McGreevey off on witch hunts

To the editor:

For about a year, State Sen. Jim McGreevey, D-24, led a troupe of "men in black" on missions around New Jersey, fighting make-believe demons and frightening senior citizens and middle class taxpayers.

The Legislature and the Whitman Administration worked with municipal officials and interested parties to reform the state's utility tax structure, so that it will provide \$3.7 billion in relief for New Jersey taxpayers over five years. Yet McGreevey and his Energy Tax Review Commission chose to ignore the facts and tried to transform a bipartisan issue into one which he could use for his own

political gain.

To borrow a quote from one of his own press releases, McGreevey predicted "municipalities will get hammered" by the reform legislation that I sponsored and was signed into law by Gov. Christie Whitman this month.

For the record, here is how local property taxes will be affected by my bill:

- The new utility tax structure provides more money for local property tax relief than the old system that McGreevey supported;
- It provides for an automatic growth in property tax relief into the new millennium; and
- It provides an ironclad guarantee that the state cannot skim money from the fund, thereby ensuring that property taxpayers come first.

As a former city council president, I can honestly say that if this is "hammering," then get out the nails and start banging away! In fact, this is a great deal for municipalities and property taxpayers.

That's why it was strongly endorsed by the New Jersey State League of Municipalities and the New Jersey Conference of Mayors and received nearly unanimous support in both houses of the Legislature.

Only one person in the entire Senate voted against the bill - Jim McGreevey. Democrats joined Republicans in support of this initiative because they knew it wasn't about politics. It was about provid-

ing \$3.7 billion in relief for property taxpayers. Only Democrat McGreevey, the depression candidate for governor, put politics ahead of people.

Keep it up, Jim, and you will find out the hard way that, as the song suggests, one is the loneliest number.

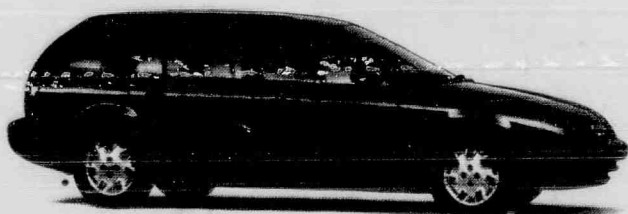

NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

National Night Out set for Tuesday, Aug. 5

Neighborhoods in Belleville, Bloomfield and Glen Ridge are being invited to join forces with thousands of communities nationwide for the 14th annual National Night Out crime and drug prevention event on Tuesday, Aug. 5.

National Night Out, which is sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch and co-sponsored locally by municipal police departments, will involve more than 8,800 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities and military bases around the world.

In all, more than 28 million people are expected to participate in "America's Night Out Against Crime."

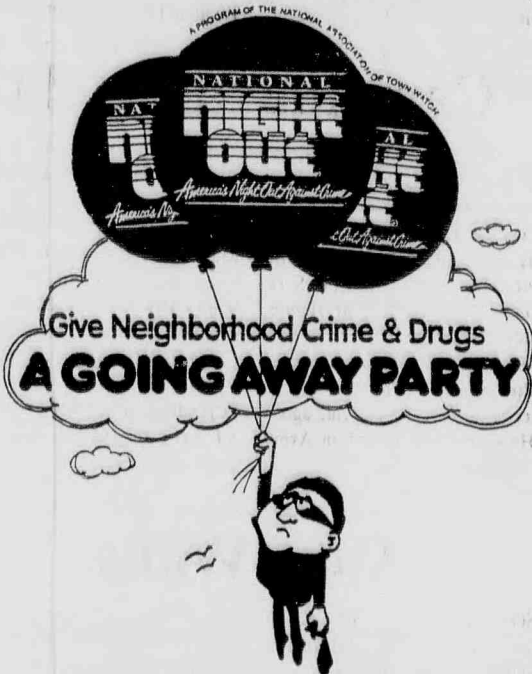
National Night Out is designed to heighten drug and crime prevention awareness, generate support and participation in local anti-crime efforts, strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community relations, and send a message to criminals, letting them know neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

From 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. on Tuesday, residents in neighborhoods in Belleville, Bloomfield, Glen Ridge and across the nation will be asked to lock their doors, turn on outside lights and spend the evening outside with neighbors and police.

