St. Patrick's Day celebration Saturday will feature pipers, bands and joy

Belleville will play a major role in the 19th Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade, Saturday.

The parade is sponsored by the Nutley Irish American Association. Many of the members are Belleville residents, including the Association's Member of the Year, Mary Karen (Pierce) O'Connell.

Marching in the parade will be the Ironbound Irish American Association, whose president, Tony Mullen, is a resident of Belleville.

The parade will be part of a day of celebration, beginning with a Mass at 10:30 a.m. at St. Mary's R.C. Church, Nutley.

The parade will step off at 1 p.m. from Brookline Avenue to Harrison Street, then Franklin Avenue and on to Chestnut Street.

The Grand Marshal will be Eddie Kirk, owner of Kirk's Tire Co. in Belleville.

Kirk won fame for his fighting off an attempt by a British firm to acquire ownership of Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. in 1987, organizing 200 dealers around the country against the takeover attempt.

The Deputy Grand Marshal is Arlene Casick of Nutley. Queen of the Parade is Mary Kane.

Among the units will be the Emerald Pipe Band of the New York City Department of Corrections, which will escort dignitaries and members of the Association into St. Mary's

Church, 17 Monsignor Owens St., where the celebrant will be the Rev. Leonard E. Dembow, Pastor and the co-celebrant will be the Rev. John McCrone.

Eleanor Antonelli will be the singer for Mass.

Leading the parade will Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 493, Nutley.

They will be followed by the Emerald Band, the Rory O'Moore Pipes and Drums, the Staten Island Pipers, Chu C'hullain Pipe Band, the Nutley High School Band, the Weehawken High School Band and the Denville String Band.

Other marching units will include the Nutley Fire Department, the Nutley Rescue Squad, the Essex County Sheriff's Department, the Holy Family Nursery School, the Knights of Columbus of Belleville, the Knights of Columbus of Nutley, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Nutley Recreation Twirlers, the Iron Workers Local, and others.

The Master of Ceremonies will be John B. Griwert, the parade director, who will be at the reviewing stand at Franklin Avenue and Chestnut Street.

At 3 p.m. a Post Parade party will be held at the VFW Post, 271 Washington Ave., where entertainment will be offered by Bobby Byrne.

When she learned of efforts to create the Challenger Division, she offered a financial donation in Mr. Giebler's memory, noting that he was a man whose love for children should be remembered.

A Challenger baseball field was recently created by volunteers from a dilapidated basketball court in Bloomfield.

Friends of Jamie dinner dance Friday night at Branch Brook

A fund raiser for Jamie Conway, 14-year-old victim of a rare and extremely painful disease, will be held at 6 p.m. Friday at the Branch Brook Manor, under the auspices of Friends of Jamie, Inc.

The disease, Reflex Sympathetic Dystrophy Syndrome - RSDS was diagnosed in the young lady two years ago.

RSDS attacks the nervous system and leaves the victim in constant pain. There is as yet no known cure and no drug that relieves the condition.

Friends estimate that the family has to bear expenses of thousands of dollars for weekly physical therapy as well as doctors' care.

Friends of Jamie Inc. was formed by Lynda Morgan, Maria Lombardi and Pat Dunn to help the family meet its financial problems.

Jamie is an 8th Grader in the Belleville school system. She requires treatment at the Pain Management Clinic at JFK Medical Center in Edison.

Belleville firefighters are among those participating in the effort, as friends of the Conway family.

Jamie's grandmother was a teacher in the Middle School for 20 years.

The Crime Watch: Bingo!

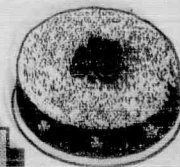

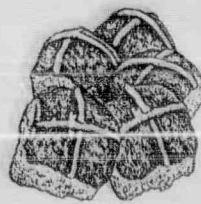

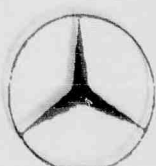

Aside from That

A number of people have sent us jeering messages to point out that **Gerald McCann** served as mayor of **Jersey City**, not **Union City**, as stated in last week's column. These critics, of course, are thinking of a different McCann. We were really talking about **Jerald McCann**, who was mayor of **Union City** (1845-8) and was jailed for selling counterfeit horse car tickets. He successfully ran for election again on the eve of the Civil War, during which he left town never to be heard of again. So much for the critics . . .

