Soho we won't go

Citizens maintain suit over property

With a lawsuit still looming, a move to rescind commercial zoning at the Soho property was rejected by the township council.
Meanwhile, officials say a gated condominium/townhouse plan is being considered by the developers of the property, located at the corner of Belleville and Franklin avenues.
At-Large Councilman Lou Pallante, who voted in favor of rescinding the commercial zoning, said he is concerned that the current townhouse plan may not go through.
"If it hits any kind of snag, you're in a commercial zone. What if the developer says he wants to go commercial," Pallante said. "I don't want it zoned commercial. I think it needs to be tweaked up."
He said he did not yet know what he wanted to do next about the commercial zone.
Al Schmitt is a member of Citizens Organized for Responsible Redevelopment (CORR), the group suing to stop commercial development at the site. He said he

thought the ordinance to rescind the commercial zoning was "a no-brainer."
He said the attorneys for all sides discussed the change in March.
"It's obvious this can't hold up. The council needs to rescind the ordinance and renew its commitment to saving the great lawn," Schmitt said.
He said the main reason development is not allowed on the great lawn area is that the property is deemed open space under a redevelopment ordinance that supersedes all other ordinances.
The condominium/townhouse gated community is not attractive to Schmitt personally, but he said he was not speaking on behalf of CORR.
Cambridge Heights, the similar type of community in Nutley, has about 9.8 housing units per acre. The Soho plans would have 24.5 units per acre, according to Schmitt.
"It's horrendous," he said.

Grant aims at aggressive drivers

Speeders and overly aggressive drivers beware - more is being done to stop dangerous drivers.
The police department has gotten nearly \$22,000 from the federal government to combat aggressive driving in the township.
The money comes from the National Highway Safety Authority and pays for overtime and the purchase of two radar detectors, according to Police Chief Joseph Rotonda.
"It is to help us eliminate, or at least reduce, aggressive drivers, speeders, tailgaters and red light runners," he said. "It will help us reduce accidents and fatalities."
There will be "roving pa-

trols" throughout the township, Rotonda said.
"We want to let aggressive drivers know we're out there, and educate them that we're out there," he said.
Second Ward Councilman Thomas Fuscaldo said one of the areas where speeding is a problem is Route 21. The township has had joint operations with the state police to reduce speeding on the highway.
"There's other parts of town, like Washington Avenue and Franklin Avenue, that need traffic help," Fuscaldo said.
The funding grant of \$21,920 was just applied for, and will likely arrive in the fall, Rotonda said.

Public employees finding cost-saving caps on retirement pay

Too many retired public employees have received too much money in accumulated sick leave and vacation time. Public agencies have answered the potential budget-killer by instituting ceiling caps on the amount of unused time a public employee can claim upon retirement.
Meanwhile, public employees are getting a shocking lesson after leaving their jobs: good health doesn't pay. "They instituted (the maximum caps) because of the inordinate amount of (unused time) that was being paid out," Chris Durkin, director of human resources for Essex County, said of the county's policy.
"It was to save the budget," Durkin said, "to save money."
Former Essex County Executive James Treffinger might not have set the precedent for capping unused vacation time, but he did set an example.
Last year, after leaving the county executive's office,

Treffinger put in for 118 unused vacation days and was paid \$43,383.88 in accumulated vacation time. Treffinger's 118 vacation days far exceeded a state statute stipulating that unused vacation time for state and county employees can only be carried over for one year.
"If you have 20 days (per year), the most possible days you can get (are) 40," said Durkin.
Because of the county's policy, Treffinger wasn't allowed to keep the full share. The former county executive wound up receiving \$28,677.48 to the county.
State employees operate under the same state statute that allows the county to carry over unused vacation time for one year.
According to the state Department of Personnel, state employees with more than 20 years of service receive 25 vacation days per year. Should a state employee retire after over 20 years of service without using any vacation days, the most an employee can receive is the salary equivalent of two years of unused vacation

time, or 50 days.
The maximum accumulated sick leave pay state employees may receive upon their retirement or departure is \$15,000.
Locally, cap ceilings on unused sick leave and vacation time differ among municipalities and their respective union agreements.
Unlike Montclair, where the most recent caps on accumulated time have been in effect since 1999, the Township of Belleville has operated with unused sick-time limits "for a while," said Ray Kimble, Belleville's township manager.
Belleville's public employees may be compensated for unused vacation time in accordance with the state statute limiting payouts to public employees with two years' worth of accumulated vacation time.
Retiring or departing Belleville police officers can receive up to \$15,000 worth of unused sick time. Firefighters can leave with as much as a half-year's salary. The maximum amount a Belleville Township public employee can claim is

