## Students receive test help

Organization offers reduced rate

Starting in the fall, Belleville High School seniors looking to achieve a decent grade on their Scholastic Aptitude Tests (S.A.T.) will receive assistance.

The Board of Education sought out Educational Services Center, Monsey, N.Y. to conduct preparatory classes for students wishing to take the S.A.T.'s.

The courses offer 24 hours of total instruction for two or three nights a week in classrooms with anywhere from 10 to 17 students.

But one of the most satisfying aspects of the plan, said Boardmember Louis Pallante, is the price. Educational Services will charge \$250 per attendant, instead of the normal \$295 per student. All fees will be paid by the parents if they choose to enroll their children.

"It's not costing the board anything. The board doesn't even say who is going to go," said Pallante.

Pallante added that this is just one of the ways the guidance department assists students.

"This is what our guidance counselors are doing. The guidance counselors reached out. I urged them to get some kind of S.A.T. program," he said.

"The school offers a course in S.A.T.'s, but it's nothing to this concentration. I don't think we've done this before," he added.

Pallante said the board did hear offers from other services, such as the Princeton Review, which charges \$750 per attendant.

Dr. Richard Benninger, director of the guidance department at Belleville High School, said most students who enter into the program do improve their test scores. The classes allow the students, "clues on how to take the exam."

"Most (students) are reasonably successful," said Benninger.

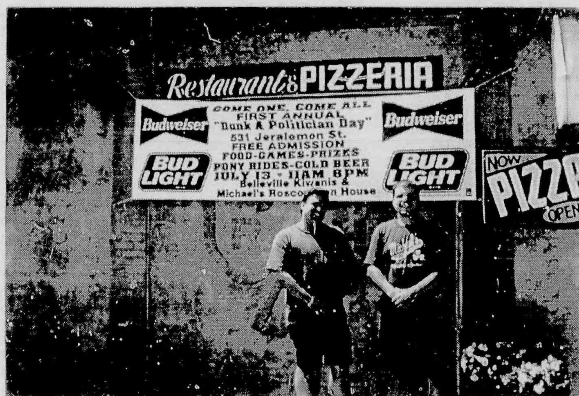
Benninger said parents are mailed promotional literature in enough time to give parents the option of which company they want to enroll their children with.

"There are several companies willing to do this," said Benninger.

## Fundraiser held by Kiwanis

If town residents have the proper aim, Mayor Victor Canning, Fourth Ward Councilman Mario Drozd, and other local politicians might become a little wet on Saturday.

The Belleville Kiwanis Club and Michael's Roscommon House are sponsoring their first ever 'Dunk A Politician Day' on July 13 from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. at 531 Jerusalem St.

The brainstorm of Tom Grolmond, who will be sworn in as president of the Kiwanis Club in October, the event will raise

money for the club's general charity fund.

"All the money raised will go right back into the community," said Grolmond. "It started out as a roast a pig in the parking lot, then it turned into outdoor liquor, then into this. Any elected official is welcomed to be dunked. I'm hoping for the best."

The festivities will include a dunking booth with the town's politicians poised over a container of water. Residents will then get to dunk the official with tennis balls. There will also be pony rides, a Coors truck ready to fill cups of beer, and plenty of concession

stands.

Other people and organizations lending a helping hand include Michael (Dauksis) Roscommon, owner of the Roscommon House, the Elk's club, Drozd, Canning, and the Belleville Fire Department.

While the Kiwanis Club receives help from the community, they also spend a vast amount of time helping organizations throughout Belleville.

They raised \$30,000 to purchase bullet-proof vests for Belleville Police, bring food to the

## Arson investigation continues...

## Local police wait to press charges

Belleville officials are waiting for notice from the Essex County Prosecutor's Office on whether or not to press charges on two of the women involved in the bizarre convenience store fires set last week.

All four suspects are Belleville residents, but only the 12-year-old girl has been charged with arson by the Lyndhurst Police Department and the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office, said Lt. Ken Spera of the Belleville Arson Unit.

The 12 year old allegedly set fire to merchandise with a cigarette lighter in a total of eight different convenience stores, one in Belleville and Nutley, two in Bloomfield and four in Lyndhurst, officials said.

In Belleville, the Quick Check on the corner of Washington Avenue and Little Street was visited by the suspects last Monday.

"She lit a rack of potato chips on fire. That's what they did," said Spera.

In each incident, one or two adult women would engage the store attendant in heated conversation, officials said, as the youth then strayed off and set the fires, said Nutley Fire Capt. Fred Scaleria.

