Asbestos plan may hike taxes

Following an outburst of public criticism concering the presence of friable asbestos in Belleville schools, the system's top ad-ministrator is planning a comprehensive asbestos management program that is likely to hike school taxes.

"Sure there will be a tax hike," Belleville Schools Superintendent Michael Nardiello told the Times, The cost of an asbestos management program is very prohibitive.

He said a thorough removal program could possibly cost as

much as \$500,000, but that fl asbestos encapsulation is largely recommended over the more ex pensive asbestos removal process the cost to taxpayers could be much lower.

Asbestos potentially cancerous
Asbestos partieles, believed by
government experts to be poten
tally cancerous over long periods
of continued exposure, have been
detected in the corridors and
rooms of nearly every township
school.

These asbestos levels were
recorded in a series of school
board commissioned tests taking
place from 1977 to the current
years.
