Littering is increasing at an alarming rate and must be curbed before high standards of housekeeping become hopelessly compromised.

A clean, well-kept park is no chance affair — it is a result of a cooperative effort by those using the park and personnel responsible for maintaining it. It stands to reason that the handful of men attempting to keep park areas clean cannot prevail against wanton rubbish spewing. The Essex Gounty Park System involves facilities so widespread and vast that intensive policing becomes impractical. Consider also how gusts of wind can further aggravate the situation, and it becomes apparent that the answer lies with recognition by park visitors of their individual responsibility in the matter.


