## Town reverses CMHS fund denial

Funding for the tri-town Community Mental Health Service was assured Saturday when elected officials of Belleville, Bloomfield, and Nutley agreed to finance the center for 1977.

The resolution for the continued support by the municipalities included a stipulation that a task force, appointed by each town, evaluate the programs of Community Mental Health Service (CMHS) and report within 60 days on the center's effectiveness and future direction.

Last month, the Belleville Board of

Commissioners voted to end the town's financial support, but Mayor Michael Marotti said at Saturday's meeting Belleville's Commissioners would unanimously support funding CMHS for 1977.

Nutley Public Safety Commissioner, Carmen Orechio, proposed the resolution at the morning meeting "to remove the cloud" CMHS has been operating under since the center's future was placed in doubt. Commissioner Orechio proposed the continued funding and evaluation because he said he believed CMHS per-

formed a service each town could not replace on its own. He also argued for the task force study to avoid a yearly battle on CMHS support which constitutes a "paltry amount" of each town's multi-million dollar budget.

Bloomfield Mayor John Kinder noted his town's declining participation in the center's child guidance program and said, "my interest is in getting the guidance program on track again. We need great communication (with the center) and we've got to reassess ourselves and

## Board to seek new bids following loser complaint

New bid proposals for a truck and trash compactor will be sought by the town following a special hearing at Town Hall on Monday.

The Commissioners reversed an earlier decision awarding the contract to Mack Truck of Hillside after one of the bidders protested the action. Following a closed executive session, Commissioner Mary Senatore, who had sought the truck, made a motion to rescind the bid award and another motion rejecting all other bids and requesting new bids at the December 14 meeting of the Commission.

This week's hearing came after George Post of the Industrial Truck Body Corporation protested granting of the bid to Mack, the highest bidder. According to Post, the published bid violated New Jersey law in that it listed specifications which could only be met by one manufacturer. He also objected to the fact that the bid was granted because immediate delivery was the reason for giving the contract to Mack, but that requirement was not specified in the published legal notice.

The challenged notice read, in part, "One 1976 Mack six-wheel truck, Model RD 600S or equal with Heil 25-yard garbage compactor body or equal. Availability and delivery of the complete

vehicle, fully equipped, shall be a factor in the award of the bid."

According to state law, the municipality may set certain minimum standards necessary for the award of a bid, but any specifications which are overly restrictive are outlawed.

Questioned by the Commissioners on

the matter, Town Attorney John Scott said, "If the specifications indicate a particular product, the bid and any award would be illegal."

The Town Attorney would not comment on the specific reason for the Commission's move, and Mrs. Senatore also

## Football equipment stolen in burglaries

Officials have not yet determined the amount of football equipment stolen in a break-in at Belleville Municipal Stadium Sunday night.

Belleville High School Athletic Director, Jim Silvestri said footballs, kicking tees, and football jerseys were among the items missing from an equipment room as a result of a second burglary within two weeks. "I'm working together with the town and the police to see if we can limit the accessibility of the building," Silvestri said.

The AD added the break-ins were unfair to the many students who were participating in the football program at the high school.

Varsity football coach Tom Testa es-

timated 15 to 18 footballs were stolen in the two thefts. Footballs have been costing the school about \$35 dollars each and the coach called the losses costly to the taxpayers as well as bad for team morale.

Belleville Deputy Police Chief Frank Haight said property damage was also involved in the break-in that was discovered on Monday morning. The police will be working with the school "to try to take more stringent precautionary measures in the future," the Chief added.

Belleville detective Martin McNish and Barton Rossi have been assigned the case and will be working in conjunction with the high school to find the football stealers.

## Cable representatives meet with Trustees

Representatives of the Suburban Cablevision Company met with the Board of Education this week to discuss the kind of service the school system may expect when installation is complete.

Sal LaMarca, program director for the company and Dennis Evans, manager of engineering services, attended this week's meeting at the request of Trustee president Matthew Pica. He asked the men to speak with the Board in order to obtain details on what Suburban would do for the schools.

According to LaMarca, the company will provide on a loan basis portable videotape machines for the high school and will also train students in the use of the equipment. He said the training "could be done in 10 minutes," and added the picture quality would be "excellent."

