Last week, these two clubs renewed the rivalry in 1983 and without a doubt, this contest was one of the best games played between these two clubs in a long, long time. As most of you know, the Buccaneers won, 12-6, with Michael Murphy scoring two touchdowns and rushing for over 170 yards in the contest. That can be read in the news story. The real story of the game came in the trenches, the hard hitting on the front line and the class with which this game was played.

This was a vintage game from kickoff. On one side, there was Belleville High School team, a state ranked ball club and winners of the past five Belleville Nutley encounters. The Bucs fielded a pretty sizeable ballclub, had a great deal of experience and are known to be a very good road club. As a matter of fact, Belleville has never lost a game in their blue and white road uniforms, the uniforms having been adopted back in 1980.

On the other side, enter Nutley, a young ball club, very well coached, a hard hitting ball club that might not have been as big as Belleville, but possessed just as much guts and courage. This was a class team, much improved from its somewhat spotty behavior of a year ago and a team that will win its share of ball games this fall.

There were many heroes in this game. The heroes weren't easy to find. They weren't flashy, they weren't superb, they were just tough. That's the story of the Belleville-Nutley game. It's been that way for God knows how long. It's a story of two teams playing their hearts out. Forget about the records in this game. It was just two teams who know each other pretty well off the field, but for 48 minutes, it was go for the glory on the field.

For Belleville, the list is long, but it's hard to overlook the outstanding effort put forth by the offensive line "Tough game," said Mike Murphy after the war had ended. "I'll tell you

one thing, the line did a great job."
Mike Murphy, a 245 pound bulldozer with a football in his hand, has the chance to become one of the all time great backs, not only in Belleville history, but perhaps state history. He has good speed, can run over defenders and is totally dedicated to playing this game. However. Murphy is a total gentleman off the field and gave the credit to where it is sometimes forgotten, to the offensive line. Players like Ralph De Falco, number 63, Dom Do Paolo, number 66, John Apicella, 62, Dave Mozeika, 34, Robert Mozeika, 71, Anthony Lombardi, 54 and a countless number of other linemen made those holes so that Murphy, along with Frank Tursi, Billy Baber and Mark Walsh could run through

The Belleville defense, which has been so superb the last three years, continued to shine. Although the Bucs lost their defensive coordinator, Tony Sorrentino to a head coaching

job at Midland Park, they have pulled together with Joe D'Ambola calling the signals now. It seems as if they never missed a beat. Joe D'Ambola has been around the Belleville football scene for many years. He has been the assistant to John Senesky for seven years now and is a top flight football man. Maybe he could be a head coach some place else, but having him in Belleville is

one of the best things that could have ever happend to the organization. D'Ambola does his job in a quiet way, but without him, the success would never be so consistent.

You can go on and on. There's John "I'll never call for a fair catch' Oliveri, who returns punts with reckless abandon, somewhat in the mold of Bruce Harper or one time great Mike Battle. He's taken some vicious licks, but like that reliable Timex watch, he keeps on tickin'.

The catalyst to all this is head coach John Senesky. The king of organization, his teams drill with the precision of marines after six weeks of boot camp. They even line up in numerical order during the National Anthem. Everything about this program is first class. You can't begin to imagine the work that goes into an operation like this and sometimes people might take it for

Since Senesky took over. the Bucs have a regular season mark of 40-14-1. They have been to the playoffs three of the last four years and everyone knows they should have gone in 1981 as well. They have produced countless memories. What we're seeing is perhaps one of the best football programs in the state of New Jersey. One day, it may be the

For Nutley, this is a squad that lost a good deal to graduation. They didn't lose their sense of hard play and never give up attitude. They possess a fine super runner in Michael Lubertazzi and a dangerous runner in Gary Geraghty. Its quarterback Louis Scerbo, can rifle the ball with the best in Essex County. Bob Harbison, their wide receiver, has a good pair of hands and should be on many receiving ends of Scerbo passes.

Coach Pete La Barbiera came to Nutley in 1982 and immediately led them to a 6-3 mark. Chances are good that Nutley can duplicate that record this season, if not improve it. At the Belleville-Nutley game last Saturday, you saw two fine football programs going head on. Perhaps Belleville is a little ahead of the Raiders as far as experience is concerned. However, the Belleville-Nutley rivalry continues to burn fiercely and proudly. It will be burning for years to come.

