Belleville Bruins just miss title shot

The third time wasn't the charm for the Belleville Bruins. After winning the Essex County League championship two years running, the Bellevilleites 1976 title hopes were ended Monday night when Union took the second game of the final series, 4-2.

The local diamonders downed South Orange, 5-0, last Thursday to advance to the championship but Union outscored Belleville, 13-11, on Saturday and the Rockets repeated their winning performance Monday to take the title away from the Bruins for the first time in three years.

The baseball bears, 28-9 for the season, are now readying themselves for state tournament play beginning August 28. No games have yet been scheduled for this tourney but it is doubtful at the moment Belleville will play any of the state matches at home. Bruin team manager, Mike Welsh, said he has told a league official, "I will not be responsible for the conditions of the field." The lack of maintenance on the high school baseball diamond, has been very disappointing to the bears manager.

Monday, the Bruins lost their second contest in the best of three championship series against the Union Rockets. The Rockets jumped out to a three run lead in the fourth inning on four consecutive singles and a sacrifice fly.

Union's three run lead came after an unusual play in the third inning. Bruin Bruno Giordano clouted a home run over the fence but was limited to a double when the umpire said he didn't see the ball clear the fence. Belleville manager Welsh said the umpire asked the Rocket centerfielder if the ball had bounced over

the fence and the Union player said the ball had.

So after consulting with the opposition the ump ruled it had bounced and Giordano stayed on the basepaths and was stranded there.

The Bruins got on the scoreboard in the seventh when outfielder Bob DeJianne connected for a double and scored on a single by centerfielder Willie Puentes. The last local run came in the eighth when Guarino and Puentes drew walks, were advanced to third and second on a

sacrifice, and a hit by Jim Rake, batted in Guarino.

Union scored another run for breathing room in the eighth and coasted to the championship in the nine inning game.

"They played better than we did," Welsh said. "Union beat us, they deserve to win."

The Bruin manager added he believed although the Rockets exploded to the championship in the final game, the

Phil Grippaldi feted by town

Three time Olympian Phil Grippaldi was feted by the youth of Belleville and the Recreation Department last week with a charity carnival and a plaque to honor his many athletic achievements.

Grippaldi, a middle-heavyweight lifter, took fourth place in the Montreal Olympics and set an American record in the process. The Belleville Barbell Club member lifted 330 pounds in the snatch and then made 452 in the clean and jerk hoist, to better the old American mark by five pounds. The local Olympian then had to lift 462 pounds to beat out Atanas Shopov of Bulgaria for the bronze.

It was a weight Grippaldi had never attempted before and he cleaned the weight to his shoulders in the squat position and began to stand up but started to black out and had to end the attempt. Grippaldi finished in fourth place, the same spot he occupied at the Munich games in 1972.

The plaque presented to Belleville's Pan Am champion and Olympian by Anthony Dondarski was on behalf of the young people in town and the Recreation Department. Dondarski told Grippaldi, "We are grateful for the recognition you've brought to our town and for the example you've set."

The proceeds from the carnival at the Rec House raised money for the Cerebral Palsy Center to be presented in Phil Grippaldi's honor.

Highlighting the fair were bicycle and stereo prizes and stands from every playground featuring sand terrariums, dart throws, and a bowling pin contest.

Though he didn't win a medal at the games, Grippaldi won a silver award for his American record lift of 452 pounds in the clean and jerk. Grippaldi said last week he is going to stay in competition

Bullets tops in b-ball

The Bullets shot well enough in an overtime period to take the Junior League basketball title by defeating the Bucks, 64-62.

Jim Grogan led the championship Bullets in their overtime effort with 26 points. The Bucks, who had been the regular season champions with a 7-1 record, received double figure scoring in the final from four men. Barry Taylor with 20 points. Jack Brooks and Bernie LePore who tallied 14 each, and Dave Carry, who added another 12 markers for the Buck cause.

Keith Isler and Duane Baker were the Bullets who put on the best performances with Grogan, shooting for 16 and 13 points respectively. The Bullets were 4-4 in the regular season but were the only cagers to beat the Bucks in the pre-

playoff schedule. The championship win wasn't easy for the Bullets, they had to come from behind to achieve their title.

Trailing by as many as eight points at one time, and by a count of 43-38 after three quarters, the Bullets bounced back midway through the fourth quarter, led by Grogan's 10 points. The championship contest was tied though at the end of regulation time, 54-54.

The Bullets, who were inconsistent throughout the season, got off to a fast start in overtime, gaining baskets from Duane Baker, Lou Ritacco and Grogan. With only a minute and a half left in the overtime, the Bucks came back with three quick baskets of their own from Bernie LePore, Dave Carry and Barry Taylor to tie the battle again at 60 each.

