Reward offered for illegal students

Residents can help out the town and make some cash thanks to a plan by the Board of Education to weed out students illegally attending Belleville public schools.

The district will offer an award of \$50 to any private citizen "whose report regarding possible illegal students results in the removal of the student from the school district," according to school board member, Ralph

Mazzuca, who chairs the residency committee.

The 2002-2003 end of the year report on illegal students includes statistics that show the district was awarded \$10,819.57 by the courts from parents whose children illegally attended Belleville schools.

"Not all of the money has been paid by the parents yet," Mazzuca said.

Feds subpoena library financial statements

It appears the federal government is after something in Belleville, though it's not yet apparent what.

The U.S. Attorney's Office in Newark subpoenaed financial records for the Belleville Library and Information Center on Washington Avenue last week.

Township Manager Raymond Kimble confirmed that federal agents visited the library July 29 to serve the papers. As of Monday of this week, no federal agents had yet contacted him about the matter.

"We will cooperate 100

percent with them," said Kimble, continuing that he has no knowledge as to what the investigation is about.

The Belleville Times reached out to the U.S. Attorney's office, which would not confirm or deny that it had been serving papers in Belleville, nor explain the purpose of the subpoenas.

While it has not yet been disclosed what the U.S. Attorney's office is investigating, questions were raised earlier this year by some residents over the library's spending of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) money on construc-

'Home Depot' on the range

Company representative comes to discuss a cooperative WalMart site

The future face of the 24-acre former-Walter Kidde site on Main Street in Belleville is starting to take shape.

At Monday night's work session of the Belleville Township Council, Attorney Mitchell Abrahams of Cole, Schotz, Meisel, Forman and Leonard PA, which represents Home Depot, came before the council to present a preliminary site plan.

Though he said it was by no means a finished plan, the sketch showed a 135,000 square foot WalMart at the eastern end of the property, and a 115,000 square foot Home Depot store at the western end. A large customer parking lot may be in the southern portion of the property with space for approximately 1,380 vehicles.

According to Township Manager Raymond Kimble, the proposed WalMart is not a Super WalMart, which usually sells groceries along with its department store goods.

Abrahams said that WalMart and Home Depot would own the property in a reciprocal easement agreement, where shared parking, lights and property maintenance would be taken care of on a cooperative basis.

WalMart has a contract with Max Finkelstein Inc. to

purchase the property. Home Depot is pursuing a contract for a portion with WalMart.

The Township Council is expected to vote on approving a recommendation by the planning board that would change the zoning of various properties in Belleville, including the Walter Kidde site, which would change from industrial to commercial retail, according to Second Ward Councilman Thomas Fuscaldo.

Fuscaldo said he would have to look at the proposal "a little further" before deciding how to vote.

"We may have to change the zoning further," he said. "We want to encourage as much development as possible, but this may hinder it."

One of the biggest hur-

dles for the developers to overcome will be getting Department of Environmental Protection approval of the site. A clean-up has been active on the site for years, but the agency hasn't declared it fit for development yet. There are some on the council who believe that zoning the site commercial retail now may expedite a new assessment of the land.

Council reconsiders abolishing rent leveling board/protections

The Township Council appears to be taking a much more amiable approach to the issue of rent leveling, as discussions have shifted from abolishing it completely to merely changing it.

At Monday night's work session, members spoke of the importance of protecting the interests of both the property owner and the tenant.

Back in June, the council came within a razor's breadth of abolishing the town ordinance that estab-

lished rent leveling through the auspices of a rent leveling board. A proposal had been placed on the table that would have done away with the board, which, like several citizen/town committees in Belleville are proving to have done, just stopped meeting.

"The problem with the current ordinance is if we eliminate the rent leveling board, we eliminate rent leveling, and I don't think that's wise," said Councilman William Escott.

Gone would have been

protections for tenants and landlords alike. Several sitting on the council didn't even seem to realize this. Those who did felt that rent leveling was hindering local property owners from adjusting their rents to keep pace with the rising cost of operating a property.

In June, angry tenants packed the council chamber to speak out against the abolition of rent leveling, which they saw as their only protection from landlords who may gouge

Belleville rescuers coordinate for happy ending

Last Wednesday, the Belleville fire and police departments assisted in the rescue of a baby fawn trapped in the Second River canal along Mill Street.

Associated Humane Society of Newark dispatched two units to assist in capturing and rescuing the fawn. Firefighters lowered a cage to the animal control officers, who were finally able to safely rescue the fawn from the river.

The deer was taken to Associated Humane Society animal shelter in Newark where it was examined for injuries. It will be relocated in a rural area. Firefighters credited Animal Control Officers Tywan Diggs and Michael Fowler for their efforts to corral the deer.

Clear sailing offered through insurance maze

Seniors with questions on how to negotiate the sometimes confusing labyrinth of health insurance claims can get free advice from SHIP, a service for counseling of Senior Health Insurance Programs, offered at Clara Maass Medical Center.

SHIP is a state health insurance assistance program offered in 21 counties throughout the state. Through the Clara Maass Volunteer Office, seniors in the area can set up an appointment with a trained counselor who can answer questions regarding Medicare, HMOs, PPOs, Medigap, and drug programs for seniors. SHIP also offers information on legal services and Medicaid.

“Counselors are trained to help Medicare beneficiaries deal with insurance claims and evaluate health insurance needs,” says Michael Capano, SHIP counselor.

Seniors wishing to make an appointment to discuss health insurance claim-related matters can call the Clara Maass Volunteer Office at (973) 450-2150 and ask to speak with a SHIP counselor. Since the program is state-funded, all services are offered free-of-charge.

Students may notice some changes this fall

The public school district has two high school projects being worked on this summer that aim to improve the comfort level of students in the cafeteria and enhance the appearance of the gymnasium.

The local Rotary Club is funding the cafeteria project for more than \$11,000. The new area will be outside the cafeteria, with new side-

walks, tables and chairs. The cafeteria will also now be handicapped-accessible, according to school board member William Villano, who is on the board's buildings and grounds committee.

