The Mental Health Players are a Verona-based troupe that educates the public about mental illness and the importance of getting help for those in need. "The purpose of this program is to not back away but to go towards someone," said Sharon Curran, the players' community education coordinator. "When we turn our backs on obvious problems, the person will spiral down without help."

At a point during performances, Curran facilitates an interaction between the characters and the audience to assess how they would react to the situation.

Mental illnesses, the group teaches, are just like any other ailment. They are medical in nature and may lead to serious consequences if not treated. In addition to raising awareness and erasing stigmas for community groups and schools, the group also gives "hands-on" advice about how to

enforcement or social services.

The Mental Health Association of New Jersey started the Mental Health Players program 26 years ago. The group covers a wide range of topics, including mood disorders, anxiety disorders, schizophrenia, dementia, Alzheimer's disease, eating disorders, and attention deficit hyperactivity disorder. The topic is up to the organization requesting the presentation.

Curran's group primarily works in Bergen, Essex, Passaic and Hudson counties. Since she started directing the program, the Montclair resident has required more training for the volunteers, who normally do not have prior acting experience. She now provides a comprehensive overview of mental illness symptoms and how to depict them, and teaches such theater techniques as pantomime and how to present in the round.

After initial training, the volunteers are provided a schedule with topics. She coordinates who can perform where. Rehearsals are usually held at the site within an hour of the actual performance. Once the actors learn how to depict the symptoms, the scenes are basically improvised from there.
