack of space, only reserve and standing order books will be ordered along with the best sellers and popular subject matter books. She has assured the Board that the library will do the best it can under these present circumstances.

Mrs. Reed urged the Board to consider the acquisition of additional shelves in the Reference Area which are badly needed. Inexpensive metal shelves will be placed in the garage to store second and third copies of titles.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mrs. Grover and Miss Flanagan will consult with Mrs. Reed in regards to clarifying and updating the Staff Manual.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz made a motion that the Board of Trustees accept the J. W. Signal bid of \$4,139 for the installation of a fire detection system modified to include a semi-annual inspection at an annual charge of \$180.00. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Sagosz noted that the fire detection system will be tied into the Police Department's burglar alarm panel.

The Board of Trustees would like Mrs. Reed to contact the J. W. Signal Company to notify them of the acceptance and to obtain a specified date of completion for the installation in writing.

Mr. Ostrow defined the Local Public Contracts Law by stating that any purchase over \$2500 must be advertised for bids. If the purchase is under \$500, it may be given to anyone. If it is over \$500 and under \$2500 three bids must be received.

Mrs. Lopis suggested that Mr. Sagosz be authorized to set up the specifications for the Reference Area Shelving requested by Mrs. Reed so they can be put up for bids.

Mrs. Reed will inform the Superior Engineering Company that their contract will not be renewed and that the Board of Trustees will advertise for bids.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the Board of Trustees advertise for bids for the inspection and maintenance service of the heating, ventilating, and air-conditioning equipment at the West Orange Free Public Library. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS:

The square dance was a success. Over 200 people attended of all ages and the Recreation and Parks Department cooperated fully. A letter will be sent to Fred Maglicone, Supervisor at Layfette Playground thanking him for his assistance. A copy will be sent to Anthony Naporano, Director of Recreation and Parks.

Mrs. Reed suggested that the Board of Trustees consider placing bars or steel mesh over the window which has been broken into a second time. The Board of Education uses mesh over their windows as the window may still be broken with bars. Mrs. Reed will contact the Burglary Squad at the Police Department to ask their advice.

CBS will interview Mrs. Reed on Monday, August 2, 1976 about the Inner City Mother Goose book.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mrs. Lopis read a letter sent to Mrs. Strauss from Councilman Spinelli in which he recommends an establishment of a Project Group to investigate ways in which the Town, the Board of Education and Library can work together to achieve operational efficiencies and economies.

Mr. Sagosz suggested that a letter be sent to Councilman Spina reminding him of the library's needs if a portion of the public works law is obtained by the town. Councilman Spina listed a number of projects in an article in "The Star-Ledger" which he felt worthy of attention, but did not include any future plans for the library. The Board secretary will send this letter to Councilman Spina with copies to the Mayor and Town Council.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:45 P. M.

DIRECTOR'S

MONTHLY REPORT

JULY 28, 1976

A concerted effort is made in each monthly report to keep you informed of matters pertinent to the library and the events taking place in or sponsored outside our library walls. Also, we endeavor to make you aware of the conditions under which we work and some of the everyday experiences encountered.

This report is also meant to be informative and precise on library-related matters and conditions which affect all of us. Special attention is given to our space problem and to the urgency of installing a burglar alarm system as soon as possible.

Space is at a <u>premium</u>. We have had to take drastic steps to ease this situation. Book purchases have been reduced to the bare minimum. Reserve books, best sellers, popular subject matter books and "standing orders" are the only books purchases being made. This trend will probably continue for the remainder of this year or until our space problem is relieved.

The matter of acquiring additional shelves in the Reference Area has seemingly been forgotten. May we have a decision on whether or not we can expect to purchase them in the near future?

It was decided, I believe, that the proposal made by Mr. Zeiher of the W. B. Wood Company was more reasonable and realistic than the other two companies (Commercial Equipment Company and Bro-Dart). I suggest that some money from our book budget be transferred to this line if needed.

Sal Basciotti, town carpenter, is presently working with me to obtain metal free-standing shelves which are inexpensive, to set up in the garage. With this addition some relief can be obtained for second and third copies of titles.

Since the end of the school year I have been working very closely with several students in shifting books and magazines and discarding what we considered outdated or an excessive number of a given title.

Several activities are in progress this summer. Along with scheduled movies which are being shown, there is a "Jeans" contest, a summer reading program two sessions each week and are very well attended, and a special music program for four weeks, conducted by a volunteer, Ms. Toby Menkis. Both individual and group exhibits are being displayed throughout the summer. They are attracting quite a bit of attention.

