## Bucs Big Running Attack Stops Nutley Squad 12-6

Displaying a solid running game, the Belleville football team continued its winning tradition by stopping arch rival Nutley, 12-6, in the season opener for both teams.

Next for John Senesky and the 1-0 Buccaneers will be Bloomfield High School this Saturday afternoon at Foley Field, Bloomfield. Kickoff time is set for 1:30 p.m.

"It's nice to start off with a win and especially nice to beat a team like Nutley," said Senesky following the victory. "They (Nutley) are very well coached, have a good team and play hard. This was a big game for us. Nutley had a lot going for it. This was a game where they had the home field, a lot of fans and a lot of

enthusiasm. I give our kids a lot of credit. We made some mistakes out there, but all in all, it was a good effort."

The game was a typical Belleville-Nutley affair, a hard-fought, tight game in which neither team gave up. Although Belleville dominated the contest for three and one-half quarters, they could manage but two touchdowns, both of which came from senior running back Mike Murphy. Murphy, a 1,000-yard rusher last year, barreled for 177 yards and was practically unstoppable rushing through the Nutley line. The 6-2, 245-pound senior, is 20 pounds heavier and 10 times stronger than in 1982 and his presence on the field was an awesome sight for both

friend and foe.

Belleville scored all its points in the second quarter. Using a good running attack with Murphy, Billy

Baber, Frank Tursi and quarterback Mark Walsh, the Bucs started a drive from their own 20 following a (Please see "Bucs" on page 14)

we've reached that mark and considering we didn't hit that plateau last season, I guess it's safe to say we have been showing improvement."

In the vaulting exercise, Laura Cairo took top honors with a 7.4. Jill Lillis was second in the event with a 6.9 while Gina Lemongello and Debbie Battista just missed out in placing. On the uneven parallel bars, Debbie Glasser was the winner, scoring 5.05 with Cairo taking second, scoring 4.55.

Over on the balance beam, Belleville was limited to a third place showing with Lemongello scoring a 5.8.

## Booters Win Three, Lose One; Broken Leg Sidelines Cavalche

The Belleville Buccaneer Soccer team has jumped out to its best start ever, with a 3-1 record in the reorganized Northern New Jersey Interscholastic League. The boys travel to Bloomfield today for a 3:45 p.m. match with the Bengals that will be televised by Suburban Cablevision TV-3.

The squad's biggest victory thus far was over the arch-rival Nutley Maroon Raiders by a score of 10-1 Saturday. Belleville's potent attack was led by senior tri-captain Santiago Borja, who had his second three-goal game of the season.

Carlos Kingalaha, also a senior tri-captain, added a goal and three assists to break open what had been a narrow 2-1 Buccaneer lead at half-time. "We didn't plan to go out there and clobber them by such a big score," stated coach Tony DeAquino, "but the kids went out there and really worked hard."

Back on the field, goalkeeper Brian Cook put together back-to-back shutouts over Montclair and Paterson Eastside in the opening two games of the year. "Cookie played two solid games for us," said DeAquino. "He's got to be one of the best keepers in the county, if not the state." The Eastside game, which

was marred by rough play, was a very costly win for the Bucs as junior fullback Freddy Calvache went down with a broken leg; he will be out for the remainder of the season.

The only drawback for Belleville was last week's game against Paterson Kennedy, who defeated the Bucs, 4-1. JFK took control with three goals in the first 10 minutes and coasted from there. "We're going to win our fair share of games and I think we may even surprise some people," said the optimistic coach. "Of course, losing a player like Freddy is going to hurt us, but we still have a solid, veteran club for the first time in a while."

## Belleville-Nutley Contest A 'Vintage' Football Game

For five weeks, Buc Shots featured some of the best Belleville-Nutley football games of the past. The theme of every article was that the Belleville-Nutley rivalry was just as intense now as it was 30 years ago. It's a natural rivalry and a game that everyone can enjoy.