"I don't know how it happened, but somebody who I do not know nominated me." Right, Mom. In **Key West**, **United Way** told him his goal was a million dollars. In rural **Somerset**, it's six million. If he makes the goal, he'll know he really is outstanding, and a lot of local bank holdups may be solved. Miss **Reimer** says she enjoys **Key West** - "But I miss **Belleville**."

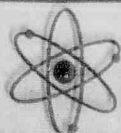

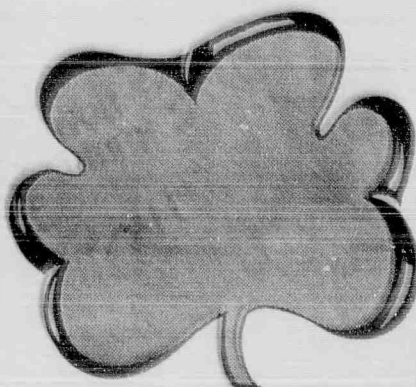

TARGETING THE NOSE

When a cold virus hits, the nose is one of the primary targets because the nose has greater blood flow per cubic centimeter of tissue than even the brain or liver. Thus, when the blood vessels in the infected area swell, the nose is most susceptible. Efforts at self-medication usually involve oral decongestants, which work by constricting blood vessels throughout the body, including the ones that supply the nose. However, these same medications may also agitate the central nervous system to bring on nervousness, restlessness and insomnia. To avoid these unwanted side-effects, patients may turn to sprays that target the nose. Those containing oxymetazoline last 8 to 12 hours, while sprays containing phenylephrine last 4 hours. Using these sprays for more than 3 days leads to a "rebound" effect, which may prompt a return to oral decongestants.

NOTE: The "rebound effect" noted with the use of nasal sprays consists of feeling even more stuffed up from the medication than from the cold after 3 or 4 days' use, meaning that the drug no longer works.

March is National Nutrition Month. This is a month dedicated to promoting a special nutrition message to the public.

This year the American Dietetic Association is promoting "All Foods Can Fit!" This means that all foods can be a part of a healthy diet.

Often people think of dietitians as the monsters who tell you what you cannot eat. In the past, this may have been true.

Now, with the new findings of research and the more inclusive attitude of most dietitians, the message is that whatever food you like to eat can be eaten! This includes that double chocolate cake.

How can this be, you ask? Well, the technique most used is the trade-off technique. Trading is when you reduce one type of food in your diet so that you can have a treat, or trading may be eating more vegetables at a meal to provide the vitamins that the chocolate cake does not have.

Most people would tell you that sausage, chocolate, and pie are foods that you cannot eat.

But, these foods can be eaten if a few small steps are taken.

First, controlling the portion sizes of these treat foods is critical. A reasonable serving of cake is 1/12th of the cake or 1/8th of the pie. Avoid huge servings and you can enjoy the food more often. This is moderation.

Second, include foods high in vitamins, minerals and fiber along with the meals in which the special treat foods are eaten so that there is still a balance.

If the food you are treating yourself with is a high fat food, complement that with foods at your meal that are low fat like grilled, baked or broiled foods. This will prevent your meal from becoming high in fat.

If a person cannot enjoy eating all foods, then that person has lost on the whole dining experience. It is all right to eat any food despite the amount of fat or sugar in that food. The key is to balance that food within a healthy diet which follows the Food Guide Pyramid.

Choosing the right lens for your frame — Part II

Last issue, I discussed some eyeglass lens options. I focused on the style of lens, whether single vision, for distance or near, and bifocals.

Today, we will follow that up with a discussion of lens materials. The particular material will affect weight, thickness, vision and cost.

Whether a lens is single vision or bifocal, you may be asked what the lens should be made of. Years ago, all lenses were glass. These were heavy, but didn't scratch much. Nowadays, glass is rarely used except for some photochromic lenses because of weight and safety since glass breaks more easily.