\$12,000 in unused sick time.
"It depends on the union," said Kimble. "The unions are all different here."
When former Montclair Police Chief Thomas Russo retired from the Montclair Police Department in January 2001, he had accrued more than 500 unused sick days in 31 years.
But Russo, who began his employment with the Montclair Police Department in 1960, fell under the terms of the Superior Officers' Association (SOA) contract. The SOA agreement, like the township's agreements with the Police Benevolent Association (PBA) and the Fireman's Mutual Benevolent Association (FMBA), allows those who begin their employment with the township prior to Jan. 1, 1963 to receive a maximum of 225 days of unused sick time upon retirement.
The PBA contract also allows officers who began employment between January 1963 to June 30, 1994, to retire with no more than 130 days of accumulated sick leave. The same 130-days stipulation applies to offi-

cers employed on or after July 1, 1994, except with a \$13,000 maximum.
FMBA members fall under the same maximums as PBA and SOA members. The only difference lies with firefighters employed on or after Jan. 1, 1995, who can be paid for no more than 130 accumulated sick days, or a maximum of \$10,000.
"There's nothing magic about any of those numbers," said acting Montclair Township Manager Clyde Sweatt. "They're just to contain costs."
Non-union Montclair municipal workers cannot receive above \$5,000 in unused sick time upon their retirement. Nor do non-union public employees get paid for unused vacation time.
"Except in a situation where there's a specific reason as to why an employee couldn't take their vacation," said Sweatt.
"But," Sweatt added, "people don't accumulate a large number of sick days."
"We're pretty much across the board," said Michael Rohal, manager for

the Borough of Glen Ridge, where employees may receive a maximum amount of 100 accumulated sick days. Glen Ridge's maximums are applied to police officers covered under the PBA, the borough's employees affiliated with the Communications Workers of America union, and non-union management employees.
A unique situation could be brewing on the county level, where most employees are eligible to receive one day for every five in accumulated sick days.
Most, that is, except corrections officers at the Essex County Jail Annex in North Caldwell, who belong to a different union than corrections officers at the main Essex County Jail in Newark.
The union for corrections officers at the North Caldwell annex won a court decision allowing West Caldwell corrections officers to receive one-for-one payment in accumulated sick days instead of one-for-five.
But when the new jail now under construction in (See Sick Time on Page A4)

An unknown vehicle traveling north on Washington Avenue hit a man crossing at Academy Street. The vehicle then continued north

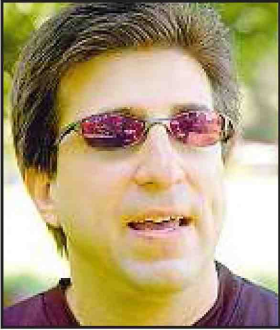
down Washington Avenue.

National Night Out coming August 5

The 20th Annual Night Out (NNO), a unique crime/drug prevention event sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW), has been scheduled for Aug. 5.

The Township of Belleville will observe National Night Out with a giant block party to be held on the Great Lawn at Christ Episcopal Church, 393 Washington Ave., from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. The event will offer free food and the public will be entertained by D.J. Eddie.

The annual Business After Hours, hosted by the Suburban Essex Chamber of Commerce, will also take place that night. The public will have the opportunity to view displays by various local businesses on the lawn. Businesses wishing to reserve a table to display business cards or promotional materials are asked to phone (973) 751-0616. The cost of the tables is \$15 for participating chamber members and \$25 for non-members.

Last year's National Night Out campaign involved citizens, law enforcement agencies, civic groups, businesses, neighborhood organizations and local offi-

cials from 9,850 communities from all 50 states, U.S. Territories, Canadian cities and military bases worldwide. In all, 33 million people participated in NNO 2002.

National Night Out is designed to heighten crime and drug prevention awareness; generate support for, and participation in, local anti-crime programs; strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships; and send a message that neighborhoods are organized and fighting back.

The National Association of Town Watch (NATW) is a nonprofit, crime prevention organization, which works in cooperation with thousands of crime watch groups and law enforcement agencies throughout the country. Since 1981, NATW has been dedicated to the development, growth and maintenance of organized crime and drug prevention programs nationwide. NATW's network has grown to include over 6,000 crime, drug and violence prevention organizations.

National Night Out, America's Night Out Against Crime, was introduced by the association in

1984. The program was the brainchild of NATW Executive Director Matt A. Peskin.

In an effort to heighten awareness and strengthen participation in local anti-crime efforts, Peskin felt that a high-profile, high-impact type of crime prevention event was needed nationally. At that time, he noted in a typical "crime watch community," only five to seven percent of residents were participating actively. Due to the worth and success of these programs, he felt this percentage was too low. Subsequently, he proposed a national program, which would be coordinated by local crime prevention agencies and organizations — but that would involve entire communities at one time. The first National Night Out was introduced early in 1984, with the event culminating on the first Tuesday in August.

That first year, 400 communities and 23 states participated in National Night Out. Nationwide, 2.5 million Americans took part in 1984. The seed had been planted. In subsequent years, participation has grown steadily. The 19th annual National Night Out

on Aug. 6, 2002 involved 33 million people in 9,700 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities, and military bases worldwide. National Night Out 2003 will culminate on Aug. 5.

While the traditional lights on and front porch vigils remain part of NNO, activities have expanded considerably over the years to include block parties, cookouts, parades, visits from police, festivals, neighborhood walks, safety fairs, contests, rallies and meetings. Peskin said, "It's a wonderful opportunity for communities nationwide to promote police-community partnerships, crime prevention, and neighborhood camaraderie. While the one night is certainly not an answer to crime, drug and violence, National Night Out does represent the kind of spirit, energy and determination that is helping to make many neighborhoods safer places throughout the year. National Night Out is a night to celebrate crime prevention successes, and to expand and strengthen programs for the next 364 days."