He thanked school board vice president Dawson Bloom, who is an engineer, for "lending his engineering capabilities" to the project.

Board president Alfonse DeMeo said he was "skeptical"

and now is "sold" on the cafeteria project.

"It will make for a more hospitable lunch period and relieves some overcrowding," DeMeo said.

The second project is "beautifying the gym to restore it to its original state of many years ago," Villano said.

Part of the old ceiling will be removed, and the pre-existing ceiling repainted "to

open it up like it was 25 years ago," he said. The colors would be Belleville's team sports colors.

"We're looking for low dollar value and high impact," Villano said.

The timetable for finishing these projects is by September, he said.

Improvements to the gym's bleachers and locker rooms will come later, according to Villano.

Books to put students one step ahead

Public school officials are looking to improve math scores for the High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA).

Students must pass the HSPA to graduate from high school. To that end, the school board has approved new math textbooks.

"These books have revised basic skills, and will help with HSPA in the math department," said Superintendent of Schools Dr. Joseph Ciccone.

A curriculum committee

including math department leaders and school board members selected the books.

"The book is aligned to HSPA standards," Ciccone said.

The money for the books has already been allocated in this year's school budget, he said.

The book is entitled "New Views in Mathematics: A Student Test for the HSPA Curriculum."

All Belleville High School students beginning in the fall will use the book, Ciccone said.

Staying safe on the roads and trails this summer

The Belleville Health Department is committed to educating the public on issues, which concern the safety of its citizens. Now that the warm weather is here, more and more are bicycling. While bicycle riding is fun and great exercise, it poses certain risks.

Every year, approximately 400 to 500 children in the United States die as a result of bicycle injuries, most within blocks of their home. Most of these deaths and numerous injuries are the result of brain trauma.

When children fall off their bikes, they have a

good chance of hitting their heads, which is the most fragile part of the body. If a child's head strikes the pavement even at a slow speed, permanent brain injury can result.

Helmets can prevent 85 percent of serious head injuries. Riding a bike is a balancing act for everyone who rides. It only takes a moment's inattention for an injury to occur. Scraped knees and broken bones heal, but a head injury can result in permanent disability.

Parents need to set a good example by wearing

helmets themselves when they ride. Wearing a helmet should be a condition for riding a bike, not an option. Consistency is very important. If a parent allows a child to ride a bicycle on some occasions without a helmet, the child will not

believe the message about the importance of wearing it.

When purchasing a helmet, look for a Snell and/or ANSI certification sticker. These mean the helmet meets basic safety standards.

tenants if left to their own devices.

The council tabled the matter until this week's meeting.

In the meantime, Escott said he had done some checking, and found that the rent leveling board works for all parties involved.

He said that landlords who struggle to keep up with their costs could go to the rent leveling board and file a hardship case. In legitimate instances, the landlord can pass the costs on to the tenant.

The rent leveling board has reportedly been inactive for two years. In that span, anyone with a concern has been referred to Eileen Risoli of the health department.

Councilman Louis Palante recommended appointing new members to the rent leveling board and making it a viable body once again. Most others agreed. Escott suggested examining the option of increasing the amount a landlord could raise rent.

"We should do what's fair for the tenants and what's fair for the property owner," said Councilman Thomas Fuscaldo.

by the district's domicile investigators, Bruce Morgan and Wayne Worley.

They conducted a total of 1,286 investigations. Of those, 26 were "dwellings with possible zoning or occupancy violations," according to the report.

Transfers out of the district because of non-residency status totaled 72, and registrations denied were 25.

On a regular basis, both investigators monitored 22 designated areas regarding possible illegal students, Mazzuca said.

As of June 30, the student enrollment per school was: School 3, 376; School 4, 334; School 5, 393; School 7, 464; School 8, 469; and School 10, 122. The middle school had 810 students and the high school 1,406.

The total number of students was 4,519, according to the report.

Class wins award for safety production

Deborah Strano's driver's education classes produced public service videos on seat-belt safety with the high school television station to try and save lives.

Now, they have won an award for their efforts.

The program, entitled "Seatbelt Safety" has been chosen by the New Jersey Child Health Month Committee to receive the John W. Alexander Outstanding Project Award.

"The award is given each year to an organization that carries out a health and safety activity that involves children in a creative motivating learning experience that promotes sound health principles," Ciccone said.

The district will receive a cash prize of \$300 to fund future health and safety projects, he said.

Students in the driver's education class were divided into groups to create a slogan and short 30-second commercial to promote seatbelt safety. With the direction of the high school communications department, the students created videos that were aired on WBHS.

The students also presented the videos to the Board of Education and to parents in the community.

Eloisa Hernandez-Ramos, project coordinator for Child Health Month, said, "In recognition of your outstanding project, we would like to publicly recognize you in October, which is officially Child Health Month in New Jersey."

Details of that ceremony are still being worked out, she said.

"Congratulations and thank you for your commitment in improving the health and safety of New Jersey's children," she said.

The students created 15 separate video public service announcements. Each participant had gotten a certificate of appreciation and a baseball cap.

The National Highway Safety Association says that motor vehicle crashes are the leading cause of death among teens. Other statistics show that African American and Latino teens are 50 percent less likely to wear seatbelts. Other statistics show that 32 percent of teens thought it was "uncool" to wear seatbelts, while 30 percent found it "uncomfortable" and 18 percent said they believed they are "invincible."

The videos were diverse, with one featuring "seat-belt boy," a character created by one of the students, Theodore Soppeck.

Student Crystal Soto relived the painful memories of losing her father and his girlfriend in an accident where seatbelts were not used.

Another student, Claudia Ochoa, wrote a poem about seat belts, which read, "It can save your life, the life of a friend or the life of a loved one...make the right choice."

