### DPW announces leaf pickup schedule for Spring cleanup

The Department of Public Works started its leaf collection operation on Tuesday.

From April 1 through June 15, there will be weekly pickups of grass and leaves.

The schedule is as follows:

Monday, Zone 1 pickup.

Tuesday, Zone 2 pickup.

Wednesday, Zone 3 pickup.

Thursday, Zone 4 pickup.

Friday, Zone 5 pickup.

Leaves and grass must be placed at the curb in brown paper bags or cardboard boxes weighing no more than 40 pounds.

All brush must be placed at the curb in brown paper bags, cardboard boxes or tied in bundles. Brush and branches should not exceed four feet in length.

- No plastic bags or containers with rocks and other debris will be collected during leaf, grass and brush pickup.

- Any loose leaves, grass or brush at the curb will not be collected and will be subject to a summons.

- Leaf bags may be purchased at the Department of Public Works, 429 Stephens St., at three for \$1.

- For information about which Zone is yours, call (201) 450-3300.

- The Township Recycling Yard is located at 429 Stephens St. It is open Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Saturday, 7:30 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Glass and plastic bottles, aluminum and tin cans may be brought to the yard.

## Council winnowing out the contractors bidding on Municipal Building project

The Township Council reviewed 13 bids by contractors seeking the job of renovating the interior of the Municipal Building, Monday night.

The proposals ranged from a low bid of \$1,026,375 by U.S. Contractors Corp. to a high bid of \$1,998,000 by Arkay Construction.

Only three bidders submitted timetables for completion of the job, Mayor Victor Canning said.

This provision of the contract was considered essential by the Council.

One of those who provided a timetable was Nicosia & Sons of Belleville, whose principal, Ken Nicosia, told the Council, "As a taxpayer of Belleville, I suggest you reject all the bids, and let us sharpen our pencils for another round."

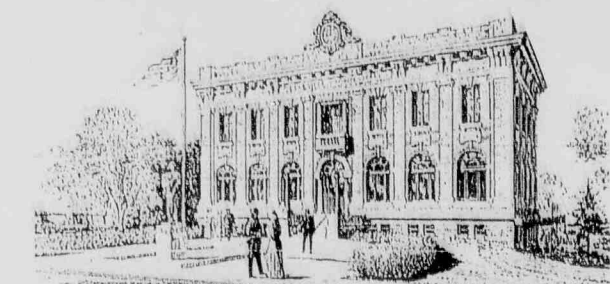
Nicosia & Sons made a bid of \$1,288,177.

In addition to the base bids, varying bids were made on alternative proposals, which included installation of a fire sprinkler system, installation of a fire sprinkler electric pump, substitution of VCT tile for hardwood flooring at meeting room and substitution of VCT tile for ceramic tiles in the main entrances and halls.

Several bidders did not make offers on one or more of the alternatives.

A spokesperson for Comfort Mechanical Corp. of Long Branch argued that his firm was the only one to offer a comprehensive timetable for the job.

The Council has voted adoption



of a bond issue of over \$2 million to fund the renovation job of the building which was built in 1912 at 152 Washington Ave.

The exterior has been cleaned, and windows have been installed, as part of the exterior renovation.

The timetable of the project is of importance to the Council because the administrative departments will need temporary homes during the job. Plans now call for the moving of most departments to School 1, formerly used as headquarters of the Board of Education.

The bidders' base bids were:

U.S. Contractors Corp. \$1,026,375; Integrated Construction, \$1,061,000; Silcon Inc., \$1,167,777; JDK Construction, \$1,180,716; Chanree Construction, \$1,231,500; Comfort Mechanical, \$1,238,936.

Nicosia & Sons, \$1,288,177; River Drive Construction, \$1,319,450; Gagliotti Construction, \$1,348,000; Castle Construction, \$1,398,765; Croicon Construction, \$1,427,277; Ward & O'Donnell, \$1,700,000, and Arkay Construction, \$1,998,000.

The Council went into close session to consider the bids.

## The Crime Watch: Drugs!

Police say they found a suspect to be a walking drugstore when they arrested him at 5 Hill St., March 27.

Officers Philip Gamarro and Richard Giordano went past the address at 1 a.m. when they saw someone attempting to hide behind bushes in front of the house.

Police said Vincent Matarazzo, 36, of 5 Hill St., was found to be carrying three crystals of crack, 10 yellow pills, two white round pills and two capsules of white powder.