Third River repair delayed by State DEP

Improvements designed to make the Third River less susceptible to flooding and erosion have been delayed by state officials. State Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) officials are holding up the work, according to Second Ward Councilman Thomas Fuscaldo. While the DEP officials wait to get preliminary scheduling, the contractor who was awarded the bid for the work wants more money. "The contractor wants an

adjustment in the bid process since the bid was awarded a year ago," Fuscaldo said. Township Manager Raymond Kimble said the town is negotiating how and why the bid needs adjusting. The work to be done would prepare the river for gabion walls and terraced, blocked structures to stop flooding and erosion, Fuscaldo said. The work will start at the Nutley border and go as far up to the Bloomfield border as the funding will allow. A Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) grant will fund the beginning of the work on the Nutley border, Fuscaldo said. A total of \$475,000 in money was allocated by the state for the work as well, he said. Finally, some left over bond money from the township is being used, Fuscaldo said. "It's not a big number," he said of the bond money. There was a scheduling conflict that kept some of the work from starting on July 1, Fuscaldo said.

four council members who voted against rescinding the commercial zoning.

His reasoning is that the matter is still in litigation, and he is not convinced that it is good to "flip flop" during lawsuit negotiations.

"I think that they (the developers) are amenable to a residential development," Fuscaldo said. "It could be satisfactory to residents, even to CORR. I don't think it's necessary to change now."

He said if the property owners were heading strictly toward commercial development, he might have been convinced to vote for the ordinance.

"It's not necessary to change anything now if the lawsuit gets settled," Fuscaldo said.

He said "it's simple," that if negotiations weren't ongoing, the council would say it wants the property to be zoned residential.

Fuscaldo said he understands Pallante's concern about what commercial development might bring.

He said, however, that the two sides are close to an agreement in principal on a gated community.

"If we weren't this far down the road with residential development, I'd agree with Pallante," Fuscaldo said.

He said in the big picture residential development could be good for taxpayers, and people are not happy with nothing happening.

"We need to stabilize taxes," Fuscaldo said. "I'm tired of residents saying on the one hand, they want to keep employees and services at the same levels we have now, on the other hand we can't have any development, and on the third hand, taxes are too high. In Belleville there's always three sides to every story."

Newark is completed, the plan is to combine all of the county's corrections officers into one site. Once all of the county's corrections officers are moved to the one facility, two different corrections officers' unions could be vying for equal benefits.

"It's going to be a real battle," Durkin said.

Montclair will probably never pay for the likes of Thomas Russo and his 225 days of unused sick time again.

Russo, whom Sweatt refers to as a "one-in-500 case," began his employment with the Montclair Police Department in 1960 and was the township's most senior public employee when he retired in 2001.

Because he was the last township employee to have begun his employment prior to 1963, Russo likely will be the last Montclair Township public employee to receive a lump-sum check for 225 days worth of unused sick time.

"God forbid if anything would have happened to me, I had plenty of sick days to cover a catastrophic illness," Russo said.

"But I was only paid 225 days," he added. "I gave the town back 300 sick days."

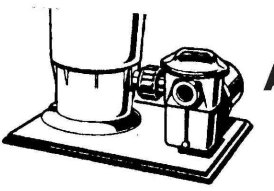

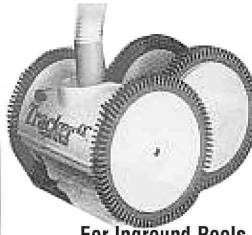

Bad boys, bad boys

What’cha gonna do when they’re waddling after you?

A push to require that police recruits in New Jersey be physically fit before they are hired may help do away with the stereotypical overweight cop who can’t outrun a pastrami sandwich. That’s good news.

It’s obvious that the physical demands of police work require some kind of fitness standards for recruits. Cops can be required to suddenly chase down a suspect, for instance, with no time for a warm-up. Or they might be called on to perform CPR for an extended period of time, or even pull an accident victim from a car. Being overweight and out-of-shape can also put the safety of other officers at risk if a cop isn’t able to come to the assistance of his or her partner.

Robert Lyons, director of the Passaic County Police Academy, who has dismissed

dozens of out-of-shape candidates from the academy, is pushing for a state law that would require physical fitness standards for all police recruits. The need seems obvious.

The standards would be the same for men and women, and would be based on nationally recognized fitness standards. Those who fail a physical test would be removed from consideration for jobs.

Getting candidates who are used to staying in shape could also help prevent police from becoming overweight on the job. And testing officers annually for physical fitness, which some departments already do, might be another way of keeping police from turning into their department’s version of television’s Andy Sipowicz.

You needn’t speak volumes to speak volumes

A decade or so ago I was just beginning to approach the computer in my work. As I tried to do what I needed to do, I availed myself of various resources. First, there were those big instruction books that came with the programs. I quickly decided that one needed a course just to understand the books. Then, I had a few friends who quickly took me through a multitude of complicated steps that I could never seem to remember.

