As for the national political, writers, specifically, Cuomo states "I do notice an in creasing interest in my ethnicity, and one has to wonder about that" At different times, Governor Cuomo also criticized news organizations for using the word. "Mafia" to describe organized crime. Cuomo makes the point organized crime goes beyond the Mafia, which automatically translates to Italian heritage.

Come to think of it, growing up in the town of Nutley, we felt the heel of oppression because our name began and ended in "O". In Nutley, time has made a difference, although, we frankly believe the bigots remain bigots—at least those that are still around. They will never change, but the consoling fact is that these bigots are not bigoted against Italian-Americans. We can include our Jewish brothers and sisters, our black brethren—and our recently arrived Oriental friends among us who are being scorned by the same bigots who gave us the treatment as we wended our was through life, not only in Nutley, but throughout not only in Nutley, but throughout this great nation of ours.

Trying to change people's minds won't help — it's the heart that needs change — and a few trans

needs change— and a few transplants might help some bigots bet ter understand, appreciate and love the minorities. Change a person's heart, and the mind changes automatically.

What more sacrifices are required of an ethnic group in order to be accepted as full-blooded. Americans? The Constitution of the United States guarantees equality and justice for all. To some of ps, at times, the words give us the strange feeling of emptiness—since in the real world, equality and justice are hard to come by.

Director of the Division in 1982
and has been Acting Director since
last November. Last year, Parrillo
successfully argued before the U.S.
Supreme Court New Jersey: position which established the state's
power to purge mob-connected
labor officials from unions representing casino workers. O'Brien,
the former boss of the Division, applauded Parrillo's appointment,
emphasizing the continuity to the platided Partitio's appointment, emphasizing the continuity to the regulatory process that Parrillo's promotion provides. It is the first time in the Division's history that a person from within was promoted to the top spot.

Once again, Tom Kean is to be complimented for making the appointment that continues his quest to maintain government with un-impeachable integrity. In Parrillo, Governor Kean has

School board member tells truth about budget

It is also misleading to attempt to compare the educational system budgets of two adjacent towns unless both have equal numbers of student body, faculty and physical plants, etc.
If Mr. Golden did a little in depth homework, he would have found that over the last five years, including this projected 1986-87 increase of 26.03 tax points, that the Township of Belleville's educational budget has averaged annual cost of \$35 to a \$50,000 assessed, value homeowner.
