Watch out, Folks! Bridge will be out

Word from Trenton has come to Belleville that the Rutgers Street Bridge will close in August, 1998.

Construction of a new bridge will begin at that time, and the estimated time of completion is estimated at two years.

Traffic will be shunted to the Avondale Bridge and the Clay Street Bridge.

The cost of the project, paid for by federal funding, is estimated at \$30 million.

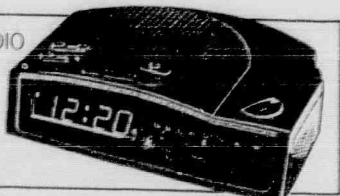

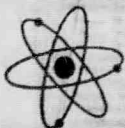

Senator Scott has earned renomination

State Senator John Scott has well served his Republican Party objectives and is entitled to his party's nomination. He paid his dues while at the same time earning the respect, confidence and support of the three county chairmen that span his legislative district — Bergen, Essex and Passaic Counties. Even Governor Whitman made a special trip to Scott's fundraiser in Lyndhurst recently to express her personal appreciation for Scott's support of her basic program and urged voters to renominate Scott — this despite the fact that Scott differs with Whitman's liberal agenda which includes affirmative action and partial birth abortions. There are in our midst wonderful teachers — not the least of them being a Richard Ruffalo — or a Jim Donovan — who help our young people to excel.

No salary is high enough to pay them.

There are volunteers in our midst who work with the ill, care for the elderly, provide counsel and comfort to the young and the old.

But the burdens of our society cannot be put on the shoulders of the volunteers alone. There has to be a community of spirit among us to help us become a community of achievement.

Voters elected council members of the Jewish faith in greater numbers any one could remember — and this despite the fact that voters of Jewish faith today represent a minority in Passaic. Mayor Semler had to overcome formidable opposition, in part based upon distortions of her record, and in some cases, outright lies about her ability to govern. A public official of integrity, conscience and competence, Semler has rare qualities, difficult to find in most candidates for public office in the City of Passaic.

McGreevey of Woodbridge and former Morris County Prosecutor Michael Murphy. Murphy doesn't stand a Chinaman's chance to be elected. The best he can do is be a spoiler. Of the three Democrat gubernatorial candidates, the one most likely to present the best case for the Democrats is Congressman Bob Andrews. As the Democrat nominee for Governor, Andrews probably will carry the solid south part of the state which represents eight important counties. At 29, he was elected a Camden County Freeholder, and at age 33, he was the youngest Democrat in Congress. Now 39, he seems headed for a Democrat Primary victory. Andrews is credited with a sharp mind, dry wit and a polished speaking style. Andrews recently received a major boost when the Hudson County organization endorsed him.

• **GOVERNOR WHITMAN** has two more problems on her plate. The New Jersey Supreme Court has ordered a revamping of state aid for education effective this September! This includes replacing dilapidated unsafe buildings, as well as allocating funds to improve the quality of education for children in three major communities which the Supreme Court claims are underfunded. Another problem just as serious with different consequences is Whitman's espousal of a \$3 Billion bond issue to replenish funds she used from the pension fund reserves to bail out her 1996 budget; and now to plug the holes in the 1997-98 budget, she wants to

float a \$3 Billion bond issue that will cost taxpayers many more billions in interest — to be paid by another generation of taxpayers.

It used to be that New Jersey governors were able to maintain a budget on a pay-as-you-go basis. With smoke and mirrors, Whitman has made it through the last three years and is desperately trying to whip Republican senators into voting for her \$3 Billion bond issue which with interest will add on several more billions in debt.

We think Whitman should restore the taxes she cut and gain some credibility in the process.