Last week, these two clubs renewed the rivalry in 1983 and without a doubt, this contest was one of the best games played between these two clubs in a long, long time. As most of you know, the Buccaneers won, 12-6, with Michael Murphy scoring two touchdowns and rushing for over 170 yards in the contest. That can be read in the news story. The real story of the game came in the trenches, the hard hitting on the front line and the class with which this game was played.

This was a vintage game from kickoff. On one side, there was Belleville High School — the visiting team, a state ranked ball club and winners of the past five Belleville-Nutley encounters. The Bucs fielded a pretty sizeable ballclub, had a great deal of experience and are known to be a very good road club. As a matter of fact, Belleville has never lost a game in their blue and white road uniforms, the uniforms having been adopted back in 1980.

On the other side, enter Nutley, a young ball club, very well coached, a hard hitting ball club that might not have been as big as Belleville, but possessed just as much guts and courage. This was a class team, much improved from its somewhat spotty behavior of a year ago and a team that will win its share of ball games this fall.

There were many heroes in this game. The heroes weren't easy to find. They weren't flashy, they weren't superb, they were just tough. That's the story of the Belleville-Nutley game. It's been that way for God knows how long. It's a story of two teams playing their hearts out. Forget about the records in this game. It was just two teams who know each other pretty well off the field, but for 48 minutes, it was go for the glory on the field.

For Belleville, the list is long, but it's hard to overlook the outstanding effort put forth by the offensive line. "Tough game," said Mike Murphy after the war had ended. "I'll tell you one thing, the line did a great job."

Mike Murphy, a 245 pound bulldozer with a football in his hand, has the chance to become one of the all time great backs, not only in Belleville history, but perhaps state history. He has good speed, can run over defenders and is totally dedicated to playing this game. However, Murphy is a total gentleman off the field and gave the credit to where it is sometimes forgotten, to the offensive line. Players like Ralph De Falco, number 63, Dom Do Paolo, number 66, John Apicella, '62, Dave Mozeika, 34, Robert Mozeika, 71, Anthony Lombardi, 54 and a countless number of other linemen made those holes so that Murphy, along with Frank Tursi, Billy Baber and Mark Walsh could run through them.

The Belleville defense, which has been so superb the last three years, continued to shine. Although the Bucs lost their defensive coordinator, Tony Sorrentino to a head coaching

job at Midland Park, they have pulled together with Joe D'Ambola calling the signals now. It seems as if they never missed a beat. Joe D'Ambola has been around the Belleville football scene for many years. He has been the assistant to John Senesky for seven years now and is a top flight football man. Maybe he could be a head coach some place else, but having him in Belleville is

one of the best things that could have ever happen to the organization. D'Ambola does his job in a quiet way, but without him, the success would never be so consistent.

You can go on and on. There's John "I'll never call for a fair catch" Oliveri, who returns punts with reckless abandon, somewhat in the mold of Bruce Harper or one time great Mike Battle. He's taken some vicious licks, but like that reliable Timex watch, he keeps on tickin'.

The catalyst to all this is head coach John Senesky. The king of organization, his teams drill with the precision of marines after six weeks of boot camp. They even line up in numerical order during the National Anthem. Everything about this program is first class. You can't begin to imagine the work that goes into an operation like this and sometimes people might take it for

granted. The answer to that would be look at the record. Over the past four seasons and including the opener last week, Belleville has a regular season record of 32-5. Since Senesky took over, the Bucs have a regular season mark of 40-14-1. They have been to the playoffs three of the last four years and everyone knows they should have gone in 1981 as well. They have produced countless memories. What we're seeing is perhaps one of the best football programs in the state of New Jersey. One day, it may be the best.

For Nutley, this is a squad that lost a good deal to graduation. They didn't lose their sense of hard play and never give up attitude. They possess a fine super runner in Michael Lubertazzi and a dangerous runner in Gary Geraghty. Its quarterback, Louis Scerbo, can rifle the ball with the best in Essex County. Bob Harbison, their wide receiver, has a good pair of hands and should be on many receiving ends of Scerbo passes.

