Staring at the sun

Belleville wiz clearing the picture in space

For years, scientists have tried to predict the sun's solar flares, which can disrupt satellites and power grids worldwide.

Now, a local doctoral candidate has traveled to California and built a device to help in gauging the probability of solar flares.

Tom Spirock, 34, who grew up on Van Houten Place, said the purpose of his invention is "to take pictures of magnetic fields on the surface of the sun."

Constructing the instrument came about when Spirock was a masters candidate at the New Jersey Institute of Technology (NJIT). The man in charge of the Big Bear Observatory, located in a resort area outside of Los Angeles, offered him a posi-

tion building this instrument.

It took two years to build, and measures the strength and direction of magnetic fields of the sun, he said.

"Parts of the sun become twisted like a rubber band and that causes solar flares," Spirock said. "To predict when they will happen is the ultimate goal. For now we're looking at probability. It's like saying it will be likely to rain today, but not predicting when."

So with the instrument built, Spirock now works on writing his thesis for his doctorate.

"It's about why I did what I did, how I did what I did and what the result was," he said. "I'd like to finish it as soon as possible, hopefully (See Spirock on Page A5)

She catered to all with food and friendship

Ann Nardiello of Daily Catering remembered by family and friends

If you grew up in Belleville, you've probably tasted Ann Nardiello's cooking.

Eggplant parmesan served at a cousin's baby shower. Stuffed shells offered at a friend's New Year's Eve party. Or perhaps you've tossed a ham and cheese sandwich over to a fellow guest at a "football wedding," marriage receptions for smaller budgets that were popular in the 1950s.

Nardiello owned Daily Catering, a Belleville institution for the past 60 years, until her death last week at the age of 86. Her legacy will include serving up homemade, good-to-the-last-drop-of-gravy Italian cooking at countless celebrations. But that's not all. The lifelong Belleville resident will be remembered as one of those rare people everybody had a kind word for and who in return had a

kind word for everybody.

Her son, Gerald Nardiello, who will continue to operate the business with his brother John, took some time earlier this week to remember his mother.

"She was an institution here in the Silver Lake section of Belleville," Nardiello explained. He said that she was known for the ability to dish out sound advice as well as tasty food. "When somebody needed something, they went to see mom," he said.

Ann Nardiello started the off-premise catering business with her husband John in the 1940s and was the sole proprietor since his death 25 years ago. Nardiello often worked seven days a week, and at one point or another she employed each of her six children as well as many a neighborhood kid. Daily Catering operates out of a big kitchen in the back of a house on Honiss Street. Over the years,

most business has come from repeat customers and a reputation spread by word of mouth.

When she was able to take some time off, Nardiello was known as a "world-traveler," venturing with friends through various countries in Europe and South America. She also loved going to the racetrack.

It does seem like a gamble, running a business on her own with six children to raise, five sons — Joseph, John, Anthony, Steve and Gerald — and a daughter, Mary Ann Paul.

But she made it all seem remarkably easy.

"Everyone always got a gift on special occasions," Gerald said as a testament to her ability to juggle the demands of a business and a family which also includes 15 grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

According to Marie Strumolo Burke, president of the Silver Lake Civic Association and a columnist for the Belleville Times, St. Anthony's Church in Belleville was filled to capacity for a

Take a 'Night' out of crime

Twentieth Annual Night Out happens Aug. 5

The 20th Annual Night Out (NNO), a unique crime/drug prevention event sponsored by the National Association of Town Watch (NATW), is set for Tuesday, Aug. 5.

Police Chief Joseph Rotonda said the evening will run similar to last year, with block parties and a softball game.

"People send us a list of block parties, and the police visit, giving out t-shirts and crime prevention tips," he said.

Rotonda said the "Mobile Precinct," a large police trailer headquartered in Silver Lake, will go from party to party.

The National Night Out Mayor's Trophy Softball

game takes place at Clearmon Field on Union Avenue at 6 p.m. The game features the Belleville Police versus the Belleville Fire Department with the winner owning the Mayor's Trophy for one year.