• **THE** Senate contest that affects Bloomfield and Glen Ridge in Essex County involves incumbent Senator Joe Bubba and the Republican nominee, Passaic County Freeholder Norman Robertson who says, "the question of personal and professional ethics lies at the heart of every issue in this senate race." Robertson rightfully claims that Bubba's ethical standards are below Robertson's and unacceptable in public service. Robertson has asked Bubba to sign an "Ethics in Government Pledge" agreeing not to accept gifts from lobbies and personally benefiting from senate services. Robertson noted for example that Bubba introduced legislation in Trenton that would have benefited the senator's private sector job as a financial consultant, although Bubba saw nothing wrong in that effort. Bubba accuses his opponent of raising taxes eight times in eight years. By remaining silent during those eight years, obviously Bubba had no objection. The charge is now made by Bubba because he is not the candidate of the Passaic County Republican Party. Robertson formerly was associated with the internationally famous law firm of Rogers and Wells whose home base is New York City. Rogers was Nixon's former secretary of state and attorney general of the United States.

Budget cuts cause change of hours at main, Shafter branch library immediately

The Library Board of Trustees voted at its May 14 meeting to reduce hours at the Main and at the Shafter Branch Library because of over \$121,000 in budget cuts to the Belleville Public Library and Information Center for the first time in forty years. At the Main Library, hours on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday will be from 9-8, rather than 9-9, and Saturdays, 9-1, instead of 9-5.

The Shafter Branch Library will close on Thursdays and Fridays now and throughout the summer. If the funding is restored, the library will resume its normal hours.

"The Library is the informational, educational and cultural hub of this community," stated Library Director Adrea Cohen. In searching the Internet at the library, Cohen found articles indicating that library budgets have gone up over 6.5 percent nationwide, while the library's budget is one of the lowest in Essex County and yet provides outstanding services, is being cut over 18 percent in 1997. She notes that the library's budget compromise of \$630,537 in 1997, from a proposed budget of \$671,642 in 1997, as compared to the 1996 budget of \$612,162, funded by the Township, would represent only less than one-half of one tax points, in the Township's budget.

The library needs its budget to operate the library. Capital funding will preserve the roof of the library and increase the capacity of the computer cataloging system, which is outdated, but will now provide for paying the bills on a daily basis for books and media, maintenance of the library, and the maintenance of the computers, which comes from the budget provided yearly by the Township.

Grants are only for a year and are for a special program, or collection development purpose, but do not provide for the day to day maintenance of the library. Donations to libraries in every community help provide special books, concerts and programs, which they could not otherwise afford, but they are not always made on a regular basis, and do not provide for the maintenance and daily operations of the library.

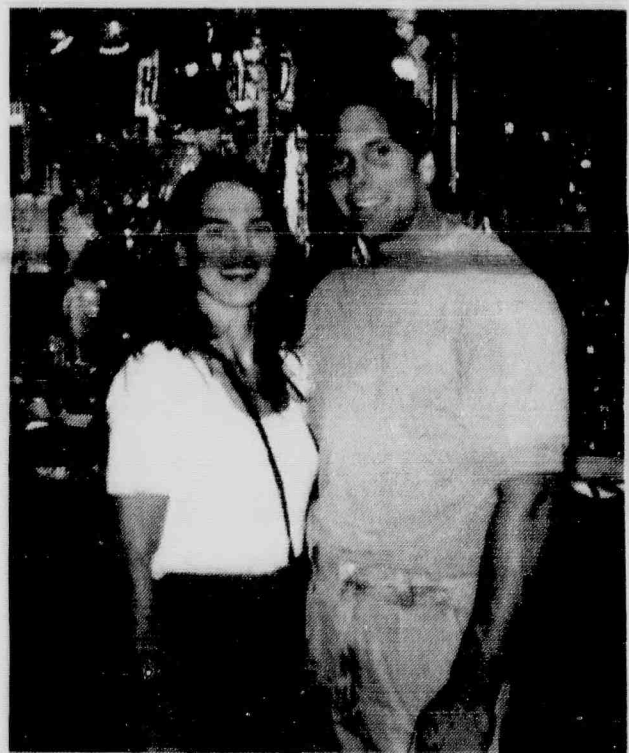

'87 Lady Bucs were destined for greatness

(Second in a series)

His team had gone 26-6 in 1986, captured an NNJIL title and lost a heartbreaking 2-1 decision to Caldwell in the Essex County tournament final.