Coach Pete La Barbiera came to Nutley in 1982 and immediately led them to a 6-3 mark. Chances are good that Nutley can duplicate that record this season, if not improve it. At the Belleville-Nutley game last Saturday, you saw two fine football programs going head on. Perhaps Belleville is a little ahead of the Raiders as far as experience is concerned. However, the Belleville-Nutley rivalry continues to burn fiercely and proudly. It will be burn-

ing for years to come.

In case anyone is interested, a decision has been made on the Belleville High School athlete of the year in the girls' category. As a lot of you know, the award has been presented to the top male and female senior athlete since 1980. It has gained a lot of popularity over the years and has been a pleasure to present. That's why it's with great displeasure that the award will be cancelled in the girls' category for this school year. It seems that there has been too much importance placed on this award, and the worst part is, the importance doesn't come from the respective athletes who stand to lose the most from it. Jets Discover True Power Beating Rams on Sunday

Last Sunday afternoon, the New York Jets played the Los Angeles Rams in a game that started off looking like football but ended up in near warfare, both on the field and in the stands.

In other games around the NFL, the Cards nipped the Eagles, the Cowboys stunned the Saints, Minnesota edged Detroit, Buffalo breezed by Houston, Baltimore won its second game of the year, stopping Chicago in overtime, Miami continued to win, Cincy won for the first time, New England surprised Pittsburgh, the Browns upset the Chargers, Washington breezed by Seattle, San Francisco stopped Atlanta and the Los Angeles Raiders, perhaps the best team in the NFL right now, won its fourth game in four tries, whipping the Denver Broncos.

Over at Shea, the Jets won an emotional game from the Rams, 27-24, the second straight week in which the Rams lost a 27-24 game. For the Jets, Freeman Mc Neill separated a shoulder and will miss six to eight weeks of action. For those who did play the entire game, there was plenty of action. The Jets had to rally from deficits of 7-0, 14-7 and 17-14 to forge a 24-17 lead late in regulation time. The Rams came back, however, tying matters with just seconds left on the clock.

Pat Leahy's toe was the difference in the extra session as the nine year veteran boomed a 26 yard field goal through the uprights to give the Jets a very big win. A loss would have dropped them to 1-3 in the standings and set them dead last in the AFC east. While the Jets were picking up a win, Mark Gastineau and his war-dance nearly set off a major riot in the third quarter. Both teams were hitting hard throughout the contest and a number of near scuffles nearly broke out during the course of the game.

However, Gastineau set the mood of the early evening when he did his crowd pleasing dance following a sack of Vince Ferragamo and Jackie Slater, the Rams offensive tackle decided that the dance was an insult to his ball club. Slater ran up behind Gastineau, pushed him and the melee began. Both teams emptied onto the field and it took nearly five minutes to cool things off. No one was thrown out, but both teams were hit with major penalties. After the scur-mish in the stands, things got ugly in the stands with a number of nasty fights breaking out among the big crowd. It certainly wasn't a night of fun and entertainment at Shea Stadium.

For this weeks picks : SAN DIEGO AT GIANTS: Are you kidding? Despite the fact that San Diego is 1-3, they are ten times better than the Giants and should breeze here. The Giants secondary isn't bad, but that's not good when Dan Fouts and Company arrive. JETS AT BUFFALO: (MONDAY NIGHT) These two did not play each other at all last year because of the strike. missed Nutley field goal.

Following a five-yard penalty, Baber carried for 11 yards followed with another run for five yards, and Tursi scrambled another six to the Belleville 37. From there Murphy picked up 30 yards in two carries and Baber added four more yards to the Maroon 30. It was at that point that Belleville took advantage of a big opportunity. Walsh rolled out to pass and fired to tight end Dave Mozeika. Mozeika tipped the ball in the air and following a seemingly endless flight, the ball ended in the hands of Tursi for a 22-yard gain and a first and goal on the Maroon eight.

From there it was Mr. Murphy trucking through the Raiders line, scoring from a yard out two plays later, giving Belleville a 6-0 lead. The Bucs missed the point after kick.