The main site is a giant block party to be held on the Great Lawn at Christ Episcopal Church, 393 Washington Ave., from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. The event will offer free food and the public will be entertained by D.J. Eddie.

The annual Business After Hours, hosted by the Suburban Essex Chamber of Commerce, will also take place that night. The public will have the opportunity to view displays by various local businesses on the lawn. Businesses wishing to re-

serve a table to display business cards or promotional materials are asked to phone (973) 751-0616. The cost of the tables is \$15 for participating chamber members and \$25 for non-members.

The other block parties are mostly in Silver Lake. Those include Naples Avenue, Eugene Place, Lake Street and Salter Place. The other ones, so far, are Van Houten Avenue, between Hornblower Avenue and DeWitt Avenue, and Celia Terrace, between Berkeley Avenue and Continental Avenue, according to Sgt. Craig Mack of the traffic department.

"Usually we get between 10 and 15 block parties," (See Night Out on Page A5)

• Police arrested and charged Reimundo Gonzalez, 34, of Elizabeth with making terroristic threats and possession of drug paraphernalia following an altercation at the McDonald's restaurant on Franklin Street on July 26. Gonzalez had an altercation with the store manager where he threatened to kill him after his fast food apparently was not fast enough.

"Where's my 'expletive' food? Hurry up, I'm in a hurry," Gonzalez said before threatening to kill the manager. After his arrest, a glass pipe was found on him. Bail was set at \$1,000.

• Police arrested and charged Orlando Cintron, 35, of Belleville with aggravated assault, making terroristic threats, and possession of a weapon for unlawful purposes on July 26. At the apartment complex on Mill Street, Cintron allegedly threatened to kill a 24-year-old woman with a razor knife. Police disarmed him without incident. Bail was set at \$1,000.

• As part of the July 25 DWI sobriety checkpoint, police arrested and charged Alexander Reynard Stephen, 20, of Belleville, with possession of marijuana. His Chevrolet Cavalier was stopped at 1:30 a.m. on Franklin Avenue, and the marijuana was found in the car's center console. He was released on his own recognizance.

• Police arrested and charged Matthew Mathai, 51, of Nutley, with driving

while intoxicated on July 25 at 3 p.m. He drove up a lawn at 600 Belleville Ave. and hit a street sign. He then drove north on Carpenter Street, where he hit a parked car at 45 Carpenter St. and then hit a house at 53 Carpenter St.

He was found slumped over the wheel, unconscious, and regained consciousness at Clara Maass Medical Center. Doctors drew blood and police await the blood alcohol level. Police said he smelled of alcohol. Mathai was admitted for observation overnight.

• A man was robbed at gunpoint and carjacked on Cuozzo Street on July 21. The 66-year-old male victim parked his 1997 Chevrolet Lumina in front of his house. At that point, a black male, six feet tall, opened the car door, displayed his handgun and demanded money and jewelry. He got \$700 in cash, a diamond ring and a gold bracelet. He then took off in the man's vehicle.

• Police arrested and charged Benedicto Nieves, 37, of Newark, with three counts of sexual assault and endangering the welfare of a child. He was arrested, along with the 14-year-old Bronx, N.Y. girl after being caught jumping the turnstiles at the Journal Square train station in Jersey City.

In the course of the investigation, police learned that the two had been having sex for three days. Bail was set at \$50,000.

Checkpoints netting more than drunks

Belleville police continue to act with county law enforcement to conduct DWI sobriety checkpoints in the township, often discovering more amiss on local roads than drunk drivers.

The most recent checkpoint was July 25, at Franklin Avenue, north of Belleville Avenue, in front of the Hendricks Field golf course, according to Sgt. Craig Mack of the traffic bureau.

On that night, between 9 p.m. and 2:30 a.m., 785 vehicles went through the checkpoint, with 44 stopped for some kind of violation, including one DWI and one marijuana possession arrest (see the police blotter.) Thirty summonses, including

moving and non-moving violations, were issued.

