Bucs finish their best in eight seasons

Overcoming the Township Council's incompetence towards athletics that has made the track program legendary in Belleville, the Buccaneer baseball team posted a 17-12 record this past spring, the program's best record in eight years.

"It was an outstanding season, all things considered," head coach Alan Frank said. "The kids played well, they never got down because of the situation we faced at home. I wish it could have been different, especially for the seniors, out everyone adjusted well.'

The Bucs advanced to the Greater Newark Tournament semifinals before losing a 2-1 decision to Nutley. It advanced to the state sectional semifinals before losing to Livingston.

The season started out with a series of promises that the varsity baseball field in Belleville would be completed in time for the Bucs to play some games. It started with an April 15 deadline, followed by April 29, then finally, May 15.

Now, due to continued bungling in the Township, the field is still not ready, and according to Frank, probably won't be until next April.

"At this point, they need to re-seed the field and that will take time," Frank said. "I didn't think it was worth it this summer to try and play a few games. I just want them to get the job done right, and that means seeding it by the fall, so it will be ready for next season."

On the field, the Bucs were led by seniors Mike Perinotti and Nick Galante. Both players will attend the College of New Jersey next fall, where they plan to play baseball. Both earned firstteam all-county and Group 4 honors. Perinotti, a talented centerfielder, was Belleville's leadoff hitter while Galante, the starting shortstop, was the team's most consistent hitter.

"Needless to say, they were the catalysts to our success," Frank said of Perinotti and Galante.

Seniors Danny Russomano, Tom Suchdolski, Dan Zarafino, Christian Santiago and Michael Bruno were also instrumental toward the team's standout season. Russomano was a power-hitting designated hitter, Suchdolski had a fine year as a pitcher and at the plate, Zarafino was solid defensively and also hit in the clutch, earning him allcounty honors, Santiago played brilliantly at catcher and Bruno was an excellent pitcher.