Nutley took the ensuing kickoff but could not mount a drive. Following a 20-yard punt, the Bucs took possession on the Raider 40. From there Baber picked up eight yards to the 32 and Murphy added four more to the Raider 28. Tursi added three yards and Walsh, on a quarterback keeper, got Belleville a first down on a 10-yard bootleg. Murphy then picked up two yards to the 13 and finished the drive with a 13-yard run up the middle to pay dirt. The Bucs attempt at the two-point conversion failed and the lead was 12-0.

Belleville threatened to blow things wide open late in the first half when Nutley quarterback Lou Scerbo fumbled on his 20 and Anthony Tucci recovered for Belleville. However, the Nutley defense was able to do the job and the half ended with Belleville ahead, 12-0.

The Buccaneer defense was in total command in the third quarter,

holding the Raiders to near silence while the Belleville offense was relatively quiet. Nutley's only score came late in the fourth quarter with Murphy, who plays defensive end on the other half of the coin, on the bench nursing a mild injury. From their 27, the Raiders used some strong runs by running back Mike Lubertazzi, Gary Geraghty and the passes of Scerbo to mount a strong drive. Scerbo's 24-yard pass to Bob Harbison clinched the Raiders first score of the season. They missed the two-point conversion and their attempt at an onside kick failed when Baber recovered the kick.

The Bucs ran the clock out with their strong running game and came away with a tough, hard-fought victory.

"Any time you play Nutley," said Senesky, "it's always like this. They play hard and it's always a close game. As far as we're concerned, I was very happy with the play of Baber and Tursi. They form a nice complement to Murphy. The defense did a nice job. We made some mistakes, basically penalties, but we cut down on our turnovers, and most importantly, we didn't have any injuries. The kids were in good condition."

Senesky refers to the Belleville-Nutley game as a "good rivalry." Last Saturday was a vintage example of what a great rivalry the game is.

NOTES: The victory over Nutley was the sixth straight for Belleville dating back to 1978. Most of the games have been close. The scores, including this year have been 12-6, 10-3, 26-0, 13-7, 7-0 and 31-0. Nutley's touchdown was their first against Belleville since 1980 and their first in Nutley since 1977. Crowd was estimated to be near 8,000 at Nutley Park Oval.

# School System Needs Instructor Qualified to Teach Vietnamese

led out of regular classes for a set period of time each day for intense practice in English, he said. Students who share a common language are grouped in each ESL class and the classes are taught in English.

By contrast, bilingual classes are taught in the primary language of the student group. Bilingual pupils are classified on a scale of 1-6 with the highest figure representing those least proficient in English.

The degree of proficiency in English determines what percentage of that student's instruction must be in his native language, said Rosamilia.

The administrator noted that although Belleville does not offer bilingual classes, substituting a double ESL period instead, many of those students demonstrate very weak English proficiency.

In addition to overseeing the ESL programs in the senior highs and middle schools, Rosamilia is the principal of School 7, the district's

magnet school. All Belleville elementary students in need of ESL attend School 7 even if they must be bused there.

The students attend regular classes but are pulled out for their ESL periods twice daily.

When asked how they adapt to this situation, the administrator replied, "They really seem to be working out very well. We spread them out so that they're in different classes and they benefit from interacting with English-speaking classmates."

He added that since all those students eat lunch in school, they profit by socializing with the others.

In addition, Rosamilia and his ESL staff are seeking creative methods for coping with the language barriers which he sees as more persistent among today's student population than among previous ones.

The administrator observed that in the past, children who spoke a prior language were aided in their ef-

forts to learn English by parents who tried to learn the new language themselves and use it at home.

He does not feel such reinforcement is evident today. "Many of our students speak only their native language at home where they also listen to radio and television programs on foreign language stations."

As a result, he said, the progress students make in learning English in the classroom can vanish over a weekend or any extended vacation from school.

"We're trying to remedy that by setting up a library of cassette tapes those students can check out for home study so they maintain their exposure to English," he said.

"We want them to get all the practice they can. To survive in America today, these students must learn to use the English language fluently," the administrator insisted.