Plastic lenses were the standard for the last 15 years or so because they're lighter in weight. But plastic can scratch, so the manufacturers started to find more resistant lenses. Plastic is now fast becoming a thing of the past.

The urge to get lenses thinner and lighter is reflected in the newer lenses today. Polycarbonate and high index plastic are now becoming standard.

Polycarbonate gives a thinner profile with extremely strong impact resistance. These are most recommended for children. From a standpoint of appearance, they can be cut thinner than plastic. They will however scratch easily unless treated.

High index gives better optics, slimmer profile and greater resistance to scratching. In my opinion, these lenses are superior although the gap between them is narrowing. There are different high index options also, so you need to rely on your eyecare professional's advice when choosing.

So when discussing the material, be aware that the different materials will most definitely affect your vision, comfort and cost. When asked if you want a thinner lens, you need to know whether it's high index or polycarbonate and is it aspheric or not.

I always ask my patients if they want thin, thinner or thinnest when discussing the options.

Are You Experiencing Any Of These Symptoms?

Some common vision conditions

Nearsightedness (Myopia). You see close objects more clearly than those at a distance.

Farsightedness (Hyperopia). You see far objects more clearly than close ones.

Astigmatism. You see blurry or distorted objects at all distances, because the front part of your eye (cornea) is slightly irregular in shape.

Presbyopia. A natural part of aging begins to blur your reading and near vision by about age 40-45 and gradually worsens.

Glaucoma. A build-up of excess fluid in your eye, causing internal pressure and damage to the optic nerve. Can result in severe vision loss and even blindness.

Cataracts. A clouding of the Clear lens of your eye that distorts entering light, causing blurred or hazy vision. Can lead to blindness if not diagnosed and treated.

If so, you may need vision help.

To help individuals kick the smoking habit, Mountainside Hospital in Glen Ridge has developed a seven-session smoking-cessation course.

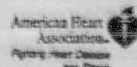
The program, which includes an orientation, program and maintenance session, will begin Thursday, March 20 from 7 to 8 p.m. at the hospital.

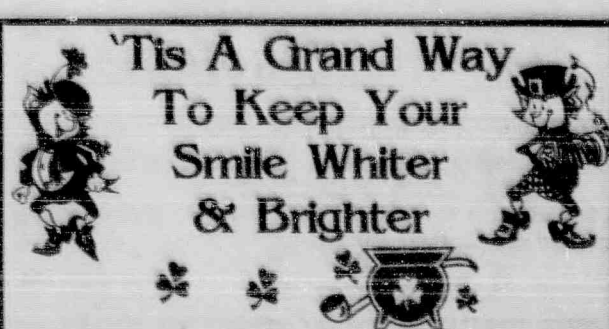

On cracks in the sidewalks

Last week's photo of former Public Works Commissioner Vincent Frantantoni pointing to cracks in a sidewalk near the Municipal Building has brought some protests for township workers.

The point out that the sidewalk shown in the picture was actually laid in 1991, not 1995 - as the caption indicated - and that there was an expansion joint in the sidewalk a few feet from the spot where Mr. Frantantoni was standing.

It was also stated that the reason for the crack is that a front loader did some work on a nearby fire hydrant and caused the crack.

We should note that Mr. Frantantoni did not put any blame on township employees, whose work he praised. He found fault with private contractors and with allegedly poor supervision of the projects.

We do not see eye to eye with Mr. Frantantoni on some issues, and in the nature of Belleville politics, some grandstanding is to be expected.

But two things about Mr. Frantantoni we do accept - one, his personal honesty, and two, the fact that he knows concrete.

In a town made up in good part by people who have made their living with their hands, the number of people familiar with the laying of concrete is probably in the thousands. Mr. Frantantoni makes his living as a contractor and his knowledge is based on experience. And there are cracks in some of the

sidewalks laid in recent years. Mr. Frantantoni blames the failure to place expansion joints - strips of lathe impregnated with tar - between sections of sidewalk for their subsequent cracking.

He pointed out sidewalks laid 10 years ago where no cracking had occurred.

Cracks in sidewalks lead to erosion and in a few years, instead of a few decades, replacement is required.

Faulty sidewalks are a hint that other aspects of municipal maintenance may be less than desirable. We cannot tell if there are faults in the infra-structure below our streets, until a water main breaks or a sewer clogs.

