## St. Patrick's Day celebration Saturday will feature pipers, bands and joy

Belleville will play a major role in the 19th Annual St. Patrick's Day Parade, Saturday.

The parade is sponsored by the Nutley Irish American Association. Many of the members are Belleville residents, including the Association's Member of the Year, Mary Karen (Pierce) O'Connell.

Marching in the parade will be the Ironbound Irish American Association, whose president, Tony Mullen, is a resident of Belleville.

The parade will be part of a day of celebration, beginning with a Mass at 10:30 a.m. at St. Mary's R.C, Church, Nutley.

The parade will step off at 1 p.m. from Brookline Avenue to Harrison Street, then Franklin Avenue and on to Chestnut Street.

The Grand Marshal will be Eddie Kirk, owner of Kirk's Tire Co. in Belleville

Kirk won fame for his fighting off an attempt by a British firm to acquire ownership of Goodyear Tire & Rubber Co. in 1987, organizing 200 dealers around the country against the takeover

Among the units will be the Emerald Pipe Band of the New York City Department of Corrections, which will escort dignitaries and members of the Association into St. Mary's

## Nutrition On-line

March is National Nutrition Month. This is a month dedicated to promoting a special nutrition message to the public

This year the American Dietetic Association is promoting "All Foods Can Fit!" This means that all foods can be a part of a healthy diet.

Often people think of dietitians as the monsters who tell you what you cannot eat. In the past, this may have been true.

Now, with the new findings of research and the more inclusive attitude of most dietitians, the message is that whatever food you like to eat can be eaten! This includes that double chocolate

How can this be, you ask? Well, the technique most used is the trade-off technique. Trading is when you reduce one type of food in your diet so that you can have a treat, or trading may be eating more vegetables at a meal to provide the vitamins that the chocolate cake does not have.

Most people would tell you that sausage, chocolate, and pie are foods that you cannot eat.

But, these foods can be eaten if few small steps are taken

First, controlling the portion sizes of these treat foods is critical. A reasonable serving of cake is 1/12th of the cake or 1/8th of the pie. Avoid huge servings and you can enjoy the food more often. This is moderation.

Second, include foods high in vitamins, minerals and fiber along with the meals in which the special treat foods are eaten so that there is still a balance.

If the food you are treating yourself with is a high fat food, complement that with foods at your meal that are low fat like grilled, baked or broiled foods. This will prevent your meal from becoming high in fat.

If a rerson cannot enjoy eating all foods, then that person has lost on the whole dining experience. It is all right to eat any food despite the amount of fat or sugar in that food. The key is to balance that food within a healthy diet which follows the Food Guide Pyramid.



## Choosing the right lens for your frame - Part II

Last issue, I discussed some eyeglass lens options. I focused on the style of lens, whether single vision, for distance or near, and bifocals

Today, we will follow that up with a discussion of lens materials. The particular material will affect weight, thickness, vision and cost.

Whether a lens is single vision or bifocal, you may be asked what the lens should be made of. Years ago, all lenses were glass. These were heavy, but didn't scratch much. Nowadays, glass is rarely used except for some photochromic lenses because of weight and safety since glass breaks more easily.

Plastic lenses were the standard for the last 15 years or so because they're lighter in weight. But plastic can scratch, so the manufacturers started to find more resistant lenses. Plastic is now fast becoming a thing of the past.

The urge to get lenses thinner and lighter is reflected in the newer lenses today. Polycarbonate and high index plastic are now becoming standard.

Polycarbonate gives a thinner profile with extremely strong impact resistance. These are most recommended for children. From a standpoint of appearance, they can be cut thinner than plastic. They will however scratch easily unless treated.

High index gives better optics, slimmer profile and greater resistance to scratching. In my opinion, these lenses are superior although the gap between them is narrowing. There are different high index options also, so you need to rely on your eyecare professional's advice when choosing

So when discussing the material, be aware that the different materials will most definitely affect your vision, comfort and cost. When asked if you want a thinner lens, you need to know whether it's high index or polycarbonate and is it

I always ask my patients if they want thin, thinner or thinnest when discussing

Faulty sidewalks are a hint that other It was also stated that the reason for the aspects of municipal maintenance may be less than desirable. We cannot tell if there are faults in the infra-structure below our streets, until a water main breaks or a sewer

> One of the reasons for the unsightliness of some of our streets is the variety of pavement that has been put down by the town over the years

> We have only to see the difference in the repair work done to cement pavement by Public Service - which replaces the concrete seamlessly - and by the town, which prefers to dump asphalt on the crevices and let the weather shape the result into a ski course.