As of last week, Belleville's ESL population breaks down as follows: senior high school — nine Hispanics, 15 Vietnamese, 27 other; middle school — five Hispanics, three Vietnamese, 10 other; School 7 — 28 Hispanics, 14 Vietnamese, seven other.

Since last June, according to Rosamilia, the district experienced an unexpectedly large influx of Vietnamese students at the senior high school level.

"These figures could still change, though. Many of these students register in their area schools until it is determined they require the special attention of the ESL program."

# Hearing on Rent Ordinance Monday Night at Town Hall

tures, major appliances and other items which do not appreciably prolong the life or improve the condition of the building."

Rent Board Attorney Frank Cozzarelli said this week the matter was brought to court questioning the distinction between a "capital improvement" and a "major capital improvement."

"There was also some question about the vagueness of the present wording," said Cozzarelli, who added that the court questioned the fairness of defining as a capital improvement any action that enhances rental value of a unit and becomes the burden of the tenant.

Local rent laws have distinguished between improvements that are routine maintenance and repairs of a landlord's property and those that are substantial alterations and upgrading.

The differentiation is important in cases where landlords seek various rent increases before the rent leveling board. Under the ordinance, Belleville landlords are automatically entitled to no more than an annual 6 percent rent increase on each dwelling unit.

Any landlord failing to realize a 10 percent profit on his property in a given year may apply to the rent board for a hardship increase hearing. At such a hearing, the board examines the bills for routine upkeep of the rental property and determines if an increase, above the allowable 6

percent is warranted for that year. If so, the board sets the amount the landlord can further ask and limits the period of time in which the hardship increases can be leveled.

In addition, Section XIV of the ordinance allows landlords to seek additional rental for major capital improvements or service. Landlords must also appeal to the board for approval of such an increase which, by

local law, cannot exceed 15 percent of the rent for each unit.

This section permits landlords to pass on to tenants certain portions of investments made in the property value itself and it was that point that was challenged as unclear in court.

The proposed amendment comes up for public hearing and final vote at the Oct. 3 Commissioners' meeting in Town Hall.

## Little Theatre's 'Tribute' Is Excellent Entertainment

For one night this month, turn off the tube, ignore the season premiere of another warmed over situation comedy and enjoy an evening of real entertainment at Nutley Little Theater's production of Bernard Slade's "Tribute."

Audiences who seek an involving story well performed won't be disappointed in the local mounting of this bittersweet play about a charming show business publicist who learns he is dying and tries to make amends to the grown son he has neglected over the years.

Ideally suited to NLT's small auditorium, "Tribute" traces three months in the life of Scottie Templeton, a fun-loving, sometime entertainer who never really made it as a performer and turned his talents for charming people to public relations instead, a job he really isn't very good at either.

Scottie is an irresponsible "Peter Pan" who likes flashy girls, parties, jokes, and fun. People like him for this and excuse his inability to follow through on anything.

Even his ex-wife, Maggie, can't stay mad at him although he left her and their only son Jud, years ago to fend for themselves as he partied around.

However, Jud is one person who cannot excuse his father's failings, and the play opens with Scottie expecting a visit from the college age son he has not seen for several years.

A studious youth, Jud resents his father for abandoning him at age 8, and that resentment, coupled with Scottie's attempts to introduce Jud to a lighter life of wine and women lead to the play's major emotional confrontations.

Complicating those matters, Scottie has just learned he is suffering from leukemia and may not have much time left. He resists medical treatment, fearing what he may be reduced to.

The unlikely happens as it falls to Jud to persuade his father to follow the doctor's orders.

Frank McCormick, an NLT veteran, gives a warm, skilled performance as the funny man who refuses to take anything, even his illness, seriously.

McCormick delivers Scottie's lines convincingly and gets appropriate laughs but Scottie is a complicated man. Despite his surface charm, he is high-strung, incapable of aloneness and not very admirable in his somewhat shallow approach to human relations, a fact with which he later comes to grips.

It's easy to like McCormick's Scottie but not so easy to see the character's flaws in his performance.

Robert Diachessyn was more successful in conveying both sides of the son. Aloof and intense, Jud is hard to take when he criticizes everyone who understandably likes his appealing father.

