Garden State Cancer Center opens its doors

Cancer statistics

- Cancer is the state's second leading cause of death.
- The state ranks fourth (tied with Nevada) in the nation for cancer mortality.
- The state's cancer death rate is increasing.
- One out of every three state residents is destined to become a cancer patient.
- The highest incidence of cancer in the state is in the Northern region—Essex, Bergen, Hudson, Morris, Passaic, Sussex, Union and Warren Counties.
- Over 45,700 state residents will be diagnosed with cancer this year.

New Jersey's first free standing cancer research facility opened its doors Tuesday.

The Garden State Cancer Center's mission is to foster clinical research for new technologies in the diagnosis, detection and treatment of cancer with linkage to a network of affiliated hospitals.

Currently the center occupies about 25 percent of the 200,000 square foot hospital that was constructed by the county in 1930, which was the nation's first isolation hospital for the treatment of infectious disease particularly tuberculosis.

The cancer center was founded in 1991 by its president Dr. David Goldenberg, as the clinical arm of the Center for Molecular Medicine and Immunology (CMMI). It was established in 1983 at the University of Medicine and Dentistry in Newark.

Since the former site was too small and had an increasing rate of

programs, it chose to relocate to the site of the former Essex County Geriatric Center on the corner of Franklin and Belleville avenues.

"We began the long, arduous process of acquiring this public facility in 1991, with funds received from the U.S. Department of Energy under the efforts of former Congressman Robert Roe and Senator Frank Lautenberg," said Dr. Raymond Menard, the center's vice president for Administration.

"The hospital was empty and in disrepair, being an eyesore for the community," he added.

The renovation of the building will take place in phases over the next four years, costing about \$56 million.

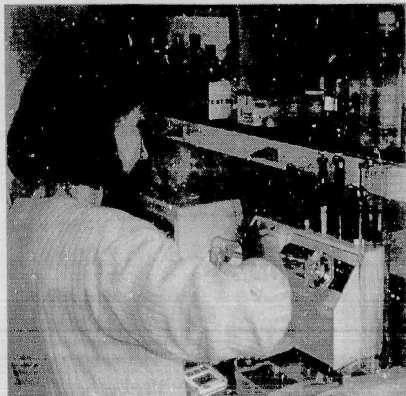
Phase one was financed through a start-up construction grant of \$10,500,000 from the U.S. Department of Energy, an equity contribution of \$500,000 from GSCC/CMMI, Essex County bond proceeds of \$3,600,000, a Community Development Block Grant of \$500,000 from the

Department of Housing and Urban Development, and a contribution of land from Essex County valued at \$2,400,000.

The nearly \$42 million needed for phases two through five is projected to come primarily from private philanthropy, with some limited support from federal and state sources.

Senator Frank Lautenberg said, "the opening of the Garden State Cancer Center is a milestone for New Jersey. All of us are pleased that this new facility is located in our state where there is so much concern about susceptibility to cancer and the availability of advanced treatment. Now the Center can expand on its accomplishments and develop into one of the premier cancer research facilities in the nation."

He added, "they are one of the highest funded institutions in New Jersey receiving peer-reviewed grants from the National Cancer

Veteran's songs bring patriotism to life

Veterans' Day and the significance of patriotism were two topics that marine veteran Jim Cava stressed in his visit to Public School 9 last Thursday.

Cava, who stood on the school stage with a flag as the backdrop in his marine uniform, shared with the children the story of how he lost his arm while serving as a Comman with the 5th Marines in the Vietnam War.

"My chopper was shot down by the enemy...Unconscious I was pulled to safety from the burning chopper by a brave fellow Marine," said Cava.

Through narrative and patriotic songs like "You're a Grand Old Flag," "America," "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" and "America the Beautiful," Cava brought through the themes of the importance of honor, liberty, equality, justice and humanity.

"These are the sovereign principles conceived by our founding fathers, upheld and defended with invincible determination that forged a great nation. For the good of our country, for the survival of our nation, we must get back to basics in America by simply reaffirming belief and respect for these virtuous and fundamental principles that constitute America," said Cava.

Children from all grade levels read their essays about the significance of Nov. 11.

"...To me Veterans' Day is the dedication of men and women in the Armed Forces. Our veterans fought for peace liberty and of course our freedom. Time and time again, our veterans put themselves on the line risking and sometimes losing their lives in defense," said fifth grade student Melita Klenovic.

Teachers rally for closure in contract negotiations

Pouring rain did not stop more than 300 teachers from gathering last Thursday night inside the high school to show their unity regarding the negotiations of their contracts.