Two foul shots sunk by Grogan put the Bullets in front with 23 seconds left. However, the Bucks tied the game only two seconds later when Vinnie D'Antonio came in cold off the bench to hit two clutch foul shots in completing both ends of a one and one situation.

Bullets high scorer Grogan appropriately hit for the winning basket with a layup with 11 seconds to go. The Bucks last attempt to tie the game again went astray and the Bullets found themselves Junior League basketball champions.

The Bullets defeated the Nets, 57-37, in an opening round playoff game the night before. Balance was the name of the game for the Bullets in this contest as three cagers scored in double figures and two others made significant baskets at key times. Morris Thomas was the Net scoring leader with 13 tallies. The Bucks reached the finals by putting down the challenge of the Knicks, 48-44. Barry Dealany was sensational for the Knicks, as his 26 point total almost single handedly pulled off an upset.

The Bucks, on the other hand, received scoring from seven different players, led by 14 Dave Carry tallies. Barry Taylor with 13 and Jack Brooks with 10 were other high scoring Bucks.

The Nets knocked off the Knicks in the consolation game that preceded the championship final. The 28-23 victory of the Nets was aided by the ever improving John Eiflander, who amassed 10 points, while Barry Dealany again headed the Knick attack by hitting for 15 points.

League Director Mark Corino was more than pleased with the results of the summer program. However, Corino said he realized none of the season could have been accomplished without the assistance

of his staff.

"First of all I would like to thank my assistant, Dean Campana, who was willing to do anything to make this league a success, from being timekeeper during the games to occasionally being a referee," Corino said. "Belleville High School basketball coach Dan Grasso deserves a special thanks for backing our program 100 percent, and helping us get it started in an organized manner," the League Director added.

"We could not have done what we did without Mr. Grasso's interest in the program."

Corino also had praise for the coaches of the summer basketball league. "My four coaches, Abdel Anderson of the Bullets, Rich Nisivoccia of the Bucks, Sam Rosamilia of the Knicks and John Butch of the Nets deserve a personal thanks. These men gave of their time freely, and received no financial reward for their services, helping only because they wanted to make the youngsters better ballplayers."

John Megna, Dick Baker, and Joe Lupo were also cited by Corino for the capable job they did refereeing most of

Pirates prevail over Met team

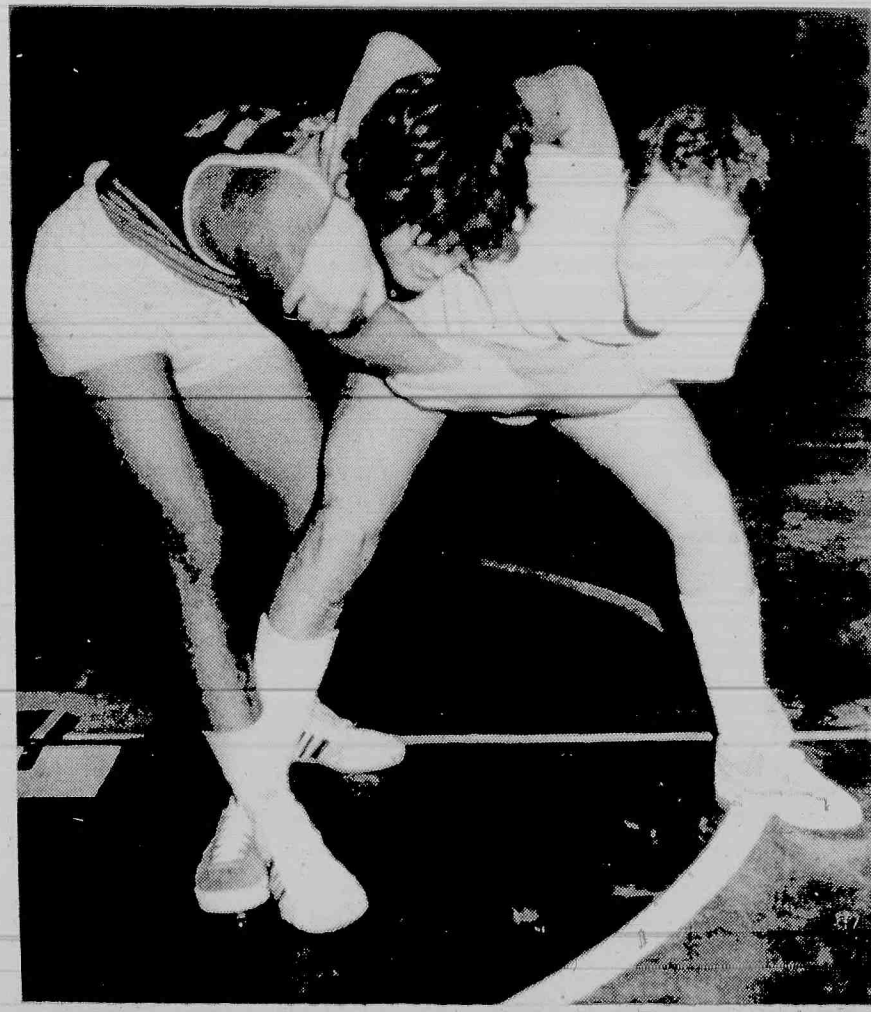
The Pirates prevailed in a dramatic extra-inning championship game to take the Senior League title in the best of three series against the Mets last week.