Ephedra: Questions emerge about safety

Ephedra, the herbal stimulant which is used to build muscle and lose weight, is currently not regulated in the New Jersey high school athletic system, and NJSIAA officials said there are no future plans to do so.

It is already outlawed in the National Football League, National Collegiate Athletic Association and Major League Soccer. It is legal in the National Basketball Association and the National Hockey League. Strangely enough, MLB commissioner Bud Selig banned the substance in the minor leagues, but not the major league. Currently the associate general counsel of the Major League Baseball Association, Eugene Orza, is battling with Congress and stated that MLB would not ban the product unless the government does.

The issue of ephedra use has become a hot topic since the death of Baltimore Orioles pitcher Steve Bechler. The 23-year-old died of organ failure caused by heatstroke. He collapsed on Feb. 17 of this year during a conditioning run. It was soon discovered that he had ephedra-containing supplements in his locker. The *Baltimore Sun's* website, sunspot.net, reported on July 18 that his widow, Kiley Bechler, had filed a \$600 million lawsuit against Cytodyne Technologies, the company that produces Xenadrine RFA-1.

This was not the first death that was potentially linked to ephedra, but possibly the most glaring. Studies are underway to determine if ephedra is responsible for or mainly contributes to strokes, heart attacks and seizures. A spokesperson of the FDA stated that there are "123 reported deaths that are associated not necessarily caused, by ephedra since 1994." The source stated that other problems reported include high blood pressure, heart palpitations, nerve damage, memory loss and psychosis.

The herb ephedra is derived from the plant *ephedra sinica*, also known as ma huang. When consumed into the body, ephedrine and pseudoephedrine are released and are referred to as ephedra alkaloids. It then speeds up the central ner-

vous system and has similar effects as caffeine. It can be taken to assist in weight loss and strength training or for a boost of energy during a game or practice.

NJSIAA

The New Jersey State Interscholastic Athletic Association has not, and according to its senior officers, will not make a policy regarding the use of ephedra at the high school level.

"It states in our constitution that the discipline of any substance, legal or illegal, will be controlled by the schools that the students attend," said Jim Loper. "We do not have a policy about the regulation of using supplements."

Assistant Director Steve Kimko added, "We do not have an official policy on ephedra. We leave that up to the school systems."

The NJSIAA does not list any substances as being banned, including illegal steroids, said the officials. They stated that it is up to the schools and coaches to educate their players on what they should and should not put in their bodies.

"It's a local decision, and we do not have a state organization policing the issue," said Loper. "Any penalties that take place will be administered by the local school district."

And Loper states that the NJSIAA's policy is exactly how the schools want it. For the policy to be changed, a school would have to offer a proposal to the NJSIAA stating why it feels that the organization should create a policy on the topic. Thus far, Loper states that the NJSIAA has received zero petitions.

"No school has submitted legislation to us," said Loper. "Right now, the common belief is that the issue can be better controlled by the school districts. The rule of regulation is at the local level."

In fact, Loper stated that the NJSIAA has yet to suspend a player for taking athletic-enhancing substances. "There were two players suspended this year by their coach," he said. "But that was for steroid use, not ephedrine use."

Although no official stance has been taken on the



topic, Kimko stated that there has been workshops by the NJSIAA educating coaches on the topic of supplement use.

"We've had successful seminars," said Kimko. "This past spring, we had 65 coaches turn out for our workshop, which is a very high number."

DSHEA

On October 25, 1994, Congress passed the Dietary Supplement Health and Educa-

tion Act (DSHEA). It amended the previous Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act and established standards for products known as "dietary supplements". In this act, the government defined a dietary supplement as a "product (other than tobacco) intended to supplement the diet that bears or contains one or more of the following dietary ingredients: a vitamin, a mineral, an herb or other botanical, an amino acid, a dietary substance for use by man to sup-

plement the diet by increasing the total dietary intake or a concentrate, metabolite, constituent, extract, or combination of any" of the previously mentioned items and that it is to be taken in the form of powder, softgel or gelcap. The product cannot be classified as a drug and it cannot promise to treat or prevent a

disease.

The only warning that appears on supplemental products is near the company's catch slogans - "This statement has not been evaluated by the Food and Drug Administration. This product is not intended to diagnose, treat, cure or prevent any disease."

Taxes For Profit

A few weeks back this column talked about the battle between the governor and the casino operators about increased state taxes for Atlantic City's hotels/casinos. If you recall, this column decided to stay neutral in the battle of big business and big government because, "It really doesn't matter who's right or wrong or who wins or loses because whatever the outcome, we the "low rollers of the world" eventually pick up the tab.

I'm sorry to say that once again this column had it pegged right, as some of you already realize. Parking has increased from \$2 to \$3 and more, depending on what each casino decides to charge. There's also an amusement and room tax increase.

If you wish to complain to the casino people about these increases, they will tell you, or lead you to believe, that it's a mandatory state law. That is not so. What is so, is that the State of New Jersey has increased taxes on those casinos doing business in the state, and the casino operators spin it to seem that they have no choice but to charge these taxes to their patrons.

Before this latest increase in parking fees, the state taxed all the casinos \$1.50 per car to park. That's what the casinos had to pay the state. Most of them decided to charge you and me a minimum of \$2 and more for every car they parked. When I asked what the extra 50 cents was, they said, to pay for the costs of having a booth attendant collect the parking fee. Now I don't know what it cost them to put up a small booth with an unskilled employee in it, certainly not 50 cents a car.

I do know that whatever it cost, the casinos have not only turned their personal casino tax over to the rest of us, but have, and continue to make, a tremendous profit on their parking policy. Imagine the thousands of cars that roll into each casino day and night and multiply that by 50 cents gross profit and you can see that apart from people ever gambling a nickel. They have put themselves into the immensely profitable parking garage business. Now they have been taxed again and again they have passed it on to us with an even greater profit picture.