Credit should be given to our secretary, Sandy Goss, who has produced many timely mini bicentennial figures which have been prominently displayed. She is actually wearing "two hats" one as secretary and the other as library exhibit artist. She has a tremendous amount of work to do but never says "no" when asked to make another sign, type another letter, etc.

We feel an immediate need for some type of burglar alarm system. The second time in two months our library has been burglarized. Entrance was by the same window in the Children's Room which was again broken. Both photocopying machines were ransacked and relieved of whatever money was in them--approximately \$19.35 (Xerox \$10.10 - Toshibafax \$9.25). Our Monroe adding machine was taken along with three sets of earphones, change from Mrs. Rabinowitz's desk and two record players were wrecked. (I was just interrupted by a telephone call from Captain Temple informing me that a senior citizen had found our adding machine near the senior citizens' garden and had turned it over to the Police Department. He further stated I could send over for it--which I did).

I would like to respectfully recommend that the vulnerable window be equipped with upright iron bars as soon as possible until some type of burglar alarm system can be installed. We feel that this vandalism will continue throughout the summer months, or maybe even later. Therefore, some deterrant measure should be instituted before any very serious crime is committed.

You will probably be bombarded with more complaints from borrowers who are unable to obtain certain titles, materials or services. Please rest assured that we are doing as best we can under the present circumstances.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

SEPTEMBER 1, 1976 (August 25, 1976 meeting)

Mr. Wagner, representing McManus Hardware Supply Company spoke to the Board of Trustees before the opening of the meeting. He described the window guards his company would install if the Board elects to protect the south side of the building from window damage. The price for complete manufacture and installation would be \$1,061.00.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by President, Anita Strauss. Present were members Andrea Grover, Nancy Herman, Eileen Flanagan, Albert Kupferer and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Director Lola N. Reed, Board Accountant, Stewart Manheim and several residents of West Orange.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mrs. Strauss asked for an addition to the Minutes of the July 28, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting to include on page 2, paragraph 1 under 0ld Business-'for the lowest responsible bid' to be inserted in the motion to accept J. W.
Signal's bid for fire detection equipment. Mr. Sagosz made the motion to accept the minutes with this modification. Mrs. Herman seconded, and it was passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1. Bills Presented for Payment:

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Mrs. Herman seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

2. Financial Statement:

Mr. Sagosz inquired if the library had received an audit. Mr. Manheim explained that an audit had been completed a few months ago, but as yet, we had not received a report. Mrs. Reed will contact the auditors, Samuel Klein and Company, to find out when the reports will be delivered.

Mr. Manheim stated that \$4,300 is available each month for the remainder of the year in the library budget. He indicated that the library is working very close to the lines allocated for each area.

Mr. Sagosz questioned the deficit of \$423.32 in the Public Employees Retirement System. Mr. Manheim explained that this represents a cost of living increase for retired employees that the Board of Trustees is required to provide. Also, voucher numbers 1620, 1621, and 1622 represent the employees' share of P.E.R.S. The library pays the employer's share once a year on June 30.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Mrs. Grover seconded it, and it was passed unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed's proposal to make three part-time employees full-time employees will be tabled at the present time. The Personnel Committee will meet to discuss the need for this action along with the Budget Committee who will determine budget priorities for 1977.

Mrs. Reed requested that as many Board members as possible should attend a demonstration of mini computer operation given by C. L. System Inc. to be held on Sept. 21, 1976. This is a first step towards the computerization of all of the Essex County libraries.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

The Personnel Committee requested that each Board member read the revised Staff Manual and give any suggestions, criticisms, etc. at the next meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz will assist Mrs. Reed in comparing the specifications of the bids received for the reference area shelving. One bid was received through advertisement, and three others had been submitted previously by library request.

No bids were received from the advertisement that was placed in the newspapers for the servicing of the heating and air conditioning system. Mr. Sagosz will compile a list of companies the library can solicit.

Mrs. Reed received a call from Mr. Corwick's office informing her that renderings were on file there for the new library addition. Mr. Sagosz suggested that the Board inquire into the exact requirements needed for the building plans. Mrs. Strauss will contact Mr. Moss for this information.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz and Mrs. Reed will look into the possibilities of using mesh in plastic for window protection. A glazier will be called to determine the prices.

Mrs. Reed reported that she had received many letters from throughout the country as a result of her television interview regarding Inner City Mother Goose.

Mrs. Reed explained the library's book selection policy. Briefly, she stated that the library abides by the "Library Bill of Rights", which she will distribute to the Board members.