Town of Belleville was responsible for the loss of the initial meeting in the finals against Union, last Saturday.

The field condition became an issue as a result of Union's winning run scored in the seventh inning, Saturday. When a grounder was hit to Frank Petite, he fielded the ball and threw it to home to stop the runner who was on second from crossing the plate.

Welsh said Petite's peg to the plate was perfect but the ball hit a clump of weeds and bounced over the catcher's head. It was a dozen runs for the Rockets then, as much as they needed. Belleville lost 13-1.

The Bruin bats started sounding in the second inning of the weekend game, when Giordano singled, Otskey walked, and then the two stole second and third base. Puentes singled and drove home the runners for the first two Belleville tallies.

Three more local runs crossed the plate in the third when Bob DeJianne pounded a home run that also scored Tony Roselle and Jim Rake, who were on with a walk and a hit.

Right fielder DeJianne contributed another run in the fourth when he singled home Puentes. Five more runs in the losing effort were totaled for the Bruins in the fifth. Puentes homered following a single by shortstop Kevin Goy. A triple by Danny Dunn drove home Roselle and DeJianne for four scores and Frank Petite doubled home Dunn for the fifth.

The diamond bears won their last game of the season last Thursday night against South Orange to advance to the finals. Greg D'Alessandro and Jeff Stember combined on the mound for the Belleville shutout, 5-0.

The Bruins jumped to the lead in the first inning when DeJianne tripled following walks to Roselle and Rake for two runs. Two more

runs came about in the same way in the seventh after singles by Roselle and Rake led to scores when DeJianne sacrificed Roselle home and designated hitter Petite doubled home Jim Rake.

The Bellevilleites capped the point total in the eighth when catcher Bill Otskey singled, was advanced by a Kevin Goy sacrifice and Roselle drove in Otskey for his second hit of the contest.

Jeff Stember relieved Greg D'Alessandro on the Bruin mound in the seventh to complete the shutout.

The Bruins will now settle for their division championship and hope for the best results in the state tourney beginning a week from this Saturday. No scheduling of games for the tournament has been released yet, but it is doubtful any Belleville games will be played here because Bruin manager Mike Welsh has requested state officials not to use the stadium field as a possible site.

The Bruin leader notes the poor playing condition of the diamond as a reason to avoid anymore games here. "They think if they rake the field for 15 minutes, they're taking care of the field," Welsh said. "It's like playing on cement," he added.

The team manager said he called the state tourney officials and told them if any games were slated for Belleville, "I will not be responsible for the condition of the field," Welsh noted although the Bruins have won two league championships and were in contention for a third, "every year the field got worse not better."

"When these guys put out 100 percent for themselves and the town doesn't reciprocate, you start to wonder if it's worth it," Welsh said.

The state tournament will be a double elimination series, so the Bruins can lose one and remain in contention for the state title.

Next week, the Times/News will include complete statistics on the 1976 Belleville Bruins.

for the present time, but the Belleville weightlifter would not speculate on his chances for the 1980 Olympics.

The 198 pound class lifter said his immediate plans include attending two invitational meets next year in Russia next March and Hungary in July. These matches will prepare Grippaldi and other lifters for the World Championship in Stuttgart, Germany. The local lifter said he is optimistic other athletes from Belleville can qualify for the world meet.

Grippaldi said the Belleville Barbell Club is internationally known for its talent and activity in weightlifting and he praised the sport as healthy and wholesome. "It develops your mind as well as your body," Grippaldi said. The local club has 28 Olympic class lifters and will compete in September to begin the process of qualifying for the Stuttgart meet.

Bucky Cairo, president and coach of the local barbell club, said the club is active throughout the summer and winter and is always interested in

picking up younger members. The club will perform an exhibition for the Chamber of Commerce in Paterson on Labor Day.

Grippaldi said Cairo has done a lot "behind the scenes for weightlifting in this town." "Here's somebody doing something good and decent for youth," Grippaldi added. "We're glad to have him as our president and coach."