Several Board members asked if the company would provide free service to each of the town's schools, but engineering manager Evans indicated the schools would have to pay. Installation, however, would be free.

Evans also said the company is now before the Public Utilities Commission, its regulating body, seeking permission to charge schools on an hourly basis rather than on the flat monthly charge. He added it was "likely the PUC will approve this."

All sporting events will not be covered by the company, LaMarca said, but those that were not could be covered by students with portable cameras, and public access time could be used to air the games.

The Suburban representatives also revealed there would be no "X-rated" films shown by the company. Both men said it was "against franchise policy" to show such films. There will be "R-rated" films, however, but these will be shown after 9 p.m.

declined comment, saying, "All I know is that now I have to go and see about renting a truck."

The Public Works director originally sought purchase of the vehicle on October 21 at a special meeting of the Board. She requested that the purchase be made and the money be obtained as an emergency appropriation. That proposal was defeated after Scott questioned the emergency nature of the appropriation.

Mrs. Senatore said the truck is needed to pick up and haul leaves to the disposal site. According to the Commissioner, her department will have to rent the necessary equipment at a cost of approximately \$2,400.

The original bids were opened at a special November 1 meeting of the Board, and the award of the contract to Mack was announced at the November 9 meeting.

rededicate ourselves to the original intent.

Belleville's Public Affairs Commissioner, Vincent Strumolo, also expressed concern CMHS was going beyond the scope of the three towns' original intent. "I'm not against mental health," Strumolo said. "We're getting away from mental health programs that we started."

The Commissioner cited a "Friendly Visitor" program for the aged sponsored by CMHS duplicated in Belleville by the Health Department and also by the county. Strumolo told Mrs. Ruth Cowell, director of the CMHS agency, "you're impinging on programs I have."

Mrs. Cowell told the town officials CMHS would welcome any evaluation study. "We believe it would pass muster under professional evaluation," Mrs. Cowell said.

The towns have not yet notified CMHS who the representative from each community would be on the task force



# Senior notes

Beginning January 1, beneficiaries of Social Security will be able to earn \$3,000 per year in wages without loss of benefits. That's an increase of \$240 over the current level. This is good news for some of the elderly who work either full or part time.

Now for the bad news. Also beginning January 1, a person who goes to the hospital under Medicare will be responsible for the first \$124 of his or her bill. The deductible at present is \$104. Patients will also have to pay \$31 a day for the 60 through the 90 day of a hospital stay, up from the present \$26 a day.

In the recent election, in which turnout was supposed to have been light because of voter apathy, it was revealed that 47 percent of those eligible voted. There has never been apathy among the aged, and this time was no exception.

Of those over 55 years of age and eligible to vote, 65 percent turned out to cast their ballots. The difference between the two levels is the "senior power," which the organized senior citizens movement is trying to make work for the benefit of all Americans.

The Belleville Senior Citizens Club program committee reports a good turnout last Tuesday for a showing of the television program, "A Man's Dream." This hour-long showing was presented by the Bell Telephone Company. The meeting followed.

Tickets for the Christmas party are available for club members, and can be obtained at the clubhouse.

## The Carter Presidency

Jimmy Carter is now the President-elect. We wish him well. We live in a restless, troubled world — a world that could use the best of leadership from every country.

While Americans are not dying in foreign wars, there are soldiers who are dying every day. The Mideast is a problem. Lebanon is a very special problem. So is Ireland. The African continent is in turmoil. Solutions to these and other problems are not easy to come by. It may just be that Jimmy Carter, with the help and support of the American people, may bring peace to these troubled peoples.

Domestically, most reports for the immediate future are on the pessimistic side. There is much talk about how Jimmy Carter is going to spend America into bigger and bigger holes from which we can never recover.

In practice we believe Jimmy Carter will be far more conservative than his campaign statements would indicate. We believe Jimmy Carter intended to win the Presidential election regardless of what public positions he was obliged to take in order to obtain the support of voters.

As President we believe Jimmy Carter will not advocate reckless spending. As President we believe Jimmy Carter will be a strong leader — and will often clash with Congressional leaders of his own party.