One of the reasons for the unsightliness of some of our streets is the variety of pavement that has been put down by the town over the years.

We have only to see the difference in the repair work done to cement pavement by Public Service - which replaces the concrete seamlessly - and by the town, which prefers to dump asphalt on the crevices and let the weather shape the result into a ski course.

We can attest to the hard work and the good work done by township workers as they battle to preserve our town with the limited resources they are provided.

But cracks in the sidewalk do raise questions, the way a jump in a thermometer reading does.

The cost grows, and grows

Years ago, there was a proposal to build a Municipal Building that would house all the scattered departments of government and create an anchor for Washington Avenue shopping with the construction of a parking garage.

The cost was considered by many to astronomical - \$8 million to \$10 million - and the design by a noted area architect was considered too grand - or "too good" - for Belleville.

It also involved a neighborhood rehabilitation program which many feared would lead to wholesale dispossession of families who had resided in town for generations.

All this overrode the fact that some \$8 million in federal financing was available. The commissioners who had supported the idea were driven from office and a change of government from Commission to Council-Manager was made.

The need for a municipal building continued, and a compromise was reached. A new Public Safety building would be built, and the current municipal building renovated.

Many departments of government continued to be scattered through the town, and the public safety building proved to be costlier than expected.

In fact, the cost has passed \$7 million, and we do not believe that a certificate of occupancy has ever been given the building.

While police headquarters took on a new, and improved, look, the municipal building seemed to decay. Haphazard attempts at renovation only made the situation worse. The beautiful old Council Chamber was gutted and chopped into a warehouse of an office for the Township Clerk, and looked as if a cyclone had torn through it.

Home in inner city neighborhoods would be condemned for the same conditions of disrepair found in Town Hall.

Nearly half a million dollars was bonded for a rehabilitation effort in 1993, and nearly \$2.2 million will be bonded for a further rehabilitation effort.

Thus far, the costs of the new public safety building and the old Municipal Building are higher than the cost of the proposed municipal complex of 10 years ago.

And there is no hint of any federal financing to help the project.

In fact, by the time the interest is paid on the bonds, the actual cost to the taxpayers will be far in excess of what the rejected project would have cost.

This is known as building with your hands instead of with your head.

It is a practice only too well known in Belleville.

Hopefully, projects such as Belleville 2000 may lead to better planning in the future. Belleville will need it.

Where the streets are kept clean and real estate is maintained.

Appointing Mr. Kimble as Town Manager is a good beginning. The gentleman was a former police officer and official so he certainly knows what is needed to keep us safe; as a longtime resident (the most important factor) his children were educated through the Belleville school system - he has to have the background to keep a sense of pride in township matters.

Also, the move to appoint him and doing away with two positions to save money is a plus. While many have doubts this move will work, let's give him and the council a chance. If it works - wonderful - and if it doesn't - it can be changed. The former managers, as we know, certainly didn't have the best interests of Belleville in their hearts.

They lived elsewhere. You know that where you live you have your pride.

I was a former Belleville resident and a product of the Belleville school system and returned to the "beautiful village" almost eight years ago (yes, returned). You and I are responsible, along with township officials, for the image of this town and what it has to offer.

Keep your property maintained, keep litter off the

streets (I pick up in front of my house daily and sometimes my neighbor's), put out those furniture items on the correct days.

And, to the Council and the new manager, the buck always stops someplace - who makes sure everyone follows through on their job? That's the most important factor of your level.

Bob says he is enjoying Belfast, but the constant mortar attacks and a recent killing of a soldier "are really putting a strain on a cease fire in Northern Ireland. The unionist paramilitaries are threatening to break the cease fire if the IRA kills one more person. It's a little tense here, but most of the conflict happens in West Belfast. I'm in Stranmillis which is like Nutley." I just hope Bob will not be in harm's way facing the threat of constant gunfire from the irresistible urge of Irishmen to kill each other. On the face of the postal card is a picture of the Belfast City Hall - a very imposing structure.