He was charged with possession of controlled dangerous substances.

An attempted purse snatch was charged to Eddie Tony Cruz-Rivera, 18, of Belleville, late March 27.

Police said a woman in her 30's walking on Newark Avenue hung on to her purse when two men tried to pull it from her.

Officers Weedo and Breiner obtained a description of the suspects from her and Officer Gerard Corbo arrested Cruz-Rivera at Newark and Belmont Avenues. The suspect was held in \$1,000 bail. A woman resident of Newark, 27, made an unfortunate appearance before Municipal Judge Frank Zinna on March 26.

Appearing on motor vehicle violations, she swayed back and forth as she approached the bench to address the judge. A court attendant grabbed her before she fell.

Police said an examination indicated she was under the influence of heroin. So, a charge of using narcotics was added to several warrants for outstanding motor vehicle violations.

At 11:30 p.m., March 27, two juveniles, 16 and 17, were seen shooting an air rifle at street lights and street signs at Belleville Avenue and Carpenter Terrace.

Officers James Melillo and Rocco Andreottola ended the shooting spree. The juveniles, both residents of Belleville, were turned over to their parents.

A Belleville man, 29, had to raise \$200 bail after being charged with shoplifting two cartons of cigarettes on the afternoon of March 28.

Dave's Discount Liquor Store in the Pathmark shopping center, Washington Avenue, reported the theft. Officers Joseph Zarrello and John Holland made the arrest.

Two young Belleville men were arrested while parked in the Mill Street dead end, 10:40 p.m., March

27.

Officers Nicholas Breiner and Anthony Weedo reported finding two bags of marijuana in their car. They were released on their own recognizances.

Failing to signal a turn led to the arrest of Marianne Castellano, 47, and her passenger, George Boulatis, 43, both of Belleville, on the afternoon of March 27.

Detectives Dante Pasquale and Ralph Marotti stopped the car at Mill Street and Union Avenue. Police said they found two vials of cocaine had been tossed out of the car after police signalled it to stop.

Mrs. Castellano was charged with driving on the revoked list as well as possession of a controlled substance.

Police were looking for Jorge Rosario, 35, of Belleville when he was seen walking at Little Street and Washington Avenue, the afternoon of March 27.

Detectives Robert Capece and James Giuliano had warrants for his arrest. They added a charge of possession of narcotics, reporting he also had two packets of heroin on his person. He was held in \$1,000 bail.

## Aside from That

A photographic memory is what brought Mrs. Ruhama Beattie to America from her native India. Her mind skills are so astounding that scientist brought her to this country simply to analyze her abilities. She lectures and writes on the subject of memory and moved to Belleville to be near her son, David Beattie, and her daughter-in-law, Phebe Kant Beattie. Ruhama's father, Timothy Avdhany, was famed in India as a memorist in his own right. Ruhama can tell you your birth date down to the day of the week and can remember complex tables of information and documents. Her son, David, says he does not have that kind of memory. He is in management at

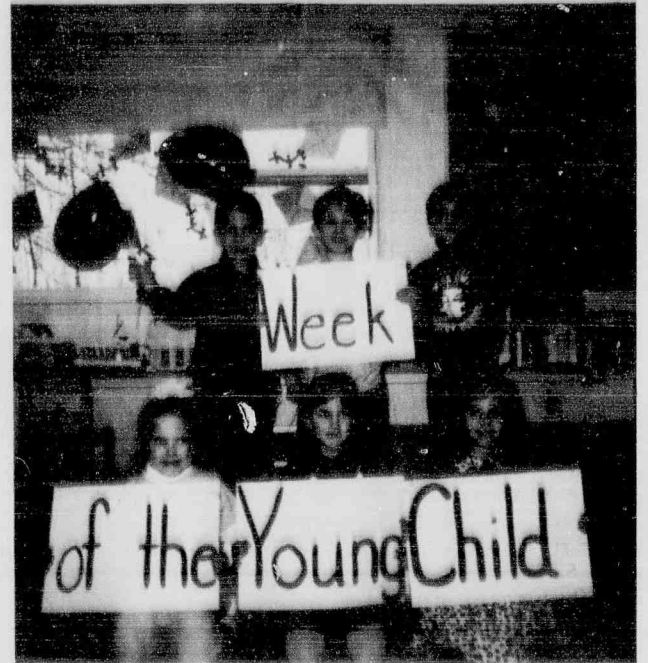
Wendy's, the fast food chain. But his son, David Jr., is deep into computers at the age of four. According to Phebe Beattie, both sides of the family, maternal and paternal, are part of the small Christian minority in India, and their baptismal names reflect the influence of Scottish and English missionaries. In fact, Phebe's parents, Saphya and Paul, are evangelizing in India now. Phebe and David Beattie are active members of the Kearny Bible Chapel. "It's founded by Scottish people," Phebe says, "and we feel very much at home there." . . . Phebe attended a Catholic school in India - "Where I received a very good education" - before coming to America with David, whom she met in India. She has a couple of businesses - Computer Monitoring for Seniors and Latchkey Kids Service, which essentially are telephone check-up systems to keep constant touch with the elderly and with children of working parents. Phebe recently became a certified Volunteer Advocate with the Office of the Ombudsman of the Institutionalized