Since June the Board of Education and the Belleville Education Association have been negotiating on this issue.

Thursday night a state mediator was called in to help break the deadlock between the two parties.

"They should not have been picketing inside the school...It was a fire hazard. They were wall to wall. You can't block hallways like that," said Board member Frank Montagna.

Carol Amato chairperson of the negotiating team for the Belleville Education Association, said the outcome was "a move in a positive direction."

"Even though we did not reach a settlement last night, there was an improvement in the tone and focus of negotiations," she said.

Montagna responded, "of course they thought the meeting went positively. They did not give anything up. We have reduced our demands tremendously, and they are not budging."

Louis Pallante, chairman of the Board of Education's teacher's contract negotiating committee said, "in the sense that both parties

Giving the gift of life

Man thanks police, fire and emergency personnel for saving his life

Saving a life is a precious gift that often goes unappreciated.

But Peter Arancio, 63, knows the significance of CPR because it saved his life.

On the morning of Oct. 5, Peter Arancio woke up and had a serious asthma attack.

Peter's wife Lucille urged him to use his asthma machine and then he opened a window for air.

Since he was still having trouble breathing he called Lucille to help him.

Lucille quickly called 911 for help.

Ironically his 33-year-old son Larry—who has been a member of the Belleville Police Department for more than six years—was working the desk at the time of the

incident and he dispatched the call.

Minutes after the call was dispatched, Belleville Police officers Anthony Tucci and George Geyer arrived at the scene and found Peter Arancio; to be blue with no pulse.

The two officers then started doing CPR on him.

Members from the Belleville Fire Department Anthony Labruza and James Coponi arrived at the scene and continued performing CPR on Peter.

Seconds later, Vincent Cisternino and Deborah Ehling from the mobile intensive care unit of Clara Maass Paramedics, arrived and used the defibrillators.

They then got a pulse and transported him to Clara Maass Medical

Institute, thus providing our citizens with new investigative methods to treat cancer without our patients having to leave the state."

The center is the only New Jersey institution to twice receive an Outstanding Investigator Grant for Goldenberg's research, totaling more than \$20 million since 1985, and to hold a Program Project Grant awarded to Dr. David Gold for the multidisciplinary research on the development of better methods to detect and treat colorectal and pancreatic cancers, totaling about \$11 million.

"Considering the economic costs of current treatments that are available, I am highly encouraged by the specialized research, diagnosis and treatment taking place at the Garden State Cancer Center," said Congressman Robert Menendez.

The center has an advanced imaging center devoted to diagnosing and detecting cancers at an early stage. It also has an outpatient clinic for therapy trials, and eight major research laboratories devoted to studying cancer for the perspectives of molecular biology, genetics, and immunology.

"The Center has been successful in rapidly transferring the results of our laboratory research to the clinic, where patients who have failed all other forms of therapy come under our clinical research trails, approved by federal and institutional committees, as a last hope. Ultimately, we hope to use these new cancer detection and treatment methods at earlier times when the disease is not so advanced," Goldberg said.

He added, "in addition to being able to handle more patients by acquiring these new clinics and support laboratories, we are expanding our network of affiliated research hospitals throughout the region, so that cancer patients can have access to the methods developed at our Center while they remain closer to home."

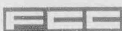

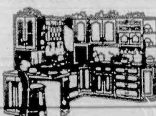

are talking I view that as positive. We didn't get everything we wanted yet, nor did they, but we are continuing to talk and share ideas."

Maryann Zizza, a Public School 3 special education teacher said the group gathered because they "want to show solidarity and unity and put faces with the ideas."

"Up until this point, there has been no progress and no agreements except for the fact that the board hired an expensive negotiator," said Elaine Indendy, a Public School 5 teacher for special education.

Indendy and Zizza said the board wants a wage freeze, to double the deductible on teacher's

medical insurance, to make teachers pay 10 percent of medical premiums, decrease teachers longevity and decrease teachers terminal pay for sick days.

A purple flyer stating the above items and the date of the rally was circulated to all members of the teaching staff.

Montagna and Pallante said the wage freeze proposal was taken off the table Thursday night.

Both board members said the current deductible for teachers is \$100 per individual and that the board would like to consider raising it to \$200.

"The board in its proposal would like the teachers to contribute to their medical benefits," said Pallante.