Although we preferred President Ford, we have confidence that the presidency will have a sobering effect upon Jimmy Carter. Instead of the indecisions of the campaign, Carter will be very decisive, and in the final analysis, the decisions will be his to make. After six months into his term, we believe Jimmy Carter will be able to turn around the country's economy. From that point in time the following 18 months should be among the most prosperous the people of our country have ever experienced.

President Ford has built a tremendous foundation upon which President-elect Carter can build. We believe interest rates will go down. Prices may go up slightly and by the end of 1977 there should be a noticeable drop in the nation's unemployment figures.

Yes we have complete confidence in the strength of America, its people, its government and its future.

It may well be that by the time 1980 rolls around, the nation may witness double-digit inflation. That is one of the risks that "full employment" may bring. It's a gamble we must take in order to provide a job for everyone who wants one.

## Fire safety suggestions

Every day at least 2,200 homes and apartment buildings are destroyed by fire in the United States.

It is, perhaps the most terrifying, claimed 6,500 lives during 1975. Frequently the victims were young children who were alone when the fire started. Some 3,500 youngsters through age 15 perished from fire last year and many hundreds of victims are still recovering from serious, often disfiguring injuries.

The tragedy of these statistics, the New Jersey State Council points out, is that the suffering and waste of lives and property could have been avoided if these families had kept their property as fire safe as possible and had an emergency home escape plan.

Here are suggestions prepared by the Safety Council and the National Fire Protection Association on how to plan for a quick exit in a fire emergency:

Carefully figure out at least two routes to the outside from every room in the house, especially bedrooms. Allow for blocking of stairways and halls by fire.

Make it a rule to close bedroom doors at night. These closed doors will hold back flame and smoke, allowing vital extra time for escape.

For escape from upper floors, plan to use porch and garage roofs, ladders, or trees as ways down to safety. Be sure exit windows work easily so that even a child can open them — and see that windows are low and large enough to climb through.

## Golden Comments

Most of our prominent town officials have spent their time at Atlantic City this week attending the New Jersey League of Municipalities convention, which holds its annual event at the seashore resort.

It is indicative of the time of this writing that Commissioner Rocco Saletta will be unable to attend the convention due to a confining indisposition. He had been under considerable stress in resolving contract negotiations with the employees in his department.

The unseasonable cold temperatures of early fall have brought on an abrupt and heavy fall of leaves that finds out street department workers trying to cope with the accumulation. It takes time, but they'll get rid of them.

As a note of information, we'd like to pass on the fact that our Commissioners, as they usually do, passed a resolution declaring a moratorium on the enforcement of the alternate side of the street parking provisions for street cleaning purposes during the winter. The reprieve lasts from November 22 to March 31, inclusive.

Should a vacancy occur on the United States Supreme Court within the next four years, it would not surprise this columnist if an old friend of the people of Belleville and an eminent scholar of jurisprudence and judicature were to get the nod from Jimmy Carter.

According to news reports, our old Congressman, Pete Rodino, now serving the 10th District, got a phone call at his home around 1:30 a.m. on election night from presidential candidate Carter, before the outcome of the election had finally been determined. Carter expressed his thanks and appreciation for all the work Rodino had done on his behalf throughout the campaign.

Reportedly, Carter's "thank you" call to Rodino was the first he made during the long election night. He told Rodino, "I am looking forward to working with you in the coming years, and I would like to add that I am very proud of you."

That accolade, coupled with a campaign utterance of Carter, in which he stated "I think it's a shame that someone of Italian background has never been appointed to the Supreme Court," would indeed indicate that Rodino might get such a post. Rodino, chairman of the House Judiciary Committee, which played a vital role in Nixon's removal from office, should have a "green light" clear track to fill any Supreme Court vacancy that might come up under a Carter administration. And who, we ask, more richly deserves such a high honor than Congressman Rodino? His appointment would bring dignity, acumen, prestige and respect to the judicial system of the United States.

A brief analysis of the election results shows Carter's chief strength came from a "solid South" Democratic vote for the first time in years, a heavy black vote both in the South and the big cities and the strong support of organized labor, which liked Carter's choice of Mondale as his running mate. The next vice president has long been a friend of labor and his strength helped bring Carter victory, since labor support aided Carter in key states like New York, Pennsylvania and Minnesota, Mondale's home state.