I put it to you casino operators, why can't you level with your guests on this matter. I had to check out the law itself to gather this information. All businesses are taxed in some form or another by the cities, municipalities or states they conduct business in. The gaming industry isn't any different from any other business, but they have a distinct advantage over other businesses in that they don't have to give their customers anything if they choose not to for their patronage.

Gamblers understand this and accept the fact that they proceed at their own risk and very often go home empty handed, but it smacks of greed and arrogance to ask their guests not only to pay to beautify their casinos and surrounding properties, but also to make a profit on top of it.

Imagine any other business owner asking their customers to pay for the beautification of their business and the surrounding grounds. So, please give us a break. If you can't, then heed the words of a man of the people, a low roller I'm sure, in his day. He identified with enough of the common folk to get himself elected president of these United States. He said, "You can fool some of the people some of the time, even fool most of the people most of the time, but you can't fool all of the people all of the time." Thanks Abe.

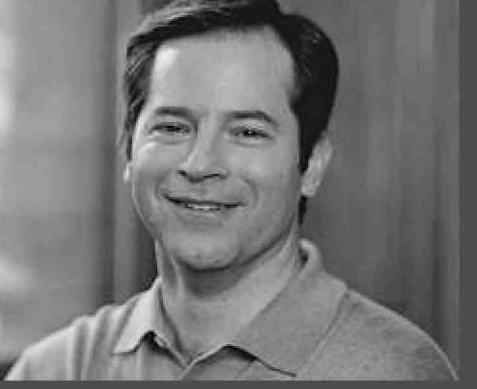

Gone but not to be forgotten

A couple of years ago, Anthony Buccino went to a war memorial service in Nutley.

"I was looking around at the veterans' names, and I didn't have any idea who they were," he said.

That experience started Buccino on a quest to put stories to the names of the war dead of Nutley and Belleville.

"A lot of families have either died or moved on from World War II. That inspired me," Buccino said. "Many of them are long forgotten, and I wanted to help people remember them."

Then in May, recently deceased Belleville Fire Chief George Sbarra's book of war memories "Remembrance" came out. Sbarra forwarded Buccino what he had so far, and the Belleville site was begun.

"Had it not been for Chief Sbarra's efforts over the past two years that culminated in 'Remembrance' it's likely the Belleville Sons project would not be where it is today," stated Buccino. "Chief Sbarra was a one-of-a-kind and he will be missed."

"In two or three months, we caught up with the Nutley site," he said of the Belleville site. There were 110 Belleville dead in WWII, but not all documented.

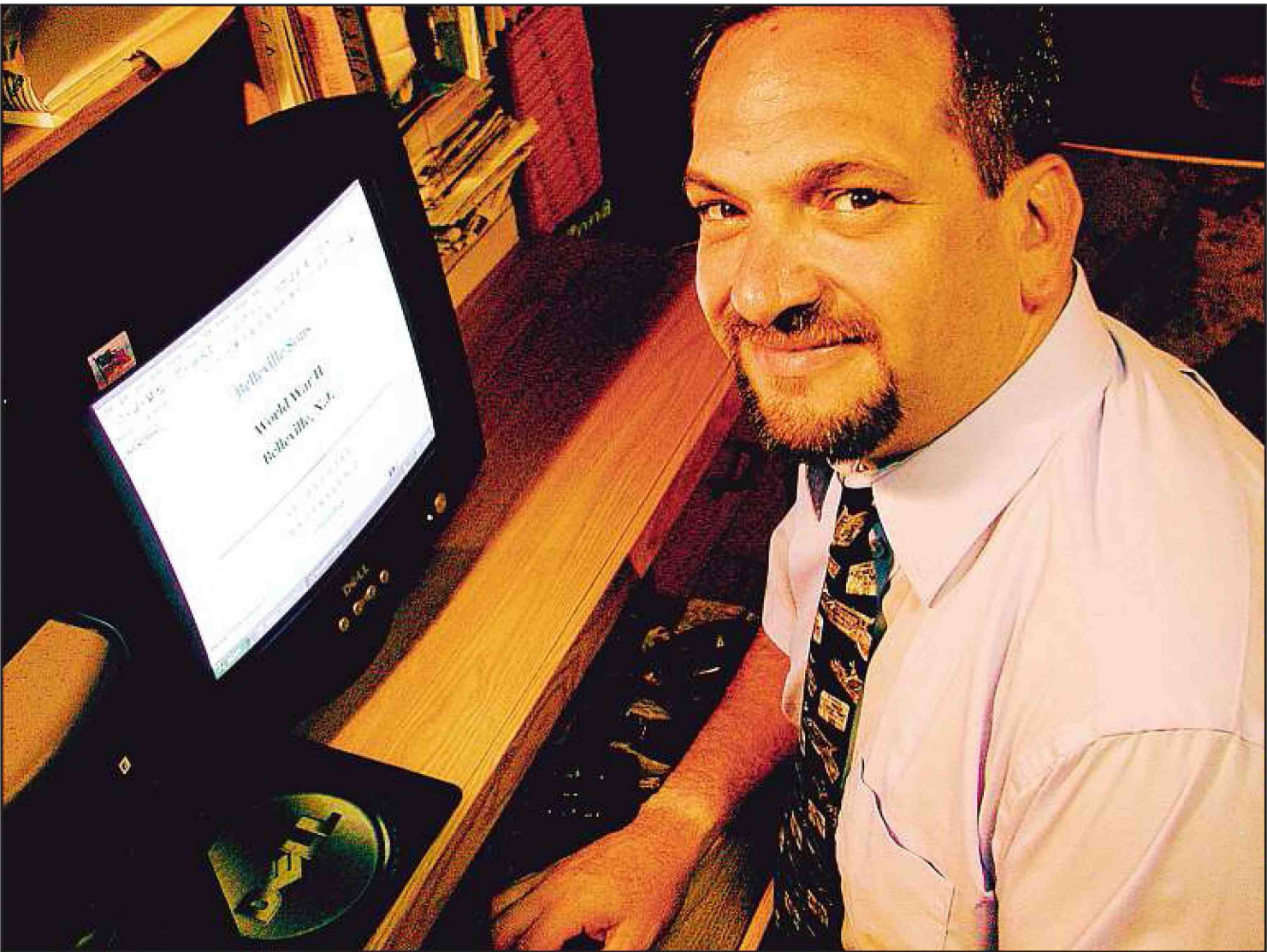
"My criteria was, if it was written up in the Belleville Times, that means they at least once lived there," Buccino said.

