Home field disadvantage

In the batting cage a few players line up to practice their catching skills.

They won't dare step out on the field that has been unplayable for over a year now. And even though in the backs of their minds they hope that when the sun melts the last remnants of frost that they will be able to walk onto their home field for the season opener they say that vision is only a dream.

What's real is something that players on the Belleville High School varsity team say they have become accustomed to. Unplayable fields. Broken promises. Endless rows of buses and foreign fields in towns they have never heard of.

The site at the stadium is heartbreaking for the seniors on the Belleville varsity baseball team because they know that there is a good possibility they won't play another home game before they graduate next spring. Last Tuesday at the Belleville Town Council meeting their suspicions were all but confirmed when they heard for themselves another promise that the council would try to finish construction on the field in time for the spring season. But they heard that same promise last year.

Despite more than \$2.2 million in renovations to the stadium's football field and elsewhere, the baseball fields are in such bad condi-

tion that many players say that the diamond looks almost as bad as when the town council vowed to renovate the field years ago. After months of hearing about surcharging the entire complex to create a level surface for playing fields it is all but impossible to see the outfield from home plate. What's worse the entire field resembles a ratty quilt. In addition to uneven and mismatched patches of grass, gaping holes threaten to catch cleats and injure players. The town has spent more than \$4 million over the past four years in reno-

vations to the entire municipal stadium. To date the only portion of the stadium that has been satisfactorily completed is the football field.

"We are in a real catch 22 situation," said Mayor Gerald Digori at the Sept. 9 council meeting. "We are not satisfied with the fields and we are not accepting those fields, but as a result the kids have no fields to play on."

At a special meeting of the town council on Aug. 25, several members voiced their dissatisfaction with the work done by the con-

tractor, Marsellis-Warner Corp., and discussed potential plans for salvaging the work done on the field. So when the council announced it would make a determination about additional work on the field at the meeting last Tuesday, dozens of parents, coaches and players crowded into council chambers poised to hear the painful words. The council members passed an agenda to spend another \$165,000 on the field and promised that they would do their best to get the field ready for the spring. But the group has

Isabel hits home

With a major hurricane, Isabel, moving toward the East Coast, Belleville officials wanted residents to review their family disaster plans and begin making preparations for any of the hurricane's effects.

Police Capt. Leonard Burrell said part of a family's disaster plan that residents still have time to complete is to know the risks for a family's area and minimizing the effects as best as possible.

"In emergency management, we have two sayings that bare repeating. The first one is, 'Better to have and not need, than need and not have.' The second one is, 'Prepare for the worst and hope for the best.' We do not know how the hurricane will affect Belleville, but now is the time to prepare," Burrell said.

"Do you live in a flood-prone area? Did your area flood during Tropical Storm Floyd?" he asked. "Moving your vehicle to a higher

ground would be wise before the hurricane hits."

Securing patio and deck furniture, securing or putting away hanging plants or flower baskets, summer ornaments and other outside items like flags will minimize damage, not only to these items but also to a resident's home, Burrell said.

Prepare a family disaster kit. Make sure residents have needed prescription medicines, at least a one-week supply. This is especially important for the elderly, Burrell said.

For babies, make sure there is enough formula, diapers, and baby food. Other essentials include a three-day supply of water, figuring one gallon, per person, per day. Battery-powered flashlights with extra batteries, a first aid kit and any special items that might be needed for a sick or disabled person are all necessary, he said.

Having enough non-perishable food items and a bat-

Games may go later to revitalize attendance

The majority of Belleville's student athletes play before sparse crowds in the mid-afternoon, since many parents cannot get away from work or other obligations in time to watch their sons or daughters compete.

Now, school officials are looking to help change that.

School Board Vice President Dawson Bloom chairs the board's athletic committee.

"We want to reschedule games or meets later in the evening when its possible

parents will get to see their kids," Bloom said.

He said the early games are part of a larger problem of students "lacking parental involvement today."

Bloom said the changes would take time to implement on a wide basis. "We'll take it on a sport-by-sport basis," he said.

For now, some varsity football games are being switched to Friday nights.

Superintendent of Schools Dr. Joseph Ciccone said the changes would go far beyond just one sport.

"We want more evening

matches, not just in football, but in all sports," he said.

Bloom said when he was a student, "My parents were at every event. I want today's kids to have that chance."