Last year, neighborhoods throughout Belleville, Bloomfield and Glen Ridge held block parties, cookouts, contests and youth activities on National Night Out.

National Project Coordinator Matt Peskin said, "National Night Out is an ideal opportunity to build neighborhood unity and strengthen police-community partnerships in our fight for a safer America. On Aug. 5, millions nationwide will join forces to give crime and drugs a going-away party."

Neighborhoods that plan to hold block parties are urged to register with their local police departments. In many towns, officers will make arrangements to stop by the neighborhoods that are holding events and meet with the neighbors on Tuesday.



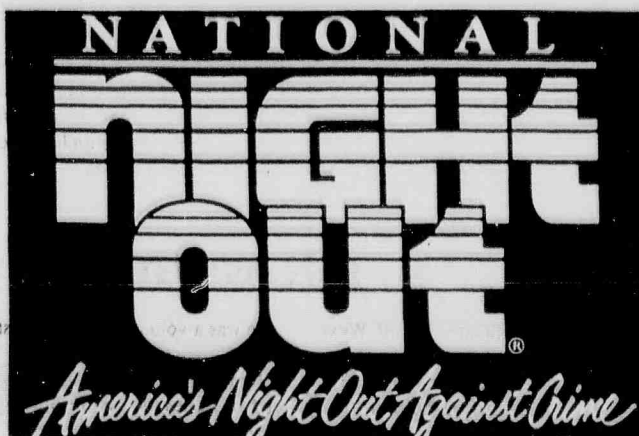

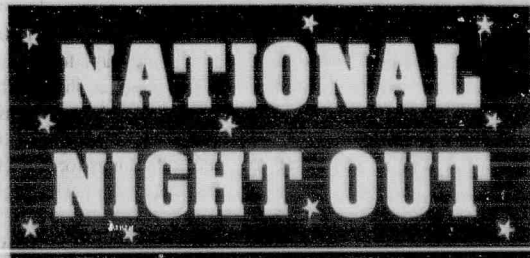

An echo of F.D.R.

On another page, we chronicle the vigorous, successful life of Anthony Passaro, a man who has filled his 81 years with productive labor, keen insights, energy and a sense of humanity.

"There is good in everybody," Mr. Passaro says, and he has written a book to prove it.

A man who lived through the Depression, Mr. Passaro has learned some lessons about that episode. "Bring back the C.C.C. (Civilian Conservation Corps), the W.P.A. (Works Progress Administration)! Let the government give jobs to the people!"

This is not quite in line with majority opinion in the United States Congress, these days, but there is no question that the legacy of government involvement left by Franklin D. Roosevelt is still molding the nation.

Current fears of government spending as bankrupting the nation brings to mind that the efforts of the Roosevelt Administration to restore prosperity never spent more than \$5 billion a year, and it wasn't enough.

What did end the Depression was the spending of \$300 billion to win World War II. And we now spend far more than that in a peace time economy.

Something like the old C.C.C. and W.P.A. is needed for the urban and rural poor who are still a large part of our society.

We have often argued that the 30,000 acres of Newark Watershed Property in Passaic County would be an ideal place for young people to learn trades as roads are built, lakes dammed, and hardwood logging resumed.

And it would probably pay for itself.

As for the W.P.A., the post offices, school buildings and other government structures created by the use of otherwise unemployed workers was nothing compared to the federal interstate highways provided by Republican Dwight D. Eisenhower.

But Eisenhower's program would have been unthinkable before the era of F.D.R.

Mr. Passaro made his living in private industry as a designer of electronic equipment. But he sees the role of government as that of friend, rather than foe, of business.

If, as critics of the New Deal claim, the so-called alphabet agencies did not work - which is to say, cure the Depression - it is because there were not enough of them.

It is unfortunate that it took rearmament to show how massive infusions of cash into a sluggish economy could be successful.

Hopefully, from now on, we will not need a dreadful necessity to do such things as provide health care for all and full retirement protections for our people.