The '86 team had set a school record for most victories by a team in a season. So, when 1987 rolled around, Lady Buc softball coach **Carl Corino** wondered what his team could do for an encore.

"We had a great year in '86," Corino said. "26 wins by a young team. We had a sophomore pitcher in **Janine Luzzi** who won 20 games, the first time a Belleville pitcher ever won 20 in a season.

"Now we get to '87 and the nucleus of the '86 team is back, along with some young kids that have great potential."

There was a near perfect mix of youth and experience on the '87 roster. **Cindy Ruggiero**, a senior, played first base, **Laurie Dondarski**, a sophomore, was the second baseman, freshman **Stacey Johansen** played shortstop when she wasn't pitching and senior **Trisha Tramultola** was the third baseman.

In the outfield, **Racquel Melson**, **Carol Morrison** and **Natalie LaBella** played left, center and right respectively. **Giovanna Mallozzi** also saw a good deal of time in the outfield and was a key player on the '87 roster.

The key to any good softball or baseball team is pitching and Corino knew that the '87 team would be solid in that position. Luzzi, 21-5 in '86, was back for her junior season and Johansen, a phenom on the Suburban League and Little League levels, was beginning her first season on the varsity.

The battery would not have been complete, however, without senior **Laura Caruso** providing defense and stability at the catching position.

So, the proverbial stage was set for what looked like a real good season on the diamond.

"I knew I had the luxury of two good pitchers that year," Corino said. "I tried to space their starts so that no one would be over used. Luzzi was the person I would turn to against the stronger teams. She had been there in '86 and knew how to get the big outs.

"We knew that Stacey was going to be a special player. The key with her was getting her the innings and getting her used to playing on the varsity level. It's a little different than what she had seen before, but we felt confident she would step in quickly."

Luzzi, who was inducted into the Belleville High School Hall of Fame last November, won key games against North Bergen in the state semi finals and pitched the team to impressive victories over Livingston, Ridgewood, Clifton and Montclair, to name a few.

Because Johansen was on the team, Luzzi did not get the start every game, but she did compile a 12-3 record with a microscopic 0.95 ERA in 1987.

She pitched 103 innings that year, striking out 66, walking just 31 and allowing 49 hits.

Johansen's numbers were also outstanding. She was 15-1, the only loss coming in the county final, with an ERA of 0.46. She struck out 124 batters in 106 innings, which is a mind boggling stat when you think about it.

In addition, she walked just 12 batters all season long and allowed just 47 hits.

In the aforementioned defeat in the county final, she pitched six shutout innings against Caldwell, but in the seventh, gave up three runs without a ball ever leaving the infield.

"It was one of the toughest defeats I've ever been around," Corino said last week of the Caldwell defeat. "That and the loss to Edison in the state final that year. We won 28 games in 1987, but the two I remember the most were losses. That's not to take away from what that team accomplished, but as a coach, I always think about the game that got away."

The '87 Lady Bucs got off to a tremendous start. The team won its first 13 games before losing to DePaul. Another loss to Clifton would follow before a string of victories prior to the game with Caldwell.

Next week, we'll look back at some of the key victories from that wonderful season ten years ago.

