## BHS Class of 2003 ‘reaches for the stars’

On a hot, early summer night, about 300 Belleville High School seniors represented the Class of 2003 at the school's 106th commencement.

At the June 24 ceremony, speakers looked back at four years of high school and forward to the challenges of the future.

Diana DeSantis, president of the class of 2003, welcomed the crowd. She said that sharing the past four years formed "memories that will last forever."

In entering the "real world," she said, "No matter what path we choose we will be successful."

DeSantis said temporary setbacks should only lead to greater motivation.

"Reach for the moon. If you miss, you will land among the stars," she said. "Be a person that makes things happen."

Next, Valedictorian Therese Joy Rodis Dublin quoted the late comedienne Gilda Radner, who said, "I wanted a perfect ending."

She said the wish doesn't come true, because life is about not knowing what is going to happen next.

Dublin said she had mixed feelings, but was clear about her feelings about one emotion: regret.

"Regret is a wasted emotion invented by man to keep us in the past," she

said.

In life, Dublin said, nothing is set, but change must be embraced.

"You can stubbornly resist change, but change will always prevail," she said.

In the final analysis, Dublin said a perfect ending is not an option.

"There are no endings at all. Just today, the here and now," she concluded.

Salutatorian Celestine Compton talked about mixed emotions.

"I'm nervous. I don't have a clue about the future," she said. "And I have regret, that I didn't get to know all of you."

She also named excitement, pride and joy at making it to graduation.

Compton said the class would "go in separate ways and forge different paths. But we will find ourselves on the same path - the path to success."

Like many speakers at graduation, she talked about change. "How you choose to embrace that change will determine whom you become and what you do," she said.

She compared life to the game Snakes and Ladders, where you climb all the way to the top only to be sent back to the bottom.

"However many times you're at the bottom, if you're willing to work hard

enough, you can achieve anything," Compton said. "Reach for the stars."

Ahmed Darwish was an honorary guest speaker. He spent the 2002-2003 school year in a residency honors program at the University of Southern California. Basically, he combined his senior year of high school with his freshman year of college.

He said he did the program because it was "something novel."

Darwish credited the teachers in Belleville "as some of the best teachers around."

At USC, he said he found

"We've got a lot to learn." For instance, he thought if he had the book for a class, he didn't need to attend class - wrong.

"Humble yourself now before someone does it for you," Darwish said.

USC has pride and school spirit, some things he said Belleville could use in greater supply.

"We can be a beacon of light in an otherwise bigoted world," Darwish said.

He then thanked his parents in Arabic.

Darwish challenged his classmates to be "collectively ambitious. Go out proud (See Grads on Page A5)

## Belleville boasts more this July 4

History will be recreated this Fourth of July in the cemetery of the Belleville Dutch Reformed Church, while residents can experience the traditional ceremonies of the Independence Day celebration while staying in town.

Michael Perrone has led a restoration effort at the church site, and the cemetery will officially reopen at 9 a.m. July 4. Six Boy Scouts dressed in Continental uniforms will serve as an honor guard, with 65 replica muskets to be placed on the gravestones of Belleville's 65 Revolutionary War veterans buried there.

Also on hand will be a cannon, three-fourth the size of a Revolutionary War gun. The gun will actually fire a blank. The festivities will include a 21-gun salute.

At the traditional festi-

ties on July 4, the recreation department will hold its annual field day for youngsters, ages four to 12, at the Municipal Stadium, starting promptly at 9:30 a.m.

The events, which will be open to all young Belleville residents, will be divided into three categories. There is a junior division for ages four to six; an intermediate division for ages seven to nine; and a senior division for ages 10 to 12.

Events will include the 25, 50 and 100 yard dash, an agility race, a three-legged race, sack race, a girl's tug of war and a boy's tug of war.

The members of the Belleville recreation playground staff will conduct all activities. Ribbons will be awarded to the first, second and third place finishers and all will share in slices of watermelon.

## Planning and zoning appointments delayed

The zoning and planning boards will have to wait beyond July 1 to have vacancies filled.

The township council delayed approving the appointments until the July 8 regular public council meeting.

"So we can argue, yell and scream about who is going to be there," Fourth Ward Councilman Michael Melham said.

The council can delay the appointments, as long as they are made before the

first zoning and planning board meetings after July 1, he explained. The planning board meets several days after the July 8 council meeting and the zoning board meets weeks after.

The council reorganized on July 1, with all of the major appointments remaining the same.

