The Buccaneers will begin the '84 campaign with a contest against Don Bosco Prep of Ramsey, away, on Sept. 22. Belleville's final preseason contest will be on Saturday when the club arms start.

"There were some good things in that game." Senesky said. "There's a lot of work todo, but I was happy with the effort. The seniors took charge of the team. The offensive line did a solid job and there were some good things happening out there."

The offensive line, a veteran group of athletes, should be a tough assignment for opposing defenses this year. The guards are seniors John Apicella and Dominick Di Paolo. The tackles are Bob Mozeika 'and Steve Tribuna, the center is Ed Stangl and the tight end is senior Steve Kimble. All those men were starters in 1983 and have improved their strength during the off season. "Right now we're working on depth at the different positions," said Senesky. "It's a long season and we'll be facing some big teams. The object of the scrimmages is to give the kids experience at different positions and give our starters some good back ups."

The offensive backfield, which

The offensive backfield, which was hit hard by graduation, will show a familiar figure at quarterback. Senior Mark Walsh, a three-year starter at safety and two-year quarterback, will steady the offense. At 6 2", 190 pounds, Walsh should be able to see over opposing defenses and spot open receivers.

The running backs currently battling for starting positions are seniors John Oliveri, Anthony Gizzo and Michael Gibbons. Senior Jim Caponi is also vying for time in the backfield, as is junior Sean Mulcahey and senior Anthony La Bruzza. Oliveri, Gizzo and Gibbons have varsity experience, however, most of their time has been on defense. Oliveri sees time in the defensive backfield and returns punts. Gizzo is a solid defensive safety and Gibbons is a tough nose tackle.

On defense, Senesky admits to some "shifting" in the early going. "There are some holes in the defense." the coach said. "There are some bright spots, too. Depth is the key with the defense. We have some good front line players and are looking for depth at certain positions."

Returning to anchor the Bucefense will be Walsh at safety, Steve Kimble at defensive end, Tribuna and Mozeika at guard, Gibbons at nose tackle and Gizzo at defensive back. The linebackers currently fighting for positions are Di Paolo, Dave Long, Robeils and Andy Martinez.

"The attitude is good," the coach said. "Our conditioning is

very good. Last weekend against West Essex we received some compliments from the officials on our conditioning. I know the seniors are waiting for the chance to start the season. They are anxious and want to get things started."

Out-of Towners Are Sneaking In

A stern warning was issued by Michael D. Nardiello, superintendent of schools, that legal action will be taken against any student illegally attending Belleville schools.

Nardiello says that numerous reports have come to his attention of students attempting to attend Belleville schools who do not live in the township. He has tried, he says, to ascertain how many have made such a try and where they come from, but without success.

"We can't get a fix on those who would violate our residency requirements. The reports we get don't include any specifics, but we know that such attempts have been made. We want to be sure it doesn't happen here and that is why we have issued this warning."

The superintendent told The Believille Times that he had discussed the matter with the Board of Education which expressed concern that such illegal students might try to attend Belleville classes.

"Belleville schools are for Belleville residents only. Those students attending illegally, and their parents will face legal Board of Education action. If you know of anyone attending your schools it legally, please call this office at 7517407. Your call will be kept in strict confidence" was the text of the statement issued by Superintendent Nardiello's office.

The school administration acted following a number of calls and reports about out-of-Belleville students attending the township's schools. Some reports specifically concerned illegal students at the high school.

School attendance in Beleville. Like those of other municipalities in New Jersey, is determined by residence. The rules are strict for most school districts so as to properly conform to the law and the use of educational funds.

"I hope that those who know of any student illegally attending our schools will come forward to let us know where and when that took place. We, of course, will keep such information in the

The Believille Rent Levelling
Board will hear complaints about
alleged rent overcharging from tenants of the Bridgebrook apartments at a special meeting Monday, Sept. 17.

The Belleville Rent Control
Law permits annual rent increases
of no more than 6 percent. Any
amount over that is illegal.

There are, however, other
grounds for rent increases under
the present law such as hardship
and parity that permit landlords
to increase rentals. Each individual complaint will be heard
from the Bridgebrook tenants.
For the purpose of this particular
hearing a special counsel, High
Luccariello of Manlewood, has
been appointed.

The hardship increase, if
granted, are based upon claims by
the landlord that he has not been
able to obtain a "reasonable
profit." A parity increase refers to
renting an apartment of comparable size at the same rent as
had been charged by a departing
tenant. Landlords are permitted,
under Belleville's current rent law,
to increase rents to a limit of 6
percent. If any other increase is
desired, the landlord must appear
before the Rent Levelling Board
and apply to one of the exceptions.

Orechio Bill Advocates Fingerprinting of Staff Human Service Commissioner George Albanese and Attorney General Irwin Kimmelman have all announced their support for Senator Orechio's proposal. Here in Nutley. Orechio is a commis-sioner and the director of the Public Safety Department.

All current and prospective employees of private and public child care centers should be required to undergo fingerprinting and criminal background checks under legislation recently proposed by Senate President Carmen A. Orechio.

Under the meaure, which will be introduced when the Senate convenes next month, current employees who refuse to be fingerprinted for backgound checks would be dismissed. Any such employee who has been convicted of sexually, physically or emotionally abusing a child would be barred from employment at child care centers.

The proposal follows several disclosures of sexual abuse of children at day care centers and is similar to the future.

"The time has come when this should be done one a mandatory basis," Senator Orechio said.

He stated that also under consideration was an expansion of the requirement to cover workers at state institutions, foster and group homes for children as well as individuals who operate private child care centers in their homes. Public hearings will be held in the near future on the measure which is still in draft form.






Taken from the pages of a recent issue of TIME written by Mimi Sheraton in the books section of that publication, we were intrigued by the captioned title "What's the Beef?" in a review of the book Modern Meat by Orville Schell, Random House; 337 pgs., \$17.85.

The quintessential essence of the theme centers upon the reality that not many Americans who bite into a hamburger or a leg of fried chicken realize that along with the expected seasonings, they are probably getting generous helping of hormones, antibiotics, insecticides, and even printer's ink from wastepaper that was recycled into animal feed. Such unappetizing and potentially harmful gifts come courtesy of the meat producers who routinely feed them to livestock to promote growth, not only in the animals but in their own

come courtesy of the meat producers who routinely feed them to livestock to promote growth, not only in the animals but in their own bank accounts.

The author acknowledges the progress that has been made in providing Americans with an abundant meat supply at low prices, but he and many research scientists he interviewed warn that before such feeding practices are continued, more should be learned about their lasting effects on consumers. It is also essential, he says, that more effective methods of Government inspection be devised to guard against the illegal use of such substances.

Mr. Schell, a respected journalist and China watcher, is also a pig farmer, a term he prefers to the meat industry's title, pork producer. It was his own reliance on chemicals and pharmaceuticals, in chores like helping a sow give birth to a particularly difficult litter, that started him wondering just how widespread the use of antibiotics and hormones might be.

This book is the result of findings on his trip throughout the country. It is compelling, and often frightening. The overprocessed meats eaten en route, such as boneless "restructured" spare-ribs, prefrozen, preportioned steaks, and turkey roll that had no dark meat whetted his concern.
