



One Man's Opinion

Russia, which has more atomic weapons than we have, fears them in the hands of NATO; German unification is only alternative

As a military alliance, NATO is eight years old but it has changed so much that even its parents would not recognize it.

cognize it.

When the North Atlantic Treaty Organization was created in 1949 it was a 20-year contract between the United States and its Western European allies—chiefly France. Britain, the lowlands and Italy—having as its main purpose the defense of Europe against the Soviet Union.

Since then, Germany, even a divided Reich, has risen as a power on the continent and has been encouraged to demand integration of East and West Germany, Where once, in 1949, NATO foresaw the defense of the Rhine against the Red Armies, NATO has now shifted its sights to the Oder-Neisse frontier between Germany and Poland.

Where once, NATO would have settled for half a continent so long as the Red Armies did not cross the Rhin is military thinking has been changed to a so-called "for ward strategy" which is offensive as well as defensive.

It is timely, therefore, that we learn belatedly that at the meeting in Bonn, Germany, early this month of the Minnesian station of the state o

Atomic weapons, NATO agreed, are the only real deterrent against aggression and the Bonn West German Federal Republic did not hesitate to risk its life by approving the stocking of atomic is no sign that it is diminishing weapons to be able to reply immediately to any hostile move of the Red forces.

We can look for the ques-tions of the equiping of West German armed forces with atomic weapons and Bonn's "neutralism" between East and West to dominate the German election campaign this Summer, leading up to the federal elec-tions in September.