Board President Alfonse DeMeo said, "I didn't have the luxury of my parents at many of my events." He said he wants to see more student-athletes have their parents present at games.

He thanked Athletic Director Karen Fucella for moving the football games to nighttime.

Ciccone said, "Last year

we had no lights (for the football field), and we weren't sure they'd be operational in time this year."

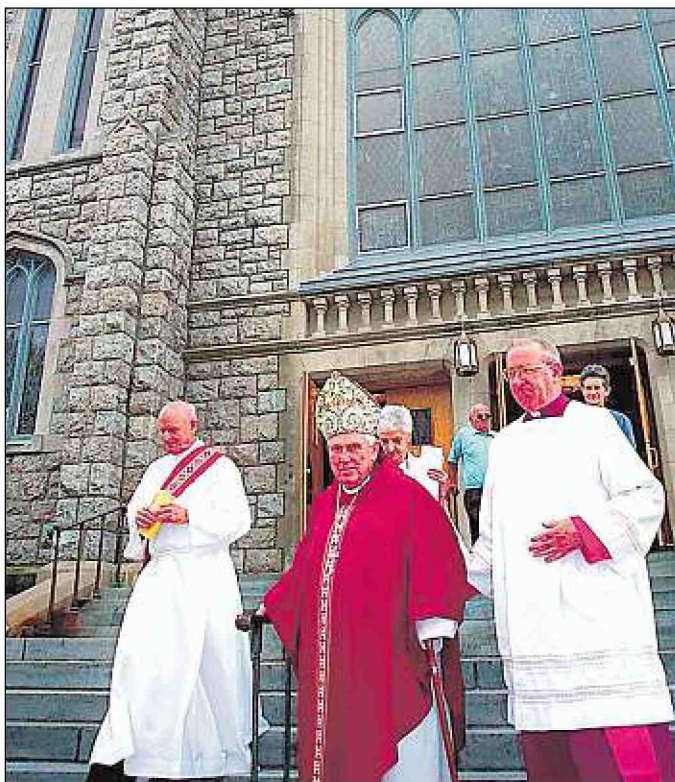
Since they are, games that were set for the early afternoon on Saturday are being moved to Friday nights.

Ciccone said attendance for homes games in general, especially for football, are down throughout the area.

"Kearny has done away with football," he said. "It's not like years ago when everybody went to games. Now you have the mall and

Authorities warn of latest phone scam

A phone fraud that officials say is sweeping the nation and parts of Canada hit Belleville this weekend when a resident received a phony call pretending to be a notification that the woman had won a cash prize in the amount of \$500,000.

Police Sgt. Anthony Raffaeli said that a female Belleville resident, whose

name has been retained during the investigation, received a call from a male caller who informed her that she had won the grand prize in a sweepstakes drawing. The caller asked her to send a check in the amount of \$2,100 to secure her winnings. The victim said that she wanted to think about accepting the prize and hung up the phone. Approximately five minutes

later a second female caller phoned the victim, again saying that she had won the \$500,000. The victim terminated the call and contacted the police.

The questionable phone call is one that bears similarities to a string of cases in which a group of telemarketers placed numerous phone calls across the coun-

Council narrowly misses unlawful passage

The Belleville town council narrowly missed passing an ordinance unlawfully at their meeting Tuesday that many area residents fear could change the face of zoning in the township.

Council members had just finished their unanimous vote in favor of the ordinance, allowing landowners to build on nonconforming 25 by 100-foot lots, when

resident Vinnie Frantantoni pointed out that the council had failed to follow proper government procedures in passing the ordinance.

"You already held a public hearing and I think that I heard you just pass the ordinance but you were supposed to send it to the planning board first," said Frantantoni, citing text from the municipal land use law. "I respectfully told you that

this will affect anyone with a lot less than 40 by 100-feet but you are still trying to pass an ordinance that the planning board really should have looked at first. When are you going to follow the law?"

The ordinance would "establish special regulations for new one-family dwellings to be constructed on existing, isolated, nonconforming

Anxieties raised over No Child Left Behind test standards

With President George W. Bush's "No Child Left Behind" (NCLB) initiative still dominating public school policies, Belleville is making changes based solely on the president's plan.

All of the district's curriculum guides must be updated every five years and with the new testing requirements coming from NCLB, especially for elementary students, Belleville decided to be "proactive," according to Superintendent of Schools Dr. Joseph Ciccone.