Mr. Sagosz inquired about the date for the installation of the fire detection system. Mrs. Reed reported that she had sent a letter to the J. W. Signal Co. informing them of the acceptance of their bid, and asking them to set up a date of installation. As yet, no date has been set.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION:

Mr. and Mrs. George Lawrence of 23 Rose Terrace, George Niver and John Di Domeniso of the TM Center at 109 Valley Road, Montclair have requested use of the meeting room approximately every three months. They feel they have been denied access to the room on a regular basis. Mrs. Reed has stated that the meeting room should be available to as many groups as possible as the library is limited to the evenings it is opened. The Board will discuss this and notify the TM Center of their decision.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:05 P. M.

MONTHLY REPORT

September 1, 1976 for August 25, 1976

This has been the busiest month of August in the library I have ever experienced. A number of summer projects have culminated; the summer reading and music programs with a Puppet Show, instead of the yearly picnic, and the Jeans Contest--all of which were very successful. Our movie programs continues. Displays of great interest have been exhibited throughout the summer.

Three pages have resigned this month for various reasons. They are Michael Molle, Michael Wilk and Terry Rucker. Only one replacement has been made--Michael Repiscak. Two other pages will probably be needed.

Our employee number will be down to 40 by September 15. We need additional personnel to adequately cover all areas throughout the day. Therefore, I recommend the following:

- That Mrs. Shirley Itkin be made permanent full-time at an annual salary of \$7,500.
- That Mrs. Jacqueline Lepore be made permanent full-time at an annual rate of \$7,500.
- That Mrs. Marie Magno be made permanent full-time at an annual salary of \$7,500.

All three persons listed above are presently on our staff as permanent part-time employees who, incidentally, are already working within $7\frac{1}{2}$ hours of full-time.

We have had national television and local radio exposure during the month. As a result of these programs, several telephone calls and letters have been received. Some of the calls came from as far away as Los Angeles and Ohio. Each of these calls and letters support the stand which the Board of Trustees and Director have taken in The Inner City Mother Goose controversy. The radio appearance was a "talk show" on WNJR radio on Sunday, August 29, 1976 at 10:30 P. M.

The Essex County Directors Group selected a committee of seven directors (of which I am a member) to visit and study two different systems of library automation as a first step towards computerization of Essex County Libraries. We visited Liverpool New York where the Gaylord System is installed. Later we visited Greenwich Connecticut where the C. L. Systems, Incorporated is in operation.

A demonstration of mini computer operation by Gaylord Corporation was set up in the Livingston Public Library several months ago. C. L. Systems, Inc. will perform the same type of demonstration for librarians and Trustees during the month of September. A discussion session will be held for both groups during that period. It is hoped that all of you will be able to attend. Gaylord representatives will also be on hand.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

SEPTEMBER 22, 1976

Before the opening of the meeting, the Board discussed the request of Mr. George Niver of the TM Center, Montclair. Mrs. Lopis will send a letter approving the use of the meeting room for four meetings (one every three months as requested).

Mr. Sagosz briefly informed the Board about the mini-computer demonstration he had attended at the Montclair Library. This trend of computerization is a change for future consideration.

The meeting was called to order at 8:20 P. M. by President, Anita Strauss. Present were members Andrea Grover, Eileen Flanagan, Nancy Herman, Phyllis Lopis, Albert Kupferer and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Director Lola N. Reed, Board Accountant, Stewart Manheim, and Board Attorney, Irving Ostrow.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Minutes of the September 1, 1976 meeting with the following correction: On page 2, the first sentence to read-"Mr. Manheim stated that \$43,000 is available each month for the remainder of the year in the library budget". The motion was seconded by Mr. Sagosz and passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1. Bills Presented for Payment:

Mrs. Grover made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment. Mrs. Herman seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

2. Financial Statement:

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to approve the Financial Statement as presented. Miss Flanagan seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Herman made a motion to transfer \$30,000 from the statement savings account #02-073-0000177-0, Midlantic Bank to the checking account, Midlantic Bank to meet this month's obligations. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed related to the Board the problems she has been having in contacting Town Hall officials in the matter dealing with the storage shed. At Mrs. Strauss' request, Mr. Ostrow will send a letter to the Town informing them that the library will not be responsible for injuries sustained by anyone climbing over the railing onto the roof of the shed.

Mrs. Strauss will speak to Police Director De Fazio about the problem of the clutter and debris in the library parking lot after late hour weekend use by individuals.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to permit purchase of a Kodak 16mm sound movie projector not to exceed the cost of ¢689.00 with purchase pursuant to the three bid requirement. The motion was seconded by Mr. Kupferer and passed unanimously.