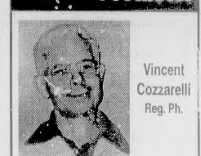

TAKING YOUR MEDICINE

Although most adults have mastered the technique of swallowing pills, there are some medications that come in other forms that must be administered in other ways. For instance, the word "buccal" refers to the cheek and mouth, and buccal tablets are those that should be placed between the cheek and gum. Once a buccal tablet is properly inserted into the mouth, the mouth should be closed and the tablet allowed to dissolve, without being swallowed or chewed. Another type of tablet, known as a sublingual tablet, is intended for placement beneath the tongue. As with a buccal tablet, there should not be any smoking, eating, or drinking while the sublingual tablet is dissolving.

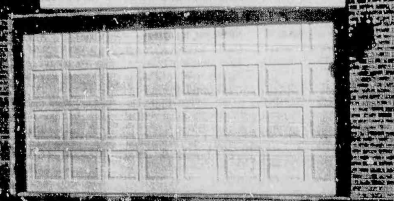

Of All Things

THIS coming February marks the 41st anniversary of the Antiques Show at the Glen Ridge Congregational Church.

Proceeds from the show directly benefit a number of community outreach programs including Hospice, Habitat for Humanity, The Food Pantry, SCEEP tutoring program for inner-city school children, Integrity House programs in Newark, and the Broughton House and St. Barnabas AIDS Centers. The show runs from February 6th through the 8th, and is sponsored by the Women's Association of the Glen Ridge Congregational Church where the show will be held. A souvenir book will be published. Business sponsored donations start at \$35 for a two-line listing. A half page goes for \$60 and a full page will be a bargain at \$100. Not only will advertisers have an opportunity to help those less fortunate, but also bring their message to the Glen Ridge population which is obliged to do its principal shopping out of town.

THE Nutley Board of Commissioners organized itself as an investigative body looking into the circumstances that resulted in employment contracts for Police Chief Robert DeLitta and Deputy Police Chief John Holland. The hearing became necessary after DeLitta and Holland filed a law suit against the town demanding the contracts be declared valid. Among the provisions of the contract that were obnoxious to a majority of the town commissioners were:

limiting the work day from 8 AM to 4 PM. Perks to be continued with raises in the future and no

cap on salaries.

The hearings are open to the public. The witnesses will be given testimony under oath. The contracts bearing a December 19, 1995 date were effective after the expiration of former Public Safety Commissioner John Kelly's term, May 14, 1996. The contracts were inherited by Public Safety Commissioner Carmen Orechio who introduced a resolution at a post election commission board meeting to declare the contracts null and void. The resolution was adopted on a vote of 3-1. Commissioner Scarpelli was absent. Voting in favor of voiding the contracts were Orechio, Furnari and Sam Battaglia. Finance Commissioner Frank Cocchiola voted against.

RELATED acknowledgment of a greeting from Tokyo from my dentist, Dr. Michael Liloia, and his wife, Ann. On the face of the card was a picture of the Tokyo Bay Hilton, a dead ringer for Miami's Fontainebleau Hotel.

THE Belleville Rotary Club and Lions Club have a joint meeting scheduled on November 20th at Antonio's Restaurant in Belleville. In order to raise funds for the many charities that are aided by the Rotary Club of Belleville, orders for citrus fruit by the box are being taken. Frank Cozzarelli, Jr. is president. The group will also celebrate its 75th anniversary at a dinner to be held next June 25th at the Chandelier.

ESSEX County Democrat County Chairman, when asked if he would support the re-election of Nutley's Joe DiVincenzo as

Chairman of the Essex County Freeholders, replied, "I'm not saying I'm neither against Joe or for him." That's a helluva of an observation for a veteran political observer who can't distinguish between superior service and ordinary service.

By any standard, DiVincenzo has been the most effective freeholder director in memory of most old timers. He has achieved this distinction despite the fact that he has been obliged to work with an Essex County executive of the opposite political faith, Republican Jim Treffinger. Because of the work of Joe DiVincenzo in his role as director of the Board of Freeholders, the cost of political perks has gone down substantially, even to eliminating jobs that are pure patronage for the party faithful. Maybe this didn't sit well with Giblin.

It wasn't long ago that Giblin caused a party disaster by naming himself candidate for Essex County Executive. In the ensuing Primary Election, he lost to East Orange Democrat Mayor Cardell Cooper whose main supporter was the powerful Essex Senator Dick Codey.

There are many factions among the Democrat Party in Essex. The County Chairman has the primary obligation of bringing those factions together instead of tearing the party asunder. Moreover, DiVincenzo has rendered exemplary service to the benefit of county residents for two successive terms. He certainly has earned the right to a third term, and he also should have earned the thanks and support of Essex County Democrat Chairman Tom Giblin.