"We want to maximize the scores for standardized tests, and these guides give us that chance," Ciccone said.

By 2006, standardized tests are supposed to be given in grades three through eight, along with the grade 11 High School Proficiency Assessment (HSPA).

"We're not unique. All of the districts are getting in line with the No Child Left Behind act," Ciccone said.

He said that NCLB "has increased test anxiety for teachers, staff and students."

Schools are supposed to be at 100 percent proficiency by 2012. The latest test is the New Jersey ASK (assessment skills knowledge) for fourth graders. There is a field test for third graders that doesn't count, Ciccone said.

Belleville is considered a Category 1 school, or a school in need of improvement, because of the way the testing is broken into subgroups. The subgroups are English as Second Language (ESL), classified or special education students, Hispanic, African American and poverty, those students who get a free or reduced lunch.

In math and language arts, the ESL and classified students fell below the minimum scores, causing the district to be labeled as Category 1, Ciccone said.

"The rating is based on a subgroup," he said. "It's unfair to the kids. I don't mind having the regular population tested, but we have a high number of ESL and classified kids and we're penalized for it."

The district has more than 800 classified students and a growing population of ESL students. At the high school, another ESL teacher has been hired to handled the increase, Ciccone said.

The curriculum guide is being put on disc and will

eventually be available on the district's website. "We want people to be able to look at them," Ciccone said.

At the Sept. 8 school board meeting, two school board members complimented the curriculum guide, put together by Joseph Kraemer, director of curriculum and instruction.

Board member Arlene Schor is a member of the curriculum committee.

"I had an opportunity to review the curriculum guide. It's exceptionally well-detailed, especially in technology," Schor said. "When the monitors come to review it, they will be impressed."

Board member John Notari is the chairman of the curriculum committee. He mentioned several areas that he said were especially well done, including math analysis, auto technology, modern history and culinary arts.

"They're all in accordance with core curriculum standards," he said.

Notari was particularly pleased to see culinary arts in the guide. "It's popular with kids," he said.

The guide covers all the necessary areas for culinary arts, including workstations for food service, Notari said.

"There are some wonderful culinary schools out there," he said.

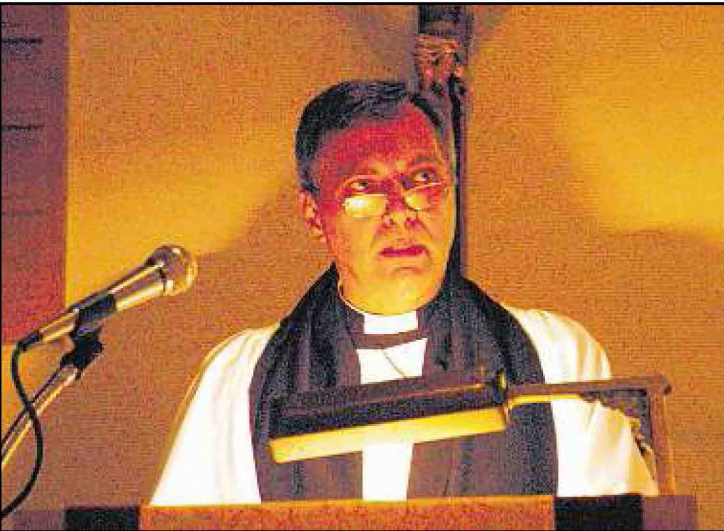

other things to do. Nationwide, attendance is down. Sometimes winning helps, but only so much."

Other matches will be moved to nighttime throughout the season - when possible.

"In some cases, it's just impossible. We only have one gym. Most schools have two," Ciccone said.

The games will be moved on a limited basis in the hope of drawing more people.

With night games comes security considerations.

"We will have police for security at night, just as we have in the afternoon," Ciccone said.

As for the potential for bad behavior, Ciccone said, "Fans emulate what they see on t.v." An example is international soccer games, he said.

"If there is a problem, we'll go back to afternoons," Ciccone said.

Group claims New Jersey air the most polluted in the country

There are countless jokes and zany rumors. But the New Jersey Public Interest Research Group (NJPIRG) claims it's official: The Garden State has the worst air in the country.