Finally, one friend sat down with me and asked, “Now, what exactly do you need to do?” Then, for each function he gave me several basic steps that I wrote down and followed successfully. Sometimes the simplest advice is the best.

Virtually all faith and value systems hinge on one simple piece of advice:

“Treat other people the way that you want to be treated.” We all know that rule. We learn it as children, and we are

quick to complain when others ignore it. But what would the world be like if we worked a bit harder to follow that rule ourselves? Think of the money that municipalities could save on clean-up (i.e. If you don’t want someone else’s trash in your yard, don’t throw trash in theirs). Think about the money the state could save on prisons (i.e. If you don’t want someone else to steal your property, don’t steal theirs).

Of course a lot of attorneys would be out of work, but lawyers are pretty bright people. I am sure that they could put their verbal skills to good use. Perhaps they could go into education and eradicate the teacher shortage. Yes, simple advice is often the best. Too bad we are not better at following that advice.

Random drug testing

And the line between caution and coercion

The recent ruling by the New Jersey Supreme Court on student drug testing offers schools another option for fighting substance abuse. But under the wording of the carefully phrased opinion, random drug testing of high school students is likely to remain rare. That’s a good thing.

In a 4-3 vote, the court upheld the program used by Hunterdon Central Regional High School, which randomly tests students involved in all extracurricular activities and all students who park cars on school property. School officials say the testing was a reaction to increased drug use and has been a deterrent.

The Supreme Court’s narrow vote upheld Hunterdon Central’s right to test

the students, but said the model can only be used within strict limits and only with evidence of a big drug problem. New Jersey schools already have the authority to test those students who exhibit signs of drug use and student athletes. Only nine districts in the state randomly test athletes.

The line between school safety and effectiveness and students’ constitutional rights is a fine one. Although high school students don’t have the same rights as adults, they shouldn’t be treated as if they lived in a totalitarian state and had no rights at all. Most districts have decided they can keep substance abuse under control without resorting to random testing.