A Lost Chapter in American History Part II

Nicholas Roosevelt and Fulton had many arguments over whether - and how - to develop the steam engine and also with Chancellor Robert A. Livingston, as he had a philosophical approach rather than a technical one.

However, had it not been for Livingston's enthusiasm and torrent of ideas it is doubtful that Roosevelt and Stevens could have succeeded in the construction of a steamboat - aside from his credit and capital.

An agreement among them was reached in 1798 and all that remained was to put a boat on the river.

Roosevelt was attracted to the idea of propulsion by means of "two wheels of wood over the sides fashioned to the axes of the flys (flywheels) with eight arms or paddles".

Stevens favored elliptical paddle wheels, while Livingston and Fulton clung to a horizontal wheel beneath the keel.

As to the construction of the engine, their differences were acute, but in the end it was left to Roosevelt and his workmen, while Livingston was permitted to retain his horizontal wheel.

The great day had arrived, after many postponements, in early August. A small battery of guns would salute the new invention. As the ship moved up the Hudson River at Red Hook it was discovered that it was incapable of movement of any kind.

Roosevelt was convinced it was was the horizontal wheel while the Chancellor blamed Roosevelt's engine. Tempers were high, an apology was given and a further experiment was set for Oct. 21, 1798.

This time, it would be the ship called Polacca, launched at Second River into the Passaic River, at Belleville.

Roosevelt later wrote to the Chancellor a letter giving an account of the trip, the speed of three miles an hour in still water, although with the wind and the tide, the speed was much less.

No less a person than the Ambassador of Spain was aboard. Highly elated, he reported the speed to be six miles an hour.

The Polacca's trip was halted when the engine appeared to be pounding the wooden frame of the craft to pieces. Altogether, it travelled about two miles down the Passaic.

On Sept. 6, 1798, Roosevelt wrote the Chancellor an important letter in which he mentioned a change in the plan.

According to "A Lost Chapter in The History of The Steamboat" by J. H. Latrobe, published in March, 1871 and held by the Maryland Historical Society.

"No better description of a sidewheel steamboat has ever been given than contained in the Roosevelt letter of Sept. 1, 1798. The original draft is certified as this is the first practical suggestion of the combination which made steam navigation a commercial success, that there is a record of in America. Both Stevens and Fulton were wrong and Roosevelt was right, time has conclusively established."

Footnote: Nicholas Roosevelt was also second cousin to James Roosevelt, great-grandfather of President Franklin D. Roosevelt. A certified U.S. patent was granted to Nicholas J. Roosevelt and James Smallman for their steam engine on May 31, 1798, signed by President John Adams.

Conclusive documentation shows that the bringing of the steam engine to America - and Belleville - by Josiah Hornblower - led to the transformation by steam of America into a different society than once was.

This all happened in Belleville, New Jersey.

• **ESSEX** County Executive James Treffinger has already proven he is entitled to a second term. He cleaned up the financial mess that he inherited and has been able to balance the budget each year. Perhaps, more important is the fact that he has been able to work in harmony with Freeholder Chairman Joseph DiVincenzo, the president of the overwhelmingly Democrat Board of Freeholders. When Treffinger arrived on the scene, Essex County government finances were in a deficit mode - its bond ratings had been downgraded, one grade above junk bond status because of past fiscal practices. The county tax rateable base for 1994 reflected a billion dollar loss. Now our county government operates without deficits, hidden taxes or deferred charges by "cooking the books". During his short two-year tenure, Treffinger has brought fiscal responsibility to his office. He reduced the number of county employees resulting in a smaller, leaner and smarter government. The county parks are getting better attention, particularly

Turtleback Zoo which has been long neglected. Treffinger resorted to privatization as a means of reducing costs and increasing efficiency. He privatized the county janitorial and cleaning services saving taxpayers a million dollars yearly. He also privatized the county security force placing it under the jurisdiction of the Sheriff's office and saved taxpayers another million a year. Perhaps, his greatest achievement was privatization of the county's geriatric center which was beset with immense financial losses and a serious drop in quality patient care. Treffinger sponsored the sale of the center to Kessler Institute providing the county with \$7.8 Million in new revenue while at the same time putting an end to annual losses which reached \$3 Million in 1995. More importantly, the patient care is now the best in the world under Kessler.