The taxpayers of Essex County have enjoyed the results of the political interfacing that Essex County Freeholder Chairman Joe DiVincenzo established with Republican Essex County Executive James Treffinger. Bucs rally to defeat Eastside

Senior quarterback Rich DeFalco recovered from a tough first half and directed the Belleville Bucs to their second win of the '96 season, a 19-18 win over Paterson Eastside last Saturday afternoon.

John Senesky's team will take a 2-5 mark into tomorrow evening's game at Don Bosco. Kickoff time is 7 p.m.

The win last Saturday snapped a five game losing streak for the Bucs, who last won in its season opener at Scotch Plains.

"We were pleased with the effort of the team and the way they adjusted," Senesky said. "Things went the way we felt they could in the second half. Give our offensive line credit for creating good traps for our runners."

"I thought our tackles, Nick Muscara and Ernie Companso were very effective. We were able to get our passing game going a little and it was good to come from behind to win a game."

The first half was a scoring fest, with both teams combining for 31 points.

The Bucs scored first when DeFalco went over from the one yard line. Edwin Garcia added the point after attempt for a 7-0 lead.

Eastside answered, cutting the lead to 7-6, but the Bucs came back, thanks to a break away 57 yard touchdown run from Donnell Graham late in the first quarter.

The Bucs took a 13-6 lead into the second quarter, but Eastside took control, tallying twice, once on an interception return and once, with seconds remaining in the half, on a 20 yard pass.

The Bucs trailed 18-13 at the break, but were able to make some defensive adjustments and kept the Ghosts off the board for the final 24 minutes.

Belleville went ahead for good early in the fourth quarter, thanks to a 91 yard drive spanning 11 plays.

DeFalco completed a key pass to Ricci Bello in the drive and the running of Chris Zarro and Bello behind a good offensive line, led to the winning score, a two yard run by Zarro with 11 minutes left to play.

"We made some adjustments at halftime, going to a zone coverage in our defensive secondary," Senesky said. "We felt we weren't as effective with man to man coverage and the change was beneficial. The wind was also a factor. It was tough to get a passing game going."

Senesky was happy with the play of DeFalco.

"He ran the offense well and took advantage of opportunities,"

the coach said. "It was a steady performance."

"I thought Efrain Mercado

stepped in at the slot back position and did a good job. Zarro gives us a solid performance every game. He's

a reliable player. Bello was a big key to us winning the game."

Graham, the Bucs leading scorer, reagravated an ankle injury originally incurred in the Paramus Catholic game.

He did not play in the second half last Saturday and is hopeful for playing tomorrow evening at Don Bosco.

"Don Bosco will be a good test for us," Senesky said. "We should match up well with them. They're comparable to us in size and offense."

NOTES: Bucs have won 7 of 10 in season series against Don Bosco. Belleville's wins came in '84, '88 and from '90-94. Don Bosco snapped a five game losing streak to the Bucs with a 7-6 victory in Ramsey last year. Their other wins came in 1985 and '89.

Belleville has a 3-1 record against Don Bosco in Ramsey.

Bucs conclude season on Thanksgiving Day, hosting Nutley in an 11 a.m. start.

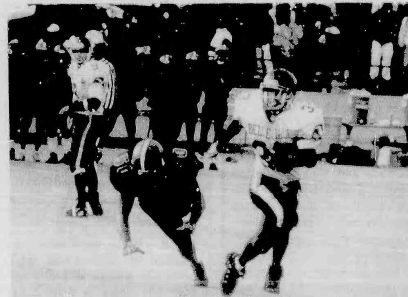

Steve Taylor, Jose Hernandez, Pete Maccoro and Joe Pizzi played

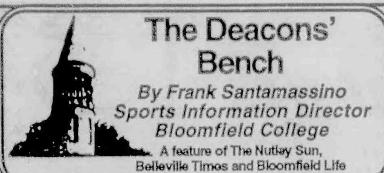
stellar games on defense.

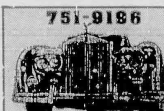

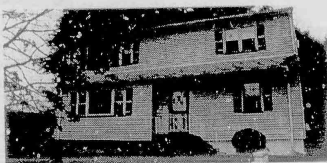

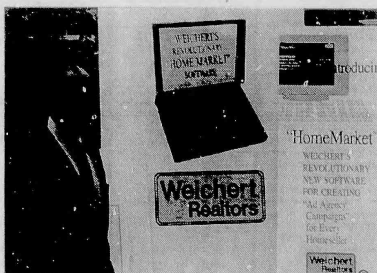