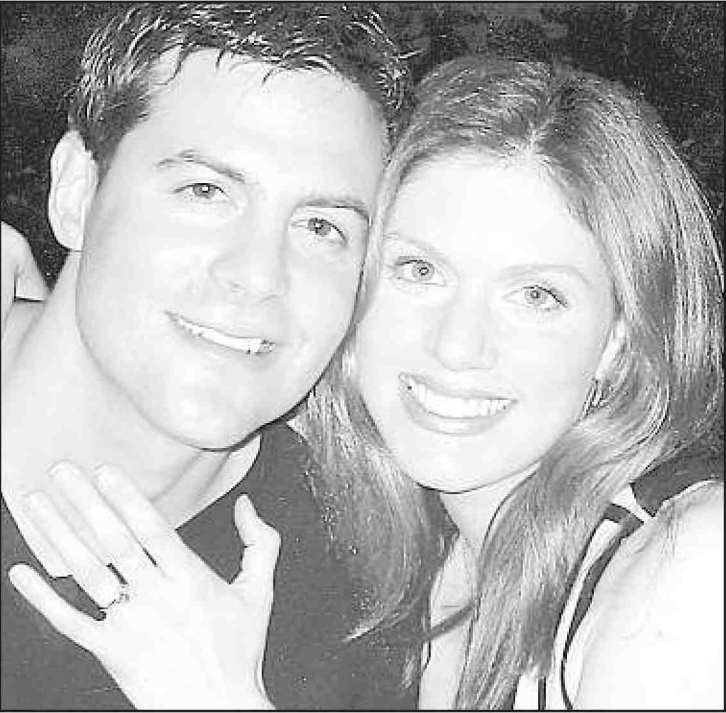

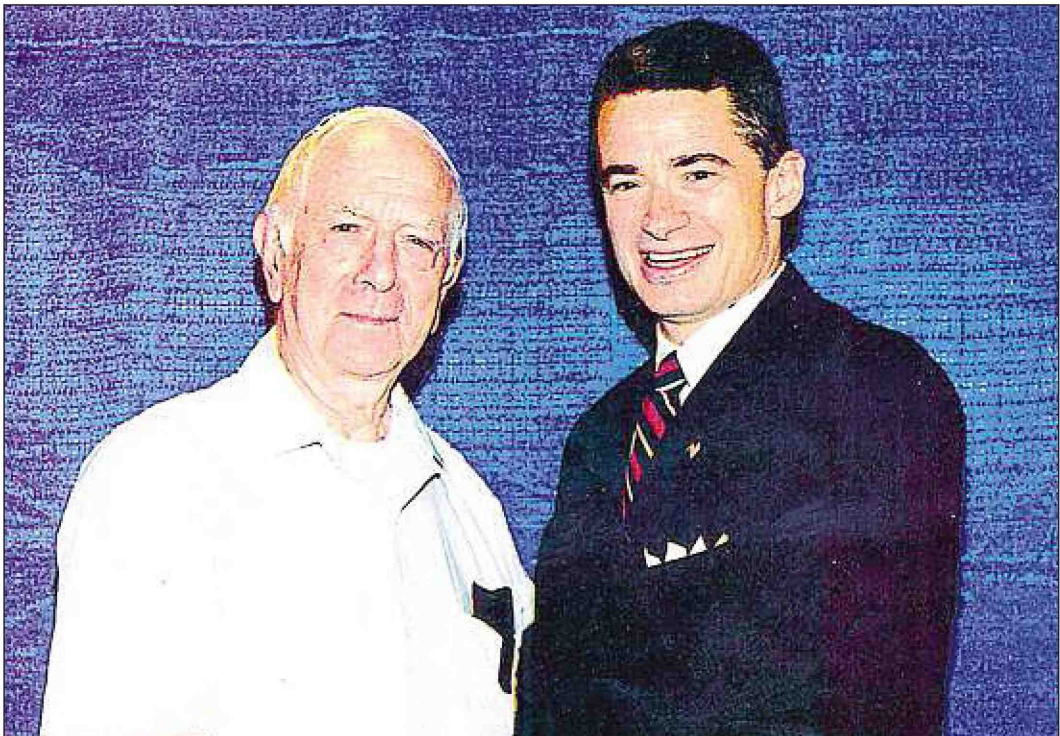

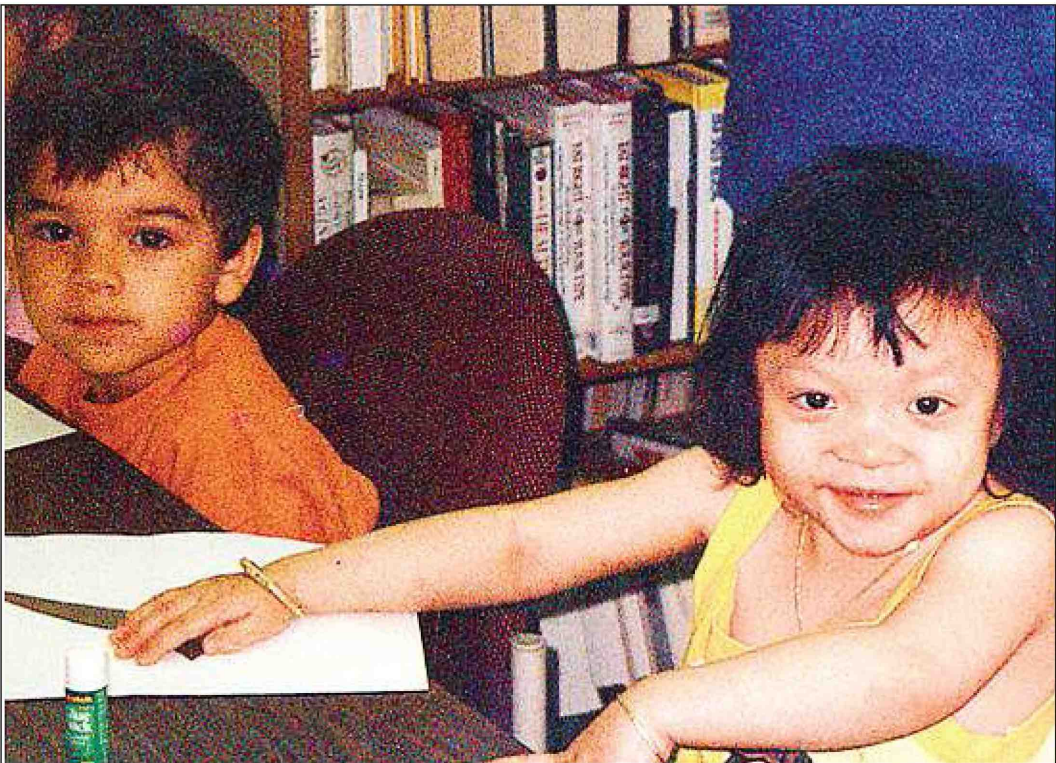

Treatment for a bunionette

Q. I have a large bump on the outside of my foot, just behind the pinky toe. I was told this was a bunionette. What can I do for this problem? I have trouble wearing shoes and even sneakers. Thanks for your help.

A. It seems what you have is a tailor's bunion, more commonly known as a bunionette. There are many options for treatment of a

bunionette. Conservative treatment consists of change in shoe gear to a wide width shoe, anti-inflammatory medication, cortisone injections and padding and strappings. If conservative treatment fails, then surgical correction is the next option.

Surgery consists of shaving the large prominent bone, cutting the bone and repositioning the bone in correct alignment. The surgery is done on a same day basis and you can resume weightbearing on the foot immediately following the surgery. Most patients can return to shoe gear in approximately two to four weeks.

Before any treatment is started, a full thorough workup on the deformity including any necessary testing, should be performed by your podiatrist.

During the six weeks of training, the airman studied the Air Force mission, organization, and military customs and courtesies; performed drill and ceremony marches, and received physical training, rifle marksmanship, field training exercises and special training in human relations.

In addition, airmen who complete basic training earn credits toward an associate degree through the Community College of the Air Force.

Across the river, development seems full steam ahead

Anyone pinning for the major development of senior living or other housing in Belleville may want to take a look across the Passaic River.

A developer has submitted preliminary plans to erect 1,550 housing units in that borough.

