















So look for these friendly smiling faces as they walk the halls of CHS.



Getting A Head Start

The Co-Op Program Provides Students With A Strong Sense Of Responsibility And Hope For The Future.

Students often wish to be transported from the classroom, straight into their dream jobs. In reality, this rarely happens. However, the Cranford Cooperative Education program provides high school Seniors with hands-on experience in the career field of their choice while they continue to attend classes.

Currently in its twenty-fourth year, the Co-op program is divided into two divisions: Business Co-op, headed by Ms. Clara Doland, and Home Economics Co-op, which is advised by Mrs. Anne Walsky. Business interns work at such respected companies as Schering Plough and Register and Transfer. On the other hand, Home Economics stu-

dents have the opportunity to choose between a teacher's aide position at one of the local elementary schools or a support service position at a local restaurant.

These directions were the prelude to a trust walk that helped Peer facilitators develop confidence and a belief in others. Every year, the program takes two trips that involve activities like this, in addition to attending a Drug and Alcohol awareness workshop in Cranford.

The Peer Development program is well known and respected at Cranford High. There are fortynine facilitators this year, twenty of whom are second year facilitators. Five of the second year facilitators run the Steering Committee. They consist of Kristen Johnson, Nicole Capece, Liz Pavics, Julie Newman and Cheryl Mitchell. The Steering Committee is in charge of running the school store and helping plan retreats and trips. Peer is led by Kitty White, George Huff. Lou Loprete, Natalie O'Donnell and Assistant Principal Joan Wilde.

Peer facilitators meet in small groups every week with their freshmen to help them adjust to high school life. They mutually discuss important topics such as family concerns, divorce and drug and alcohol abuse. All of this communication has truly helped the facilitators listen and communicate effectively with the faculty and the remainder of the student body.





the Watchung Conference.





Overall, the season has been a tremendous success and the Lady cougars continue to fight and push ahead through the semi-final and final round of county and state competi-






The end of the season will mark the loss of four varsity Seniors. The Cougars will have a young team next season, but with strong coaching and plenty of talent, don't count Cranford out.




Freshman Eric Ferreira said "There is a difference between traveling soccer team and the school soccer team. The level of competition is much harder and the games are much more challenging."





The 1994 Golden C was published by the 17 member Yearbook Staff, advised by Jennifer Hilborn, of Cranford High School, Cranford, New Jersey. The book was printed by Jostens Printing and Publishing, State College, Pennsylvania, a division of Jostens. The company representative was Bonnie Blackman.

The 550 copies of the Golden C were printed on 80 pound matte paper, 9x12 in size, and 192 pages in length with an additional 16 page Spring Supplement. The print is in black ink. The 1994 addition has 48 pages of full color MSTC prints with 16 pages of Pantone paper in the opening section. The type style is Korinna. The type set is 8 pt. for caption copy, 10 pt. for body copy, and headlines vary from 12 pt. to 96 pt. Division page headlines are hand lettered in the style of the cover.

The cover is an original Lithograph picture, designed by Jostens artist Rick Brooks. The cover is 150LB board and High Gloss laminant 478 in Royal Blue 287 and Metallic Copper 876. The backbone is inked in Metallic Copper ink. The endsheets are earth-friendly and printed on recycled paper. All original art work and poetry were created and designed by Cranford High School Seniors. The final cost of the production was \$29,500.

All student portraits were taken by Normandy Studio of Plainfield, New Jersey. Candid photographs were taken by Normandy Studio representative. Paul Tighe, and student photographers, under the direction of Jay Smith. The four-person Business Staff was headed by Richard Phillips.
