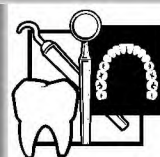

2 House blaze causes firefighter injury

A house fire broke out on Dewitt Avenue last week injuring one firefighter and displacing five inhabitants.

The residents of the one-family home were on the first floor eating dinner around 6 p.m. on Tuesday, May 17, when one of the family members went outside to get something out of his vehicle, looked up and saw smoke coming from the second floor.

He immediately ran into the house to inform other residents and dialed 911 from his cell phone. One of the residents attempted to go upstairs to put out the fire with

his fire extinguisher around the closet area, but he was unsuccessful.

"The smoke of flame overcame him," said Investigator Frank Papaanni, who is handling the case.

Instead the family notified the fire department, which arrived to the three-story building at 48 Dewitt Ave., and put out the fire about 45 minutes later. While firefighters were attempting to conduct a primary search of the house, a ladder fell on one of the firefighters, injuring him. He was treated at Clara Maass Medical Center and released.

The four adults and one teenager were relocated due to the fire and went to live with their relatives

for a few days until the insurance company evaluates the damages. The house was deemed dilapidated.

So far the fire was deemed accidental. According to Papaanni, the fire started in the closet, where some combustibles were too close to the light fixture. Over the course of time they heated and melted, and since the closet doors were closed, they held the heat in and started to ignite. The case is still under investigation.

"The heat from the light alone can cause a fire, which people should be aware of," said Papaanni.

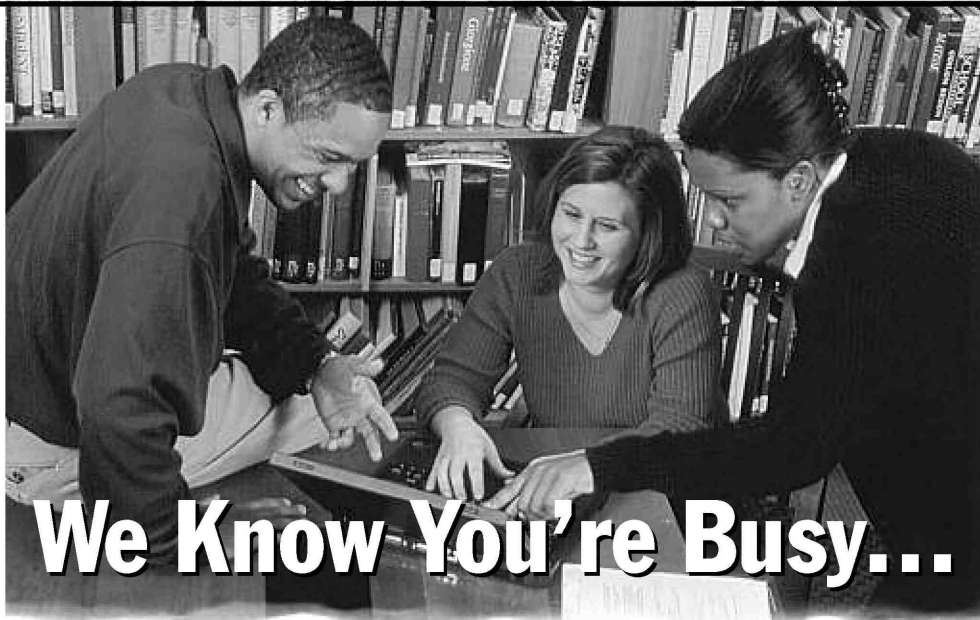

Mobster 'shooting' at local funeral home

The cast of the HBO flagship show, "The Sopranos" paid a visit to Belleville once again while filming a scene at Cozzarelli Funeral Home, May 17.

Despite past protests by local Italian-American organizations who see the show as a propagator of negative Italian-American stereotypes, officials allowed the crew to film a fourth time in Belleville, known for its large Italian-American population.

The show previously filmed in Belleville in the summers of 2002 and 2003 and in the fall of the latter year. The locations included Sac Ana, a consulting services business; Rossmore Pharmacy, owned by Vincent Cozzarelli; and Cozzarelli Funeral Home, owned by James Cozzarelli, Vincent's uncle. The crew also filmed at Vincent's home once.