Prior to that was a successful operation carried out at Washington Avenue and William Street on July 12.

Mack said normally somewhere between 850 and 1,000 vehicles pass through a checkpoint. On that night, 904 came through. Every fifth vehicle was stopped, for a total of 197 pulled over.

"The exception is if there is an obvious equipment violation that might put the motorist in danger or if they're driving erratically," Mack said.

Of the 197 stopped for an initial screening, 85 were given a second screening, and 31 summonses were issued.

The summonses were mostly for child seatbelt and

adult seatbelt violations, but also included non-inspected vehicles and revoked drivers.

There were three arrests. Two were for driving while intoxicated (DWI) and one was for possession of a controlled dangerous substance, Mack said.

While the results of the July 25 checkpoint are yet to be made available, Mack said 20 officers were involved in the multi-jurisdictional detail, including Essex County Prosecutor's Office personnel, Belleville cops and Essex County Sheriff's Department officers.

There is also always a canine officer and deputy sheriffs who work as volunteers.

"The volunteers are an immense help," Mack said.

On July 16, the Essex County Board of Chosen Freeholders appointed 13 new members to the Essex County Advisory Commission on Aging. Among the new appointees was Belleville resident and community leader Antoinette “Toni” Marone.

Marone was recommended for inclusion in the unpaid commission by Essex County District 5 Freeholder Ralph Caputo of Belleville. Caputo made his endorsement of Marone to

County Executive Joseph DiVincenzo, Jr., who then proposed her name to the freeholder board. The board appointed Mrs. Marone unanimously.

WIC continues to feed Belleville families in need

Belleville once again this year received a \$30,000 grant to administer the Women, Infant and Children (WIC) program to needy, at-risk families.

The program provides checks for specific food items, including milk, cheese, juice, eggs, beans or peanut butter and cereal. Mothers of infants are given 30 cans of formula a month for the first four months of the infant's life, according to Cindy Miezeiewski, the nurse who runs the program.

When the baby reaches four months, the mother gets cereal, and then juice at six months, she said. The help can start when a woman is pregnant to post partum. The program goes until a child is age five, Miezeiewski said.

"Eligibility is based on nutritional risk and income," she said.

As the nurse for the program, Miezeiewski handles

the Belleville program, which is a subdivision site for the master program in East Orange. It is run with a federal grant.

She gives nutritional counseling. Those in the program are assessed, are weighed, their height is measured and they have blood work done to see if they are anemic.

An assessment form is filled out to see if they are meeting nutritional guidelines, Miezeiewski said, and she then gives them "nutritional advice."

Income eligibility goes as follows: for a one-person household, the income cutoff is \$16,613; for a two-person household, it is \$22,422; for three people, \$28,231; for four people, \$34,040; for five, \$39,849; for six, \$45,658; for seven, \$51,467 and for eight, \$57,276. For each additional household member over eight, an additional \$5,809 is added.

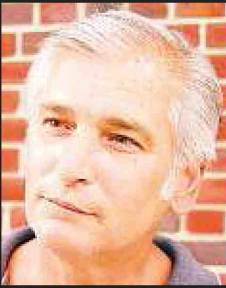

Police have little luck finding assailant

Clifton Police have not found the man who fondled a Belleville woman on Route 3 this month and was trying to kidnap her when a priest came along and interrupted the assault.

On July 7, the 20-year-old woman was walking along the busy highway to her job at Clifton Commons when a man in a blue car pulled up and offered a ride, police said.

She declined, and he began to fondle her and attempted to pull her into his car.

During the struggle, a priest drove up and the woman asked him for help, police said. The attacker drove off immediately, speeding west on Route 3.

The priest drove the woman to work but did not leave his name or phone number. A few days later, the Newark Archdiocese found the priest at the re-

quest of detectives.

The woman described her attacker as 30 to 40 years old, about 5-foot-2, and 160 pounds, with thinning hair, dark jeans, and a black-and-white checked shirt.

