Train wars

Last week the Union County. Board of Freeholders voted to study the feasibility of linking their county seat – Elizabeth – to the airport via a rail link This link would provide an ex-ceptional shot in the arm for

spurring revitalization down town Elizabeth

spurring revitalization down-town Elizabeth. In Essex, meanwhile, there has been much talk of linking Downtown Newark to the air-port, for much the same reason. Governor Kean, in fact, has already publicly stated that he supports a Newark rail link. More than a century ago a similar "train war" took place when two competing railroad companies battled to lay the most track in a project that yielded the nation's first coast-lo-coast railway. The competition, historians point out, reculted in a speedy completion of the job and economic vitality to the many communities along the way. Perhaps a well-meaning "train war" could benefit both our county and Union County, if both count governments race to

the Union County be the first to connect their reeholders voted to downtowns with the airport

ac the first to connect their downlowns with the airport which lies in both counties Further, the rail-link project will be a good test of bi-partisan cooperation between the Democratic-controlled Essex board of freeholders and Republican Executive Elect Nicholas Amato. The county which wins the train war will likely be the first to reap the benefits of having the line in place. New development will be attracted, more peopla will come into the city, and the good publicity generated from the venture will be dramatic We think that Nicholas Amato has the state support and

has the state support and leadership skills to get a rail link to the airport — and to get it built before Union County gets theirs built. We already have much of the

required track in place, and we already have Governor Kean's approval.