Montreal put on the best Olympic games of the three he has attended, Grippaldi said. The weightlifter praised the Canadians hospitality and handling of the affair.

The Belleville weightlifter was one of six competitors invited to the victory party of Vasily Alexeyev, the Russian weightlifter, who once again proved to be the strongest man in the world. Grippaldi, who speaks Russian, admires Alexeyev's talent. "It's impressive to know someone like that," Grippaldi said. The Belleville lifter called the Russian champion a good family man, and a tremendous competitor who has been able to win consistently.

Fidelity releases earnings

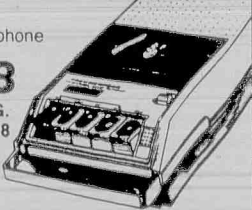

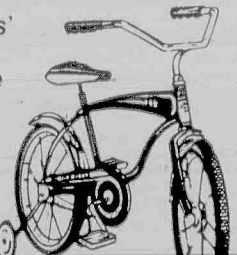

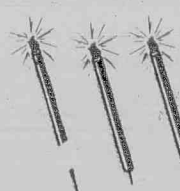

Unity Institute lists season for this fall

For 50 years Unity Institute has been bringing to Montclair the musical giants of the concert world. This season's concert series, in the Montclair High School Auditorium, is no exception. Nathan Milstein, violinist, and Leonard Rose, cellist, are two of the great talents to be heard this fall.

Nathan Milstein will appear Friday evening, October 29. This will be Milstein's seventh appearance for Unity and will be the forty-seventh anniversary of his first North American tour during the 1929-30 season. Milstein began his studies in his native Russia and made his first public appearance at the age of ten but declined a career as a child prodigy. At the age of nineteen he toured Russia with Vladimir Horowitz, a close friend who was also destined to make music history.

Milstein made his Paris debut in 1925 which led later to extensive tours of the European music centers and to North America. In his first seven seasons in the United States he gave twelve recitals in New York and made eleven appearances with the New York Philharmonic. Since his career began he has appeared more than fifty times with the New York Philharmonic, has made annual European tours, and performed at every major European summer festival. As a composer he has made a permanent contribution to the violin literature through his cadenzas for Brahms and Beethoven violin concerti. He collects books, paintings, rare old violin bows and is fluent in six languages.

LEONARD ROSE will appear Sunday afternoon, November 21. Rose has been acclaimed by the critics as "the Master cellist who needs no comparisons with either predecessors or contemporaries to establish the fact." Born in Washington, D. C., and brought up in Florida, Rose became a gold medal winner in a Florida state wide competition at the age of thirteen and was later awarded a scholarship with Felix Salmond at the Philadelphia Curtis Institute of Music.

At twenty he became a solo cellist with the Cleveland Orchestra and after four years he left to become solo cellist with the New York Philharmonic. Leonard Rose's recordings of the cello repertoire are in demand all over the world and High Fidelity Magazine calls him "The Peerless Cellist of our time."

Acknowledged as a master artist/teacher, he is on the faculty of the Juilliard School. The present first chair cellist of the San Francisco, Cleveland, Boston, Pittsburgh, St. Louis, and Toronto Symphony Orchestras, to name but a few, have all been from Rose's studio.

Leonard Rose has appeared four times for Unity in addition to an appearance as part of the Eugene Istomin, Isaac Stern, Leonard Rose Trio two seasons ago. He plays a rare Amati cello dated 1662, described by experts as "one of the finest Cremonese instruments existing today." He is a collector of "gem quality" old cello bows some dating back 150 years.

OTHER EVENTS on the Unity Concert Series include: "The World of Gilbert and Sullivan," with six Savoyards, Friday evening, October 8; Vladimir Ashkenazy, Saturday evening, December 11; The Royal Winnipeg Ballet, Saturday, February 5; Boston Symphony Orchestra, Tuesday, February 22; Bayanihan, Philippine Dancers, Sunday afternoon, March 20; Prague Chamber Orchestra with Hans Richter-Haaser, pianist, Sunday afternoon, March 27; Alicia De Larrocha, pianist, Sunday afternoon, April 17; Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, Friday evening, April 22.

He says, "Ask your employer for your W-2 (Wage and Tax Statement) before you leave. Employers are re-

quired by law to furnish W-2 forms to former employees within 30 days after their last wage payment. They should not wait until January 31st, when they send W-2 forms to their regular employees."

If you don't receive your W-2 with your final pay check, be sure to

leave a permanent address so that it can be mailed to you within the 30 days allowed by law. If you haven't received your W-2 after 30 days, you should follow up immediately. Don't wait!

Once you receive your W-2, keep it in a safe place so that you'll still have it when it's time to file your return.