(Continued from Page A1) Mack said. "I expect a few more to come in before Aug. 5."

Last year's National Night Out campaign involved citizens, law enforcement agencies, civic groups, businesses, neighborhood organizations and local officials from 9,850 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities and military bases worldwide. In all, 33 million people participated in NNO 2002.

National Night Out is designed to heighten crime and drug prevention awareness; generate support for, and participation in, local anti-crime programs; strengthen neighborhood spirit and police-community partnerships; and send a message that neighborhoods are organized and

fighting back.

In an effort to heighten awareness and strengthen participation in local anti-crime efforts, officials felt that a high-profile, high-impact type of crime prevention event was needed nationally. At that time, officials noted, in a typical "crime watch community," only five to seven percent of residents were participating actively. Due to the worth and success of these programs, officials felt this percentage was too low. Subsequently, they proposed a national program, which would be coordinated by local crime prevention agencies and organizations — but that would involve entire communities at one time. The first National Night Out was introduced early in 1984, with the event culminating on the first Tuesday in August.

That first year, 400 com-

munities and 23 states participated in National Night Out. Nationwide, 2.5 million Americans took part in 1984. The seed had been planted. In subsequent years, participation has grown steadily. The 19th annual National Night Out on Aug. 6, 2002 involved 33 million people in 9,700 communities from all 50 states, U.S. territories, Canadian cities, and military bases worldwide. National Night Out 2003 will culminate on Aug. 5.

While the traditional lights on and front porch vigils remain part of NNO, activities have expanded considerably over the years to include block parties, cookouts, parades, visits from police, festivals, neighborhood walks, safety fairs, contests, rallies and meetings.

Ideally, he said the price would come down when the projects are put out to bid. If the price comes in higher and the board still insists on going forward with the project, the district would have to pay the difference, Appleton said.

Unfortunately, the projects are not going to get done this summer.

"The paperwork is still floating around Trenton. There are so many layers of

review. These projects don't move as quickly as they once did. We have to wait for the final go ahead before we can go out to bid," Appleton said.

The projects can be done while the school year is going on next fall, he said.

"We can work them in. We might have to inconvenience a class when we're doing windows, but for the doors and the roof, there is no real problem," Appleton said.

Door and window rehabilitation projects are planned for Schools 3, 5, 7, 8

and 10, the middle school and high school. The total cost is \$469,020, with the state picking up \$189,952 and the district paying \$279,068.

Window replacements are set for Schools 3 and 5 and the middle school. The total cost is \$1,049,119, with the state funding \$424,891 and the district picking up the remaining \$624,228.

Roof replacement at School 8 will cost \$376,197, with the state taking on \$152,359 and the district funding \$223,838.

Take a stand against crime

Support National Night Out with friends and neighbors

As “National Night Out” approaches, law enforcement agencies nationwide are campaigning to involve as many citizens as possible in this annual event aimed at raising crime prevention awareness and bolstering community relations.

This year’s event, scheduled for next Tuesday, is expected to include more than 9,800 communities from across the country, as well as U.S. territories and military bases — a staggering 33 million people.

Now in its 20th year, “Night Out” in many ways represents the critical relationship between a police department and the community its serves.

Additionally, it’s a perfect opportunity for friends and neighbors to meet, mingle with police officers, and enjoy a warm summer night.

If a substantial number of residents attend this year’s “Night Out,” a powerful message is sent to criminals, letting them know that the community they hope to

victimize is well organized and poised to fight back.

Such a message can be sent when townsfolk simply lock their doors, turn on their porch lights, and spend a few hours outside Tuesday evening (7 to 10 p.m.) with their friends, neighbors and police officers.

In Belleville, the event will be held at Christ Episcopal Church on Washington Avenue from 6 to 9 p.m. with a giant block party, featuring music, activities and food (see related story, page 1).

“Night Out” is equally important for the police department, offering officers an ideal chance to show they are engaged and willing to listen to the citizens they’ve been trained to protect.