Elderly. As such, she looks out for the rights and the well being of residents of the Cedar Grove Manor. She is also interested in a program sponsored by the Financial Independence Network whose purpose is to wean people away from credit cards and get them into a self-discipline mode to get out of debt. This is a program which could put her in serious physical danger, if word gets out to the plastics industry. In the meantime, she hopes her mother-in-law, Ruhama, will remember to come back from India, where she is currently visiting. . . . The epic of Tara Davis, whose will to find employment, wheel-chair or no, has brought into play the cooperative efforts of the New Jersey Symphony, Kislak Real Estate Services, New Jersey Transit and a host of federal and state agencies, is something worthy of a major film production. Tara, with acting ambitions, has wanted to work with people in theater. Enable is a no-fee state supported agency which put her in touch with Laura Stenger of the Symphony, who said she needed a receptionist-secretary, but the office was not wheelchair accessible. Lawrence Tamburri, director of the

Symphony, approached Kislak, the landlord for the symphony, who offered to cover the costs of any renovations. NJ Transit said it would provide free fares for Tara and her wheelchair. Others, from contractors to project managers, contributed their services and, according to Suzanne Dragan, Tara's job coach, "A new, enthusiastic employee is answering the phones at the New Jersey Symphony Orchestra!" . . .

• Fifth Ward Councilman Harry Zilch says that the town could have made better use of Town Hall than renovating it. "You had the perfect locale for a remake of The Addams Family. 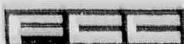

**Question:** When our children, now ages 9 and 11, were born, we set up an educational savings program for them under the Uniform Gift to Minors Act. Does the "kiddie tax" rule apply to earnings on these accounts?

**Answer:** Yes. If a child under age 14 receives unearned income in excess of \$1,300 from any source, the amount that exceeds \$1,300 is subject to tax at the parents' tax rate. Earnings received from investments set up under the Uniform Gift Minors Act are not excluded.

**Question:** My 14-year-old son earned about \$500 mowing lawns last year. Will he need to pay self-employment tax on his income?

**Answer:** Any independent business person, including minors, with net self-employment income of \$400 or more must pay self-employment tax. If the \$500 was gross, not net, income, however, remind your son to deduct all his expenses - gasoline, oil, and repairs. Also, if your son owns the lawn mower he uses, he can take a deduction for depreciation. With good records, your son will probably be able to write off enough expenses to bring his net income down below the \$400 threshold.