• **ACCORDING** to a Newark Star Ledger story, small

companies that have a written business plan make 10 percent more money than those operating without one. The biggest problem small companies have is slow sales growth. More than 10 percent of businesses responding to a recent survey complained that they don't have enough new customers and that operating costs are increasing too rapidly. Whatever your plan, a necessary ingredient is attracting new customers. Older companies are adversely affected by new competition, loss of customers closing down their businesses and mergers resulting in reduced needs. It's a fact of life that more companies are feeling the pinch of adverse economic realities.

• **BY** the time you get to read this, the most immediate problem facing Nutley residents is a plan over the line in Clifton that will bring to our border a large housing and retail development proposed for construction on Clifton's ITT property. It will include a large supermarket, numerous retail stores, dozens selling the same merchandise, a 200-room hotel, 17 movie theaters and 237 housing units. The proposed development will present Nutley with many negative factors including a proposed traffic entrance at the Kingsland Street and Washington Avenue intersection - dumping thousands of cars onto Nutley streets. Washington Avenue is designated as State Highway 7 as is Kingsland Street west from Washington Avenue. It's ridiculous to permit a super dreadnought shopping center to destroy another community's

neighborhood.

The project as proposed requires the approval of the New Jersey Department of Transportation. Here is where our legislative delegation can be effective. Senator John Scott, Assembly Majority Leader Paul DiGaetano and Assemblyman John Kelly are under obligation to lead the parade against this catastrophic proposal.

• **THE** state takeover of the Newark School System is not without its problems. An allegation was that the system was too top heavy with administrators. Another complaint was that the former Superintendent Gene Campbell was chauffeur-driven. Well - what do you know - the "too top heavy" system is now back to much the same number of supervisors, and the current supervisor, Beverly Hall who has a New York residence, is chauffeur-driven from and to New York City. Most of the staff is being replaced with New York residents, and one wonders if New Jersey teaching professionals are too dumb to be hired for staff work. Moreover, even the food caterer comes from New York City. And surprise of surprises, lack of security and poor custodial services were criticized. What do you think happened since the state supplanted the staffs? The number of security guards were reduced, thus increasing insecurity. The replaced custodial services have resulted in schools that are dirtier than they were before. Maybe now that the state couldn't improve upon the job done by the city, the next step is for Bill Clinton to take over the system, right? All of the above have contributed to a charge that an unusual number of employees applying for retirement has resulted in a six-month back log of all administrative work. Because the teaching staff perceives it is not backed by the administration, discipline in the schools is lacking.

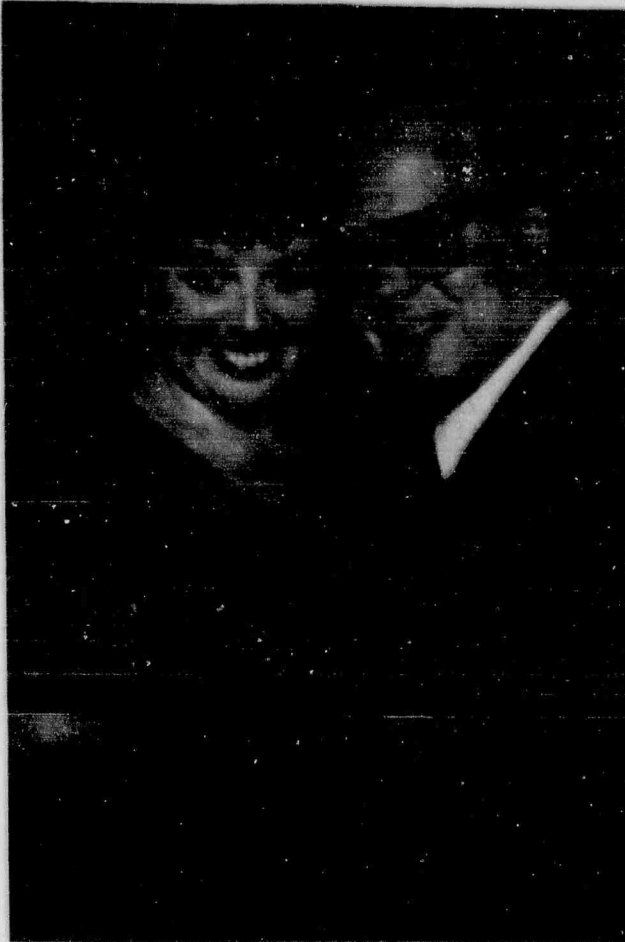

Clara Maass Auxiliary celebrates its golden anniversary

If its first 50 years are any indication, the Clara Maass Auxiliary will thrive for many more years to come. The service organization recently celebrated its golden anniversary with a year filled with fundraisers, highlighted by a celebratory concert attended by more than 300 people.