We can attest to the hard work and the good work done by township workers as they battle to preserve our town with the limited resources they are provided.

But cracks in the sidewalk do raise questions, the way a jump in a thermometer reading does.

## The cost grows, and grows

Years ago, there was a proposal to build a Municipal Building that would house all the scattered departments of government and create an anchor for Washington Avenue shopping with the construction of a parking garage.

The cost was considered by many to astronomical - \$8 million to \$10 million and the design by a noted area architect was considered too grand - or "too good" - for Belleville.

It also involved a neighborhood rehabilitation program which many feared would lead to wholesale dispossession of families who had resided in town for generations.

All this overrode the fact that some \$8 million in federal financing was available. The commissioners who had supported the idea were driven from office and a change of government from Commission to Council-Manager was made.

The need for a municipal building continued, and a compromise was reached. A new Public Safety building would be built, and the current municipal building renovated.

Many departments of government continued to be scattered through the town, and the public safety building proved to be costlier than expected.

In fact, the cost has passed \$7 million, and we do not believe that a certificate of occupancy has ever been given the building.

While police headquarters took on a new, and improved, look, the municipal building seemed to decay. Haphazard attempts at renovation only made the situation worse. The beautiful old Council Chamber was gutted and chopped into a warehouse of an office for the Township Clerk, and looked as if a cyclone had torn through it.

Home in inner city neighborhoods would be condemned for the same conditions of disrepair found in Town Hall.

Nearly half a million dollars was bonded for a rehabilitation effort in 1993, and nearly \$2.2 million will be bonded for a further rehabilitation effort.

Thus far, the costs of the new public safety building and the old Municipal Building are higher than the cost of the proposed municipal complex of 10 years ago.

And there is no hint of any federal financing to help the project.

In fact, by the time the interest is paid on the bonds, the actual cost to the taxpayers will be far in excess of what the rejected project would have cost.

This is known as building with your hands instead of with your head.

It is a practice only too well known in Belleville

Hopefully, projects such as Belleville 2000 may lead to better planning in the future. Belleville will need it.

. I RECEIVED a card from young Bob Cordasco, son of Nutley's Jerry Cordasco, postmarked Ireland. Bob is in Ireland on a special public safety tour of duty. Bob says he is enjoying Belfast, but the constant mortar attacks and a recent killing of a . soldier "are really putting a strain on a cease fire in Northern Ireland. The unionist paramilitaries are threatening to break the cease fire if the IRA kills one more person. It's a little tense here, but most of the conflict happens in West Belfast. I'm in Stranmillis which is like Nutley." I just hope Bob will not be in harm's way facing the threat of constant gunfire from the irresistible urge of Irishmen to kill eachother. On the face of the postal card is a picture of the Belfast City Hall - a very imposing structure

ACCORDING to a Newark Star Ledger story, small companies that have a written business plan make 10 percent more money than those operating without one. The biggest problem small companies have is slow sales growth. More than 10 percent of businesses responding to a recent survey complained that they don't have enough new customers and that operating costs are increasing too rapidly. Whatever your plan, a necessary ingredient is attracting new customers. Older companies are adversely affected by new competition, loss of customers closing down their businesses and mergers resulting in reduced needs. It's a fact of life that more companies are feeling the pinch of adverse economic realities.

. BY the time you get to read this, the most immediate problem facing Nutley residents is a plan over the line in Clifton that will bring to our border a large housing and retail development proposed for construction on Clifton's ITT property. It will include a large supermarket, numerous retail stores, dozens selling the same merchandise, a 200-room hotel, 17 movie theaters and 237 housing units. The proposed development will present Nutley with many negative factors including a proposed traffic entrance at the Kingsland Street and Washington Avenue intersection - dumping thousands of cars onto Nutley streets. Washington Avenue is designated as State Highway 7 as is Kingsland Street west from Washington Avenue. It's ridiculous to permit a super dreadnought shopping center to destroy another community's

neighborhood.