So join your friends and neighbors in helping make your neighborhood a safer place, take a stand against crime and drugs in your schools and on your streets, and take pride in your police department.

Second approach

Council slated to approach rent control

The Belleville Township Council told residents that on Aug. 4, it would once again take up the issue of whether or not it should do away with rent control.

The issue came up in June when an ordinance was placed on the table to do away with the township’s inactive rent leveling board, and ultimately the town’s power to stabilize rent. However, the council was taken aback by the number of angry renters who packed its chambers to protest, and also by the fact that some council members didn’t even understand what they were about to do.

It was up to an attorney in the audience to explain to the full council that it was indeed about to make an historic decision to do away with rent control. Taken off guard, the members voted to discuss it again later.

The argument for abolishing rent control has been that landlords are not able to raise rent in proportion with their increased expenses and are therefore finding property ownership more trouble than it’s worth. In some urban districts, they reportedly leave their properties to decay because they cannot raise the revenue to pay for the repairs, or pay the taxes.

It’s probably true that many landlords’ hands are tied by legislation that main-

tains an outdated formula for raising rent. But has anyone thought to “adjust” the formula? Why this sweeping measure to do away with protections, full stop?

Let’s not forget that some landlords in urban districts – heck, in any district – are just plain greedy, want to get paid but don’t want to pay anything out. Who’s going make that distinction between a landlord with a sincere need, and a slumlord?

It’s great that the council is paying attention to the pleas of the property tax-paying landlords, but who’s going to protect the renter’s standard of living?

The last time the council addressed this issue, it was repeatedly brought up that the state offers protection for tenants who may get gouged in the absence of municipal rent control. We hope that the council will be able to give a full listing of what recourse tenants are entitled to before it repeals their only local protection.

Also it will be interesting to see what research the members have done into the success or failure rate of rent control in neighboring towns, such as Nutley. When making decisions that will ultimately affect the happiness and well being of any group of people — landlord or tenant — no one should go into the meeting ignorant of the facts.

Sbarra asked us to remember others

Let’s never forget him

Belleville said goodbye to one of its greats this weekend.

Though he was best known as Belleville’s past fire chief, summing George Sbarra up by one vocation would be a disservice. He was a veteran, family man, volunteer and advocate for those who had no voice.

Around Memorial Day the Belleville Times ran a story on Sbarra’s quiet two-year effort with his family to construct “Remembrance,” a photo tribute to Belleville’s war dead. Without attracting attention, he and his children researched those from the Soho and Silver Lake regions who died in World War II and Vietnam.

It wasn’t ego that drove Sbarra to do this, but a moment of heartbreak. As the

Sbarra noticed that the portraits of Belleville’s war dead had been mislaid on the floor. He realized then that it doesn’t matter how much a person is willing to give, ultimately their legacies are at the mercy of those they leave behind.

Many knew that Sbarra’s health was waning in recent months. The Township Council took a leadership role by honoring him with a proclamation. We are left with Sbarra’s legacy. Let’s show him the respect he showed others in life and never misplace it.

The biggest and brightest stars in the sports and entertainment world will jet in from Los Angeles and New York as the party kicks-off Vegas-style with go-go dancers, human statues and a red carpet entrance. VIPs will mingle and dance where nightfall means the beginning of the ultimate lounge experience in this luxurious \$8 million venue.

This 22,000 square-foot ultimate lounge entertainment complex is located along the shops at Mohegan Sun and features three individually themed lounges and nightclubs in one, Lucky's Lounge, The Dubliner and Ultra 88 Night Club. I can best sum up the impact on lounge entertainment with the words of Mitchell Etess, executive VP of Marketing.

"We're thrilled to open this unique destination within Mohegan Sun and bring spectacular nightlife entertainment to the area; this is an exciting addition to the wide variety of concerts, sporting events, shopping and dining amenities already here at Mohegan Sun. "Mohegan After Dark" has something for adults looking for a fun place to hang out, music, dancing, food and spirits." All I wish to add to that is "Here, Here!"