The adult women, aged 33 and 26, along with the 12 year old and 4 year old, were questioned by police.

The bizarre arson incidents began June 27 at Knauer's, at 300 Broad St., Bloomfield. Then the

## Belleville graduate gets educational doctorate

James A. Corino, who was graduated from Belleville High School, has been awarded his doctorate in educational administration from Nova Southeastern University.

Corino has been principal of West Essex Regional High School since August, 1995. When he came on board, he was completing the last year of Nova's National Ed. D. Program for Educational Leaders. His doctoral dissertation focused on issues related to school climate, culture, and decision making.

Corino's studies and professional experience have helped him to formulate a philosophy of leadership that places a strong emphasis on collaboration and teamwork. He assumed his present position after serving for eight years as the principal of Lyndhurst High School. Corino began his career at that school as a teacher of business education and moved up the ranks to serve as director of athletics and vice principal. He served a one-

year stint as principal of a K-8 school before becoming Lyndhurst's high school principal.

At West Essex Regional High School, Corino has sought to develop a community of learning in congruence with the district's commitment to educational excellence. He holds high expectations for students and staff and believes that a partnership between the school, home, and community is essential. He recognizes the importance of providing the resources students need to achieve academically and to grow socially.

Corino holds a bachelor's degree in business education from Trenton State College and two master's degrees: one in business education from Trenton State College and the other in educational administration and supervision from William Paterson College. He has spoken frequently at professional meetings, including one held by the New Jersey State

Belleville Councilwoman Angie Paserchia was recently named "Woman of the Year" by the John I. Crecco Foundation.

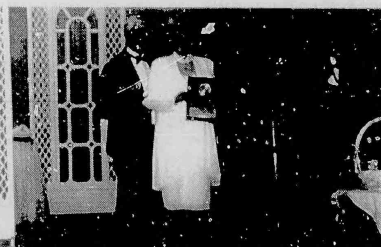

"emotionally disturbed" 12 year old allegedly set bags of potato chips afire at the Kaival Market, on Washington and Park Avenues, Nutley.

At other stores the youth allegedly set bags of cookies on fire.

Scalera said he initially believed that the Nutley fire was a bias crime because the Nutley store owners are of Middle Eastern descent.

"I thought it was a bias incident against Indians," Scalera said. "I thought if they're hitting Nutley, they might be hitting other towns."

But Spera has ruled out any bias crime, because some of the stores hit were parts of large corporations, like Quick Check and Krausner's.

"It's not a bias because there were also other stores owned by corporations. It wasn't one specific race, color, or creed. It was a random type thing. We're really not sure on why they did it, yet," said Spera.

As similar fires continued to be set throughout last week, authorities from Nutley, Bloomfield, Belleville and Lyndhurst began accumulating bits and pieces of relevant information.

One store attendant had received a partial license plate number. Scalera said Nutley officials quickly began entering "random characters" into a police computer and finally came up with a vehicle in Belleville.

Once a name was attached to a suspect living in Belleville, authorities used a high school yearbook to gain a photo of the suspect. Police soon discovered that the suspect had a criminal record and a mug shot was obtained.

The photo was shown to a store attendant, who immediately identified the woman as one of the arson suspects.

Law enforcement officials then spotted the car and followed it to Newark, where they apprehended the four suspects.

Authorities said the 12 year old confessed, but the two adult women claim they never noticed the youth start the fires.

Arson squads from both the Essex County and Bergen County prosecutor's offices are looking into the fires.

Scalera said authorities are asking anyone with information on similar fires to come forward and help with the investigation.

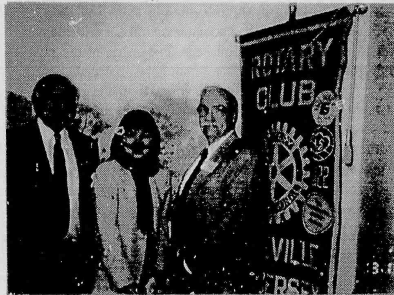

### Megan's Law: Will it be efficient or create different incentives?

After a multitude of court battles that included appeals from a vast array of sex offenders, a federal judge recently gave approval to the controversial Megan's Law.

Megan's Law was created after seven-year-old Megan Kanka was killed by a convicted sex offender who, unfortunately, lived right across the street from her.

The incident sparked the debate over the statute, which requires convicted sex offenders to register with local police after they are released from prison. The local police will then notify school groups, civic organizations, and residents of the offenders whereabouts in the community.