Ricci Bello pitched five solid innings for the Bucs ("an unbelievable five innings," according to

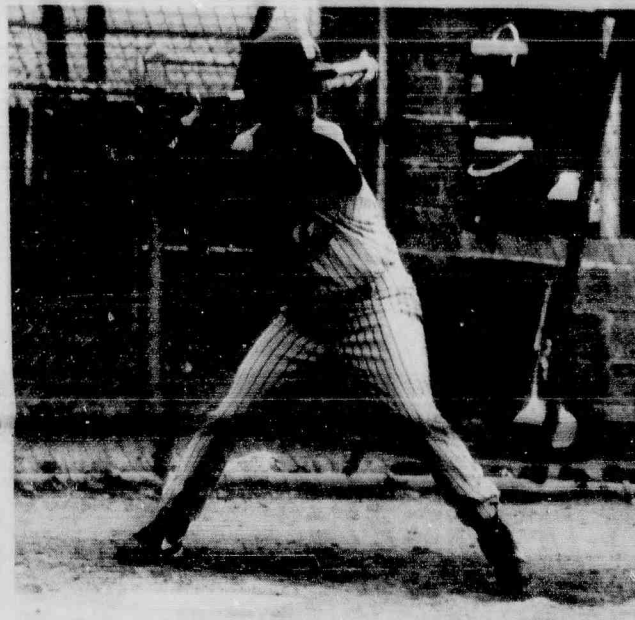
Zanfani) and the team had ten hits, but they couldn't get out of the sixth inning without major damage.

with a home run.

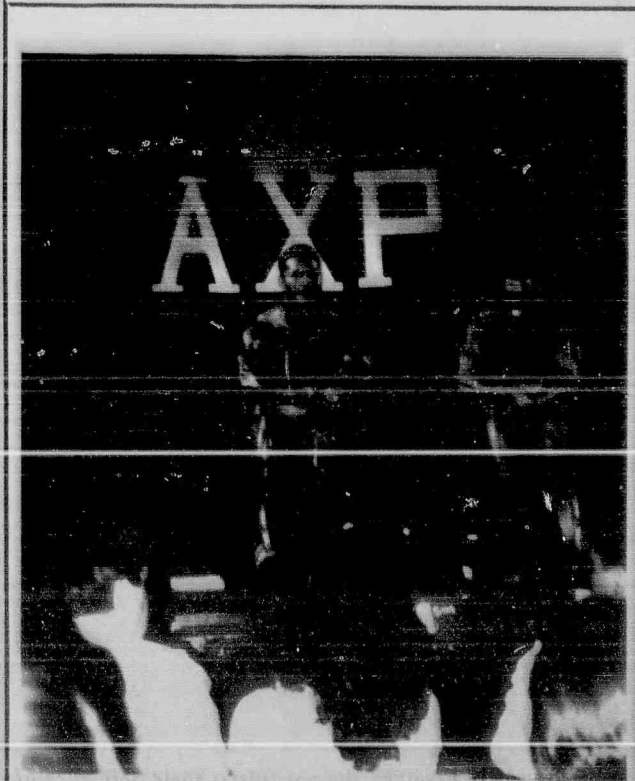

Once again, Bello pitched five

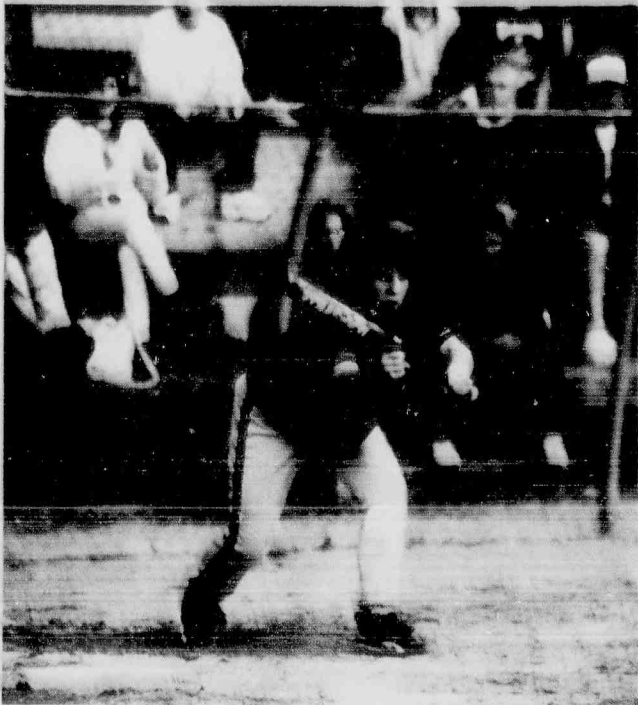
marvelous innings, but was hit hard in the sixth when the Comets came back and eventually tied it by the seventh inning.