Mr. Donnelly will contact three companies and request an estimate in writing of the cost of such a projector.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion that we charge a fee of \$5.00 for each time we rent the projector. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORT:

The Personnel Committee reviewed several passages of the staff manual with the Board members. It was decided that more time is needed to revise the manual. Mrs. Reed will give the manual to the employees' committee so that they may submit their suggestions. Therefore, this matter will be tabled until the next meeting.

Miss Flanagan recommended that the Personnel Committee be informed of any changes to be made in dealing with the staff before discussion is brought before the Board.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz informed the Board that he had received a call from Mr. Rappaport of Superior Engineering who registered his displeasure in the library's cancellation of this contract. Several letters have been sent out to companies asking for their bids on the HVAC servicing and maintenance.

The library will obtain an estimate for a panel of mesh in lexan for the side windows.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion that we accept the W. B. Wood Co. bid for \$1,945.50 as the lowest responsible bid submitted for the reference area shelving. Mrs. Lopis seconded, and it was carried unanimously.

Mr. Ostrow will write a letter to the J. W. Signal Company asking them for a starting date for the installation of the fire detection equipment.

Mrs. Strauss suggested that Mrs. Reed contact the companies who had submitted bids for the fire detection system to inform them that a company had been chosen.

NEW BUSINESS:

After discussing the 1977 proposed budget, the following changes were made: Line item--Legal Services raised to \$2,000 from \$1,800. Line item--Service Contracts raised to \$3,400 from \$2,800.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the 1977 Proposed Budget as amended. Mrs. Herman seconded it, and it was carried unanimously.

A letter from Mrs. Strauss has been mailed to the Town Council requesting a meeting to discuss the funding of the architectual fees for a library addition in order to apply for a federal grant.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion that the Board of Trustees support Mrs. Strauss; letter as a vote of confidence, and to pursue the building addition according to the requirements of the Local Public Works Capital Development and Investment Program of the Economic Development Administration. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Grover and was carried unanimously.

Miss Flanagan made a motion to transfer from part-time to full-time Mrs. Shirley Itkin, Mrs. Jacqueline Lepore and Mrs. Marie Magno as of January 1, 1977. It was seconded by Mrs. Lopis and carried unanimously.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mrs. Lopis read a letter from Mr. Olindo Romulus Angelillo of Los Angeles. He has offered the Board of Trustees \$100.00 to pay legal fees should they be brought into court over The Inner City Mother Goose.

Mrs. Strauss announced that there will be a Trustee Association meeting at the Governor Morris Inn on October 29th. Any member who is interested in attending will inform Mrs. Reed. There will be a workshop on October 14th at Hasbrouck Heights sponsored by the Regional Library Institutes 1976.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:30 P. M.

MONTHLY REPORT

SEPTEMBER 22, 1976

The opening of schools and vacations almost over, with a few exceptions, we are preparing for a busy 1976-77 year of activities and programs in the library.

Our Fall pre-school story hour will get underway on Monday, October 4th for a period of 10 consecutive weeks. Calendars of events for each month's activities are being distributed as usual. Programs, mostly movies, are being planned for youngsters on holidays.

Shortly after the storage shed was built in our staff parking lot attention was called to abuse by youngsters jumping on the roof and throwing rocks from it into the parking lots, and the potential danger of someone getting injured.

About six weeks ago someone came over from Town Hall and took measurements of the rail for the installation of safety wire. I have been in touch with Mr. Torlucci, Mr. Corwick, Business Administrator and Mr. Serio, Assistant Town Engineer to Mr. McCann. Each promised to get back to me. To my knowledge nothing further has been done.

The idea is to take percautionary measures to prevent injuries beforehand, not after the fact when a lawsuit is instituted against us. Maybe you, the Board of Trustees, can get some action from Mr. McCann.

Our parking lots are evidently being used for beer drinking parties and rendezvous--especially on weekends. Police surviellance leaves a lot to be desired. Two men, Refinski and Toohey, are kept busy each morning gathering beer cans, wine bottle and other types of debris scattered all over. Monday mornings are especially bad.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

OCTOBER 27, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 P. M. by President, Anita Strauss. Present were Board members Andrea Grover, Eileen Flanagan, Nancy Herman, Phyllis Lopis, Albert Kupferer and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Present also were Board Attorney Irving Ostrow, Board Accountant, Stewart Manheim and Director Lola N. Reed. Three residents of West Orange also attended the meeting.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1976 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to "The Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Miss Flanagan made a motion to accept the Minutes of the September 22, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting as presented. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1. Bills Presented for Payment:

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to accept the Bills Presented for Payment for the month of September. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Grover and carried unanimously.

2. Financial Statement:

Mr. Manheim noted that line items Community Services, Service Contracts, Supplies, and the Public Employees' Retirement System are in the red.