## Council to hear new plan for the Valley

There's something to be said for tenacity.

Woodmont Properties, the developers who brought the contentious Valley Redevelopment Plan before the Township Council last year, will return to Belleville next week.

The company will meet with the council prior to its 7 p.m. July 8 meeting on the invitation of the Valley's representative councilman,

Michael Melham. It is expected to discuss a much more scaled down version of the original plan, rejected by the council in November.

In light of heavy resistance to certain elements of the former plan, plus the new promise of a WalMart on one of its cornerstone parcels, the newer plan won't be as far reaching.

## Grass is always greener on the Soho property

Grass, shrubs and plants continue to be overgrown at the old Soho property at Belleville and Franklin avenues, despite a lien being put on the property to compel the owner to maintain the area.

The offending area is in the northern part of the great lawn area facing Belleville Avenue, according to Second Ward Councilman Thomas Fuscaldo.

Fourth Ward Councilman Michael Melham said the Garden State Cancer Center property only goes about 10 feet into the grass. The New Horizons developer's portion has been cut as well.

The offending party is

the Nardella group, Melham said, who have "a weird lease."

"We're trying to get them to actually take care of the property, but they don't think they're responsible," he said.

Fuscaldo said the property is not owned by anyone who actively seeks to develop the land. They'd have been summonsed in municipal court.

"We had to cut the grass the last time. Now there is a lien put on the property for the price of using our manpower and equipment to cut the grass," Fuscaldo said.

The adjacent property owner tried to cut the grass, but couldn't do it be-

cause of a lack of proper equipment, he said.

"Until it's too expensive for them to continue to do it this way, they will continue to take advantage of the town," Fuscaldo said.

If the northern section of the Soho property is developed, Fuscaldo said, the great lawn would then be maintained on a regular basis.

"I'm disappointed in the property owner for not maintaining the property," Fuscaldo said.

A separate problem happened during the winter's snows, when the New Horizons Corporation did not remove snow, and the town had to step in and shovel, Melham said.

## Shut down threat doesn't faze locals

As Republicans and Democrats in the legislature rattled their sabers this week, and the Governor threatened to close down state services without an agreed-upon budget, life in town hall was less dramatic.

Lawmakers had to balance the \$24.1 billion state budget by Monday, but were in disagreement over \$800 million in proposed taxes and increased fees up to that night. At press time, they'd come to an agreement, but had not voted.

Some area press reported that officials in different municipalities were concerned over the impending

shut down. That wasn't the case in Belleville. In a town that's threatened to shut down twice in the last two years due to 11th-hour budgets, state warnings to do the same didn't come as anything apocalyptic.

Township Manager Raymond Kimble didn't call any special meetings or orchestrate a backup plan to deal with a shift of burden to municipal services from state services. There was no worry about a drought of financial resources.

"We haven't had to make any special preparations," said Kimble Monday, "and no state government officials have contacted us to do so."

Kimble explained that most services that course the lifeblood through a community have no immediate dependence on the state, so life in a temporary state shut-down would probably be uneventful.

At press time, The Record reported that cuts were being made into funding for certain property tax rebate programs, public colleges and art groups. Scheduled increases to school and municipal aid were also being avoided.

Former Belleville Commissioner and State Tax Advocate Vincent Frantantonio said he's seen it all

Local tragedy unfolds on Harrison Street

A Belleville man is believed to have strangled his wife on Harrison Street last Tuesday, June 24 before dropping off his three children at his mother's home in Paterson and hanging himself in Lou Costello Park on Wednesday, police said.

John Irving Lovelace, 37, hanged himself from a tree in the park, located in a bustling area off Grand Street in Paterson. A suicide note was found in his pocket, police said.

A passer-by found the body around 4 p.m. and

phoned police.

Police did not say what was in the note other than that it led them to believe Lovelace acted alone in the death of his wife.

Lovelace was the prime suspect in the strangulation of Tanya Lovelace, 32, whose body was found last Tuesday at 8:10 p.m. by Belleville police in the couple's home on Harrison Street.

Belleville Capt. Frank Manno said one of Tanya Lovelace's relatives had phoned police Tuesday night after trying to contact the woman at home. Police went to the house and found the

door open and the victim lying in the bedroom.

Police said John Lovelace used a towel to strangle his wife.

The couple's three children - ages 15, 13, and 10 - were in the home at the time of the killing but did not witness the crime, police said. Lovelace drove the children to his mother's home in Paterson, and disappeared.