In case anyone is interested a decision has been made on the Belleville High School athlete of the year in the girls' category. As a lot of you know, the award has been presented to the top male and female senior athlete since 1980. It has gained a lot of popularity over the years and has been a pleasure to present. Rent Board Attorney Frank Cozzarelli said this week the matter was brought to court questioning the distinction between a "capital improvement" and a "major capital improvement."

There was also some question about the vagueness of the present wording," said Cozzarelli, who added that the court questioned the fairness of defining as a capital improvement any action that enhances rental value of a unit and becomes the burden of the tenant.

The differentiation is important in cases where landlords seek various rent increases before the rent leveling board. Under the ordinance, Belleville landlords are automatically enpercent rent increase on each dwell-

Local rent laws have distinguished between improvements that are routine maintenance and repairs of a landlord's property and those that are substantial alterations

Any landlord failing to realize a 10 percent profit on his property in a given year may apply to the rent board for a hardship increase hearing. At such a hearing, the board examines the bills for routine upkeep of the rental property and determines if



Family Players Superb In 'West Side Story'

"West Side Story" has always been one of my favorite musicals. The contemporary Romeo and Juliet story that also mirrors the seething problems brought on by gang warfare and the sudden influx of Puerto Ricans into the life of New York City in the 1950s, is the Holy Family Players premiere production for the 1983-84 season. After seeing Sunday's performance, I like it more than ever

Under the creative and skilled directorship of Nicholas J. Furris, the cast has been working on the production since May, and their hard work has paid off. They bring an energy and enthusiasm to the play that's absolutely contagious.

The production is a pleasure right from the first strains of the opening medley. The orchestra does an exceptional job on the marvelous Leonard Bernstein score. Conductor Lydia Bruno of Nutley and her assistant, Michael Silvester, who was at the podium for Sunday's show, are to be commended.

The simple, but effective brick background set, designed by producer Joseph G. Furnari (who also plays "Doc") and director Nicholas Furris, enhance the play by starkly dramatizing the environment of the story.

But the biggest congratulations of all must go to choreographer Lucio Fernandez, a name we will no doubt soon see somewhere along the Great White Way. Not only has he taken a previously inexperienced and basically unskilled cast and turned them into adept and admirable dancers, but he and Jill Echo literally stop the show in

the "Somewhere Ballet" in Act II. Other outstanding musical numbers include "Tonight," the tender duet between Tony (Paul T. 



Belleville's Past

However, the mill went unbuilt. In 1815 or '16 its site was taken over by Thomas Uffington, an English goldbeater, who employed 20 to 25 men. Several years later Uffington sold the goldbeating part of his business to a certain Mr. Jones of New York City, and turned to the manufacture and rolling of sheet brass, utilizing the local copper and the zinc from the Franklin township mines in Sussex County. In 1818 he rolled the first copper wire. He now included the making of "umbrella furniture, runners, ferrules, tips and strainers, for which he rolled the wire." It was with Uffington's preoccupation with the drawing of copper wire that the wire industry, which eventually became firmly entrenched in Belleville's economic

scheme, first made its appearance. Soon after Uffington purchased a brass lamp business begun by a certain Mr. Bragg in the old Courtlandt house, "nearly opposite the Big Rock, adjoining the Minard Coeyman tract," and relinquished by Bragg when he failed to make a go of it. By now Uffington's workers numbered 50 to 60, "12 or 15 of whom were apprentices and provided for in his own house," which was the McComb mansion on 123 Main Street. Next to the Hendricks mills, Uffington had become the largest employer in town

Probably in 1833 Uffington ran into foul weather and sold his business to William Stephens, who had conducted his own brass lamp factory at the premises of his father-in-law, James Hornblower, on the east side of Main Street, just south of the old Dutch church. Stephens took a Thomas Thomas and a Mr. Fuller as his partners. They took the firm name of Stephens, Thomas & Fuller.

The crisis of 1837 threw its sudden damp on the hopeful signs of industrial expansion. In fact, Wil-. liam Stephens, the senior partner of his firm, saw so little hope for the future that he offered for lease "the premises formerly occupied by the subscriber as a Lamp Factory and Brass Foundry...being situated in the Main Street and in the center of the village and having a spacious dock in the rear.