The fourth quarter check in the amount of \$99,611.50 was received from the Town and deposited into the checking account.

Mrs. Herman made a motion to transfer \$65,000 from the checking account at Midlantic Bank to the Statement Savings Account #02-073-0000177-0 Midlantic Bank. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Lopis read a letter from Mr. lanni of Civil Service in which he asks the Board to attend to Mr. Jonas' request of five days vacation pay for the months of January, February and part of March, 1971.

Mr. Kupferer made a motion that should Mr. Jonas' arrears be validated, the Board will pay five days vacation pay and Civil Service will be notified. Mrs. Lopis seconded, and it was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to approve a leave of absence for Mrs. Lorraine Schwartz for two months dating from Sept. 27th to Nov. 27th. Mr. Kupferer seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

Mrs. Reed had a meeting with Mr. Dreyer of the Fowler Insurance Agency in which the policies were reviewed. There has been an increase in all of the policies with the exception of automobile insurance, which has decreased.

The J. W. Signal Co. has informed Mrs. Reed that installation of the fire detection equipment will commence on November 3, 1976.

Based upon a motion that was made at the September 22, 1976 meeting which granted permission to purchase a Kodak 16mm sound projector (the amount not to exceed \$689.00), Mr. Donnelly will purchase this item from the Gene Hacker Camera Shop as the lowest bidder.

Mr. Sagosz will discuss with Mr. Donnelly the possibility of having cabinets built to house the Audio-Visual equipment.

COMMITTEES:

Mrs. Grover informed the Board that she had been contacted by Mr. Donnelly of the Employees' Association asking for a meeting with the Personnel Committee. They will meet on October 30 at 11:00 A. M. The committee will report back on this at the next Board meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz will look over the three service contracts submitted by the Volpe Service Company, Air Controlled Environment, and Monsen Engineering Company to determine why there is such a vast differential in fees.

The Board of Trustees went before the Town Council on October 5th and requested \$20,000 in architects' fees so we could make application to the Local Public Works Capital Development and Investment Program for the library addition. President Bonnet called Mrs. Strauss and stated that the Council would approve the expenditure. Subsequently, the Town Council passed a resolution to approve the appropriation of such funds. (Resolution attached to Minutes). Mr. John McCann was appointed co-ordinator for the project.

On November 8, 1976 at 1:00 P. M. a public hearing for the proposed budget will be held. Mr. Sagosz, Mrs. Reed, Mr. Manheim and Mrs. Herman will attend this meeting with Mrs. Reed.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mrs. Strauss reported that Mr. Corwick had stated that the representative from the telephone company had informed him that the library did not want to be included in the Centrex System. This not being the case, Mr. Sagosz will check on the cost of having a line for the library or hooking into the Town system now that it is already set up excluding the library.

Mrs. Strauss reported on the workshop she had attended with Mrs. Reed at Hasbrouck Heights. She is interested in conducting scientific surveys within the library to find out how our library is being used. For example, we do not know how many people come in to read magazines, or to use a specified area of books. The Friends of the Library could possibly aid us in this survey. Mr. Sagosz suggested that the professional staff determine what area would merit such a survey. Mr. Kupferer and Mr. Sagosz will review the data.

Mr. Ostrow discussed a letter sent to Mrs. Strauss from Mr. Lehman in reference to the signed agreement dated April 4, 1973. He noted that the architect will be paid in accordance with the 1973 contract, less the \$20,000 appropriated for preparation of plans and specifications in connection with the Public Works Bill. The contract states that the architect will receive 6% of whatever the cost of the addition will be.

The next Board of Trustees meeting will be held on Monday, November 22, 1976. Adjournment was at 9:40 P. M.

MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

NOVEMBER 22, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 P. M. by President, Anita Strauss. Present were Board members Andrea Grover, Eileen Flanagan, Nancy Herman, Phyllis Lopis, Albert Kupferer and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Director Lola N. Reed, Board Attorney Irving Ostrow, Board Accountant Stewart Manheim, and two residents of West Orange.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1975 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Builetin Board, was mailed to the "Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mrs. Strauss noted that in the previous meeting she had stated that there was no point in hooking into the Centrex System as the phone directories have already been issued for this year. Mrs. Herman made a motion to accept the Minutes of the October 27, 1976 meeting with this additional statement to be added to the first paragraph under New Business, page 3. Mrs. Grover seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mrs. Lopis made a motion that the Bills Presented for Payment for the month of October, 1976 be accepted for payment. Mrs. Herman seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

2) Financial Statement:

Mr. Kupferer made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. Miss Flanagan seconded, and the motion was carried unanimously.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mrs. Reed informed the Board that Mr. Toohey will be filling in for Mr. Daniello in the evenings when needed.

