

Commissioner Nuncio R. Pico, Director of Public Affairs and Health Officer Edward G. Burdzy announced that the Belleville Health Department will hold its annual free rabies vaccination clinics at the following places and dates:

May 2-Washington Ave. Firehouse ........... 6-8 P.M.

May 3-Silver Lake Franklin St. Firehouse 6-8 P.M.

According to information received by the local health authorities from the State Department of Health, New Jersey has not had a case of rabies in humans since 1955, and very few cases of verifiable rabies in dogs during this period.

Health Officials and specialists in animal diseases transmissable to a man, say this is the result of widespread immunization of dogs. They also say that uncared for dogs, which are not immunized constitute a potential reservoir of infection.

A case of rabies among dogs would spread quickly, and from them to cared for pets which have been immunized against the disease.

The Health Department urged that all dog owners, in order to protect residents of the Town, bring their dogs to be vaccinated with anti rabies vaccine at the free clinic, at the time and places above designated.