Personally I have not seen the likes of this and the totality of entertainment venues within a property anywhere in the gaming industry and that includes all of Las Vegas. The only property in Atlantic City at the present time that has a chance of coming close to matching or approaching the Mohegan Sun is the "New Borgata" which has also invested over \$1 billion in its property with the promise of exciting additions down the road.

We in North Jersey are fortunate to be geographically equi-distant and have the options of going north & south for our gaming experiences. Atlantic City has gotten most of our business to date because they've been around longer and it is perceived as a resort area with the options of having 12 hotel casinos to choose from. AC has just about squandered that big head start by neglecting the boardwalk and the beaches of the Ocean along with their Corporate greedy bottom line mentality of higher minimums, less services.

Lessening of casino regulations has allowed corporate ownership of multiple casinos, creating a monopolistic takeover of Atlantic City casinos. Once there were 12 individually owned competitive properties in Atlantic City. Powers: A champion filled with hard work and a big smile

(Second in a series)
When I received the sad E-mail from Don Roll about the passing of Mike Powers a few weeks ago, my memory quickly went back to ten summers ago, when Powers played baseball for the Belleville Bruins in the Essex County Baseball League (ECBL).

I remembered Powers as a hard nosed basketball and baseball player at Belleville High from 1987-1989, but got the chance to know him during those hot summer days when Belleville played in the ECBL. Powers was a slick fielding infielder for the Bruins with some legitimate pop in his bat. He also had a perpetual smile on his face, emblematic of a man who loved life.

Ten years ago, Powers was a young man in transition. He was just beginning his collegiate life, molding a career as an educator and eventually, a championship coach. And while he was one of the younger guys on those veteran Bruins teams, anyone who came in contact with Mike walked away with a good feeling about this man's ability to make those around him feel good about life.

Powers was determined to reach his goals in life. I remember his early days as an assistant basketball coach on Roll's staff at Passaic Valley, and his enthusiasm which quickly rubbed off on his players.

"He took his role as a JV coach very seriously," recalled former Passaic Valley player Kevin Tuohey. "He taught us to compete, to work hard, and to enjoy competition. That's what sports was all about to him, and it made a lasting impact on me. I hope to be a coach one day, and it's safe to say Mike Powers is the reason why I have chosen that career path."

In the same way Roll served as a mentor to Powers, Tuohey was hoping to travel that same path with Powers.

"I saw the way Coach Roll worked with Coach Powers," Tuohey said. "Coach (Powers) played for Roll, and I played for Powers. Then I worked (last winter) as a (volunteer) assistant for Coach Powers and I was hoping to have the chance to learn from him. Even though he left us too soon, I'll forever be grateful for everything Coach Powers did for me."

Powers was diagnosed with stomach cancer in Nov. 2001, but continued to serve as an assistant to Roll at Elmwood Park after working in a similar capacity with Roll for three years at Passaic Valley. Powers was promoted to head basketball coach at Elmwood Park for the 2002-2003 season, fulfilling his dream of being a head coach. Despite draining chemotherapy treatments which sapped his strength at times, Powers would not be deterred in coaching his players.

Chris Rothenburger played 2-guard for Elmwood Park last year in its eventual run to a state sectional title.

"We had dedicated the last two seasons to Coach Powers," Rothenburger said. "To look back at what we accomplished last season (finishing 19-5 and winning the sectional title), I'll always be grateful for the times we shared with Coach. He was such a hard worker, and that ethic carried over to us. Coach was laid back, but when he got mad, it was usually because we were slacking a little, and it didn't take too long to get the mes-

sage across. We knew what he expected, and we also knew that we'd be successful if we did what he said."

Elmwood Park's last game of the '02-03 season was a two-point defeat at the hands of Bloomfield Tech in the Group 1 semi finals. Rothenburger and his teammates had lost on the scoreboard, but the feeling of victory permeated the post-game lockerroom.