Based upon the motion that was made at the October meeting, payment to Mr. Robert Jonas for his vacation time was forwarded to him by certified mail.

Mrs. Reed will meet with Town Purchaser, Mr. Flynn to discuss the various rules and regulations involved in purchasing procedures. After attending a financial workshop at East Orange Public Library, she feels that it will be beneficial to confer with him on the methods used by the Town.

Based upon Mrs. Reed's request, Mr. Kupferer made a motion that the library be closed at 1:00 P. M. on Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion and it was passed unanimously.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Mrs. Grover, as a member of the Personnel Committee with Miss Flanagan, reported that the Board of Trustees has voted to pay the staff members for one hours work from 8-9:00 P. M. on August 9, 1976 when the library was closed due to weather conditions.

The Board of Trustees with one negative vote approved the reinstatement of pay for the personnel that was working at the library on the night of August 9, 1976. There were hurricane warnings that night and Mark Donnelly, with approval of Mr. Sagosz closed the library when efforts to reach Mrs. Reed in early evening failed. Mrs. Reed was directed to inform those people concerned to have their time cards checked and money authorized to be paid. The discussion and vote of this item were taken in closed session since it concerned personnel.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz investigated Air Controlled Environment and found the firm to be reliable. He has checked references and found them favorable. Mrs. Herman made a motion to accept Air Controlled Environment as the lowest responsible bidder with the stipulation that the contract be limited to one year. The motion was seconded by Mr. Sagosz and passed unanimously.

Mr. Ostrow will write a letter asking Mr. Silverstein to include this limitation in his contract.

Mr. Ostrow pointed out to the Board that the letter received from Mr. Lehman should be answered. In his opinion, it would be wrong to negate the contract. Based upon this report, Mr. Sagosz made a motion that the letter received from Mr. Lehman dated October 18, 1976 become a part of the contract. Mr. Kupferer seconded, and it was passed unanimously. Mrs. Lopis will notify Mr. Lehman that the Board has accepted the terms indicated in his letter.

Mrs. Strauss received a comprehensive report on the Friends of the Library submitted by Mrs. Elsa Meyers. Mrs. Meyers suggests that someone on the Board or on the outside of the library take over the organization of the Friends. She suggested trips sponsored by the Friends. Mrs. Reed feels that the staff can handle any special project set up by the Friends. The Board would like to encourage the staff in the undertaking of any such program.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz reported on the budget hearing that was held on November 8, 1976 which he had attended with Mrs. Reed, Mrs. Herman and Mr. Manheim. He indicated his displeasure with the hearing as he felt that as a Board member he was excluded from full participation. Mr. Corwick referred the majority of questions to Mr. Manheim. Mr. Manheim felt that Mr. Corwick was acting without the assistance of the Council members and therefore, needed explanation for the various items listed.

The December meeting will be held on Monday, December 20, 1976 instead of Wednesday, December 22, 1976. The two newspapers, the Town Clerk, and public will be notified of the change in dates.

Mrs. Grover made a motion that the staff be paid on the 15th of December and the 23rd of December, 1976. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

State Aid in the amount of \$36,199.00 was received by the library and deposited in the Statement Savings Account at Midlantic Bank.

Mrs. Strauss would like Mrs. Reed to contact Mr. Lehman and ask him to please consider incorporating the list of suggestions submitted to him into the plans for the new additions.

Mrs. Lopis made a motion to transfer \$45,000.00 from Statement Savings Account #02-073-0000177-0 to the checking account, Midlantic Bank to meet expenditures. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion and it was carried unanimously.

Mrs. Herman asked Mrs. Reed about the Annual Report for 1975. Mrs. Reed told the Board that she hopes to have it ready within the next week or two.

COMMUNICATIONS:

Mrs. Lopis read a letter from the Essex County Cultural and Heritage Commission in which they congratualte Mrs. Reed for her outstanding achievements as library director which was featured in an article of the "West Orange Chronicle" dated 10/14/76.

Adjournment was at 9:45 P.M.

DIRECTOR'S MONTRLY

REPORT

NOVEMBER 22, 1976

The library has been humming with activities since the new school year and our Fall Pre-School Program started. With Mrs. Schwartz on Leave of Absence and other absences due to illnesses, etc. our staff is being taxed to the maximum. So far, we are able to manage by rescheduling.

George Daniello suffered a heart attack during the month which left us without a back-up person to assist Frank Refinski, our one full-time custodian.

Joe Torlucci, Frank Refinski and I met in my office to discuss our custodial problem. Mr. Torlucci explained that he is unable to get a replacement for the library at this time. A major problem has been temporarily averted by using the services of Bill Toohey on Monday and Wednesday evenings and other times when needed.