Using data that the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has gained from 2002 studies, New Jersey was deemed to have the largest smog pollution and the highest amount of toxic chemicals in its air.

The EPA currently has 15 ozone-monitoring stations in the state of New Jersey. The ozone-monitoring stations examine the air of a certain area in an

eight hour time-period to determine whether the composition of the air exceeds the national health standard. Last year, New Jersey recorded 291 "exceedences" of the EPA's standard, a figure up 53 percent from the year earlier.

"Since air cannot be contained, any person who lives in one of the 21 New Jersey counties is susceptible to the air," said Lauren DellaCava, an environmental associate of the NJPIRG, which is a public advocacy group that stresses clean air, clean water and reusable energy.

Essex County ranked at the bottom of exceedences,

recording only 10 instances. The most frequent violators were Middlesex (29) and Camden (37) counties. There was no data for individual towns.

Smog can only be created when the chemicals in the air mix with heat.

"The summer is always worse," said DellaCava. "It's not that chemicals aren't in the air during the winter, it's just that it doesn't have the heat to be created."

According to the NJPIRG, the three main sources of smog are in-state industrialization, out-of-state industrialization (namely Pennsylvania factories across the Delaware

River) and automobile sources. Cars and trucks are the main causes of smog, registering 40 percent.

"Cleaning up these problems is the responsibility of the EPA and President Bush," said DellaCava. "The Clean Air Act has been rolled back and the Clean Cars Act is stuck in legislature."

According to DellaCava, the revamping of the Clean Air Act three weeks ago by the government will allow factory pollution to be less regulated, and that the Clean Car Act, which is stuck in the Senate Budget Committee and Assembly Appropriations Committee,

can Lung Association, Essex County has the highest rate of pediatric asthma. Trailing Bergen County in each category, Essex County ranks second in the areas of adult asthma, chronic bronchitis and emphysema. Dangerous air has never been proven to cause these conditions, but it is documented that it aggravates them.

There is a 20-percent increase in asthma-related emergency visits on "ozone-alert" days. New Jersey residents with breathing problems should look to say indoors on ozone-alert days, said DellaCava.

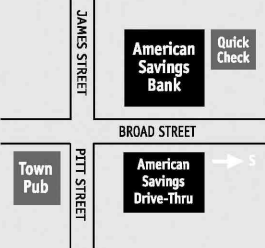

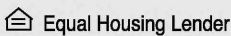

25 by 100-foot lots in residential districts.” During the public hearing at the August council meeting, several residents came forward to voice their concerns that the ordinance, which Councilman Michael Melham said would only affect a few lots, would have adverse affects on the outcomes of zoning variances for similar lots.

Several council members tabled the ordinance at the August meeting in lieu of a request to determine just how many lots would conform to the regulations put forth by the ordinance. In the manager’s report it was stated that there are 228 lots in Belleville that are measured at 25 by 100 feet but

that only a few meet the stringent regulations put forth in the ordinance.

Concerned residents, however, told the board that although only a few lots conform to the regulations set forth by the ordinance, the statute would increase the likelihood that landowners could obtain a variance from the existing 40 by 100-foot minimum. Reverend Charles Hood of the Little Zion Lutheran Church, who voiced his concerns at the last meeting, again told the council that he was concerned the ordinance would lend validity to a variance request by a neighboring landowner to build on a 23 by 96-foot lot. Hood and several members of the parish have attended several zoning board meetings to oppose a request by the

neighboring landowner to build. Opponents of the plan said that a fire several years ago that destroyed the previous structure on the neighboring lot caused damage to the church and that future building would again pose a safety hazard.

“I am here again and I am a little confused if our lot will be affected,” Hood said. “I am not sure if your passage will affect our case. I know that the lot in question is a little bit less than 25 by 100 feet, but I am concerned that if they do get a variance that building on that lot will pose a definite safety concern for our church.”

But Councilman Michael Melham continued to assert that the new ordinance would not affect the decision of the church’s case, nor

would it affect the outcome of any zoning variance cases to go before the board.

“Right now the landowner is already short,” Melham said, referring to the failure of the applicant to produce ample land to build on. “There is a letter being sent to the zoning board that this is not changing the size of a lot for a single-family home and that you can not get a variance based on this ordinance. I did a lot of homework and saw a lot of what the manager reported. I spoke to the Reverend and the Code Enforcement official and the applicant can not use this ordinance to obtain a variance.”