The project as proposed requires the approval of the New Department Transportation. Here is where our legislative delegation can be effective. Senator John Scott, Assembly Majority Leader Paul DiGaetano and Assemblyman John Kelly are under obligation to lead the parade against this catastrophic proposal.

. THE state takeover of the Newark School System is not without its problems. An allegation was that the system was to too top heavy with administrators. Another complaint was that the former Superintendent Gene Campbell was chauffeur-driven. Well - what do you know - the "too top heavy" system is now back to much the same number of supervisors, and the current supervisor, Beverly Hall who has a New York residence, is chauffeur-driven from and to New York City. Most of the staff is being replaced with New York residents, and one wonders if New Jersey teaching professionals are too dumb to be hired for staff work. Moreover, even the food caterer comes from New York City. And surprise of surprises, lack of security and poor custodial services were criticized. A "Wave of Joy" concert, featuring the orchestra of St. Peter by the Sea, was held at Holy Family Church, Nutley. This evening of orchestral music not only raised \$5,000, but also officially celebrated the achievement of 50 years of service to the Medical Center.

"The 'Wave of Joy' was an especially memorable evening for auxilians," said Clara Maass Auxiliary President Marie Vander-Zwan. The Belleville resident is now serving her fourth term as president of the organization.

"We have been very fortunate to work with such a wonderful administration at the medical center. We have also received continued support from the staff in all our events. It was rewarding to be able to include everyone in our celebration," said VanderZwan.

The Auxiliary and its members have a unique understanding of how Clara Maass serves its patients through constant interactions with various departments and people within the Medical Center. ## Bloomfield, Seton Hall Prep win county tourney

Congratulations to the Lady Bengals of Bloomfield High School and the Pony Pirates of Seton Hall Prep for winning their respective county basketball championships this past weekend at Essex County College in

For Bloomfield, coached by Jim White, it was a hard fought 53-47 win over Shabazz in a battle of two schools with rich and storied traditions in girls' basketball in Essex County.

Bloomfield won its third championship (the other two coming in 1988 and '89) while denying Shabazz a record sixth title. (Shabazz won four straight crowns from 1982-85, then captured its fifth in '91).

White is somewhat of a legend in Bloomfield. He was the Bengals boys soccer coach for many years and compiled over 300 wins. Prior to the 1981-82 season, he took the reigns as girls' basketball coach and led a program that had floundered for years to prominence.

Bloomfield has appeared in five championship games, including the past three in a row and, as mentioned, has won three crowns. In addition, they have won three state sectional titles and the 1989 team won the Group IV title and advanced to the inaugural Tournament of Champions, losing in the quarter final round.

Better clock management might have given Shabazz its sixth title last Saturday. The Lady Bulldogs play a tough defensive game and are capable of lighting it up offensively. But they didn't manage the clock well down the stretch and lost the game in the final two minutes.

In the boys division, Seton Hall Prep won its second straight county championship and third in the past six years with a hard fought win over, ironically, Shabazz.

The Pony Pirates, who have won six crowns since the inception of the E.C.T. back in 1947, used a strong second quarter to take control of the title game. They led by as many as 13 points in the third quarter, but then had to hold on as Shabazz, who plays the perimeter game as well as any team in the county, made a furious come

What hurt Shabazz was something that usually is its ally, the three point shot. Normally deadly from behind the three point stripe, the Bulldogs struggled with the long shot and Seton Hall was able to survive.

Shabazz was looking for its third championship in nine years. The Bulldogs played for the championship three straight years (1988-90), winning two crowns.

With the county championships now complete, the high school basketball sports scene will now shift to the state tournament, which begins this week. The state tourney will culminate with the ninth Tournament of Champions, which will be contested in two weeks at the Rutgers Athletic Center.

Over the past two years, the T.O.C. was played at the Meadowlands Arena. In both instances, powerful St. Anthony won the crown, beating Shawnee for the title

If you saw either, or both of those games, you'll know they were outstanding contests.