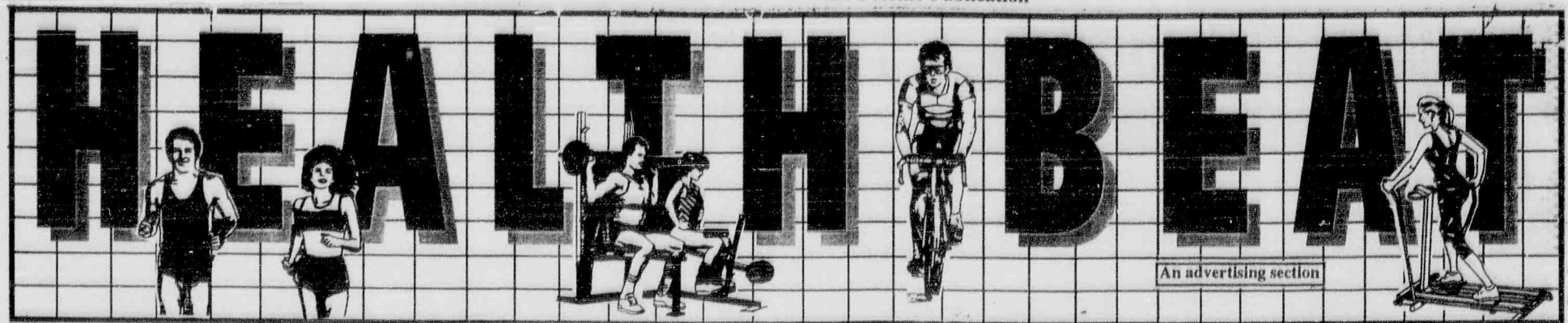

### My best bets on lens options

Over the last two months, I have been writing about ophthalmic lenses. Today, I'd like to sum up the important ideas and give you my best bets in eyeglass lens options. Hopefully, this will (1) make you an informed consumer, and (2) get you to realize value and function outway price in glasses.

Initially, I stated that you should decide on lenses first before selecting frames. This is important because some types of frames will be inappropriate for certain lenses. Bifocal lenses need certain depth to be cut, especially progressive lenses. It's a waste of time to find out after the fact that your choices were wrong and you need to start again.

My best bets in lenses are just a collection of my favorite recommendations. Hope you take this as advice the next time you need eyewear.

In 1997, glass is virtually not used and plastic is quickly becoming an old hat. The high index or polycarbonate lenses are quickly becoming standard. These are thinner, lighter and safer to the patient.

As for lens design, if you need bifocals, progressive addition lenses are being used more and more. These have no line and allow a variable focus. The best lens brand is Varilux Comfort. All the others measure themselves up to Varilux, so why not use the best?

Once you select the style and material, your best option to enhance your glasses is an anti-reflection coating. This is best for glare at night and on computers. It looks nicer too. I for one will never get a new pair of glasses without it. A large percentage of my patients get it too because I like it so much.

So when I'm presented with the individual who wants quality and value, I find it easy to help them. I just think of myself and what I would do for me or my family. It usually is successful.

In coming weeks, I want to focus on frames as well as the other health issues, like dry eyes, cataracts and glaucoma. Please let me know what you think at 667-0331.

## Fillings are not inevitable!

Q. What is preventive dentistry and what does preventive treatment consist of?

A. Preventive treatment is extremely important. Fillings are not inevitable and cavities can be prevented in the first place. Since our aim is to avoid pain, discomfort and the need for fillings, we must eliminate the cause first. The best strategy is to prevent a problem before you have it. Cavities in the teeth are caused by bacteria that is always present in your mouth. Eliminate the bacteria and you'll eliminate the cause of cavities.

Q. How do you get rid of the bacteria in the mouth?

A. First, you have to see the bacteria, then clean it away. In our office, we use a special process that colors the bacteria. Then we clean it away. If you do this procedure several times a year, there will be less opportunity for the bacteria to attack the tooth and form cavities.

Studies were conducted involving professional cleaning using dental engine. Over a three-year period, children in the experimental group, aged 7-14, received meticulous cleaning in intervals of once every two weeks in the first two years and four to eight weeks in the third year. The children in the control group had only supervised cleaning, using a tooth brush. The results were dramatic. During the 3-year period, the 84 control subjects developed 790 new carious surfaces, while the 93 experimental subjects developed only 42 new carious surfaces. There were equally positive results in the study on adults.

Q. Are there ways to stop cavities, already formed, from going any deeper?

A. Yes, cavities may not go any deeper under these conditions:

- absence of bacteria
- abundant saliva
- use of fluoride (as found in toothpaste)
- reduced sugar consumption

Q. Once there is a cavity in a tooth, is it necessary to treat it?

A. Yes, cavities are traps for bacteria and they cannot close by themselves. In the cavity, there is infectious material that, if left alone, will irritate the nerve inside the tooth, causing pain.

After the cleaning of the cavity, a filling must be inserted to protect the nerve inside the tooth and to restore the integrity of the tooth. However, fillings do not prevent further cavities. The treatment of the cavities goes hand-in-hand with preventive efforts. The best filling is always the natural tooth material. The most beautiful filling or any restorative work will not last for long if further disease is not prevented.