Melham’s response, however, did not dispel the concerns of residents. Frantantoni pointed out that while

the ordinance could not be used to grant approval to zoning variances that it would not prevent applicants from using the ordinance as an example of previous allowances by the township to build on small lots.

“With this ordinance you would be laughed right out of the court if you tried to deny anyone from building on a lot that is more than 25 by 100 feet,” Frantantoni said. “If you have an appli-

cant that comes before the board with an application for a lot that is 30 by 100 feet or 35 by 100 feet how could you tell them they can’t build on it?”

At the conclusion of the meeting council voted to rescind their vote to pass the ordinance and voted to send the ordinance to the planning board for review. The item remains on the table and will come back before the board again at next month’s meeting.

heard those promises before. “I am scared to death of what I have heard tonight because it is the same thing that I have heard for the last four, five and six years,” said varsity baseball coach Alan Frank at the meeting. “I never want to be responsible for telling a kid that they can’t play on a field, but I am scared because I know that we aren’t going to have a field in March.”

A heated Councilman William Escott responded, “We just passed a \$165,000 bond tonight so if you think for one minute that any of us wants to sit up here and tell a kid they can’t play baseball you’re nuts. I know how important it is to have home games. You people come in here and want something yesterday but this is how government works. You have to get the money and then you have to get estimates and then you can do the work. But these things take time.”

But although the council voted favorably to move the bond to finish the stadium, Councilman Louis Pallante brought up several important questions that he said could delay the completion of the field even further.

“If we have not accepted the work already done on the field then how can we do more work?” Pallante asked. “Are we then going to accept the fields? And if we do not accept those fields then how

can we go on with a bond ordinance?”

No matter how field is eventually completed for the seniors on the varsity baseball team one home game would be nothing short of a miracle. And so a team that has been light-heartedly dubbed the road warriors is gearing up for another season on the road.

“This is just something that shouldn’t be,” said JoAnn DeVito, co-president of the Belleville Baseball Association. “It is important for all athletes to have adequate facilities to build morale and team spirit and to be able to have a game on their home field.”

DeVito, whose son is a senior varsity player, said that it isn’t just the lack of a home field that is hard on the team. She says that the constant travelling leaves her son tired when he gets home from practices at games close to eight p.m. each night. What’s more DeVito says being without a field makes it hard for parents and other students to attend games to support the team.

Belleville Health delivers advice for Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

The Belleville Health Department would like to take the opportunity to educate the public regarding ovarian cancer.

About one in every 57 women in the United States will develop ovarian cancer. Most cases occur in women over the age of 50, but this disease can also affect younger women.

The exact causes of ovarian cancer are not known. However, studies show that the following risk factors may increase the chance of developing this disease:

Risk Factors

- Family history - First-degree relatives (mother, daughter, sister) of a woman who has had ovarian cancer are at increased risk of developing this type of cancer themselves. The likelihood is especially high if two or more first-degree relatives have had the disease. The risk is somewhat less, but still above average, if other relatives (grandmother, aunt, cousin) have had ovarian cancer. A family history of breast or colon cancer is also associated with an increased of developing ovarian cancer.
- Age - The likelihood of developing ovarian cancer increases, as a woman gets older. Most ovarian cancers occur in women over the age of 50, with the highest risk in women over 60.
- Childbearing - Women who have had children are more likely to develop ovarian cancer than women who have had children. In fact, the more children a woman has had, the less likely she is to develop ovarian cancer.
- Personal history - Women who have had breast or colon cancer may have a greater chance of developing ovarian cancer than women who have not had breast or colon cancer.
- Fertility Drugs that cause to ovulate may slightly increase a woman's chance of developing ovarian cancer. Researchers are studying the possible association.
- Talc - Some studies suggest that women who have used talc in the genital area for many years may be at increased risk of developing ovarian cancer.
- Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT) - Some evidence suggest that women who use HRT after menopause may have a slightly increased risk of developing ovarian cancer.

As we learn more about what causes ovarian cancer, we may also learn how to reduce the chance of getting this disease. Some studies have shown that breast-feeding and taking birth control pills (oral contraceptives) may decrease a woman's likelihood of developing ovarian cancer. These factors decrease the number of times a woman ovulates, and studies suggest that reducing the number of ovulations during a woman's lifetime may lower the risk of ovarian cancer.