The Republican's greatest appeal was found in groups consisting of suburbanites, white-collar workers, the well-educated and those of means. In New Jersey, the GOP made clear it is still a viable party by carrying the state for Ford.

While Carter was hurt by dissent in the Democratic ranks in New Jersey, caused by dislike for the income tax, Governor Byrne, probably did more to harm Carter's chances by associating with him than anything else.

President Ford gave a good account of himself and must be well respected for restoring integrity and trust in the office of President after the sad Nixon disgrace. In fact, Ford might have won, had he not pardoned Nixon. Nonetheless, he won't starve — he'll get a yearly pension of \$100,000. He should get by on that.

## Patriots' park guide not available

A new report on the current status of Patriot's Path, a linear greenbelt park along the Whippany River, has been published by the New Jersey Conservation Foundation and the Friends of the Patriot's Path.

The comprehensive report is a useful guide to those interested in the 27-mile-long park which NJCF helped initiate and which it serves as professional consultant in coordinating the work of the six Morris County municipalities involved.

The 10-page booklet details the topography of the river, outlines the history of the Path and its planning and growth over the past decade and describes the needs it can serve. NJCF, in conjunction with the Morris County Park Commission and Morristown Rotary Club, first proposed the park concept in 1966 as a means of protecting the river corridor from further encroachment, improving water

quality, preserving open space for recreational purposes and providing an alternate transportation route.

The Path, about a quarter of which has thus far been opened, will link a wealth of parks and historical sites in Morristown, Mendham borough and the townships of Hanover, East Hanover, Mendham and Morris.

The report shows the exact location of the Path in each town, specifying parcels of land which have been acquired and those which are still in negotiation. It lists the locations of sections of the park now open for hiking or bicycling and the length of each.

It also includes a 22-inch map of the entire park, prepared by Judy Keith of Morristown, which indicates completed and proposed sections of the Path and shows side trails, park and recreation areas along the route and natural, historical and educational points of interest in the area.

The communities involved in planning

and developing the Path have received matching grants from federal, state and private agencies totaling nearly \$1.2 million for the project. A citizens' organization, called the Friends of Patriots' Path, was formed in 1972 to assist in promoting the park and implementing plans for its development.

Approximately 50 percent of the land needed for the Path is now in public ownership. NJCF serves as land acquisition agent for Morristown's section of the Path.

There will be an charge of \$1 for copies mailed. Copies will also be available for purchase at the Morris County Library and libraries in the municipalities involved.

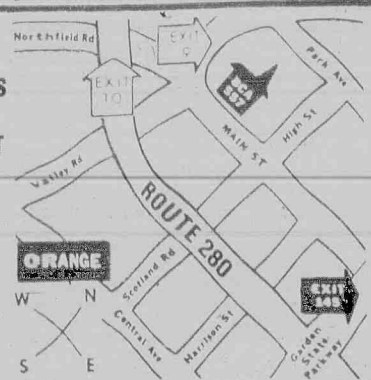

## Kiwanis to fight crime

—The Kiwanis Club of Belleville will begin a new community service program called "Safeguard Against Crime," according to Vincent Sorrentino, president of the group.

—The purpose of the program, according to Sorrentino, will be to bring to the attention of the public the dramatic increase in crime against people and property. The Kiwanis will try to describe ways in which individuals can prevent such crimes.

—Sorrentino said the program will attack the problems of crimes against the home, crimes against children, crimes against businesses and offices and crimes against senior citizens. He said the Kiwanis will also deal with organizing and operating civilian surveillance programs (not to be confused with vigilante committees), and conducting basic attitude programs aimed at encouraging understanding

of and respect for the law. The men will also stress dependence upon and respect for law enforcement officials. —In developing the program, Sorrentino said Kiwanis International has enjoyed the support of the FBI and the Royal Canadian Mounted Police in Canada. Both Director Clarence M. Kelley of the FBI and Commissioner Maurice J. Nadon of the RCMP have personally pledged the cooperation of their agencies with Kiwanis International and Kiwanis clubs in carrying out the Safeguard Against Crime program, officials said.

—In many communities, the Kiwanis president said, the local authorities will cooperate in the programs, which are primarily educational in nature. Groups reached, he said, will include householders, merchants, older citizens, young children and civic, church and professional organizations.