"From the beginning, the husband was the prime suspect," Manno said.

Manno said John Lovelace was unemployed and had a criminal record

dating to 1986, when he was arrested for armed robbery.

The disposition of that case could not be obtained Thursday.

Lovelace also served time in the Passaic County Jail for a drug offense in 1995 and had been arrested for burglary as well, Manno said.

The Essex County Prosecutor's Office was determining Thursday whether Tanya Lovelace had previously been a victim of domestic violence.

The children are staying with relatives of their mother, Manno said.

But who could forget the New Jersey summertime classic West Nile?

With all the near-epidemics of late, you may not have heard as much about the mosquitoes and the West Nile Virus (WNV), but health officials assure residents that risks still exist.

Thomas Restaino, health officer for Nutley, Glen Ridge and temporary officer in Bloomfield, said that right now, "There is not a lot of activity," including a scarcity of dead crows.

"I don't know if that's because mosquito season came late, or crows have become tolerant of the West Nile Virus," Restaino said.

There are bird traps throughout the county that are being tested for West Nile, he said.

"Look for stagnant water anywhere it can pool."

The key, he said, is the elimination of breeding spots, which the health department or mosquito division will gladly deal with if asked. Buckets cans and tires should be disposed of before they can be breeding spots. Fish eat mosquitoes and should therefore be placed in ornamental ponds. Roof gutters and drainage ditches should be cleaned and maintained regularly.

The county is putting larvicide in catch basins to stem mosquitoes, Restaino said.

It's now dead crow season, but there have been none in any of the towns Restaino serves. No mosquito pools tested have shown WNV. "That doesn't mean it doesn't exist," he cautioned.

lance activities were conducted in all 21 counties to detect and monitor the virus in crows, along with hawks, falcons, urban birds, sentinel chickens, horses and of course mosquitoes, as well as surveillance of human cases.

This year, the New Jersey Department of Health and Senior Services (NJDHSS) began accepting dead birds, including crows and American Kestrels, for WNV testing in April.

To protect you and your family from mosquito bites, Restaino advises residents to take the following personal precautions:

- Make sure window and door screening is in good repair so that mosquitoes cannot enter the home
- When going outside at times when mosquitoes are most likely to be biting, at dawn and dusk, wear protective clothing such as long-sleeved shirts and pants
- Mosquito repellents can be very effective in preventing insect bites and should applied to clothing and skin. When using repellents, always read and follow the manufacturer's directions carefully.

most infections are asymptomatic or mild.

In rare cases, more severe infection may result, with symptoms such as high fever, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, coma, tremors, convulsions, muscle weakness, paralysis and, rarely, death. There is no specific treatment and most recover without hospitalization. However, those developing more serious symptoms require hospitalization for supportive therapy.

The Division of Environmental Services/Mosquito Control is constantly working in the county to eliminate or modify mosquito breeding sites using a variety of control strategies, Restaino said.

For questions regarding mosquito control or to access the adult mosquito spray schedule in your community, contact the Division of Environmental Services/Mosquito Control at 973-239-0342.

With the record-setting rain of spring, some experts are predicting more, hungrier mosquitoes than normal.

When asked if that forecast was true, Restaino said, "yes and no."

Mosquitoes do breed in standing water, but when it continually rains, they cannot breathe and breed, certainly not in water that is continually disturbed by more rain, and not in streams running constantly.

"The water must be stagnant for seven days," he

## Vickie Smith's 'Ella!' to aid diabetes research

When Ella Fitzgerald passed away in 1996 of complications associated with diabetes, she left behind a legacy that Bloomfield jazz vocalist Vickie Smith tries to keep alive.

On July 17, Smith will perform her tribute show, entitled "Ella! The Song is You," as part of the Moonlight Nights Summer Concert Series, sponsored by Montclair's Office of Art and Cultural Development.

Smith will donate half the proceeds from the event to the Diabetes Research Institute Foundation, founded in 1970 to find a cure for juvenile diabetes. "The DRIF is thrilled that Vickie is taking the time to think of us and the mission that we're after," said Tom Karlya, the national development director for the organization. Karlya added that in clinical trials, patients have had Type 1 diabetes reversed. "Our hope is that one day this research project will become a reality for all those living with diabetes, many of whom are children," Karlya said. "These types of events that Ms. Smith is generous enough to offer for us is the reason we get closer to our goal every day."