Women who have had a tubal ligation or have had a hysterectomy also have a lower risk of developing ovarian cancer. In addition, some evidence suggests that reducing the amount of fat in the diet may lower the risk of developing ovarian cancer.

Women who are high risk for ovarian cancer due to family history of the disease may consider having their ovaries removed before cancer develops. This procedure usually, but not always, protects women from developing ovarian cancer. The risks associated with this surgery and its side effects should be carefully considered. A woman should discuss the possible benefits and risks with her doctor based on her unique situation.

Having one or more of the risk factors mentioned here does not mean that a woman is sure to develop ovarian cancer, but the chance may be higher than average. Women who are concerned about ovarian cancer may want to talk with a doctor who specializes in treating women with cancer: a gynecologist, or a gynecologic oncologist. The doctor may be able to suggest ways to reduce the likelihood of developing ovarian cancer and can plan an appropriate schedule for checkups.

The sooner ovarian cancer is found and treated, the better a woman's chance for recovery. But ovarian cancer is hard to detect early. Many times, women with ovarian cancer have no symptoms or just mild symptoms until the disease is in an advanced stage.

Ovarian cancer often shows no obvious signs or symptoms until late in its development.

Signs and symptoms of ovarian cancer may include:

- General abdominal discomfort and/or pain (gas, indigestion, pressure, swelling, bloating, cramps)
- Nausea, diarrhea, constipation, or frequent urination
- Loss of appetite
- Feeling of fullness even after a light meal
- Weight gain or loss with no known reason
- Abnormal bleeding from the vagina

These symptoms may be caused by ovarian cancer or by other, less serious conditions. It is important to check with a doctor about any of these symptoms.

To help find the cause of symptoms, a doctor evaluates a woman's medical history. The doctor also performs a physical exam and orders diagnostic tests.

Cervasio’s manuscript is a trip back home

Joe Cervasio’s many attributes include his spirituality, love of family and friends, and deep affection for growing up in Belleville.

Cervasio has been able to put those characteristics into a manuscript that he hopes one day will be published. He has entitled his work “Bad News on the Doorstep”, a look back at growing up beginning in the late 50s and concluding in what I always felt was a classic year, 1971.

Anyone from the age of 35 on up, who spent any of their youth in Belleville or Nutley, will really enjoy this manuscript. The references to Biase’s Restaurant, Bloomfield Avenue, the 1958 Mud Bowl, St. Francis Church and the great Barringer-East Orange football rivalry made me feel like I was a little kid

again.

There were a number of great lines in the book, and some wonderful sports analogies. One paragraph that I particularly enjoyed read like this. “The valet parking attendants at Biase’s Restaurant on Bloomfield Avenue were busy that night. Situated across from City Stadium, and a short walk from Saint Francis’ Church, the Italian-

American eatery would barely be able to hold the 300 plus alumni and family who would be celebrating the legendary Thanksgiving Day classic football game between Barringer and East Orange.”

“Rocky proudly turned the car keys over to one of the teenagers parking vehicles that night. It was a 1968 Malibu that Frank had purchased on the West Coast and had given to his dad after Marietta died late last year. It was the newest car Rocky ever had, so he had insisted on driving his family that night.”

Joe tells a wonderful story of the ‘58 Mud Bowl between Belleville and Nutley, a game that Nutley won, 13-0 in a swirling snow storm at the Oval in early December.

He talks of his dear friend, Rich Luzzi, the greatest player in the history of Belleville High School football, and the only person to have his number retired by the school. References are also made to another good friend, Lenny Luongo.

Cervasio also remembers the High School Game of the Week that used to appear on WPIX and was hosted by the legendary Marty Glickman. He also remembers ‘family idols’ like Frank Sinatra, Perry Como, Johnny Ray, Eddie Fisher, Frankie Lane, Louie Prima, Rosemary Clooney and Peggy Lee.

The manuscript has a definite theme, one of hard working people settling in Belleville and Nutley, working hard, and reaping the benefits of that effort. It’s a story of family and commitment.

A graduate of Belleville High School and later Cornell University, Joe Cervasio has done a marvelous job in putting together this manuscript. It’s a must read, and, hopefully, it will be published.

For sure, if you get a chance to read it one day, you’ll never want to be put it down.

