





### Taxpayers Beware

Aroused citizens are now appearing asking before the town commission searching questions - but from the looks of things they are still getting a runaround.

Summertime is upon us. This is the period of the year when citizens concern themselves with vacation plans and while their backs are turned politicians seize the opportunity to pass laws which are unpopular and against public interest.

Many ordinances have been tabled by the present town commission. Every one of the tabled ordinances is unpopular but some may sneak through this summer if our taxpayers are not vigilant.

We can only report the news. It remains for our citizens to attend the town commission meetings and voice their objections to the further squandering of public funds.

### **Operation** Pathfinder

Suppose you worked for an oil company as a touring specialist, with the job of selecting the best routes for up to 100 motorists a day and then staying behind while they went gallivanting off fun or business. This sounds frustrating enough to pave a path to a psychiatrist's couch.

But it doesn't work out that way, according to the people who man the touring centers of our oil companies. None is looking for a psychiatrist. In the words of one staffer, "The job re-quires endless contact with people, and people and their problems are fascinating

These specialists are located in many cities here and abroad, and they provide free tour guidance by mail, phone and personal contact.

They're called upon to handle both the serious and the ridiculous. One bureau, for instance, had to plot a coast-to-coast for a young man whose pregnant tour wife had always to be within 100 miles of a hospital. Other bureaus have to reassure people that those TV bandits are not actually bushwacking travelers in the Western desert. And, believe it or not, when Hawaii was admitted to the union last year, there were requests for "directions on driving to our 50th state." The oil company gets no direct benefits unless the motorist happens to buy its brand of gasoline, and sometimes the route passes through areas where gaso-