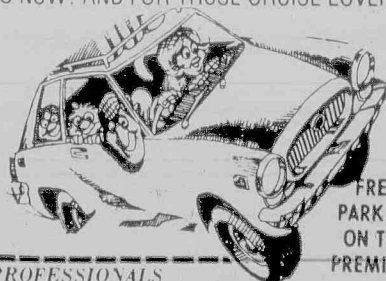

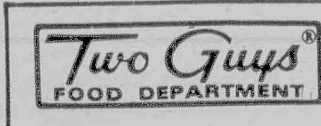

## Blue-Gold whips hapless Kardinals

The Bellboy offense finally got hot on the cold Kearny gridiron Saturday as they burned the Kardinals, 7-30, for the second Belleville victory of the year.

The seven Blue-Gold touchdowns more than doubled the offensive tally for the first seven game of the season. The Bellboys produced the offensive push powered by the running performances of Joe Gelpi, Chris Cervasio, and Frank Mozeika. The triumphant trio scored all seven Belleville touchdowns and combined for 333 of 362 Blue-Gold ground yards.

"I was quite impressed with Frank Mozeika's running and Joe Gelpi's," Belleville coach Tom Testa said. "Even though he was not one hundred percent (because of an injury) Cervasio did a good job," the coach added.

Both the Kardinal and Bellboy defensive squads were loose enough Saturday to allow 77 points scored but coach Testa said he was pleased with the Kearny kick blocked by Ralph Amiano for the Bellboys. Testa noted Amiano's blocked kick forced the Kardinals into attempting two point conversions for the remainder of the contest without success.

While Belleville managed the second victory of the season, coach Testa wasn't completely happy about the way the contest was handled by the refs at Kearny. Two Belleville players were ejected from the match by the refs and the Belleville leader blamed it on lack of self-discipline and the rivalry involved in the cross-river game. The ejections weren't so hard to take for Testa as some calls however. One that dismayed the Belleville coaches was a pass received by a Kardinal and a first down denied to the Bellboys.

The completed pass looked very incomplete to the Belleville bench and the first down attempt looked successful to the same viewers. "The officials were atrocious," Testa said. He also complained some Kardinals were "spearing" some Belleville players with their helmets without getting called for a penalty by the refs.

Overall, Testa said he was very pleased with the offense generated by the Bellboys at Kearny and thanked the underclassmen who "made us work during

the week" in preparation for the second win.

Belleville won the toss and received to begin Saturday's offensive festival. It only took a little more than two minutes for the Bellboys to drive 79 yards for the first score of the day. The march to paydirt was aided by two penalties on the Kardinals, a 32 yard gain by Gelpi, a 15 yard run by Nicosia, and Cervasio's 17 yard scamper into the end zone. The Blue-Gold took the lead 7-0 with a successful extra-point kick by Bob Racioppi.

## Borja named MVP by Big 10 coaches

Senior Bellboy Hernan Borja has been named Most Valuable Player by the Big Ten soccer coaches for the 1976 season. The Belleville forward booted 15 goals to lead the Blue-Gold team in scoring and finish fourth in the league.

Coach Tony Cahill cited his star forward's all-around ability as Borja's strong point in compiling MVP votes. Not only did Borja lead the team in goals, he also made eight assists. In addition, Bellboy Borja was high man on the team with 78 throw-ins, 97 free kicks, and 19 corner kicks.

Borja was also credited with one save for the year during one of his stints at a defensive spot and Cahill called him Belleville's "most all-around player and obviously the most skilled." The MVP honor for the Bellboy was coupled with Borja being named to the first team named by the coaches for the Big Ten conference.

Two Belleville juniors on the second year booter squad were also picked for the second and third all-conference teams. Bobby Freda, a junior halfback was picked for the second team in the Big Ten conference and junior forward, Joe Coscarelli was named to the third all-conference squad.

Cahill called Freda and Borja the two most valuable Belleville booters. "I can't say one was more valuable than the other," the Blue-Gold coach said. Freda, a halfback, was a defensive star for the Bellboys throughout the season. Coscarelli made six goals and two assists for the season.