Working from the old Belleville Times papers from 1941 to 1946, he put the dead in chronological order. Twelve to 15 died in Normandy, including a couple in submarines.

His daughter, Andrea, came up with so many POW/MIAs that they made it into a separate category.

"A lot of MIAs, you never hear if they come back," Buccino said. Three or four definitely came home, but others may have come home quietly and their status is not known, he said.

There was a Nutley veteran who disappeared over

Germany, and the son wrote to Buccino to say he came back.

"You never know when you're finished with this. There's always a different angle. When do you stop?" Buccino said. "We've probably pretty much maxed out, unless I hear from people related to veterans that we don't have information on yet."

There are 16 people in Nutley who are just names, with no other information. The number of Nutley people who died in WWII is in the 90s. Four of five died of pneumonia. Others died as U.S. flight instructors away from the fighting.

Eventually, Buccino wants to do books with the local historical societies, "to do everybody justice."

In Belleville, he didn't have any World War I names until the late Belleville historian Ed O'Neill's list of names was found printed in the Belleville Times in 1996. "Hopefully the historical society has more information," Buccino said.

The sources for Buccino's list include the New Jersey War Dead, which is a print-out from 1946 of the dead and their next of kin; The American Battle Monuments Commission; the New Jersey State Library; the Nutley Sun and the Belleville Times.

The last place to look for those killed in service to their country is people who died in service during peacetime.

"We'd have to go through every newspaper. I don't know if that's possible. But if people who knew someone want to get in touch, we'll do it," Buccino said.

"You couldn't pay me to do this, with all of the time I've spent. If it's done this year, fine. If it's done next year, that's fine, too," he said.

He said he hopes to come out with a first edition and then update the names in subsequent volumes.

Some great stories have come out of all of that work.

Someone who lived across from Buccino in 1958, when he was four years old was on the list, but he never found out what happened to him.

Another soldier lost was his second cousin. "I'm still finding out about my own family," Buccino said.

A wife put her husband's name in and found her husband's father. "He barely knew his father, who died in World War II, but this brought them a little closer," Buccino said.

Two younger brothers found their older brother, who died in Korea. "It brought him back to them for a little while," he said.

Then there was the woman who saw this boy in the candy store as a young woman, and had a crush on him. She found him in the Vietnam section. "She hadn't thought about him in 25 years, but she pictured him like it was yesterday," Buccino said.

"It's having an impact, as you see the response from families," he said. "It's important to remember these guys and their sacrifices."

Don't let it become too hot to handle says Belleville Health

Warm weather and outdoor activity generally go hand in hand. However, it is important for older people to take action to avoid the severe health problems often caused by hot weather. "Hyperthermia" is a general name given to a variety of heat-related illnesses. Two most common forms of hyperthermia are heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Of the two, heat stroke is especially dangerous and requires immediate medical attention (see Definitions).

Health and Lifestyle Risk Factors

The temperature does not have to hit 100 degrees for a person to be at risk. Both one's general health and/or lifestyle may increase a person's chance of suffering a heat-related illness.

Health factors, which may increase risk, include:

- Poor circulation, inefficient sweat glands, and changes in the skin caused by the normal aging process.
- Heat, lung, and kidney diseases, as well as any illness that causes general weakness or fever.
- High blood pressure or other conditions that require change in diet. For example, people on salt-restricted diets may increase their risk. However, salt pills

should not be used without first asking a doctor.

- The inability to perspire, caused by medications including diuretics, sedatives and tranquilizers, and certain heart and blood pressure drugs.
- Taking several drugs for various conditions. It is important, however, to continue to take prescribed medications and discuss possible problems with a physician.
- Being substantially overweight or underweight.
- Drinking alcoholic beverages.

Lifestyle factors that can increase risk include:

Unbearably hot living quarters. People who live in homes without fans or air conditioners should take the following steps to reduce heat discomfort: open windows at night; create cross-ventilation opening windows on two sides of the building; cover windows when they are exposed to direct sunlight; and keep curtains, shades or blinds drawn during the hottest part of the day.

Lack of transportation. People without fans or air conditioners often are unable to go to shopping malls, movies and libraries because of illness and/or lack of transportation. Friends or relatives might

be asked to supply transportation on particularly hot days.

Overdressing. Because they may not feel the heat, older people may not dress appropriately in hot weather. Perhaps a friend or family member can help to select proper clothing. Natural fabrics such as cotton are best.

Visiting overcrowded places. Trip should be scheduled during non-rush hour times and participation in a special event should be carefully planned.

Not understanding weather conditions. Older people, particularly those at special risk (see health factors), should stay indoors, especially on hot and humid days, particularly when there is an air pollution alert in effect.

How is hyperthermia treated?

If the victim is exhibiting signs of heat stroke, seek emergency assistance immediately. Without medical attention, heat stroke is frequently deadly, especially for older people.

Heat exhaustion may be treated in several ways.

- Get the victim out of the sun and into a cool place — preferably that is air conditioned.
- Offer fluids but avoid al-

cohol and caffeine. Water and fruit and vegetable juices are best.

- Encourage the individuals to shower or bathe, or sponge off with cool water.
- Urge the person to lie down and rest, preferably in a cool place.

How is hyperthermia detected?

A person with symptoms including headache, nausea, and fatigue after exposure to heat probably has some measure of heat-related illness. It is important to recognize the difference between the very serious condition known as heat stroke and other heat-related illnesses. Persons experiencing any of these symptoms should consult a doctor.