Mr. Torlucci explained that the new work code stipulates a minimum of 4 hours pay for employees who are called back after a normal work day. Since Mr. Refinski is asking time and a half for hours other than his normal schedule, we find more monetarily advantageous for the library to hire Mr. Toohey for overtime pay.

Robert Jonas was paid by certified mail \$298.95 less \$17.49 social security tax (\$281.46 net salary) for five days' earned vacation pay--1/1/71 - 3/17/71. A copy of the check with a covering letter have been sent to the Department of Civil Service at 1100 Raymond Boulevard in Newark.

The workers from J. W. Signal Company are still with us. They informed me that the installation of our fire detection system should be completed by Wednesday, November 24th.

With permission from you, the Board of Trustees, we would like to close the library at 1:00 P. M. on Christmas and New Years' Eve as we have done in previous years.

Two very worthwhile workshops were held during the month. One which was held at East Orange Public and sponsored by Southwest Essex Area Libraries was on Purchase and Accounting Practices of Libraries. Our authority was Comptroller/Purchaser Joe Bonin of Maplewood who is also an instructor at Rutgers University and serves on the Board of Trustees.

Mr. Bonin discussed things like The Art of Purchasing, Public Contracts
Laws, Blanket Purchasing, Batch Paying, Model Specification, Proposal
Guarantee, Performance Bonds and Certificates of Insurance.

The second workshop sponsored by NJLA and the State Library was held at the Wayne Public Library. It was called A Hands-On Learn-By-Doing Public Relations Workshop. The workshop leader was Mrs. Virginia Backler, a free lance library consultant. Both Mark Donnelly and Lola Reed attended and came away reassured that we are doing something right here at the WOPL.

Shelves for the Reference area have arrived and will be installed during the week of November 22nd.

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MINUTES

BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING

DECEMBER 20, 1976

The meeting was called to order at 8:15 P. M. by President Anita Strauss. Present were Board members Eileen Flanagan, Nancy Herman, Phyllis Lopis and William Sagosz constituting a quorum. Also present were Board Attorney Irving Ostrow, Board Accountant Stewart Manheim, and residents of West Orange.

OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT:

The President opened the meeting and stated that on January 6, 1975 in accordance with Public Law 1975, Chapter 231, approved October 21, 1975 and known as the "Open Public Meetings Act," proper notice of this meeting and all Library Board meetings for the year 1976 was posted, and shall remain posted throughout the year, on the official Main Library Bulletin Board, was mailed to the "Star-Ledger"—the officially designated newspaper, was mailed to the "West Orange Chronicle"—the second newspaper, and was hand-delivered to the Town Clerk.

MINUTES:

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to accept the Minutes of the November 22, 1976 Board of Trustees meeting as presented. Miss Flanagan seconded the motion, and it was passed unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT:

1) Bills Presented for Payment:

Mr. Sagosz questioned voucher #2043 of National Fuel Oil Company for \$667.32. One of the service charges on this bill is for draining the boiler. Mr. Sagosz will inquire into why this service was performed by the fuel company, instead of Air Controlled Environment.

Mrs. Lopis expressed concern over Voucher #2012 from Curtis Service, Inc. for repairs to the Mobilibrary. It was explained that this had been for road service and that more work had to be performed on the Onan engine. Another invoice is forthcoming.

2) Financial Statement:

Mrs. Herman made a motion to transfer \$45,000 from Statement Savings Account #02-073-0000177-0 to the checking account, Midlantic Bank to meet November expenditures in December. Mrs. Lopis seconded, and the motion was passed unanimously.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion to accept the Financial Statement as presented. The motion was seconded by Mrs. Herman and unanimously carried by the Board of Trustees.

DIRECTOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Sagosz inquired as to whether Mrs. Reed had appointed someone to act as Assistant Director to take her place at the Board meeting when she is not available. The Board of Trustees would like to have a representative appointed by Mrs. Reed.

Mr. Sagosz made a motion that the library not install a vending machine containing the West Orange Chronicle. Mrs. Herman seconded the motion and it was passed by the majority of the Board of Trustees. (Three ayes, one abstention.)

Mrs. Strauss noted that the library's application for federal funds under the Public Works and Employment Act of 1976 has passed five different clearances which includes local, county, and tri-state approval.

Mr. Ostrow stated that the suggestion made by Mr. Flynn, Town Purchasing Agent, that the library retain our present insurance company is not a valid one as the library has policies in excess of \$2,500. Contracts must be established by advertising for bids. The board will adhere to this advertising policy.