"I love the energy and joy Ella put into each song and shared with her audience. It's what music is all about," says Smith, excitedly. "To be able to blend Ella's love of music, her concern for children and her fight against diabetes has very special meaning to me. I hope this benefit concert for DRIF will make a difference in people's lives as Ella did for mine."

When asked of her admiration for Ella Fitzgerald, she explained that while growing up with a very close relationship to her grandparents, she was introduced at a young age to the music of the Swing Era, and had a large collection of recordings, including Ella's. "My introduction to Ella was not as 'The Scat Queen' or 'The Memorex Lady', but rather the legend-to-be early on in her career," said Smith. "With much love and admiration, I've done a lot of research into those years and into Ella's life as well, and developed this show."

Songs in the show will include signature hits such as "I'm Beginning to See the Light," "How High the Moon" and "Oh, Lady Be Good," and lesser-known treasures such as "Sugar Blues" and "Starlit Hour". Covered in the tribute are

the first 20 years of Fitzgerald's career on the Decca label. Accompanying Smith is her jazz trio, "Cool Blue Central," which includes Bob de Benedette on piano, Ron Naspo on bass and Jeff Pines on drums.

Smith performs regularly in the New York/New Jersey area, most recently having presented "Ella! The Song is You" at Trumpets Jazz Club in Montclair. She has performed with prominent musicians such as Bucky Pizzarelli, Jerry Bruno, Joe Cocuzzo, Lenny Argese and Joe Battaglia and the NY Big Band.

The performance will be held at 7:30 p.m. in the Montclair High School Ampitheater, located at Park and Chestnut streets.

Fuscaldo said that, for him, "the necessary qualifications are that you live in Belleville and have a desire to be on the board and learn what you need to know to make decisions."

He said members "make good decisions based on your walk of life. I was no zoning expert when I got on the zoning board, but I knew what's necessary for Belleville."

For Fuscaldo, the biggest consideration in picking members is bringing back as many of those who have already served and have the experience.

He said the controversy over reappointments "is more political than practical."

Fuscaldo voted to reappoint Jay Boulker to the zoning board last year even though Boulker led a fight against Fuscaldo's Valley Redevelopment plan, because of his qualifications and experience. "He lambasted us," he said.

Fuscaldo said he could state with a clear conscience that the planning and zoning boards have done a better job than the councils in the last two decades.

Those appointments made at the July 1 noon session included Angelo Risoli as deputy mayor; Thomas Murphy as township attorney; Emil Nardachone as township attorney/prosecutor; Marc Calello as assistant prosecutor; Anthony Iacullo as public defender and Alfonse DeMeo also as assistant public defender.

called for demolishing homes has been stripped completely. Woodmont has also agreed to try and meet with WalMart to coordinate the development of its parcel in a manner that maximizes the profit making potential of the surrounding area. That includes the 10-acre property owned by the United State Postal Service and the Belleville Industrial Village.

For a while, it seemed that the WalMart was just a rumor thrown out by anti-redevelopment advocates to stave off the Valley plan. Six months after the vote, those on the council who had rejected the plan were starting to wonder if anything was indeed happening at the Walter Kidde site at all.

Mayor Gerald Digori said in May that he wanted to hear from Jerome and Harold Finkelstein, the owners of the Walter Kidde site, if they had made any definite ground in securing a contract with the retailer. One month later, an ad hoc press conference was held on the site to tout a newly signed agreement between the Finkelsteins and WalMart. The Finkelsteins were there; WalMart was not.

But when it seemed that rumors of a WalMart going up in Bloomfield would derail the legitimacy of the deal, the Star-Ledger reportedly confirmed that, indeed, Belleville would host the store.

Woodmont has said that it worked with WalMart in the past, and could come up with a plan that incorporates the retailer's needs, rather than forcing dictates upon it.

Local man in critical condition after hit and run in Bloomfield

Lighting fireworks at home isn't even legal in many areas, so if you still want to use them, be sure to check with your local police department first. If they're legal where you live, keep these safety tips in mind:

Sparklers are just too dangerous. If you give your child a sparkler, make sure he keeps it outside and away from his face, clothing and hair. ## The story of the stadium is out of a cartoon

When he's not enlightening the citizens of Belleville with his superior knowledge of such intricacies as designing a web site, Belleville Councilman Mike Melham often chimes in with his equally superior knowledge of Municipal Stadium.