Definitions

Heat stress occurs when a strain is placed on the body as a result of hot weather.

Heat fatigue is a feeling of weakness brought on by high outdoor temperatures. Symptoms include cool, moist skin and a weakened

pulse. The person may feel faint.

Heat syncope is sudden dizziness experienced after exercising in the heat. The skin appears pale and sweaty but is generally moist and cool. The pulse may be weakened, but the heart rate is usually rapid. Body temperature is normal.

Heat cramps are painful muscle spasms in the abdomen, arms or legs following strenuous activity. The skin is usually moist and cool and the pulse is normally or slightly raised. Body temperature is mostly normal. Heat cramps often are caused by a lack of salt in the body, but salt replacement should not be considered without advice of a physician.

Heat exhaustion is a warning that the body is getting too hot. The person may be thirsty, giddy, weak, uncoordinated, nauseous, and sweating profusely. The body temperature is usually normal and the pulse is normal or raised. The skin is

cold and clammy. Although heat exhaustion is often caused by the body's loss of water and salt, salt supplements should only be taken with advice from a doctor.

Heat stroke can be life-threatening! Victims of heat stroke almost always die so immediate medical attention is essential when problems first begin. A person with heat stroke has a body temperature above 104 degrees. Other symptoms may include confusion, combativeness, bizarre behavior, faintness, staggering, strong rapid pulse, dry flushed skin, lack of sweating, possible delirium or coma.

Heat-related illnesses can become serious if preventative steps are not taken. It is important to realize that older people are at particular risk of hyperthermia. Many people die of heat stroke each year, most over 50 years of age. With good, sound judgement and knowledge of preventive measures, the summer can remain safe and enjoyable for everyone.

Town pre-school registration continues for kids

The Belleville Dept. of Recreation and Cultural Affairs is accepting registration for the Pre-School Play Program for four-year-old children.

A session is from 9 a.m. to 10:45 a.m. or 12:45 p.m. to 2:30 p.m., five days a week with class limited to a maximum of 20 students in each session. A minimum of 10 children is required in each session. The cost of the 32-week program is \$175. The

mothers of the children accepted must participate by serving one duty day about every eight or nine days according to the published schedule. School will tentatively begin on Monday, Sept. 15 and will run through May 2004.

Children born between Oct. 1998 and Sept. 1999 who will enter kindergarten in Sept. 2004 are eligible. Participants must be Belleville residents. Since there are a lim-

ited number of openings, applications will be accepted on a first come, first served basis only.

Children (and their parents) must be able to speak and understand English in order to participate.

Tosato tabbed as Caldwell coach

Belleville's long-time cross country coach will have a new address this fall.

John Tosato, who has been at the helm of the program since 1982, will be the first women's cross country coach at Caldwell College.

"We're very pleased to have someone of John's coaching ability, and most importantly, strong character, be named not only our women's cross country coach, but the first coach in that program's history," said Caldwell College Athletic Director Mark Corino. "It's an historic moment for Caldwell, well, and I feel confident that John is the right man for this challenge."

Cross country will make it's debut at Caldwell this fall. It is the 10th intercollegiate sport at the NCAA, Division 2 school and the first sport added to the docket since women's soccer in 1998. As with the other nine sports at Caldwell, cross country will have scholarship monies available.

"I'm obviously very excited about this opportunity," Tosato, who grew up in Newark and makes his home in Lyndhurst, said. "I've become pretty familiar with Caldwell the last few years, and know Mark and the athletic staff there

pretty well. While it is a new position, I'll feel at home."

While Tosato is looking forward to working at Caldwell, he will miss coaching cross country at Belleville. He will, however, remain as Belleville's indoor and outdoor track coach.

"This year will be more of a transition," Tosato said. "I'm meeting with the kids, and will explain the situation to them. In a way, it won't be too hard, because I'm still teaching at Belleville and will see them every day."

Tosato began his coaching and teaching career at Belleville in Nov., 1981, when he was hired as a science teacher, a position he continues to hold today. Starting a program from scratch isn't new to Tosato. A month after he was named to his teaching position, Tosato began the indoor track program. He was named the outdoor track coach in March 1982.

Caldwell will open its inaugural women's cross country season this September.

"Obviously, my recruiting process will begin at the end of this season," Tosato said. "This season will be more of setting up the program, and working with the student-athletes who would like to come out for the sport, and then building from there."

1978: The Buccaneers debut

The long-standing tradition of excellence that was Belleville football had received a face lift of sorts 25 years ago when the team's name was changed from Bellboys to Buccaneers.

Heading into the 1978 season, the optimism permeating the Bucs was noticeably positive. Second-year head coach John Senesky recalled his feeling that the season would produce some positive results.

"We all had learned a great deal in 1977," Senesky said from his home in San Diego last weekend. "I know that as a coaching staff, we had learned a lot and we felt a lot more organized heading into 1978. And even though we didn't have a big senior class that fall, we had a lot of experienced players returning."

Among those returning players were the team captains, Angelo Santinelli and Joe D'Agostino. Santinelli played center and line-backer, D'Agostino was an offensive lineman.

"They were tremendous captains," Senesky said. "Those guys wanted to make that year special and pretty soon, everyone felt the same way."

Most of the seniors had seen significant playing time in '77, and they were especially prideful of the improvement in the second half of that campaign.

"We started 0-4 in '77," Senesky said. "We were shut out in the first three games that year (and lost 36-12 to Passaic in the fourth week), so when we won our first game (17-14 over Irvington in week

five), you could tell those kids were anxious to keep that momentum going."

Santinelli was the team's vocal leader. A throwback to the 1950s, Santinelli almost considered it an insult to be taken out of the game, even for just one play. He had a shoulder injury that would cause him considerable pain on certain plays, but he would never consider coming out of the game. After his team lost to Passaic 38-13 in '78, Santinelli said the only injury he had was to his pride.

