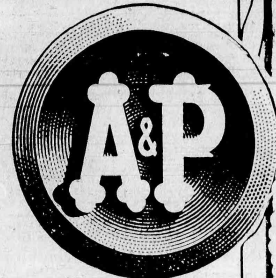

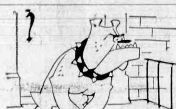

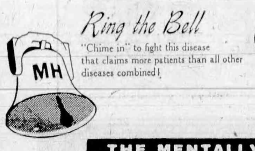

The 20-year-old soldier was graduated from Belleville High School in 1954.



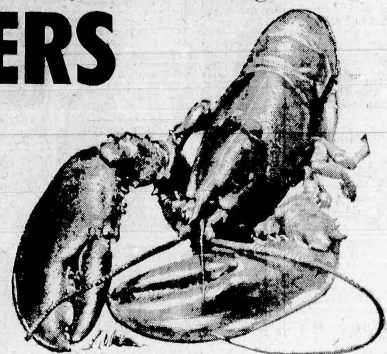

How To Prepare Your Boiled Lobster

Fill a deep kettle with hot salt water enough to cover the lobster (1 tablespoon salt per quart water). Bring water rapidly to boiling. B. H. S. TEACHER REVIEWS BOOK BY FORMER PUPIL

One of the rewards of teaching is seeing one's former students make successes of their lives. During the years of my teaching in Belleville High School, many students have passed through my classroom. Some have gone on to achieve success in the scientific, the engineering, and the professional worlds. Only a few have

attained notable success in literature.
One of that small number has recently published a book of poems. He is Martin Bucos who graduated from Belleville High School in 1947. While he was here as a student, he began to show that he possessed more than ordinary ability in English composition. His earliest claim to fame as a writer was an essay which he wrote and submitted to a "Scholastic Magazine" writing contest.
His essay won one of the highest awards then offered to student writers for meritorious work.
From that early accomplishment

Martin has had a long string of stories, essays and poems published. His recent book of poems, "The Voluntary Tongue", was published by the Helene Wulitzer Foundation in Taos, New Mexico, near where he now lives and works.
The poems are all written in the modern free verse style, and are, as the critics term it, "A vigorous expression from a poet of the Silent Generation." All kinds of subjects are brought under "his observation": love, war, nature, classic authors.
Many times his personal bitterness, or "groping for the light" seems to dominate the emotions expressed in the poems. Perhaps

members of the "Silent Generation" are lost and are seeking for some philosophy to which they can pin their faith. At least, that searching for a faith, or a reason for being is evident in these poems.
Every poem is vigorous, (not always pleasant) but original in style and rhythm.
Let us hope that more members of the "Silent Generation" will express their soul searching in poetry and will eventually be able to reach a happier state of emotions.

RODINO'S FATHER DIES AT 73 YEARS Had Been Active In Political Career Of 10th District Congressman

country and settled in Newark in 1900.

Besides the congressman, Mr. Rodino leaves his wife, Mrs. Josephine DeRobertis Rodino; another son, Patrick Rodino, of Belleville; a daughter, Mrs. Ann Iovine, of Newark, and two

grandchildren. His first wife, Mrs. Margaret Gerard Rodino, died 48 years ago.

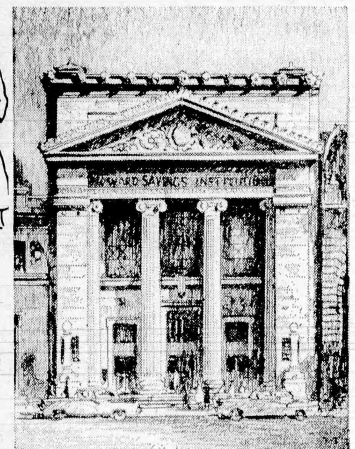
FIRST OFFICE, 1857