With nearly 80 members, ranging in age from 35 to 80 years, this dedicated group of individuals has raised, over the last five years, in excess of \$107,000 for Clara Maass. Activities include flower and jewelry sales in addition to the "Pennies from Heaven" campaign which was created to collect 500,000 (\$5,000) pennies to benefit Clara Maass' Oncology Department.

A "Wave of Joy" concert, featuring the orchestra of St. Peter by the Sea, was held at Holy Family Church, Nutley. This evening of orchestral music not only raised \$5,000, but also officially celebrated the achievement of 50 years of service to the Medical Center.

"The 'Wave of Joy' was an especially memorable evening for auxiliaries," said Clara Maass Auxiliary President Marie VanderZwan. The Belleville resident is now serving her fourth term as president of the organization.

"We have been very fortunate to work with such a wonderful administration at the medical center. We have also received continued support from the staff in all our events. It was rewarding to be able to include everyone in our celebration," said VanderZwan.

The Auxiliary and its members have a unique understanding of how Clara Maass serves its patients through constant interactions with various departments and people within the Medical Center. The organization determines recipients of its fundraising efforts by targeting selected areas within the hospital they feel need financial assistance. Their recommendations are then reviewed and voted on by the

Medical Center's executive board.

One of the most memorable years for the Auxiliary occurred in 1995 when the organization presented a check to Clara Maass for \$54,000, representing proceeds from a "Hearts of Gold" fashion show and annual Holiday Tree Lighting project. The funds were designated for the new Women's Health Center, which officially opened on the lobby level of the Continuing Care Center in October.

The Clara Maass Auxiliary presenting serving the Medical Center was preceded by two other fundraising organizations, the Betty Porter Memorial Society and the Ladies Hospital Society. When the hospital was rededicated in 1946 as the Lutheran Memorial Hospital, an invitation was extended to area women to help organize an auxiliary. When the name of the hospital was changed in 1952 to Clara Maass Memorial Hospital, the Auxiliary's name was changed accordingly.

In addition to fundraising efforts, the Clara Maass Auxiliary and its members are also very active in the governing side of service organizations, hosting for the second year the New Jersey Hospital Association's Region I and Region II annual meeting of Auxiliaries and Volunteer Services, once again bringing state-wide attention to the organization and Clara Maass.

"Clara Maass is quite lucky to have such a hard-working group of women as part of its family," said Brendan Farrelly, vice president of Corporate Development. "Without their continued efforts and dedication, we might not be able to offer as wide a variety of services to our patients. They should be commended for their diligence and congratulated on an impressive first half-century of success."

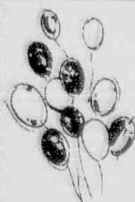

BUG SHOTS

Bloomfield, Seton Hall Prep win county tourney

Congratulations to the Lady Bengals of Bloomfield High School and the Pony Pirates of Seton Hall Prep for winning their respective county basketball championships this past weekend at Essex County College in Newark.

For Bloomfield, coached by **Jim White**, it was a hard fought 53-47 win over Shabazz in a battle of two schools with rich and storied traditions in girls' basketball in Essex County.

Bloomfield won its third championship (the other two coming in 1988 and '89) while denying Shabazz a record sixth title. (Shabazz won four straight crowns from 1982-85, then captured its fifth in '91).

White is somewhat of a legend in Bloomfield. He was the Bengals boys soccer coach for many years and compiled over 300 wins. Prior to the 1981-82 season, he took the reigns as girls' basketball coach and led a program that had floundered for years to prominence.

Bloomfield has appeared in five championship games, including the past three in a row and, as mentioned, has won three crowns. In addition, they have won three state sectional titles and the 1989 team won the Group IV title and advanced to the inaugural Tournament of Champions, losing in the quarter final round.