D'Agostino was a little quieter, but his tenacity on the offensive line could never be underestimated. Both captains were also outstanding in the classroom, a trait that many of the players, including junior quarterback Ed Aulisi, who is today a neurosurgeon, can attest to.

The senior class that fall also included Phil Lazaro, Anthony Dondarski, Jerry Fazzini, Alex DonnaMaria, Carl Garofolo, Perry Mayers, Scott Grant, John Pravata, Weddy Tramutola, Tom Henry, Jim Galasso, Mike DeMayo and Joe Francheschini.

The juniors who were so vital to that team were Carl Lordi, Rich Vitiello, Danny Amadeo, Joe DeLorenzo, Joe Garofolo, Lenny Mendola, Dante DeNotaris, Mike Nicosia, Aulisi, Dante DeNotaris and Russ Pagano.

Senesky's first recollection of how determined the '78 team was came in an off-field moment.

"We were doing a fundraiser for Belleville football," Senesky said with a chuckle. "And the kids

had to sell these candles, and they weren't the easiest things to sell. But they did a great job, and I remember thinking 'if they can sell those candles, they're bound to be successful'."

Off-season conditioning wasn't as prevalent as it is today, but Senesky knew then how important it was. When he became head coach, Senesky instituted a decathlon, a series of running and weight lifting events that gave the coaching staff a good idea of where the players were in conditioning. The event was held the first week of practice.

"I remember that the '78 team had some excellent results in the decathlon," Senesky said. "Everything was starting to come around."

The pre season had produced the desired results. Now, it was time to see how the team would fare in the regular season. Next week, a look back at the nine games of the '78 season, beginning with the season opener against powerful Livingston.