"(The season) was a dream come true for our team," Rothenburger said. "What I'll remember most about Coach was he would do anything for his players. There was never a question about that. I'd like to coach one day, and I hope to have an impact on young players in the same manner Coach had with me."

Following the end of the season last March, Powers continued working as a teacher in West Orange. Roll remembers playing golf with him six weeks ago and feeling his friend was doing well.

"He looked great," Roll said. "He said he felt good and was looking forward to going away on vacation with his wife (Jennifer). I honestly never felt his health was an issue, you just never got that with Mike. Everything was upbeat."

"I never felt for a minute that he wouldn't be back coaching next year," Rothenburger, who graduated this year, said. "It was never an issue. But that's the way Coach was. As bad as he might be feeling, he always conveyed positive thoughts. No one really knew how ill he was at times."

Powers' health did deteriorate on vacation and upon returning home, it was evident his struggle had magnified.

"A friend called and said Mike had been in the hospital, but that he was coming home, and I figured 'oh, good, he's okay,'" Roll recalled. "And my friend said, 'no, he's going home where he will feel most comfort- (See Buc Shots on Page B2)

"We had two teams playing junior legion ball, too," Frank said. "So plenty of kids saw valuable playing time in the summer. Now, we're hoping to get into a tougher fall league, which can only help. Like I said, we need to be less tentative and more confident in the bigger games, and playing good competition will help us in that regard."

Football to celebrate 25th anniversary

It was a warm September morning at Municipal Stadium in Belleville. The sounds of pads cracking, footballs popping into players' hands and the shrill sound of whistles and yelling coaches permeated the sultry air.

While it felt like summer, and indeed it was, football was very much the subject for a group of high school players that Labor Day morning, Sept. 4, 1978. Second year head coach John Senesky, himself a former Belleville High School halfback (class of 1964) was eagerly roaming the field in his blue shorts and white and gold tee-shirt, looking for a player to teach his Wing-T offense to, or a lineman to show a blocking scheme, or a prospective fullback to explain how his

position would necessitate contact on just about every snap.

Senesky's energy was not necessarily reserved for the media, but the 32-year-old husband and father of two young boys was always cordial to the press, especially when the 19-year-old Belleville Times reporter who was assigned to cover the team that year, was himself a former student of Senesky's print shop class, and was probably even more excited at the prospect of covering the team in 1978 than Senesky was in coaching it, if that was possible.

The reporter had moved to Belleville in 1969, went to School No. 7 for a year, then the Belleville Junior High, where he met Senesky as a 12-year-old kid; eventually graduated from BHS, and pretty much never missed a

Belleville High School football game during that eight-year run. He remembered those Bellboy games well, specifically the running of Ricky Caruso, Al Cervasio and Alan Frank, the passing of Joe Lotriglio, Joe Papisidero, Ricky Loma and Phil Bruno, the soft hands of Joe Troise and the ferocious defensive play of Robert Luongo.

He was there for the Bellboys' 7-6 win at Nutley in '71, when Lotriglio scored the winning touchdown. He never forgot that '72 team's stingy defense, which allowed just 49 points for the entire nine-game season. And who could forget the scoreless tie at Nutley in '75 in that heavy downpour at the Oval?

Now, the reporter was moving to the "big time", (See Football on Page B2)

(Continued from Page B1) having advanced as a stringer for the Belleville Times, where he had covered cross country since 1975, to working the varsity football beat. And as he walked onto the field, look-

ing for Senesky's familiar face, a million questions wandered through the reporter's mind, the least of which was asking Senesky if the scars of the '77 season and a 2-6-1 mark which included four defeats by shutout, including the infamous 63-0 setback to Seton Hall Prep, would infringe

on this year's team. "No," the reporter thought. "I won't ask him about that." Senesky was easy to find, and seemed at ease that morning. Practice was going well, he had an experienced group of players returning, and the mood amongst the players and coaches on that Labor Day nearly 25 years ago was one of excitement. "So," the reporter said, a bit nervously, "how does this team look in comparison to the one which finished the '77 season." And as soon as the question left his lips, the reporter wished he had said something like "how about those Jets?" (who had stunned Miami in its season opener a day earlier at Shea Stadium), or "do you think the