In the June 19 issue of the Belleville Times, Melham is quoted as saying the varsity baseball field "looks decent and playable, but is a little lumpy."

Okay, let's digress a little. The varsity baseball field, which was promised to Belleville High School baseball coach Alan Frank on three different occasions last spring-only to be denied later because the field wasn't prepared properly-is indeed "lumpy."

A source familiar with the incompetent handling of the field got a good laugh out of Melham's description of the field as lumpy.

"It's lumpy," the source said, "because the grass was planted over dirt that had tire tracks from the work

trucks. That's why it's lumpy."

Melham must have forgotten to mention that when talking about the lumpy field. Of course, he also failed to mention that the foul pole was planted in the wrong spot on the varsity field last spring.

Melham continues by saying the JV field, which has been out of commission since 2001 but is just about completed, could be used for legion ball this summer.

Frank has a concern about that issue, however. "Yes, that field is pretty much ready," Frank said.

"But there's a five-foot cement barrier in the outfield that could pose a safety problem. Perhaps it will be removed, but right now, it could be a problem."

So, two years after Melham, Councilman Tom Fuscaldo and (now former) Mayor Angie Paserchia stood at Municipal Stadium holding shovels to commemorate the "ground breaking" of Municipal Stadium, we've seen one-and-a-half high school football seasons lost, two J.V. baseball seasons down the drain and the 2003 varsity baseball campaign eliminated. And based on the "work" that has been done on those fields, chances are none of those seasons would have been in peril had there been any kind of organization and commitment to the work.

Melham goes on to say that "the stadium's not going to go as smoothly (as street paving). (But) We're getting there."

If this were a Batman and Robin comic strip, I can visu-

alize Robin saying "Holy recall vote, Batman. Did Mike Melham really say those things?"

Melham admits that while baseball was lost this year, "we'll have a brand new complex next year" and that he hopes the field becomes "a stadium, with foul poles and yard markers, and grass like a golf course."

And, in a perfect ending to the story, Melham recalled his baseball playing days at Belleville, remembering his freshman year (in 1989) when the baseball program at Belleville had to endure a similar fate of playing all its games on the road.

Mike, I'm sure that current players like Mike Perinotti and Nick Galante, who played all-state level baseball for the Bucs this spring as seniors, feel much better knowing that you had to play all your games on the road as a freshman some 14 years ago. What a good comparison that was.

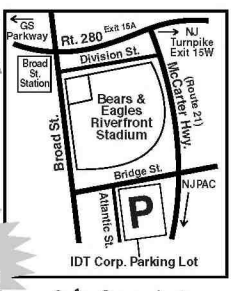

(Continued from Page B1) which goes to show the total arrogance that permeates the council when it comes to athletics. While Melham discussed the baseball field, he, like all the other council members who have served this regrettable form of government (as far as athletics are concerned) since it was convened in July 1990, never mentioned the track team. That's that group of Belleville High School athletes that has spent the last 13 seasons (under council rule, 16 straight seasons all told) on the road because no one can figure out how to give these kids a home venue.

This year was particularly appalling, as the team was forced to practice in the high school parking lot, and not so coincidentally, some of its members endured leg injuries which probably would have been avoided had there been a decent track to practice on.

A few weeks back, councilman Fuscaldo wrote a letter to the editor of this

newspaper, commending Essex County Executive Joe DiVincenzo on how nice the golf course in town looked. It's funny how Fuscaldo would go out of his way to praise a golf course, but said nothing about how DiVincenzo helped get Belleville a home baseball game at Riverfront Stadium and how others in Lynhurst worked hard to get the Bucs a home venue at Breslin Field for the state tournament.

And, ready for this? Fuscaldo, a graduate of Belleville High, ran for the high school track team back in the days when the township had leaders that cared about those kids and provided them home meets at Municipal Stadium.

Maybe DiVincenzo can offer some insight into why it's taken over a decade to provide a decent athletic facility in Belleville. He, of course, resides in that far away land called Nutley, where, somehow, its leaders have been able to provide multiple athletic fields and basketball courts, along with an all-weather track, to its residents. And if not

DiVincenzo, perhaps our "leaders" can ask those in authority in Bloomfield, Clifton, Passaic, Glen Ridge, Little Falls, Caldwell, Verona, West Orange, Kearny, East Orange, South Orange and Wayne how they did it.

