This yearly Christmas Seal Sale, known to so many thousands of people, is the one by which recognized Tuberculosis Leagues raise money for the control and prevention of tuberculosis, not in any one specified town, but in every county and State across the Nation.

Here in Essex County, 266 new cases of tuberculosis were discovered in the first six months of 1959. Two of these cases were from Belleville and two from Nutley. These figures give you an idea of the size of the TB problem in our county.



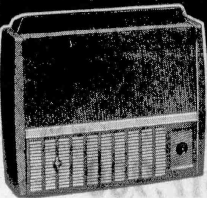

sewage was based on a 1936 contract. "If you keep harping on it (the sewage payments), the Mayor told Golden, 'Soho may demand their sewage fee.'"

Golden also went into an attack on Clara Maass for what he called holding their interests above that of the town. He was applauded after he finished speaking.

Also speaking on the hospital situation was Nicholas Brescia of 94 Lighth Street, an attorney, who said he had been connected with hospital activities. Brescia told how Columbus Hospital in Newark is operated, pointing out that while Columbus gets free water from Newark, the hospital gives clinic and emergency services. "Mass is not giving anything to Belleville, only taking," said Brescia. Brescia suggested that the commissioners and hospital officials sit down around a table and come to a better agreement on the water situation.

Commissioner Robert C. Gruhn who was a patient at the hospital for some weeks, pointed out that the hospital did have an around-the-clock emergency room.

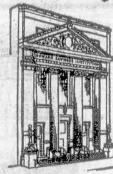

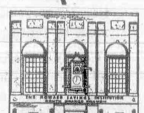

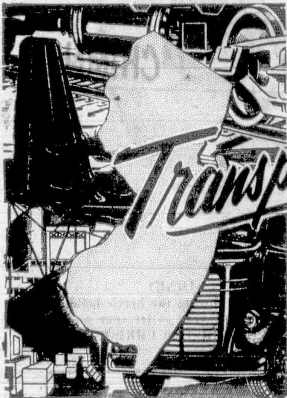