I stress again the importance of early diagnosis of caries.

Q. Why is finding the caries in the early stage so important?

A. Not all caries will develop into the form of cavities. Preventive treatment such as proper cleaning and the use of fluoride will stop them and there will be no need to do any filling. Small carious spots can close themselves with proper preventive care.

In our office, we teach proper oral hygiene and motivate the patients to cooperate in their own oral health. Fillings are not inevitable during the course of our lives. Caries can be easily controlled. We can prevent and eliminate the caries with preventive treatment and cooperation from both the dentist and the patient.

## OUR OPINION

### Non-feasance, misfeasance, malfeasance

The Consolidated Association of Belleville, representing the parents and teachers of the district, have sent a letter to the Belleville Board of Education requesting sanctions against Board Member Frank "The Finger" Montagna.

It cannot be said that the board has welcomed the letter. Board President Ralph Mazzuca, whose personal decency is beyond question, promptly sent the letter to Board Attorney Frank Pomaco.

In the usual order of things, the letter will either stay buried in Mr. Pomaco's files, or will be sealed from public view.

It is unlikely that the Board itself will ever consider, or even read, the letter.

The Consolidated Association is not a group of the usual irresponsibles who plague the public meetings. Its membership, unfortunately, rarely attends the public meetings.

There are good reasons to demand the airing of the letter.

The Consolidated Association is entitled to know just where the Board members stand.

In legal parlance, there are three grades of official misbehavior.

In "non-feasance", the failure to act to prevent or correct a wrong is the offense.

In "misfeasance", the offense is committed through error, willful or otherwise.

In "malfeasance", the offense is the outright commission of a wrongful act with

wrongful intent.

It is very rare for any of these acts to be committed in full view of the public.

Yet we have witnessed all three offenses committed by an unwitting Board of Education and a witless member of the Board.

The act of misfeasance occurred when a board member, Mr. Montagna, made an obscene hand gesture at a public meeting, directing it to three teen-age girls who were addressing the Board.

That took place on March 10.

The act of malfeasance occurred when the same Board member issued a deliberate lie, a denial that he had made the gesture seen by a hundred people - a lie he later modified by saying he did it "to illustrate a point".

This occurred on March 24.

A deliberate lie made by a public official in the course of conducting public business is, in our opinion, malfeasance.

The non-feasance, of course, can be charged to the Board members for taking no action on either action. The letter from the Association puts the board on notice to take some action.

Failure to censure Mr. Montagna is tantamount to acceptance of his behavior as proper.

We do not think the majority of the Board does tolerate such behavior in public or private life.

Neither, we believe, do the courts.

### The glory of Silver Lake

To find a real home town, preserved in all its traditional values of family and faith, one need only visit Silver Lake.

A very vital part of Belleville, it is still a community of its own, with its own flavor, its own pride.

People feel comfortable in Silver Lake. They know they are among friends. The intrusions of the outside world are felt in ways both good and bad.

Crime in Silver Lake is not something that keeps people locked in their homes, as in other communities.

But it is always a threat, and the establish-

ment of a police substation will be a success if only because it sustains people's sense of security.

Noted author, Inez Bull, Norwegian ambassador, will be honored at a tea and reception at 12 p.m. at the library, followed by a discussion of her books, "Ole Bull Returns to Pennsylvania," the biography of a Norwegian virtuoso and pioneer in the keystone state; "Oakeside: A Loving Tribute to Jean Doswell Oakes"; "The Girl on the Medal," a portrait of Julia Jones Pugliese, first women's intercollegiate fencing champion; "Ole Singstad's National Historic Landmark: The Holland Tunnel," just to name a few. Inez Bull has written approximately 15 books, with more to follow soon.

Internationally known coloratura soprano, concert pianist, editor, dedicated teacher of the retarded, director of music for the North Jersey Training School, a state institution for retarded girls, and special education and music coordinator for the Union City public schools, Bull is a graduate of Julliard School of Music with a bachelor of music degree from New York College of Music and a master's and doctorate in music education from New York University. In addition, she has received the Eisenhower Freedom Medal, the Sterling Silver Plaque from King Olav V of Norway and was named United States Goodwill Ambassador to the United States by King Haakon VII of Norway, as well as receiving the Gov. John S. Fine plaque and Pennsylvania senate citation.

She was named to the 1996 Marquis edition of "Who's Who in American Education" and "Who's Who in the World."