The season was the second varsity effort for the BHS team and the booters improved from 2-14-1 to 5-11. While the record increased in the win column, Cahill said the most disappointing aspect

of the year was the squad didn't do better considering the number of seniors on the team. Nine of the upperclassmen started on the first Belleville soccer team as sophomores and 15 seniors will be lost to the team at graduation.

The process of seeing his veterans become better soccer players by improving their skills in three years was one of the most gratifying experiences of the season, Cahill said. However with so many graduating the coach anticipates the team will need a lot of help from the fullbacks and halfbacks in filling in the gaps.

Mike Licamelli was the third leading scorer for the Blue-Gold in '76. The junior Bellboy booted two goals and one assist even though he was injured off and on throughout the season and missed the last six games of the year. His potential for next season "will be a lot greater than it was this year" Cahill said.

The comment is used to help spur the Bellboys back to the field without nursing their wounds too long and means the footballer won't be used again until the Thanksgiving game.

Conditioning before the season is stressed to help keep the ball players off the "turkey shelf" because once the real hitting and bruising begins the injuries can go beyond wisecracks to fractures and sprains. Then the hurt can become too real especially for seniors.

It has been reported one million high school football players sustain injuries during the fall season and as many as 20-0,000 miss a week of playing due to physical mishaps. The most serious pain caused on the gridiron in recent years has been inflicted on the knee. About 40,000 knee operations resulting from high school field injuries are expected to take place this year.

Bill "Doc" Ellis has been a trainer with the Belleville varsity for 28 years

and he agrees the knee is the most susceptible spot. "The knee is so vulnerable, there's no way to prevent it from being injured," Ellis said.

The veteran trainer pointed out most teams will disguise a player's ailing knee by taping both knees before a game. Sometimes opponents will take advantage of a player's weakness. "If they know a player is hurt, the natural thing is to go for the injured leg," Ellis said. Thus Belleville projects both knees as most teams do.

The Bellboys have incurred an unusual amount of hand hurts this year, according to Ellis. The most prominent sore hand, belonging to Joe Gelpi, whose quarterback talents were lost for a few games due to a "bone bruise" in his right hand.

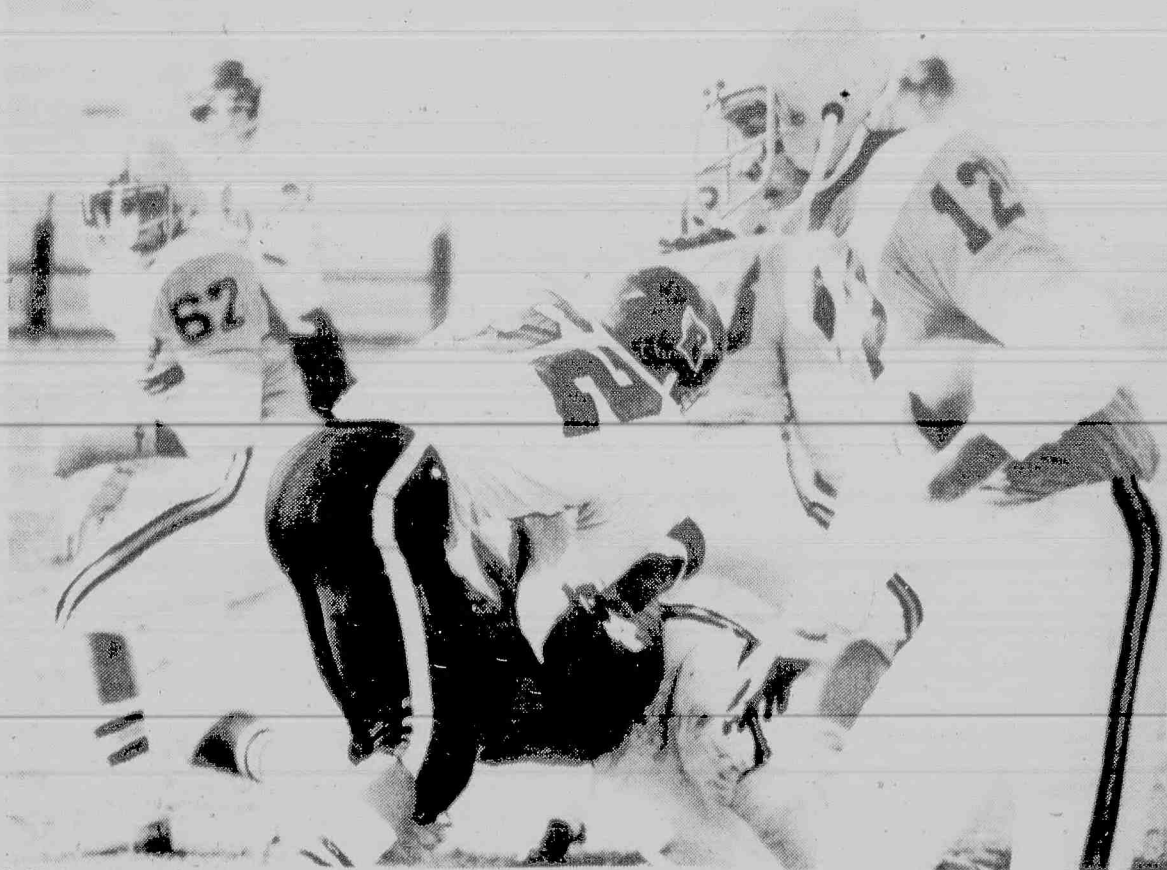
The victory was the ninth in a row for the Essex County Junior League champs and the seventh shutout of the football season for the Bellevilleites.