EnCap Golf Holdings proposes 1,200 units for seniors and 350 units of market-rate housing in the southeast part of North Arlington as part of its massive plan for four golf courses and development over 1,200 acres in four towns. The developer, which plans to place most of the golf courses over closed landfills, has preliminary approval from the New Jersey Meadowlands Commission for about 2,000 units of housing in Lyndhurst and Rutherford. Most of those units would be for seniors.

If the additional housing is approved, it would significantly boost the population of North Arlington, where about 15,000 people live, according to the 2000 Census.

The scope of the proposal, which was scheduled to be discussed by the North Arlington Redevelopment Authority on Monday, has some of the project's proponents suggesting caution.

In a recent letter to the Redevelopment Authority, Leonard Kaiser - who sits on the Meadowlands Commission - said he still believes the project will be a winner for the Meadowlands region.

But he said the proposed development in North Arlington "would pose a major

impact" for the borough. "Among the many considerations will be increased demand for city and emergency services, additional school enrollments, and a need for extensive infrastructure and transportation improvements," he wrote.

Kaiser, who subsequently was appointed to the Redevelopment Authority, said in an interview that the housing proposal could generate concern from residents. "I've been around North Arlington long enough to know that housing isn't always their first choice," said the former mayor.

EnCap attorney Eric Wisler said he doesn't expect the market-rate units to house a significant number of school-aged children. He said research shows the condominium units, in towers about eight to 12 stories high, would draw young professional couples. Some of these units might enjoy views of the New York skyline, but Wisler said they would not obstruct views for existing homeowners on streets near Schuyler Avenue.

These market-rate units would be erected on what was until recently a garbage transfer station.

Wisler said the senior housing would be built on the 90-acre Porete Avenue redevelopment site.

The senior housing could displace some warehouses on the avenue. Wisler said the company, which would need a variance to build housing in an area zoned for industrial uses, would help the businesses relocate over a six- to seven-

year period.

Most of EnCap's proposed development - which covers parts of Kearny, Lyndhurst, North Arlington, and Rutherford and would also include two hotels and 750,000 square feet of office space - is on land under the zoning jurisdiction of the Meadowlands Commission. Some of that commission-regulated land in North Arlington is already slated for golf courses.

About 100 other acres in North Arlington fall under the jurisdiction of borough officials who anticipated EnCap would ask to build housing in town.

Indeed, when EnCap purchased the 45-acre Bethlehem Steel site in February, Wisler suggested age-restricted housing might be on the way.

In May, EnCap submitted the preliminary report that was discussed by the authority July 21. The borough had not publicly released that document, saying it would be available for review at the time of the meeting.

But a borough official and Wisler confirmed key components of the report in interviews recently.

EnCap, which as recently as two years ago called for just 1,400 time-share units in its plans, has consistently been pushing for more housing. The company - which now proposes a total of 3,500 housing units between Lyndhurst, North Arlington, and Rutherford - says it's increasing emphasis of housing over office space is a response to market factors, including the likely development of

massive office buildings at the site of nearby Continental Arena.

A reporter interviewing a handful of borough residents found that some worry about overcrowding.

One man worried that development would make the area less friendly for birds.

Dot Burt said simply, "It would be too crowded."

Some others said they were too unfamiliar with the plans to comment.

Wisler said no one should think of the EnCap project as "apartment city."

He said it would be "a series of housing developments among golf courses and green space."

He said the entire project - which could be completed in 2013 and could cost more than \$1 billion - would make significant environmental improvements by closing landfills.

According to Kaiser, EnCap says the housing proposed for North Arlington is crucial to the economic viability of the second phase of the project, which involves capping three landfills.

Wisler said EnCap is willing to work with the borough to make sure the plan is acceptable.

"Before the project would unravel, we would go a long way down the road to see if some agreement can be reached," he said.

North Arlington Borough Administrator Robert Landolfi, who is also executive director of the borough's Redevelopment Authority, said the seven-member panel will seek public comment on the EnCap proposal.

He emphasized that the EnCap plans are still "very preliminary" and that the authority will give the company direction before a formal application is submitted.

"They've given us a concept we've agreed to look at," said Landolfi. "We're cautiously reviewing it."

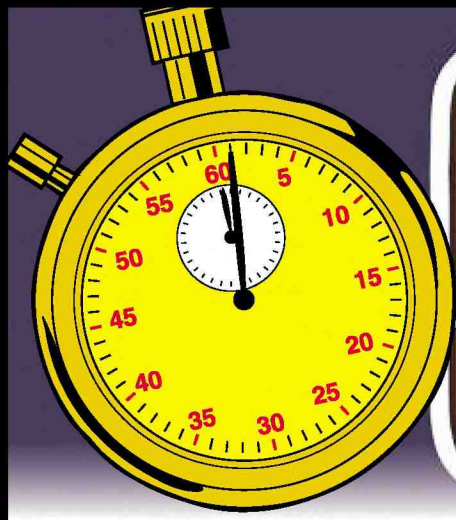

Belleville loses a gem

Michael Powers' courageous battle with cancer ended on July 14 when the Belleville native passed away at the tender age of 31.

The man who directed Elmwood Park High School to a North Jersey, Section 1, Group 1 basketball title last winter, had served as an inspiration to his family, friends and players with his tenacity in battling the disease.