Since the concept behind Megan's Law was brought into the spotlight, civil libertarians have questioned its constitutionality. Are the sex offenders paying twice for their crimes? Isn't one jail sentence enough punishment?

Other points the libertarians argued against the initiation of the law make some sense. They believe that requiring convicted offenders to register with local police will only set them on the run. It would create the incentive not to let authorities and neighbors know where they live, but turn them into drifters, roaming from community to community.

And this notion brings us to another potential problem. Sociologists have deemed this kind of behavior with a high level of recidivism. This argument, coupled with the point that offenders might not register, makes us

ask the question, would Megan's Law be an efficient law?

Physical assault, especially involving children, is one of the most egregious crimes a person could commit. Offenders should be punished with the strictest punishment. But something happens on the way to jail for these convicts.

Most sex offenders, along with other criminals, don't spend the same amount of time in correctional facilities they were sentenced for. If they did, and received the proper punishment and treatment they deserve and need, then maybe Megan's Law wouldn't be necessary.

People like to see quick results on everything in the information age. And Megan's Law on the surface seems like a justified public outcry. But some pondering of the possible repercussions should be analyzed.

Just try to put yourself in the place of a convicted sex offender who has learned that everyone in his/her community will know where they live, after they have spent 10 or 15 years in jail. Would they register or run away frightened? Would they create more of an enforcement problem by running away? These are tough questions but are important ones that need to be addressed.

We in no way are saying the concept of Megan's Law isn't justified. But whether or not it is the most efficient solution to a volatile social problem is the question that should be analyzed and discussed.

Everyone is busy these days either trying to make a living or enjoying their retirement. There are also those who find time in their hectic schedules to assist people who are in need. And there are plenty of those types in Belleville, including the Kiwanis Club.

Tom Grolimond of the Belleville Kiwanis Club, along with president Grace Perdue and other members, flourish by sponsoring fundraisers for certain charitable organizations.

And their list of organizations is a long one. The needy and homeless on Thanksgiving, patients at Clara Maass Hospital, the Belleville Key Club, Belleville High School, the Belleville Alliance for Substance Education (B.A.S.E.), and people with cerebral palsy all receive assistance from the group who celebrated its 40th year of existence last

year.

It doesn't take that much effort to help your fellow man. But with a society that places unending demands upon everyone striving to make a living, those who make the extra effort should be lauded.

You could see the pleasure Grolimond gets from helping others plastered on his smiling face. And he freely admits that is the true essence of charity.

Even though not-for-profit organizations might be able to perform humanitarian tasks at a greater level, its comforting to know a local group assists local people. This type of helping hand might not reach as many people, but their presence is often much stronger.

We wish the Belleville Kiwanis Club many more years of existence, but there are more needy people who wish that even more.

• IT may be too early for the public to stop what it's doing and address the 1997 political matters, but we find major players in the political system planning ahead for 1997.

## IT'S A JUNGLE OUT THERE! Helping you avoid the perils

The World is full of perils, many of them handmade, although we do not notice them until we have already fallen, burned ourselves, or suffered an ugly gash.

While we are happy to represent you if you suffer such an injury, we would prefer that you not be hurt at all. Therefore, we offer some basic advice: First, watch your step! Although the law says that you are entitled to walk with the assumption that your path is free of hazards, the truth is we frequently stumble over debris or uneven sidewalks, or slip on wet or icy pathways. If you do fall, indoors or out, suppress the urge to flee in embarrassment and instead report the incident to the property owner and/or business owner/manager. It is very important that you get the person's name and a copy of any written incident report. Be cognizant, if possible, of witnesses present and try to get their names. However, your well-being is paramount and this investigation can be pursued later, after you are transported to safety. You can return later to take photographs of the dangerous condition. These steps will support your credibility should you ultimately submit a claim.

Please be careful with office equipment or factory machinery. If you are hurt, identify or save the product. You may have a claim against the manufacturer, above and beyond your workers' compensation benefits.

Be wary of the items you use at home. Keep all warranties and instructions. Your attention during use could prevent an accident. Be further aware of your storage of tools, chemicals and/or pesticides and put them in places which are not accessible to others, with a special emphasis on the safety of children.

**Business Owners.** You do not want your patrons injured at or near your premises. Even though you may have liability insurance, litigation is a terrible nuisance and bad for public relations. There are some precautions you can take: First, you are responsible to maintain the sidewalk in front of your business, whether you own it or not. Make every effort to sweep it and keep it free of snow and ice. Make sure that there is adequate lighting both indoors and out. If you are in a high crime area, you may need to retain private security personnel. Inside, do not stack your merchandise too high or too precariously. Keep your aisles clear. If you have indoor steps, make sure that there are rails and reflective strips at the edge of each step.

