

A Summer School In Belleville

At last week's Board of Education meeting, a proposal was brought up for the establishment of a full-scale summer school to be run by the Belleville school system. Undoubtedly such a move would be a step step forward for the Town. At present local school children seeking additional academic instruction must go to the Bloomfield summer school and pay tuition. In Belle-ville we have a summer remedial reading program which runs for six weeks, and is program which runs for six weeks, and is conducted by three teachers at a salary of \$450. apiece. According to Superintendent of Schools Evans Thomas, 112 pupils re-gistered for the courses last summer and attended with regularity.

It seems to us that if school officials deem it wise to spend money on summer courses limited to remedial reading, which is, of course, of unquestioned value to the pupils, why not go all the wayy and give Belleville children a complete summer program? By putting it on a tuition basis the program could be established without too much added strain on the budget, and would more than pay for Itself in the additional facilities made available to the pupils.

Thus, we hope that within the next few months the Board will take the pro-posal under serious consideration and make provision for an expanded summer program in 1960.