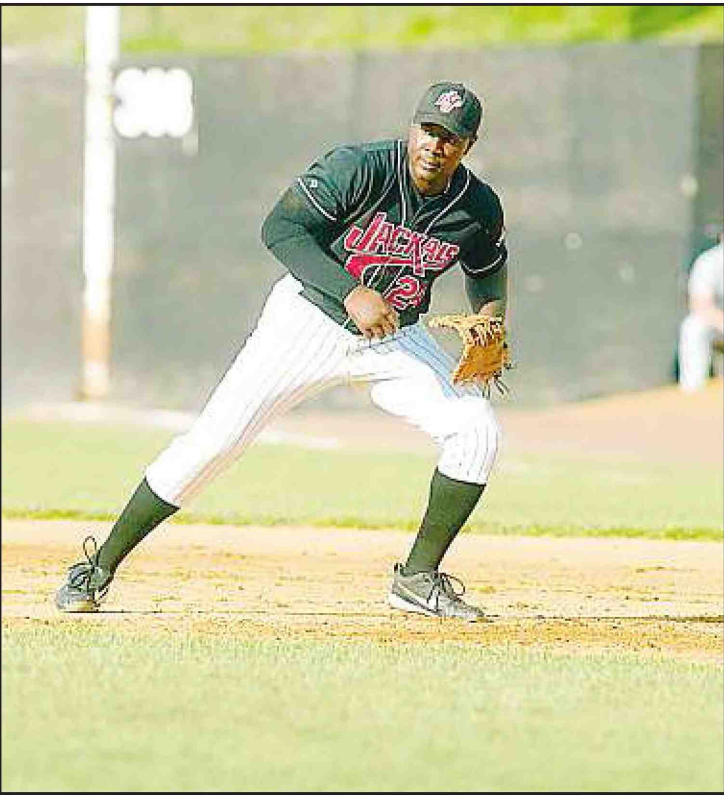

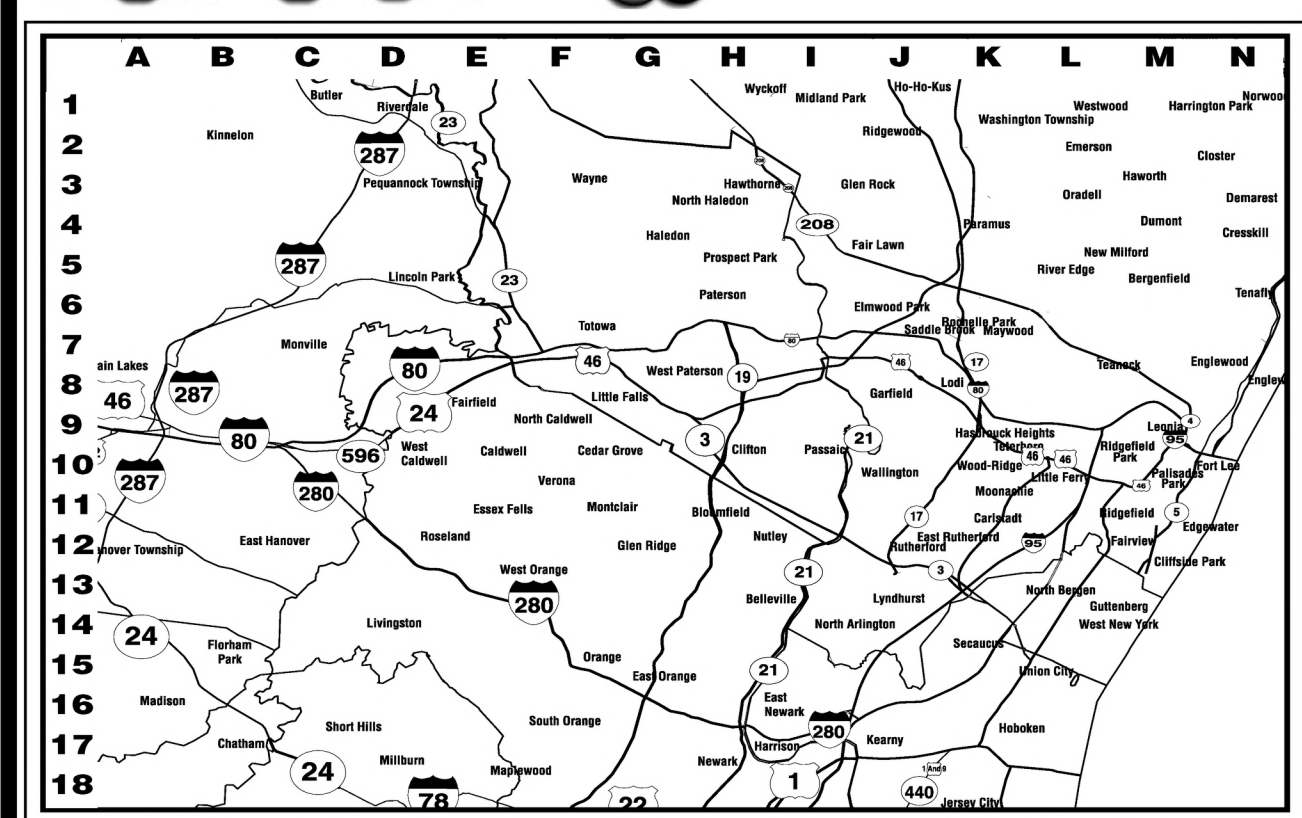

Fugetta 'bout it

Sopranos turned down from filming in Nutley

Martha Stewart may be talking about visiting Nutley soon, but for now, Tony Soprano and his crew will have to stay out.
When it comes to having the popular television series "The Sopranos" come to film in Nutley, the commission said "fugetta 'bout it."
Thomas Pandolfi, Nutley's superintendent of parks and recreation, said representatives of "The Sopranos" contacted him asking for the authority to film in Nutley.
He passed the request on to Commissioner Mauro Tucci, who oversees parks and recreation.
Tucci took the request to the Nutley commissioners, who denied the request.
Mayor Peter Scarpelli said the request was for "somewhere in Kingsland Park."
The problem was that Kingsland Park was under construction.

"They were doing work at the park, we had to say no," Scarpelli said.
"Even though it's a successful TV show, if it interferes with traffic flow, or the neighborhood, people end up getting upset," Scarpelli said of the general problem he has with television shows or movies filming in Nutley.
There was talk that "The Sopranos" also wanted to throw a character through the front of a storefront window at a former deli on Centre Street.
Scarpelli said that any show or movie that wants to film at a location has to get permission from the code enforcement department and a permit from the police department for disrupting traffic.
Steve Mairella, the president of Nutley UNICO, referred questions about his group's stance on "The Sopranos" to the National UNICO office, but offered

his personal opinion.
"My personal view is that there is some merit to the thought that 'The Sopranos' has helped perpetuate a very negative stereotype of Italian Americans. I prefer to dwell on the positive," he said.
Gerard Tolve, a Nutley UNICO member and past president, said, "We have an anti-bias committee that is very much against what 'The Sopranos' are doing."
He mentioned Manny Alfano, who heads the anti-bias group for the Belleville-Bloomfield Chapter of UNICO International. He has led protests of "The Sopranos" filming in Belleville and elsewhere.
County officials have banned "The Sopranos" from filming in county parks and county properties.
For now, "The Sopranos" attempts to use Nutley as a location have been snuffed out.

Despite recent rankings new state danger list does not include local schools

The Belleville school district may have received some unfavorable rankings this year — first from New Jersey Monthly, then from the state's county-wide school violence report, but there's a new list you won't find it on.

New Jersey, heeding a new federal mandate, identified seven schools last Thursday that are so unsafe all of their students have the right to transfer out this fall.

All but one of the seven schools are in southern New Jersey, including three in Camden. None is in the state's largest urban districts: Newark, Jersey City, and Paterson.

New Jersey is required to begin publicly labeling

schools that are "persistently dangerous" under the sweeping No Child Left Behind federal education law. All schools on the list must send letters informing parents of their right to transfer their children to other public schools in the district.

But each state sets its own definition of "persistently dangerous," and New Jersey relies on the districts themselves to report the numbers of violent incidents in their schools.

One superintendent who has a school on the list said his district is getting punished for being forthright about the violence in its schools.

Larry Miller, superintendent of rural Millville in Cumberland County, said

his district is appealing to the state to remove the "persistently dangerous" label from Lakeside Middle School.

"Millville has tried to be as accurate as possible in order to demonstrate to parents and students we're not going to tolerate inappropriate behavior," Miller said. "That has hurt districts like Millville who want to be honest enough to report those instances as they occur."

He added that the district made mistakes in categorizing some violent incidents in its state reports, such as listing a fight as an assault on a student.

Lakeside Middle School had six aggravated assaults on students and four student assaults on staff in the

three years ending in summer 2002, the period used in determining dangerous schools. It also had 10 sex offenses in that time, according to state data.

State officials said they are concerned that districts may be tempted to fudge the number of serious incidents that they report to avoid the stigma of the "persistently dangerous" label and the possible disruption if large numbers of students suddenly demand transfers.

"That was our concern from the beginning," said Susan Martz, director of the office of program support services for the education department. "Unfortunately, if we want to continue to get

our half-a-billion in federal funds, we had no choice" but to meet the federal requirement on labeling schools as dangerous.

Martz and other school officials said they are confident that schools are reporting incidents accurately. However, they said the state will begin monitoring districts to ensure this.

Isaac Bryant, an assistant state superintendent, said schools may be able to get off the list after one year if they can show they have taken steps to stem student violence and if the number of incidents goes down.

State officials said their goal is to help schools address whatever discipline or

safety problems they have so that transfers of students are unnecessary.

In fact, any mass transfers in New Jersey are unlikely. Squeezed by growing enrollments, most schools in the state lack room to accommodate a large influx of new students.

The seven schools identified as persistently dangerous are, in addition to the Millville school: Simmons Elementary School in Clayton; Atlantic City High School in Atlantic City; Patrick Healy Middle School in East Orange; and Bonsall Family School, East Camden Middle School, and Camden High School in Camden.