Yet his anger is justifiable, especially when he learns the girl he met in a museum, Sally Haines, was actually one of his father's many female pals, set up as a token date for the shy Jud.

As Sally, Victoria Frank was believable and attractive. A good link of father to son since both find her appealing.

Betsy Newberry was equally convincing as Maggie Stratton, Jud's mother and ex-wife of Scottie. Newberry played Maggie as the tolerant, wholesome "old fashioned" girl who wanted a stable, solid marriage. She finally found that with her second husband, but has not outgrown the charm of her first one.

Lin Weber Cort displayed good style as Hilary, the call girl turned travel agent who never forgot the kindnesses paid her by Scottie, a former customer turned friend.

"You treated everybody the same, Scottie," she tells him. "You are a man with no priorities." As Jud points out, "She meant it as a compliment," but the son who wants to be a priority cannot tolerate such democracy in his own father's affections.

Cort is sexy and smart as Hilary and equally hilarious when she masquerades as a shrill, spinsterish home nurse sent to Scottie as a practical joke.

She noted that in the event an emergency strikes when CMHS is unavailable for response, calls will be forwarded to the emergency unit operating out of East Orange General Hospital.

The response team there will determine if the caller can be calmed over the telephone, is capable of waiting until CMHS is available, should be taken to the nearest hospital, namely Clara Maass Medical Center or requires an immediate emergency visit by the mobile unit.

The mobile team consists of a social worker and a nurse who maintain radio contact in the course of the house call with a hospital psychiatrist.

Presently, the unit operates from 8 a.m. to midnight seven days a week but plans call for expansion to round-the-clock service.

Those in need should dial the CMHS number at 751-1630. CMHS operates Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. and on Thursday and Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and all calls will be forwarded during CMHS off hours. There is no fee for any treatment and service is available to any resident in need.

## Family Players Superb In 'West Side Story'

"West Side Story" has always been one of my favorite musicals. The contemporary Romeo and Juliet story that also mirrors the seething problems brought on by gang warfare and the sudden influx of Puerto Ricans into the life of New York City in the 1950s, is the Holy Family Players premiere production for the 1983-84 season. After seeing Sunday's performance, I like it more than ever.

Under the creative and skilled directorship of Nicholas J. Furriss, the cast has been working on the production since May, and their hard work has paid off. They bring an energy and enthusiasm to the play that's absolutely contagious.

The production is a pleasure right from the first strains of the opening medley. The orchestra does an exceptional job on the marvelous Leonard Bernstein score. Conductor Lydia Bruno of Nutley and her assistant, Michael Silvester, who was at the podium for Sunday's show, are to be commended.

The simple, but effective brick background set, designed by producer Joseph G. Furnari (who also plays "Doc") and director Nicholas Furriss, enhance the play by starkly dramatizing the environment of the story.

But the biggest congratulations of all must go to choreographer Lucio Fernandez, a name we will no doubt soon see somewhere along the Great White Way. Not only has he taken a previously inexperienced and basically unskilled cast and turned them into adept and admirable dancers, but he and Jill Echo literally stop the show in the "Somewhere Ballet" in Act II.

Other outstanding musical numbers include "Tonight," the tender duet between Tony (Paul T. Bruno) and Maria (Patricia Tatoli) who incidentally do a credible job as the star-crossed lovers; "America" performed with panache by the Sharks' girlfriends, led by Anita (Mary Lou Clark); and "Gee Officer Krupke," a lively tongue-in-cheek number, that shows the Jets at their very best, among them Action (Michael Caruso) who brings such intensity and vitality to the role that he commands attention.

The entire cast does a great job on one of the great musicals of all times. If you're looking for an entertaining evening that's sure to please, head down to the Family Playhouse and see the Holy Family Players at their prime, in their premiere production of West Side Story.

Performances for West Side Story will continue at the Holy Family Playhouse tomorrow night at 8. Other performances are slated for this Saturday evening, also at 8, this Sunday afternoon at 4, and Oct. 7, 8 and 9. Call 284-0134 for ticket information.