She is listed in The Piano in Concert, a National Endowment for the Arts, Washington, D.C. publication, of "great pianists in history" as a duo-pianist with Vladimir Padwa, a founder-member of the world famous The First Piano Quartet.

Giving over 10,000 concerts in voice throughout the world, she was acclaimed "the greatest coloratura soprano to have sung in France and Norway in history." Nominated for an Academy Award, Judy Garland portrayed Dr. Bull's life as a teacher of the handicapped in the United Artists film, "A Child Is Waiting" which premiered at the White House during the administration of President John F. Kennedy. The National Research Council in Washington, D.C., named her "the outstanding teacher of the handicapped in the United States."

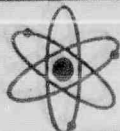

## Andres Saavedra excels in gymnastics

Andres Saavedra of Belleville was on a three-member team that took first place for Class 4 team events at the New Jersey USA Gymnastic Federation state championship meet, held March 16-17 in Clark.

The trio -- Saavedra, Nicholas Longo of Nutley and Kenny Stoute of Clifton -- competed in the parallel bars, high bar, pommel horse, floor exercise, vault and rings.

Saavedra, Longo and Stoute competed against approximately 40 other boys entered in Class 4.

Additionally, Longo captured first place all-around and Stoute placed second all-around in the Class 4 individual competition, which included boys 10 and 11 years of age.

The New Jersey USA Gymnastic Federation boys' state championship meet drew 450 gymnasts ages 7 to 18 from around the state, competing in various age classes.

In winning the team title, Saavedra, Longo and Stoute qualified to compete at the boys' regional championships, to be held April 12-13 in Allentown, Pa.

"By taking first place," said Robert Wasilewski, director of Gymnastic World, Inc. of Nutley, where the winning team members have been training since they were pre-schoolers. "The boys have shown that hard work and talent will help them reach their gymnastic and personal goals."

## Soccer referees being sought

The boys team has tri captains for the first time this year. Seniors Nick Colucci, Tristyn Kvetkus and Ernie Compasano have gained the honors and Tosato is quick to point out that four other seniors have also played key leadership roles on the team.

"We've got talented kids returning," Tosato said. "Our problem is with depth. We don't have big numbers, so we need to be as versatile as possible."

Colucci will compete in the intermediate hurdles and running events from 100 to 400 meters.

Kvetkus, who set a high jump record during the indoor season of 6' will look to meet, or exceed that mark outdoors. He also will be working in the 100 and 200 meters and should also be long jumping this spring.

"I know he'd like a shot at the outdoor high jump school record," Tosato said of Kvetkus. "It's 6'3", so it will be a stretch. But I think he'll make a run at it."

The mark of 6'3" has stood the test of time. It was set 29 years ago by Kevin Harvey.

Compasano will be a shot putter and discus thrower.

Tosato is also very high on the talents of seniors Rick Nejman, Mike Dribnak, John Bolkas and Angelo Chavez.

Nejman is a consistent thrower in the shot, discus and javelin. Dribnak will work in the mile and two mile.

Bolkas will triple jump, run the 400 hurdles, 400 meters and take a leg in the mile relay.

Look for Chavez to triple jump, run the mile and run a leg of the mile relay.

The Bucs were at Passaic Tech

last weekend for a scrimmage and did pretty well.

Jose Moreno, a sophomore, continues to excel in the distance events. He ran a 4:59 mile, then came back and ran the two mile in 11:20.

Moreno could soon be in elite company in the mile, as far as Belleville runners are concerned. The most consistent miler that has worn the blue and gold over the past 25 years was Nelson Seda, who ran a personal best of 4:35 in 1975.

In the two mile, Bellboy Jim Beck's personal best was 10:08, that coming in the Big 10 Championships back in 1975. Once again, Moreno could find himself in

that company by the end of this season if he continues to work hard.

Colucci did well in the Passaic Tech race, running 18.2 in the high hurdles and 63 in the low hurdles.

Sophomores Chris Muscara (shot put and discus) and Randy Herrera (200 and 400 meters, mile relay team) will also contribute right away.

The Bucs will get plenty of work early. After today's match, the team is at Kearny this weekend for the Kearny Invitational and next Tuesday, they will be at Nutley once again, but this time, as the visiting team competing against the Maroon Raiders.