"We had a positive experience with them and it's good for the community," said Belleville Mayor Gerald Digori. "It's just a TV show, that's all. There'd be nothing on TV if you take all of the stereotypes away."

"The Sopranos," which is the first cable series to be named best drama at the Emmy awards, revolves around a New Jersey crime family. Since the series aims at authenticity, it often films on location in various areas of New Jersey.

At Cozzarelli Funeral Home, the crew filmed part of the first episode in the sixth season, which some say may be the last, though nothing has been formally announced. The scene featured the funeral of Ray Curto (George Loros), a cop whom Tony Soprano (James Gandolfini, the star of the show) thought he had brought to his side.

Unknown to Soprano, Curto wore a wire for the FBI every time he met with him. Because Curto later died of a stroke, Soprano never found out about the deception. The scene, which seemed to take about 15 minutes to act out, took an entire day to film on location.

Nutley Commissioner Mauro Tucci, who is in charge of the Parks & Recreation Department, turned down "The Sopranos" request to film in Nutley a couple of years ago because of the negative portrayal of

Italian-Americans on the show.

"Someone in the Midwest who doesn't know any Italians will think that anyone whose name ends in a vowel is a gangster," said Tucci.

Tucci is also the township manager in Belleville, but since he has to carry out the council's decisions, he doesn't get involved in things beyond municipal matters and personnel, he said.

County Executive Joseph DiVincenzo also banned the show from filming at any Essex County park.

Those involved with the show don't feel it's completely without merit.

"Italians have a black hand. It goes back centuries," said Loros, whose last scene in the sixth season entails lying in a coffin after a lethal stroke. "Every population has its dark side."

But according to Emanuele Alfano, chairman of the Italian American One Voice Coalition, the dark side of his ethnicity is portrayed too much in the media.

According to Alfano, who's a local chiropractor, those who don't mind the show's message do not understand the profound effect it has on the world's perception of Italian-Americans.

"That show is viewed throughout the world, and that's all some know of Italian-Americans. Do we have to enforce the image?" he asked. "Why would you worship people that sell drugs, beat up women and kill?"

Alfano presented a number of articles and studies that show teenagers emulate the characters featured on HBO, available in about a third of the nation's television homes. He added that many Italian-Americans have to prove to out-of-towners that they are not the reprobates portrayed on television and in the movies. He said that Italian-Americans actually have the least amount of real mob involvement when compared to the Chinese, the French and the Russian.

But Steve Shirripa, a jokester who plays Bobby Bacala, husband of Janice Soprano, begged to differ.

"(Sopranos) shows a slice of true life," he said. "If someone thinks that all Italians are mobsters, then they're ignorant."

And with "The Sopranos" cast, life and art seem interchangeable.

Tony Sirico, who plays Paulie "Walnuts" Gualtieri, is a reformed ex-con. The man with the silver streaks at each side of his hair joked about his character, noting how crazy the show is, at one point having him strangle an old woman with his bare hands. He said that's the difference between the character and himself, he doesn't kill people, although he claims to be as tough as Paulie.

But in either case, he is happy enough just to play the bad guy.

"If I had a choice between going to work on the roof and joining the mob, I would go to work on the roof," he said.

But when the cameras were off and the actors had a break, several showed just how thin the line is between their true selves and their characters.

Both Sirico and Joe Gannascoli, better known as "Joe Soup," or "Vito Spatafore," made explicitly lewd comments to this female reporter during and after their interviews.

According to Loros, the men on the show may be stereotypes, but some of the women are the interesting ones, portraying strong character.

Aida Turturro, who plays "Janice Soprano," Tony's sister, is one of them. Her character's a free spirit

who joined the cast after the first season.

"They write very well for the women and make wonderfully full characters," she said.

Lead female actress Edie Falco has won both an Emmy and a Golden Globe for her role as "Carmela Soprano," Tony's wife, whom he cheats on during almost every episode. Fed up, her character finally asked for a divorce.