We will be happy to speak with you or to community organizations to describe in greater detail additional measures that can prevent injury to yourself or to your customers.

### First in a summer series

## 25 years later, Belleville Little League memories still vivid

Back in May of this year, I ran a series on the 1976 Belleville High School baseball team. That particular club finished the year with a 24-4 mark and held the number one ranking in the state for four weeks.

The coach of that team, **George Zanfini**, and one of the key players, shortstop **Anthony Biafore**, both gave a great deal of credit for the teams, and programs, success to the Belleville Little League program.

"Without question," Zanfini said, "the little league program taught those kids so many fundamentals. By the time they got to the high school level, they were pretty well taught the keys to the game."

"I learned so much in little league," Biafore, who later went on to Monmouth College and played in the Chicago Cubs farm system, said. "(Coach) **Mike Marotti** (whom the Belleville little league field is named after) was teaching our team things like hitting the cut off man, knowing when to go from first to third, things like that. We had so much good coaching. I can't say enough about those days."

And so, it is with that theme that I begin a summer series (about four weeks or so) on little league memories in Belleville. In this case, the memories will be particularly mine, because, 25 years ago, I played little league in Belleville.

I played the same time that Biafore and many of the stars from B.H.S. in the mid 1970's were beginning to develop their games. And while a quarter century has gone by, I can still pretty much remember the scores of every game my team, Biancardi, played that year and the key hits from my respective teammates.

In March of 1971, Belleville held its usual try outs for little league. I remember thinking that I had done pretty good in the fielding try outs but didn't fare as well in the batting section.

In 1970, I played farm league, the league directly below little league. I figured after the batting try outs that I would spend my last year eligible (I was 12 years old and the cut off was 12 for little league) playing farm league ball again.

I got quite a surprise when the phone rang one evening in my home at 725 Joramelon Street in Belleville and it was **Jim "Red" Cienaghan**, the coach of Food Fair, who was calling to tell me I had made a little league team.

This was the chance to wear what we felt was the equivalent of major league uniforms and play all of our games at Marotti Field, which, to a 12 year old, was the equivalent of Shea Stadium.

The fences were (and I believe still are) 202 feet to dead center field, with left and right an even 200 feet.

Once again, to a 12 year old kid, that seemed a moon shot. But it was the "big time," a chance to play with, and against, the best baseball players in a town that prided itself on its baseball prowess.

I remember my first practice. It was a scrimmage against Rotary Club, who would turn out to be our toughest rival. We always practiced at Belleville Park and I remember getting a chance to hit in the first inning.

**Chris Cervasio** was pitching for Rotary, and compared to the pitching I had seen in farm league the previous season, his fast ball was the equal to **Bob Gibson**.

I remember learning that hitting a fast ball pitcher required timing. If you tried to see the ball after the pitcher threw it, it would be too late to hit it.

So I remember watching Cervasio wind up and taking my swing just as he released the ball. Some how, I got a clean single. Later in that scrimmage, I hit a homer off a different pitcher, although the "homer" wasn't exactly a long shot. It was more a clean hit that was muffed as I rounded the bases.

Nonetheless, I enjoyed my first scrimmage and Cienaghan pretty much told me that I would be the starting right fielder for opening day, which would also be against the Rotary Club.

We had a good hitting team in 1971. **Mickey Lemongelli** was without question, our leader. He was a hard hitting catcher, the catalyst of our club.

**Anthony Speer** was our leadoff hitter. **Ronald "Booper" Beck** would be our power hitting first baseman.

**Joe Norton** was the center fielder and **Tom Bianchi** would start in center. **John Herka** was a key pitcher for us. **Jimmy Cienaghan** was our starting shortstop. **Rich Gasschke** was a promising infielder. **Bob McNulty** had potential and good power.

Before the opening game, however, we were told that Food Fair would not be our sponsor, that Biancardi would sponsor our team instead. We were still the team in green and gray, just different lettering.

The highlight to the start of a little league season in Belleville is the parade that begins the season. All of the players on all of the teams (there were 16 teams in the league back then, eight in each division) would parade, in their uniforms, onto the field.

We were scheduled to open the season at 6 p.m. against Rotary, and I remember being some what nervous for that. Here it was, the chance to play little league, under the lights, in front of a big crowd.

Rotary was coached by Lemongelli's dad, Mike, so there was always a little extra rivalry there.

Anyway, the season would begin. Next week, I'll begin my look back at the 14 game schedule that Biancardi would play 25 years ago.