Team aches seem to run in cycles according to the Bellboy trainer. This year it's been hands, other seasons shoulders or ankles have taken a beating.

The importance of conditioning and preventive measures has been stressed by the coaching staff at BHS to the point that 22 of the Bellboys voluntarily get their ankles taped by Ellis before a game. The practice has drastically reduced the number of serious ankle ailments, Ellis said.

Last season when Chipper Biafore broke his ankle during a game, he had both ankles taped. If the broken foot hadn't been taped, Ellis said, "he probably would have been crippled the rest of his life."

The hurts to the black and Blue-Gold squad this year have been hit-

ting key gridders. Coach Tom Testa called the loss of quarterback Gelpi "a costly one" especially for the Nutley game.

Chris Cervasio "would have been the leading ball carrier" the Blue-Gold coach said if the senior Bellboy had not been plagued by a chronic knee problem during the season. Cervasio has just been returning to full running capacity in the last two games.

A knee injury also felled Belleville's booter, Mike Limongelli during

the Essex Catholic game. He had been kicking for excellent averages during the season until the hurt and has yet to return to the kicking tee, although he started at Kearny as a defensive tackle and offensive center.

Coaches and players try not to think about injuries once a game starts but the possibility always exists. When it happens, the players should never be pushed beyond their capabilities in recovery. "As long as I've been coaching, their health is the most important item," Testa said.

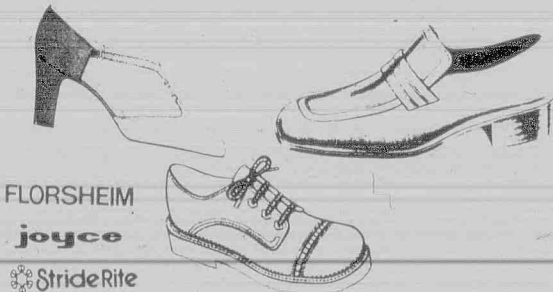

Kearny's first efforts with the football failed after a run and two pass attempts. The Bellboys took the ball on their own 14 but lost possession on a fumble and the Cardinals capitalized on the miscue.

John Plausic plunged eight yards into Belleville territory on two plays to the five yard marker and quarterback Dan Vucolo carried the pigskin over for the first Cardinal points. Bellboy Amiano blocked an extra point kick attempt by the Cardinals and Belleville held a one point margin with 4:51 remaining in the first quarter.

Gelpi returned the Kearny kick-off 24 yards to the Blue-Gold 42 to begin a ten-play, three first down, scoring drive. The quarterback carried again for 12 yards to start the

series and Bellboy Cervasio compiled 20 yards in the ground advance including scoring on a six yard drive to the end zone. After an unsuccessful kick attempt the Blue-Gold led 13-6 with 31 seconds remaining in the opening period.