Turturro said everybody is entitled to his or her opinion, but she disagrees that the show is a negative influence.

"They're not stereotyping, they're telling a story of the Soprano family," she said.

"They all tell stories," counter pointed Alfano. "But it's always the same story. (Creator of the show David) Chase took all the

worst stereotypes and put them together."

Belleville's organization UNICO, which means "one way" in Italian is an ethnic organization that stands for Unity, Neighborhood, Integrity, Community and Opportunity, is also "dead set" against the show. The group protested against "The Sopranos" filming in Belleville, West Orange and other New Jersey towns about half a dozen times. They also protested in front of HBO when

the show was released in 1999.

UNICO chairman Charles Palmisano, in charge of the anti-bias chapter, recalled his relative coming to visit from the West Coast, stepping into his house and saying, "We're at the Sopranos' home."

"They think it's a joke and it's not," said Palmisano. "We have to address that the show's there. It shows a very small percentage of who the Italians are."

Alfano said there are a number of positive role models in Italian culture, such as war heroes (Sgt. John Basilone) and athletes that also tell a story, but are not shown as much on television.

But Michael Imperioli, who plays Christopher Moltisanti, a drug addict who recently killed his girlfriend after he found out she was talking to the FBI, said the public doesn't want to watch positive stories about Italian-Americans who are doctors, lawyers or insurance salesmen. Imperioli's role earned him a Golden Globe nomination this year.

"Unfortunately, this is what the American public wants to see - it's flashy cars, flashy jewelry and flashy homes," said Gannascoli.

But according to Alfano, those who make a great deal of money off the show want to keep it alive.

Sopranos' off screen characters no better

There are a number of people who are upset at "The Sopranos" for the way it portrays Italian-Americans onscreen, but what we find more unsettling is the behavior off screen of those involved.

Usually when a show comes into the area to tape, they act like welcomed guests in a community. A perfect example is when "Law and Order: Special Victims Unit" taped at the Nutley Oval last year. The show's publicist made sure local press was on hand to bring the story to the community, thus solidifying the show's relationship with residents and maybe even drawing in a few more regular viewers. The stars were gracious, thankful for their celebrity status and trotted back to give interviews or sign autographs between takes.

Conversely, publicist for "The Sopranos" disallowed local press from entering the Cozzarelli Funeral Home, where the show filmed last week. That wouldn't be a problem, but they willfully let reporters from The Star Ledger and Entertainment Weekly onto the set. The reason given was that they've known those reporters for over 20 years. That's pretty incredible for a show only entering its sixth season.

And anyone who read the Ledger's subsequent piece on "The Sopranos" last week can see why they're allowed full access. The whole story was just a prolonged smooch on the show's pasta-gorged posterior — the usual fluff fare daily reporters often accuse weeklies of delivering. The piece didn't seem to feature one tough question, just the producers and stars expounding on how great it is to make "The Sopranos." I smell another Pulitzer coming their way.

So, "The Sopranos" have taken a cue from the White House: "As long as you write what we want, you're welcome aboard."

But also it portrays an elitist attitude by the publicist and producers. They keep talking about "telling a story," or representing "a slice of life" in New Jersey, yet they snub the reporters closest to the people they claim to portray.

Our reporter Anna Spiwak and photographer John Montalvo were told they could remain on the sidewalk, which is their right by law, so thanks for nothing.

The Belleville cops, who spend most days capturing real criminals, and thus didn't see the need to heed a bunch of fakes, let Spiwak in.

There she found the stars uninhibited by tough questions about the show's perceived racial stereotyping, which is an important issue to many Italian-Americans in this area.

Everyone on the set told Spiwak in very hushed tones that she should not speak to the show's star, James Gandolfini. Apparently he doesn't "do" interviews. Even the Ledger's performing monkey piece lacked quotes from him.

Relax, James, the day will come when no one gives a toss what you have to say. Celebrity is fleeting, so you'd better lay whatever words of wisdom you have on the world before you're banished to signing autographs on the convention circuit like Scotty from Star Trek. If you didn't want attention, acting was probably a bad career choice. Try community journalism for true anonymity.