One of Powers' best friends, former Belleville High School basketball coach Don Roll, remembered Powers' passion toward his work.

"I remember when Mike

played for me at Belleville High," Roll said, remembering specifically the '88 and '89 seasons. "He was our starting point guard as a senior. After he graduated, we became good friends, and I could tell that coaching was something he had a passion for."

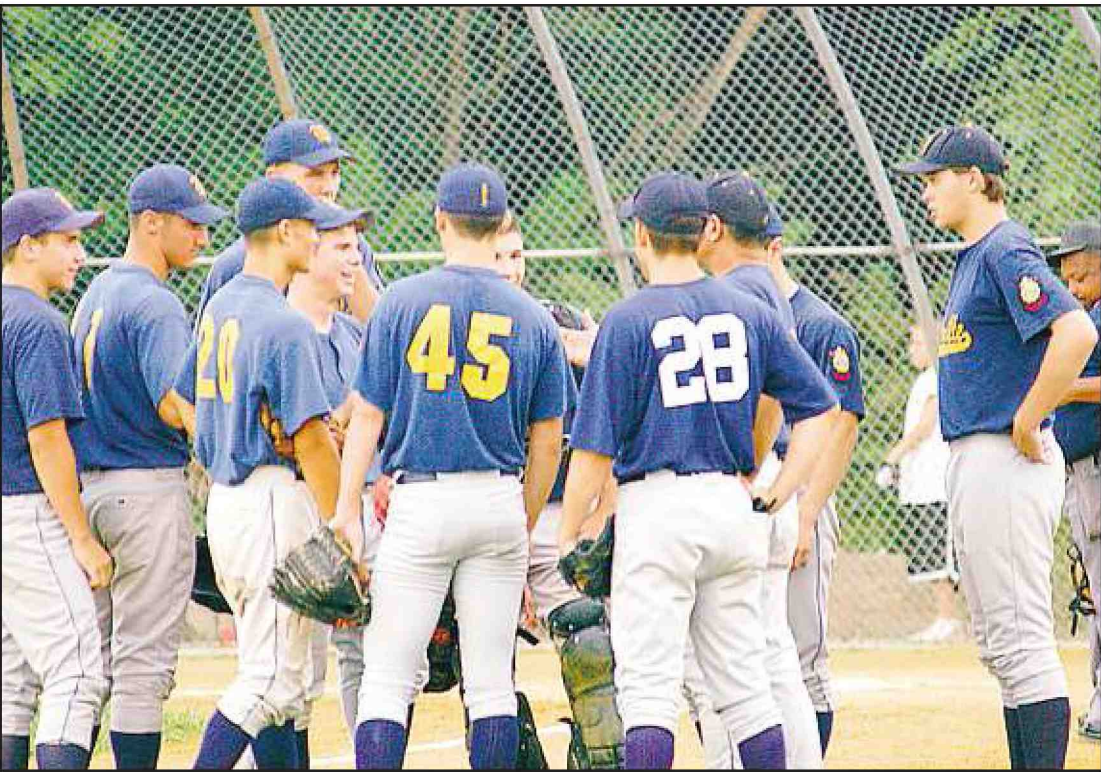
In an interview last winter, Powers recalled his state of mind when he first learned he had cancer.

"The moment I first heard about the cancer (Nov. 6, 2001) the competitor in me took over," he said. "I didn't cry. I didn't feel sorry for myself. I tried to stay positive. I think attitude has everything to do with the way you live your life."

Roll recalls Powers as man of grace, courage and commitment

(First of two part series)

Battling cancer was an inconvenience for Mike Powers, but never a deterrent.

So says his former coach, mentor and dear friend, Don Roll, in recalling Powers, who lost his battle with the disease on July 14, at the age of 31.

Powers, a 1989 graduate of Belleville High School, earned the starting point guard position as a senior for the Blue and Gold in Roll's third year (1988-89) as varsity head coach.

"I remember a game against Don Bosco Prep in Mike's senior year," Roll said. "Mike got off to a great start, I think he scored the game's first eight points. He was playing great. I pulled him out of the game, and he says to me 'why did you take me out?' And I told him 'you weren't running the plays I diagrammed.' He never forgot that, and he always said he understood in coaching that running the offense was paramount to scoring points and not running the offense correctly."

That learning experience between player and coach marked the beginning of a long-term friendship.

"After he graduated, we lost touch for a few years," Roll recalled. "But when I left Belleville (after the '97-98 school year, when Roll moved to Passaic Valley as the head boys basketball coach and physical education teacher), I ran into Mike at the shore and we talked for a while. He had just graduated from college (West Chester University, Class of '97), and he wanted to get into coaching. I had an opening for an assistant coach at Passaic Valley, and he said I want to coach with you." And I was thrilled. Any time a coach gets the opportunity to have a former

player on his staff, that's the ultimate compliment."

Roll saw quickly that Powers was completely immersed in coaching.

"We'd be at the shore, and while most people were hanging out, we'd be drawing Xs and Os, working on offensive and defensive schemes. I knew right away Mike was going to be a huge asset."