The Cardinals took to the air to start the next series but after a completed pass to Plausic, quarterback/defenseman Gelpi grabbed the next toss from its flight and took it 42 yards in the opposite direction for the third Belleville TD of the game. Racioppi followed the interception touchdown with a good kick and the Bellboy increased their margin to 20-6 over the bird men of Kearny.

The pass attack for the Cardinals was not deterred by the interception however. Kearny's quarterback Vucolo took to the air eight times in the next 15 plays for the second Cardinal touchdown. The 64 yard drive by Vucolo and his receivers was capped by a 21-yard pass play to senior back Jim Rainey for a TD. Mozeika helped break-up the extra-point pass and with 5:42 remaining in the half the Belleville lead was 20-12.

The Bellboys took the ball on their own 16 and Cervasio and Gelpi gained 9 yards on two running plays when on fourth and inches the Cardinals held back Gelpi's quarterback sneak to take possession.

The Cardinals only kept the ball for two plays however. Gelpi again predicted the flight of the Kearny pass and intercepted the pigskin in the end zone.

Taking over on the 20, the Bellboys mounted their fourth scoring march of the match. A seven yard pass to Greg Grasso set up a one yard dash by Mozeika to give the Bellboys a 26-12 halftime lead.

Belleville went scoreless in the third period while the Cardinals narrowed the Blue-Gold lead to 26-24 by the end of the quarter. Kearny started their comeback on the second series of plays in the quarter by picking up a Belleville fumble. The Bellboy mistake cost six points when Vucolo connected three times with Jeff Smedberg, the last aerial display was the 38 yard play for points. Once again the Blue-Gold defense stifled the extra-point try by the Cardinals and Kearny was creeping up gradually, losing, 26-18.

Belleville took the kick-off on the four and was forced to punt from the 10 on fourth down. Kearny fielded

the ball from the Blue-Gold 32 and Vucolo put together two throws for another TD, the last pass to Rainey for a 30 yard TD play. Mike Limongelli intercepted a two-point conversion pass to keep the Cardinals from tying the score.

Belleville took the 26-24 lead into the fourth quarter without being intimidated by the closing Cardinals however. The Blue-Gold crossed the goal line again with less than two minutes elapsed in the final period to cap a 74 yard-drive that started in the final minutes of the third quarter.

The touchdown series was highlighted by a total gain of 30 yards by Mozeika on three carries and a one yard push by Cervasio for the six points. Gelpi connected with Nicosia for a two point conversion

and the Bellevilleites were out front 34-24.

Vucolo became more persistent with his aerial attempts in the final period but Belleville held the Cardinals on the first series following their TD and took the Ball on the Kearny 30 when Racioppi pounced on a bobbled hike by the Cardinals.

This time it took the Bellboys only four plays to put the pigskin in the end zone. Gelpi took 10 yards of Kearny territory, Mozeika dashed for 13, Cervasio compiled six, and Gelpi crossed the goal from the one for the points. The conversion failed but Belleville was winning with 7:27 remaining.

The Cardinals answered the Bellboys' sixth TD with one of their own when Vucolo hit Rainey for a forty

yard pass then threw to Smedberg in the end zone to save a broken play with six points. The Kearny gridders trailed 40-30 with 5:21 remaining in the contest.

If the Cardinals were hoping to catch-up, the Bellboys took the wind

out of the Kearny sails with the seventh Blue-Gold TD of the day. The 47-yard drive saw Mozeika take 18 yards of territory including a five yard scoring run. Racioppi kicked for the extra point with a minute and a half remaining and Belleville won by the final 47-30 margin.

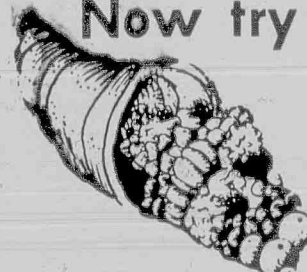
Ella Fitzgerald Is Marking

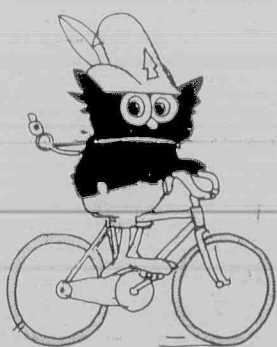