Amazing how every neighboring community to Belleville has provided its athletes, and all its residents for that matter, excellent athletic facilities, and in Belleville, we have one councilman who refers to the baseball field as lumpy, and another who praises the Belgian brick at the golf

course, while some of our most talented athletes move to other towns, or attend private schools.

In May 1999, a study was done to investigative the best and worst athletic facilities in the state. Belleville's facilities were deemed the second worst in the state, trailing only Newark. In the past four years, Newark has made considerable strides toward improvement. Belleville? Just ask the track team how much the township leaders have accomplished.

Holy recall vote, Batman. Will this ever end?

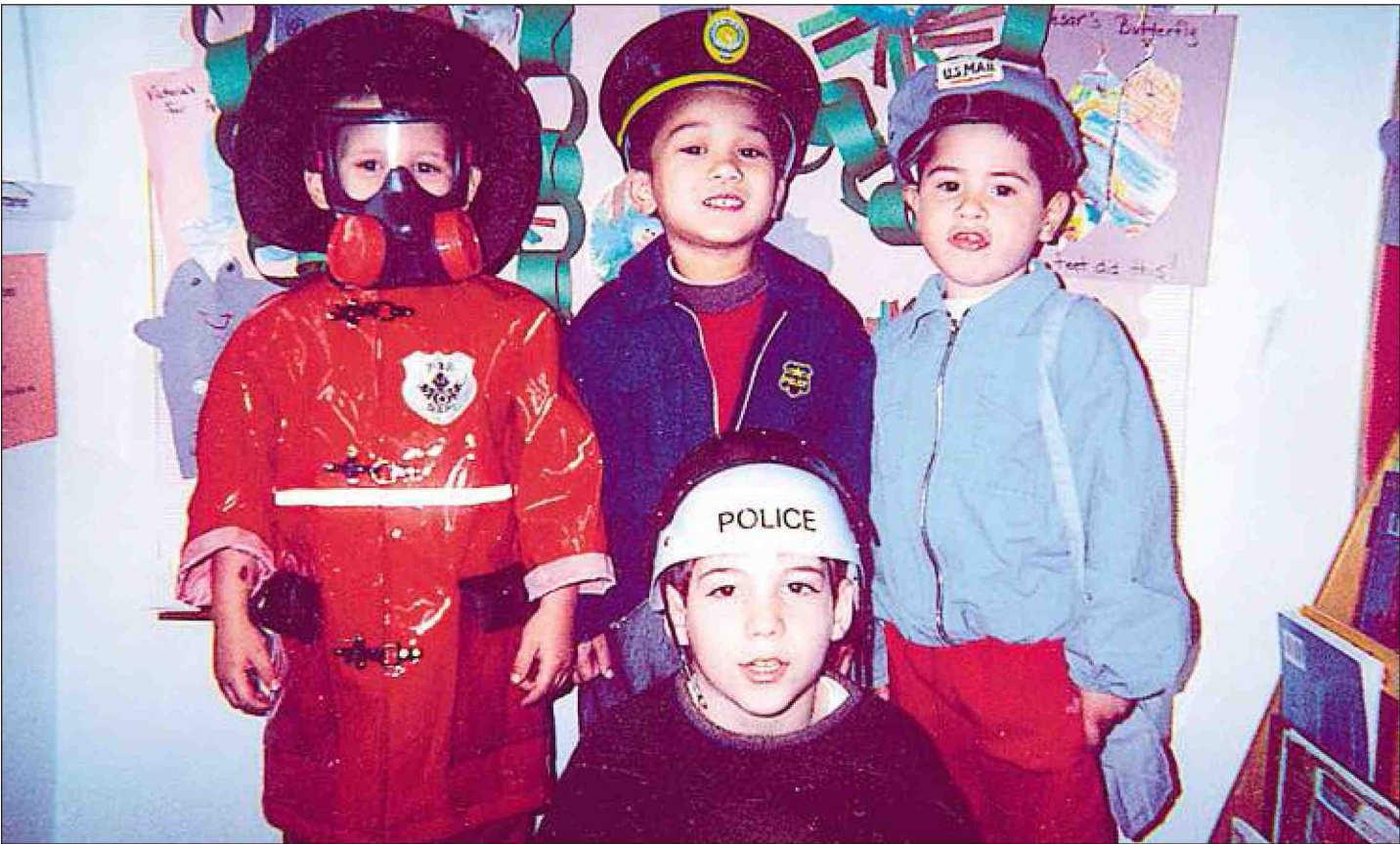