Better clock management might have given Shabazz its sixth title last Saturday. The Lady Bulldogs play a tough defensive game and are capable of lighting it up offensively. But they didn't manage the clock well down the stretch and lost the game in the final two minutes.

In the boys division, Seton Hall Prep won its second straight county championship and third in the past six years with a hard fought win over, ironically, Shabazz.

The Pony Pirates, who have won six crowns since the inception of the E.C.T. back in 1947, used a strong second quarter to take control of the title game. They led by as many as 13 points in the third quarter, but then had to hold on as Shabazz, who plays the perimeter game as well as any team in the county, made a furious come back.

What hurt Shabazz was something that usually is its ally, the three point shot. Normally deadly from behind the three point stripe, the Bulldogs struggled with the long shot and Seton Hall was able to survive.

Shabazz was looking for its third championship in nine years. The Bulldogs played for the championship three straight years (1988-90), winning two crowns.

With the county championships now complete, the high school basketball sports scene will now shift to the state tournament, which begins this week. The state tourney will culminate with the ninth Tournament of Champions, which will be contested in two weeks at the Rutgers Athletic Center.

Over the past two years, the T.O.C. was played at the Meadowlands Arena. In both instances, powerful St. Anthony won the crown, beating Shawnee for the title both times.

If you saw either, or both of those games, you'll know they were outstanding contests.

While Shawnee won't be in the mix this year, St. Anthony has to be the odds-on favorite to win its third straight T.O.C. and, incredibly, its sixth championship in the nine year history of the tournament.

St. Anthony not only has won five T.O.C. crowns, the Friars also have two national championships to its credit, the most recent one coming last year.

St. Anthony won't have it easy, however. Look for tough competition from state group rival St. Patrick's of Elizabeth, C.R.A. Seton Hall Prep (which only had one loss all season as of last weekend), Elizabeth and Camden.

In the girls division, Bloomfield will have its hands full in Group IV, Section II, with both Elizabeth and Columbia playing in that section. The winner of that group will be a heavy favorite to advance to the T.O.C. final, where it will probably face powerful St. John Vianney.

So, it's getting down to crunch time in high school basketball. I say it every year. If you have the time, try and go to some of the games.

You'll see some quality basketball from, quite possibly, future N.B.A. stars.

C. Zarro, Martin, Hands, Shama and Spina also advance

Conte, F. Zarro win district crowns

Anthony Conte and Frank Zarro will lead seven Belleville wrestlers to the regional championships following excellent performances at the districts last weekend in Nutley.

The regions began last night at Passaic Valley with preliminary round action. They will continue tomorrow and conclude Saturday with the semis and final round. All action will be held at Passaic Valley.

The top three wrestlers from each weight group in the regionals will then move on to the state championships the weekend of March 14.

"We did a good job," head coach Joe Nisivoccia said of his team, which placed fourth overall in a field of ten. "We were hoping for third and just missed out. We were in third place heading into the semi final round. Overall, it was a good effort. We've got seven kids going to the regions."

Conte did a solid job in the 112 pound bracket. The junior, who is the defending state champ at 103 pounds, pinned two opponents, including Doug Murphy of Livingston in the finals in 2:28.

Conte's other win was a majority decision, that coming in the semi finals.

"He was real smooth," Nisivoccia said of Conte. "He seems to be peaking. His drilling is more focussed and he's concentrating on getting the pin. He's a smart kid and he knows it's time to pick up the pace in February."

"I think everyone expects Anthony to be exciting and entertaining in every match. They expect perfection from him. Remember, he's a junior, he's still learning. I'm

extremely satisfied with him."

Zarro was dominant in the 140 pound class, pinning two opponents and winning a technical decision in the championship bout over Bloomfield's Joe Chiaravalle in 4:43.

"He did very well," Nisivoccia said of the junior. "He was hardly tested in the districts. He'll see some real good competition in the regions."

At 103 pounds, Tim Hands took third place and will move on to the regions. Hands, a senior, lost a close match against Adam Pitchman of Livingston in the semi final round. He then came back to win the third place bout.