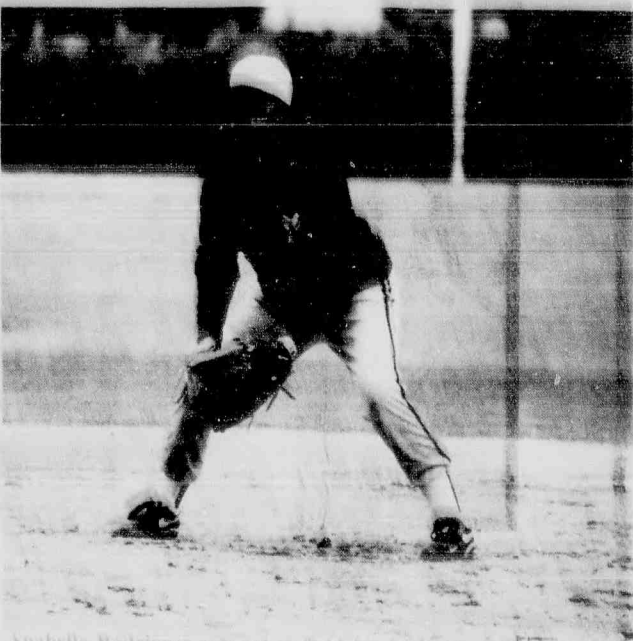

Bucs boys' midweight shell places third at Stotesbury Girls' lightweight makes semis at prestigious Philadelphia race

The Belleville varsity crew team traveled to Philadelphia to compete in the two-day Stotesbury Cup Regatta on May 16-17.

The "Stotes" is one of most competitive and prestigious high school races that the Bucs have participated in and is attended by teams from various parts of the United States and Canada.

The boys' midweight four shell produced some respectable results at the race. On the day of the qualifiers, the team of Mike Schmitt, Efrain Mercado, Edwin Garcia, Scott Horst and coxswain Chris Adamo posted a third-place finish behind Holy Cross from Canada and Gibaltor Carlson from Detroit, to advance the squad to the semifinals.

In the semis, the crew was up against tougher competition and managed to finish third again, which put them into the finals later that day.

The finals for this category contained six of the most difficult shells at the race. For most of the race, Belleville held second place behind Holy Cross.

However, LaSalle and Episcopal both made their moves to pull ahead of the Bucs during the last 500 meters. This combined with the intense wind and waves dropped the shell down to fourth place. Overall, the shell finished fourth out of 20 boats.

The other boats that did not qualify for the semifinals were the boys' junior four and senior four shells. In the boys' junior four race, the top two finishers advanced to the semifinals. The Buc junior four shell finished in third place in its heat.

The lightweight four also did not advance to the semifinals because they came in sixth place in their heat.

The girls' junior four shell failed to make it into the semis on Saturday. In their category, the top two teams in each heat advanced to the semis. The girls' junior four finished in third behind Mathews and Holy Cross. The senior four shell, which also didn't qualify for the semis, came in third place in its heat as well.

On Thursday, the team journeys to Delaware for the Nationals and will compete against crews from throughout the United States.

The series is coordinated by Dr. Keith Slocum, Associate Professor of English, Montclair State University, along with Library Director Adrea Cohen.

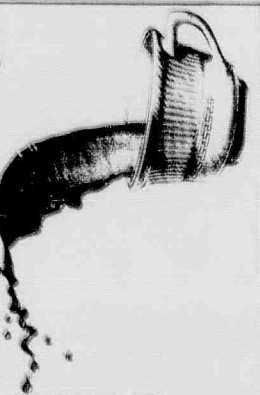