Like Whitman, Jim Treffinger certainly has proven one good term deserves another.

• **FOLLOWING** publication of this column last week in which it was reported the services of Ralph Salerno to North Jersey District Water Supply Commission were terminated as General Counsel, since the narrative offered no reason for the discharge, inquiries have been made concerning the cause of his discharge. Our best information from reliable sources indicates there were two actions by Salerno that caused the result. As counsel to the Commission, New Jersey case law requires that an attorney in his relationship with a client is bound to the high-

est degree of fidelity and good faith, and public policy requires strict adherence to such a rule of conduct. An attorney owes complete and undivided loyalty to the client who has retained him. The Lawyer's Rules of Professional Conduct provide that a lawyer shall abide by a client's decision concerning the objectives of representation. The Commission had decided upon the appointment of a particular female as deputy executive director. Despite the fact that Salerno's client was the North Jersey District Water Supply Commission, he visited the Governor's Office in an attempt to motivate the Governor's Office to become involved in the situation and impede the proposed personnel change - a violation of attorney/client relationship. Additionally, Salerno unsuccessfully attempted to persuade the acting chairman to be absent from the meeting that was to consider his dismissal. But that wasn't enough - at the meeting that led to his termination, General Counsel Ralph Salerno was present for a major part of the executive session with the exception from the portion which discussed his employment. Subsequent to his discharge, Salerno raised the question concerning the validity of the executive session with respect to the Open Public Meetings Act. The Commission followed the identical procedure which it followed in the past when Salerno was the general counsel; and during those years, Salerno never once questioned the procedure undertaken by the Commission or the validity of the decisions made. Since Salerno was present and still general counsel to the Commission, according to law, he was duty-bound to advise the Commission of the legal steps necessary during the executive session and the open public meeting. Failure to do so would suggest the possibility that he was remiss in his professional duties to the Commission.

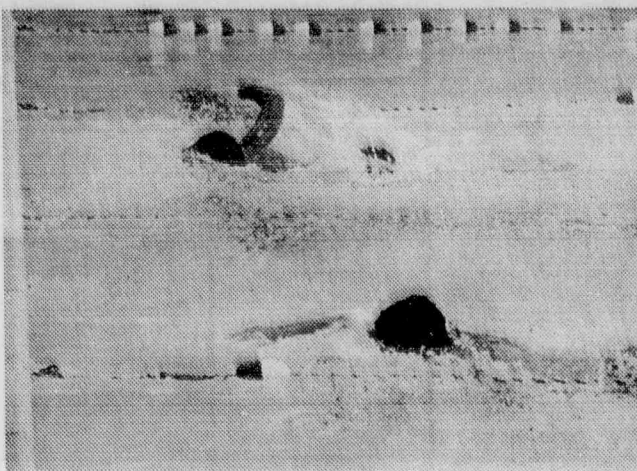

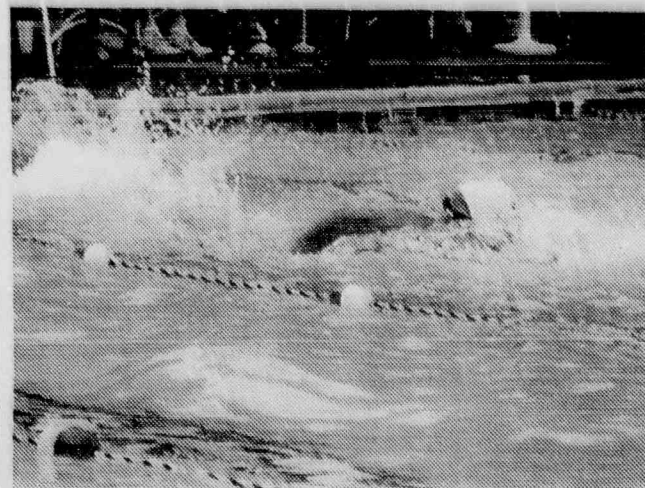