Larry Martin was stopped by eventual champion Rami Ratel in the 119 pound semi final. The match was actually classified as a default, since Martin had a shoulder injury and could not continue.

"He held his own against Ratel," Nisivoccia said of Martin, who will be moving on to the regionals. "His shoulder was giving him a lot of problems. He tried to continue, but he was having problems and didn't have any more injury time left."

Martin did come back to win the third place bout, prevailing 18-3 in a technical decision that ended in 5:50.

Mohammad Shama did a good job in the 145 pound class and will be in the regions this weekend.

"Shama is one of those guys that I wasn't sure was going to make it to the regions, but he came through with a real good effort," Nisivoccia said. "He worked hard."

Shama won an overtime decision in the first round, then lost to eventual champion Joe Immersi of

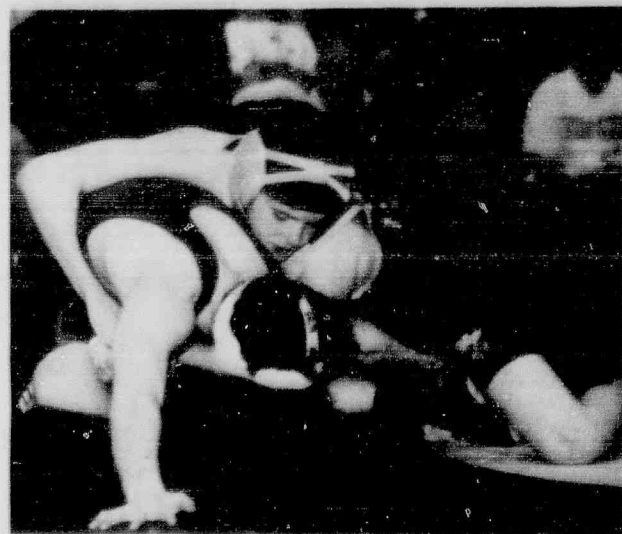

Bloomfield in the semi finals. Shama came back with a first round pin in the consolation round to clinch a berth in the regions.

Chris Zarro went through a case of déjà vu in the districts. Following a first round victory, Zarro battled Bloomfield's T.J. Francisco and once again lost an overtime decision.

In the county championship final, Zarro lost in O.T. to Francisco.

"It was a very similar match," Nisivoccia said. "He was winning most of the match, but gave up stalling points."

In the 215 pound class, Joe Spina moved on to the regions with a third place finish. Spina lost to Bruce Griggs of Essex Catholic in the semis, then came back to win

the third place bout.

"I think Spina was a better wrestler than Griggs," Nisivoccia said. "I don't think he wrestled his best in that match. I know Joe can do better."

NOTES: Mike DiPrimio won his first round match in the 160 pound group, pinning his man in 3:40.

Nisivoccia plans on letting the seven wrestlers work out at different schools this week.

"We tried that last year and it worked well," Nisivoccia said. "It gives the kids a change of scenery. Right now, the key is to keep the kids healthy and injury free."

Bloomfield won the district title, followed by Livingston, Nutley and Belleville. The Bucs missed third place by 5 1/2 points.

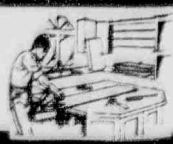

Answers To Your Questions About Business-Related Expenses

Question: I graduated from college in June with a degree in business. Since then I have gone to dozens of job interviews and have spent a lot of my own money getting to and from these interviews. Can I deduct my transportation expenses? Answer: First-time job seekers are not entitled to a deduction for job-hunting expenses. Reimbursements for such expenses from prospective employers, however, are not taxable. Once you get your first job, however, future job-seeking expenses in the same occupation may be deductible.

Question: Must a training or education course I take be job-related in order for me to deduct its cost?

Answer: Yes. For its cost to be deductible, a course must improve or maintain your present job skills or be required by your employer, the law, or regulations to keep your current salary, status, or job. You cannot deduct the cost of education that qualifies you for a new trade or business or that is necessary to meet the minimum requirements of your job. For example, you cannot deduct the cost of courses to obtain teaching certification but you can deduct the cost of courses you take to improve your teaching skills or enhance your subject-area knowledge.