Yankees can catch the Red Sox?" (and this was four weeks prior to the Bucky Dent homer). Anything but asking Senesky about the '77 season. But Senesky didn't hesitate in discussing that season. His young team, which had been outscored 97-12 in its first four games that season, then won two straight before the Seton Hall debacle, had bonded nicely in the later stages of 1977. And Senesky, in his first season as the varsity head coach after a tremendously successful run as the freshman coach, admitted he had learned a great deal that year, too. Senesky talked about that team, but quickly changed the subject to the '78 team, which had pleased him tremendously so far in drills. He then told me something which was news to the reporter, and, 25 years later, is the reason

for this feature. "Belleville's nickname is no longer the Bellboys," Senesky said. "We're the Buccaneers now." And thus begins the story of the 1978 Belleville High School football team, (First in a series on Belleville High School football)

HELP IN SETTLING STOMACHS

As if cancer patients did not have enough with which to deal, their chemotherapy can sometimes make them quite nauseated. In fact, vomiting and nausea can be so severe that some patients refuse the additional chemotherapy that could help save their lives. Fortunately, there is now some good news to report about this problem. The FDA has recently approved a new drug to control severe nausea and vomiting among cancer patients who receive certain types of chemotherapy. Emend (aprepitant) is the first drug designed to prevent the debilitating symptoms that many patients experience more than 24 hours after receiving chemotherapy. Emend is part of a three-drug therapy that blocks the brain receptors that trigger nausea and vomiting.

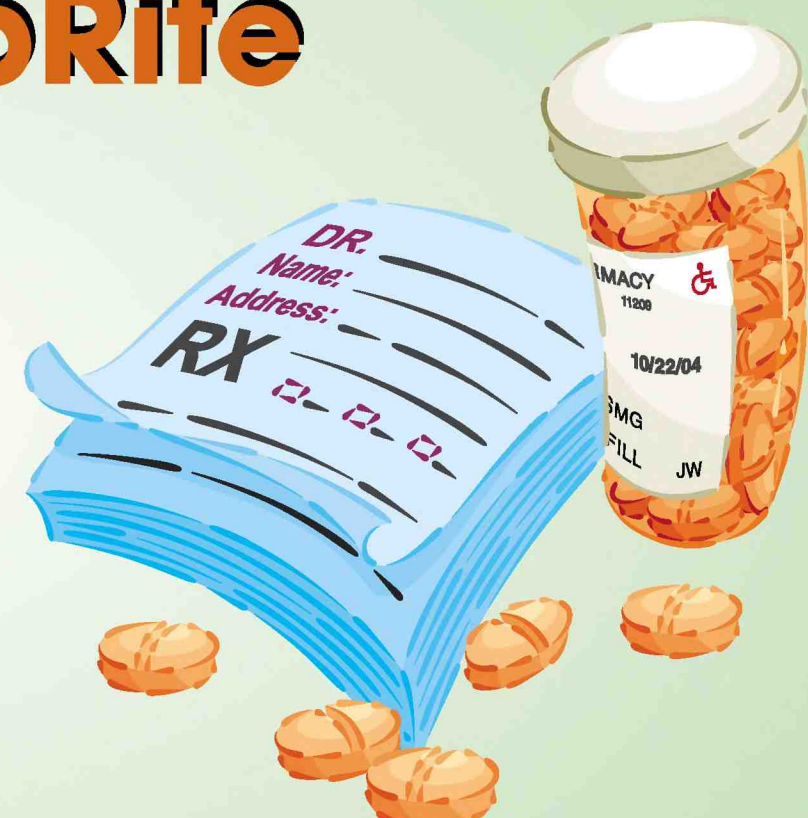