Powers and Roll coached together for three years at Passaic Valley, and the Hornets improvement during that run earned Roll conference coach of the year honors in 2000. Roll left Passaic Valley after the '00-01 school year and moved on to coach and teach at Elmwood Park. Powers' stock as a head coaching candidate was beginning to soar, and Roll was quick to recognize that.

"I felt maybe he'd like to become a head coach after that third year at PV," Roll said. "But when I spoke with him, he wanted to go with me to Elmwood Park, and I was thrilled."

Elmwood Park's basketball program was struggling, and Roll and Powers quickly injected energy into the program when they began working with the prospective players in a summer league two years ago.

"That's when I first met them both," recalled Chris Rothenburger, a standout guard for Elmwood Park last season. "I remember coaches

Roll and Powers worked with us every day in the Leonia Summer League. We really came to respect them both."

Everything seemed to be in place for an exciting season. That was until Roll got a call on his cell phone on a Saturday in November 2001.

"I remember I was driving to an Elmwood Park (high school) football game," Roll said. "And I get a call from a mutual friend of Mike's and I. And the caller says 'have you spoken to Mike?' And I said something like 'no, why?' And the caller says 'let Mike talk to you.'"

Seconds later, Roll's phone rang again, and it's Powers, delivering some chilling news.

"I have cancer," Powers said to Roll. "I won't be able to coach this year."

"I remember during the previous summer, Mike had said he was having some problems eating and swallowing," Roll said. "But we all just shrugged it off. Then he goes for a doctor's appointment in early November, and he calls me with that news."

Roll recalls pulling to the side of the road in an attempt to grasp the situation.

"I got this chill and cold sweat," Roll said. "I didn't know what to say, but I did know one thing. I told Mike 'you're coaching, there's no question about that.'"

Powers, fearing he wouldn't be able to devote his full energies into coaching with an arduous battle of chemotherapy facing him, had felt Roll would want to add another coach. Roll would not hear of it.

"I was just wondering what we would tell the players once practice started," Roll said. "And when we met with the kids, I knew I (See Buc Shots on Page B2)

Osteoporosis can progress in seniors virtually undetected

The Belleville Health Department is actively involved in increasing public awareness on various health topics of interest to the community. Osteoporosis is awareness week is in May, such as the Belleville Health Department would like to take this opportunity to inform the public about osteoporosis.

Osteoporosis is a disease in which the bones become fragile and more likely to break. If not prevented or left untreated osteoporosis can progress painlessly until a fracture occurs. These fractures typically occur in the hip, spine or wrist

Fractures in the vertebrae can result in loss of height, or stooped posture. Hip fractures can limit an individual's mobility and can lead to a loss of independence. Complications from surgery to correct hip fractures can sometimes result in death. While, women are five times as likely to develop osteoporosis, it can also affect men.

Several factors can increase your risk of developing osteoporosis.

- Thin, small bone frame
- Family history of broken bones, stooped posture in older family members, especially women.
- Early menopause before age 45, either natural or resulting from surgical removal of ovaries.
- Advanced age
- Diet low in calcium
- Inactive lifestyle

- Caucasian or Asian women are at highest risk.
- Cigarette smoking
- Excessive use of alcohol
- Prolonged use of certain medications including glucocorticoids, excessive thyroid hormones, and some anti seizure medications.

Osteoporosis leads to 1.5 million fractures a year. Approximately one in three women over the age of 50 will suffer a vertebral fracture more than 300,000 hip fractures occur per year due to osteoporosis and as many as 50,000 of these people die a year as the result of hip fractures.

Although osteoporosis is a very debilitating illness, much can be done to prevent it or arrest its progress. Calcium plays an important role in maintaining bones. Many women consume less than one half of the recommended amount of calcium. Vitamin D also plays an important role in the absorption of calcium. Vitamin D is synthesized in the skin through exposure to sunlight. Vitamin D production decreases in the elderly who are homebound and during winter months.

Ideally, daily calcium requirements should come from calcium-rich foods such as dairy products and dark green leafy vegetables like broccoli and collard greens. Many people, however, need to supplement their diets with other sources.

Exercise can be helpful in

building and maintaining strong bones. Weight bearing exercises such as walking and jogging are beneficial. Other exercises which are helpful include tennis, aerobic dance, and stair climbing.

To determine if you have osteoporosis or at risk, ask your doctor. If you are found to be at risk, your doctor may recommend bone density studies. These tests are simple, and pain-

less tests which use minimal radiation.

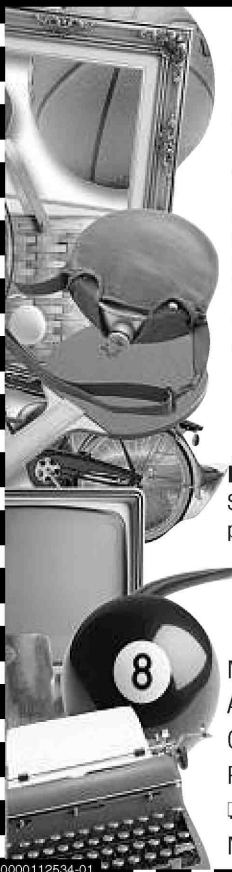