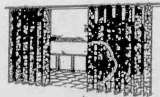

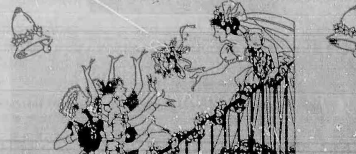

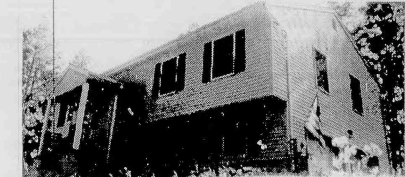

### Build high-style outdoor furniture

The first warm breezes of spring are a signal to homeowners that the days of outdoor entertaining and kicking back on the deck are just around the corner.

The right outdoor furniture can turn your deck or patio into an extra room in the summer months. Chris Inman, executive editor of *Today's Woodworker* magazine, says many homeowners now are adding the ultimate personal touch to their outdoor living spaces by building and finishing their own furniture to match their patio or deck design scheme.

One timeless design that's easy to build is the adirondack chair. Plans for this popular chair are available through Craftplans, a division of The Woodworkers' Store (21801 Industrial Blvd., Rogers, MN 5574-9514), a retail and catalog operation which caters to woodworkers.

"Actual size" project plans are the easiest to work with. Look for plans with clear instructions to "talk" you through the project from beginning to end. One tip is to make templates by tracing each individual chair piece onto 1/4-inch plywood stock, then cutting and smoothing these pieces.

Mark the lumber by tracing around these templates, then cut the pieces using a saber or band saw. This will give you more uniform results, whether you're building a single set or enough adirondacks to outfit an entire resort.

Inman says cedar is the first choice for lumber — when properly finished it will hold up to years of exposure to the elements, yet it is easy to sand and smooth for a professional-looking project. Plan on about 30 board feet per chair.

Once you've cut out and smoothed all chair pieces, the easiest way to guarantee professional results is to stain or finish the chair before assembly. For a natural finish there are a number of

wood preservative products available — some popular brands come in a variety of shades to keep your chairs ship-shape for years of deck lounging.

Rick Mueller from DAP Inc. says one alternative is to build your chairs using less expensive pressure-treated lumber, then add splash and dazzle with new water-based low VOC spray paints.

"You can use either Densote or Spray 'N Go spray paints," he says. "For a uniform finish I'd also recommend a primer. This will give you a nice base coat and also act as a leveler. It's not essential to prime; you can get the same effect with two coats of paint, but I think you'll get a better appearance."

Spray paints come in a variety of colors — even metallic, chrome, and gold-plated colors are available to let you stretch your creative muse. Or, go with popular summer shades like teal, aqua or rose. For a finishing touch, spray paints make it easy to add a stenciled design or pattern.

Mueller adds that all but the metallic finishes are VOC-compliant, making them safer to handle and easier on the environment.

Inman's choice for a dash of New England charm is authentic Windsor Green enamel paint. This paint is available exclusively through The Woodworkers' Store, which commissioned the Society for the Preservation of New England Antiques to recreate the depth and character of this unique shade.

Armed with a set of plans and simple workshop tools, including a saber or band saw, drill and power sander, Inman says the average do-it-yourselfer can build a pair of chairs in a weekend — a short time, considering that reclining in an adirondack chair on a warm summer day is a pleasure you'll enjoy for decades.

### New volume takes a look at artists' living spaces

Great art is not created in a vacuum. Most art — whether literature, painting, sculpture or music — reflects the experiences and aesthetics of its maker. Estes chose his New York apartment for its architecture: the stylized Art Deco forms mirrored his own highly detailed, synthetic, and as well as the inspirational panoramic view of Central Park from his studio.

These are just a few of the homes featured in this rare and intimate look into the living spaces of some of the most original artists of this century. In *Artists' Homes* is an eclectic collection of individual artists' approaches to domestic style and an inspiring source of innovative design ideas.

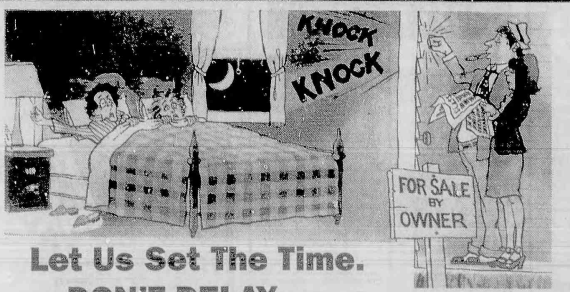