As someone who also enjoyed growing up in Belleville, my story would probably begin where Cervasio’s ended, in 1971. That was the first year I played Little League baseball at Marotti Field.

Over the next 32 years, there are plenty of great memories, but that time specifically between ‘71 and ‘77, between grade school, high school and the beginning of college, could fill a book.

I started writing for the Belleville Times in 1975 (and

started covering all the varsity sports in ‘78) and have covered some fantastic athletic events at Belleville, including football games at the Meadowlands.

Jennifer Apicella’s pursuit of 3,000 points, Frank Fazzini’s phenomenal 1980 football campaign, and even better the ‘81 baseball season, the softball team’s state sectional championships in 1987 and 2001, Mike Fortino, and Abdel Anderson, The ‘75, the ‘76 baseball team, “Z”, the GNT title in ‘81, state wrestling champs Anthony Conte, Junior Nardone, Armando Nardone, Chris Musmanno and John Perna, the ‘91 and ‘92 boys soccer teams, the outstanding cross country teams from ‘98 through the present, and so much more.

Hey, maybe I’ll write that story one day. Having read Cervasio’s work, I can only hope to put forth the same amount of energy and passion that he has.

Holy Family festival returns for 12th year

A tradition continues in Nutley and Belleville next week, when Holy Family Church of Nutley-Belleville will hold its 12th annual Italian Festival in honor of Maria Santissima Addolorata.

The festival, which features a variety of foods and rides for children of all ages, kicks of Thursday, Sept. 25, from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. and continues Friday, Sept. 26 from 6 p.m. to 11 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 27, from 4 p.m. to 11 p.m. and Sunday, from noon to 9 p.m.

The parish festival incorporates about 400 volunteers over four days, according to Msgr. Peter Zaccardo of Holy Family.

"You really can't do it without the volunteers. They're the ones who put in all the hours," he said.

He said people really want to come for the good, homemade food, including sausage and peppers, steak sandwiches, pizza and French fries.

Of the festival, Zaccardo said "it's like four days of former parishioners returning, and neighbors and family gathering."

There are wheels of chance and an Italian café where those in attendance can get a cappuccino, and espresso, or desserts like zeppoles, and a calzone, Zaccardo said. You can also walk and listen to the Italian music.

The whole parking lot is full, and during the busy times "you can barely walk," he said.

There is a 50/50 on Sunday at 9 p.m., which helps the parish budget.

Proceeds from the 50/50 will go toward renovation of the parish center.

The story of Maria Santissima Addolorata goes back to March 22, 1888, in the little town of Castelpetroso in the province of Isernia, Italy. Two peasant woman saw a vision of the Mother of Sorrows.

Ever since this historic vision took place, Zaccardo said, pilgrims have journeyed to the site, on which today stands a beautiful Gothic shrine in the honor of the Mother of Sorrows, Maria Santissima Addolorata.

In 1984, the Societa Orlandi Castellani was founded to foster devotion to the Mother of Sorrows. This group is the impetus behind the Italian Festival.

The culmination of the festival is the Mass and Procession in honor of Maria Santissima Addolorata, on Sunday, Sept. 28 at 2 p.m. in Holy Family Church. Bishop Dominic A. Marconi will be the principal celebrant. Concelebrants will include the priests of Holy Family as well as visiting clergy.

Following the Mass, the statue will be carried in procession through the streets, accompanied by a marching band, in a style reminiscent of small town processions in Italy.

The route is: from the front doors of Holy Family on to Rev. Roberts Place; right onto Harrison Street where the procession will stop for a fireworks display at Booth Park; a right onto Franklin Avenue; a right onto Centre Street; a right onto Passaic Avenue; a right onto Harrison Street; a right onto Rev. Roberts Place then back to the church. The sections of street will be closed to traffic during the brief duration of the march.

There will be a Mass in Italian to the Mother of Sorrows on Thursday and Friday, Sept. 25 and 26, at 7 p.m. in the church.

There will be lots of Italian food, Filipino food, games, rides and music nightly.

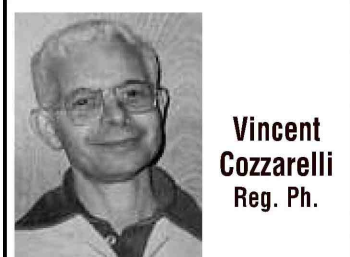