COMMITTEE REPORT:

Miss Flanagan, representing the Personnel Committee has suggested that a definite policy be written in regard to the librarian on duty. Questions for the Board to consider are: Should this policy be stated in the staff manual? What happens when the director is not at a Board meeting?

When the Personnel Committee had met with the employees' association representatives, on of the concerns was with fire drills. The staff feels that there is a need for regular fire drills. The Board of Trustees would like this written so that procedures in case of fire are explicit. Mrs. Strauss has requested Mr. Sagosz to assist Mrs. Reed in setting up this program. Also, the fire department should be contacted once again to help establish and approve of a fire drill system.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Sagosz reported on the Contract for Maintenance of the Air Conditioning and Heating Equipment. Mr. Silverstein advised Mr. Ostrow that the one year limitation of the contract is acceptable. In response to Mr. Ostrow's inquiry of the Certificate of Insurance, he was informed that Air Controlled Environment was a subsidiary of the parent company which is Environmental Control, Inc. The terms of the Agreement is for one year from December 8, 1976 and is issued by Environment Control, Inc., although billing for payment could be made by Air Controlled Environment.

NEW BUSINESS:

The dates for next year's Board of Trustee meetings are attached to Minutes.

Mrs. Strauss appointed Mrs. Herman and Mrs. Grover to the nominating committee for the January Board of Trustees meeting.

After discussing the pros and cons of trips sponsored by the library, or the Friends of the Library, it was decided that further investigation in running such programs would be necessary, and that more discussion will be needed.

Mrs. Strauss presented a plaque to Miss Eileen Flanagan for her five years of service to the Board of Trustees. On the behalf of the Board, Mrs. Strauss expressed appreciation for the contributions made to the welfare of the library.

Miss Flanagan made a motion that the part-timers in question--Mrs. Lepore, Mrs. Itkin, Mrs. Magno, be given an annual salary of \$7,912 with full-time status for the year of 1977. They will be placed on step three of the salary scale. Mrs. Lopis seconded the motion. Mr. Sagosz indicated that the employees shall be notified of this decision in order that they might voice their acceptance or rejection. The motion was passed unanimously by the Board of Trustees.

Adjournment was at 9:15 P. M. The next meeting will be on January 26, 1977.

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MONTHLY REPORT

DECEMBER 20, 1976

We had our usual headaches during the past month, some worse than others, but we have managed to survive by our well-known tactful and courteous manners backed up with our sometimes forced smiles.

J. W. Signal finally completed installation of the fire alarm system and it is functioning. However, there were a few problems discovered when they proceeded to test the system. They found that only one of the old fire alarm boxes scattered throughout the building was in working condition.

Lucky us, we never had reason to use them.

We received several book donations, as usual. But two exceptional gifts were received, both in celebration of the bicentennial. The West Orange Junior Womans Club gave us the Atlas of Early American History:

The Revolutionary Era, 1760-1790, a beautiful and very colorful book at a cost of \$100.00 from Princeton University. Mr. John T. McCann, Town Engineer, donated History of Public Works in the United States published by American Public Works Association of which he is a member.

Mrs. Itkin and I kept our appointment with Mr. Joseph Flynn, Town
Purchasing Agent, in his office on Thursday, December 2nd at 2:00 P. M.
Mr. Flynn was very cordial and patient, and willingly covered many aspects
of buying practices and, at the same time, gave us some good commonsense
advice on buying procedures.

Some of the areas covered were the purchasing of office, janitorial and maintenance supplies and the forthcoming new insurance law. He promised to advise us of any further changes in insurance laws. He also stated that ours is a good and trustworthy insurance company and that we should stay with our present agent unless revisions in the present law requires us to do otherwise. He confirmed the fact that we should continue to use the benefits of state contracts instead of making purchases from high-pressured salesmen. We should also get written inspection reports from heating and air conditioning inspectors each time an inspection is made. We were advised to use services of local businesses when feasible.

Mr. Paul Wagner, Circulation Manager has asked permission to set up a vending box in the vestibule with copies of 'The Chronicle'. The library will receive \$.07 out each \$.25 for the sale of papers. Unsold papers will be picked up at no cost to the library. The library will receive a check once each month. In case of forced entry, the library will not be held liable.

According to an article in this weeks' Chronicle Public Works Director

John McCann reports that West Orange has not received word whether the

applications for federal funds under the Public Works and Employment Act

of 1976 have been approved. It further states that other towns have had

their projects rejected. So far, our applications have passed five different

clearances including, county, tri-state and local planning board approval.

Hopefully, NO NEWS IS GOOD NEWS!

Incidentally, we have received a copy of the plans (blueprints) for the new addition to the library from Mr. Lehman.