Gandolfini made good on his press-perturbed aura when he asked our photographer if he didn't have something better to do than shoot photos of him. The man spends the whole day in front of a lens, and all of a sudden he's camera shy?

But the truest example of how untouchable these yobs think they are occurred during and after Spiwak's interviews with actors Tony Sirico and Joe Gannascoli, who made explicitly lewd comments to her face and about her within earshot.

It seems these guys need to be reminded that when the camera is off, they need to drop the act. Such things are allowed on television because they help us distinguish the character's worse traits as we move through the story. However, in real life, it's called a lack of professionalism and, frankly, juvenile.

So let's hope that the next time "The Sopranos" come to Belleville, they've gotten over themselves a bit. You can't claim to represent Jersey and at the same time act like you're too good for it.

Alfano noted that if the African-American population was misrepresented, Jesse Jackson would get on it, or the Anti-Defamation League would speak up about Jew-

ish misrepresentation. He said no one speaks up about the poor representation of Italians.

Alfano said he has spoken to the writers of the show, and they said they would look into establishing some positive Italian characters in the future.

A history of Memorial Day

The painful events of the past few years have increased the awareness and observance of the Memorial Day holiday. From the destruction of the World Trade Center to the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq, more people are spending more time reflecting on these events and on their own lives.

May 30, Memorial Day, is a day of remembrance of all the deceased, especially members of the military, police officers and firefighters who sacrificed their lives in the line of duty. Originally however, Memorial Day was known as Decoration Day, first celebrated on June 9, 1865 to honor the Civil War dead.

On June 9, 1864, the city of Petersburg, Va. was attacked by a large Union Army force. The southern section of the city was defended by 100 Confederate militiamen, mostly old men and boys. Nonetheless, the group, equipped with muskets left over from the war of 1812 and one cannon, managed to hold off the Union force of 1,300 calvary for over two hours. The militia was eventually overrun at this position and most of the men and boys were killed or captured. But the two-hour delay that they had caused allowed the rest of the city

to be reinforced and saved from the Union Army.

On the first anniversary of the battle, with flags and flowers, the women of Petersburg decorated the graves of not only their own men and boys but also the graves of the Union soldiers. On May 6, 1866, the Ladies Memorial Association was formed in Petersburg "to devise means to perpetuate their gratitude and admiration for those who died defending homes and loved ones." In early 1868, Mary Logan, wife of Union General John Logan visited Petersburg and observed the cemetery and the many decorations still remaining from previous years and later described the memorials to her husband. On May 5, 1868, General Logan issued General Order No. 11 which stated "the 30th of May, 1868, is designated for the purpose of decorating the graves of comrades." In 1882, the name of the holiday was changed to Memorial Day and in 1971, President Nixon declared Memorial Day a national holiday.

Eight men from Belleville are known to have served in the Civil War, three of whom died in battle. Artillery Captain Henry Benson was one of the 300 Union soldiers who died at the Battle of Malvern Hill in 1862. Captain Benson was commander of 125 artillerymen positioned on the

Virginia hill. The Confederate force of 20,000, led by Robert E. Lee was unable to gain even one inch of territory on the hill and lost 5,300 men. Captain Benson's funeral on Aug. 14, 1862 was Belleville's first military funeral, with nearly a thousand troops and mourners surrounding the cemetery of the Dutch Reformed Church where he was buried. Thomas Stevens died in battle on June 27, 1862 and John Rodgers was killed on April 8, 1865.

Major General Henry Rucker was born in Belleville in 1812 and during the Civil War was one of the leading officers in Washington. He was in charge of the Washington Depot, the main storage supply area for the army. The morning after President Lincoln's assassination General Rucker was one of the officers who escorted the slain president's body from the Peterson house, (where the President had been brought from the Ford Theatre) to the White House. General Rucker died on Jan. 6, 1910 at the age of 98, making him the second longest-lived Civil War general. He is buried in Arlington National Cemetery. The other known Belleville Civil War veterans were Captain Steven Van Renssaler who is buried at Christ Church Cemetery, Colonel Webster, Paymaster Ward, and James Taylor.

Push against Paserchia starts to lose steam

Despite one Belleville Republican Committee member's claim that former mayor Angie Paserchia owes money in fines to the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission, the head of the Republican Party said she is finished trying to block Paserchia's appointment to the Passaic Valley Sewerage Commission (PVSC).

The attacks against Paserchia are the latest in a series that polarized the membership.

Belleville Republican Chairman Antoinette "Toni" Marone had led a campaign against the reappointment of fellow Republican Paserchia to the PVSC, but with Paserchia and her supporters fighting back, Marone has backed off her fight.

"I've given up on it," Marone said. "I'm so tired of it all. I want to concentrate on the kids."

She was referring to her recent election to the board of education.

The nine-member PVSC is filled with an equal number of Democ-

rats and Republicans appointed by the governor, with the approval of a senator.

The commission takes care of sewage treatment for Belleville and several other municipalities in the area, and among other duties, has the power to award contracts.

According to the Star Ledger, a pattern of political patronage and nepotism has existed at the state's largest sewerage authority, and the

payroll continues to add friends and family of those who wield political power.

Marone and other members of the Belleville Republican Committee opposed a new five-year term for Paserchia at Passaic Valley, questioning her qualifications to handle the duties of awarding contracts for sewage treatment and saying others in the party would be more capable.

The latest charge comes from an 11-year-old fine handed down by the state Election Law Enforcement Commission. The \$4,500 fine was referred to the state Attorney General's Office in 1999, according to Amy Davis, director of public financing for the Election Law Enforcement Commission.

No one at the state Attorney General's Office could find a record of the fine, a fact that Paserchia latched onto in her defense.

"I don't know what they're talking about," she said. "If they can't find anything about it, what is

there? People will do anything. Next year is an election year and they're running scared that I might run."

The new children's room at the Belleville Public Library and Information Center was recently named for Paserchia by a 6-1 vote among trustees.

Michael Perrone, a trustee of the library, cast the lone negative vote, and made the accusations about the election fine.

Democratic Sen. (Ronald) Rice (D-28) defended his reappointment of Paserchia. The two worked together when Paserchia was mayor in the early 2000s. He said she has done a good job, has experience, and has developed a good relationship with the other

PVSC members.

He called the drive to block her reappointment "politics."

Perrone, a member of Marone's Republican Committee majority, said Rice doesn't know anything of Paserchia's affiliation with Richard Yanuzzi.

Yanuzzi is the former Republican chairman who got a majority elected to the Belleville council in 2000. Among other things, the majority sought to pass an ambitious redevelopment plan for the

Valley section that would have taken several people's homes through eminent domain. The plan was ultimately defeated.

Paserchia fundraised more than \$15,000 for the library and also paid for various sundries out of her own pocket.

Perrone said there was a federal investigation of the children's room plans, and the room did not need to be refurbished, especially spending \$150,000 to fix a 30 by 30 room.

A federal investigation was launched in 2003 into library records, but nothing has ever come of that investigation.

Essex County Republican Chairman Kevin O'Toole could not be reached for comment. Perrone said O'Toole is against Paserchia's reappointment.

Paserchia said she has always been "a good Republican," while

Marone supported Democrat Gary Furnari over Republican John Scott for state Senate and Democrat Ralph Caputo over Republican Joseph Scarpelli for Freeholder.

The Belleville Republican Party has been weathering a few storms due to internal strife. Most recently two factions in the party squabbled over who was the elected chairperson, Marone or Fuscaldo.

Former second ward councilman and PVSC employee Fuscaldo challenged Marone's chairmanship, even though she had the majority of Republican district leaders voting for her. Then-Republican Chairman Yanuzzi called a reorganization meeting which only Fuscaldo supporters attended, and he was elected. That challenge ultimately ended when Fuscaldo stopped pursuing the chairmanship.

Yanuzzi, who now is library director, said the move to have Paserchia's reappointment stopped is nothing but petty jealousy, that Perrone is off the wall, and cost the town millions in development ratables by opposing a redevelopment plan in 2001 in the Valley. Paserchia, he said, has spent years helping others.



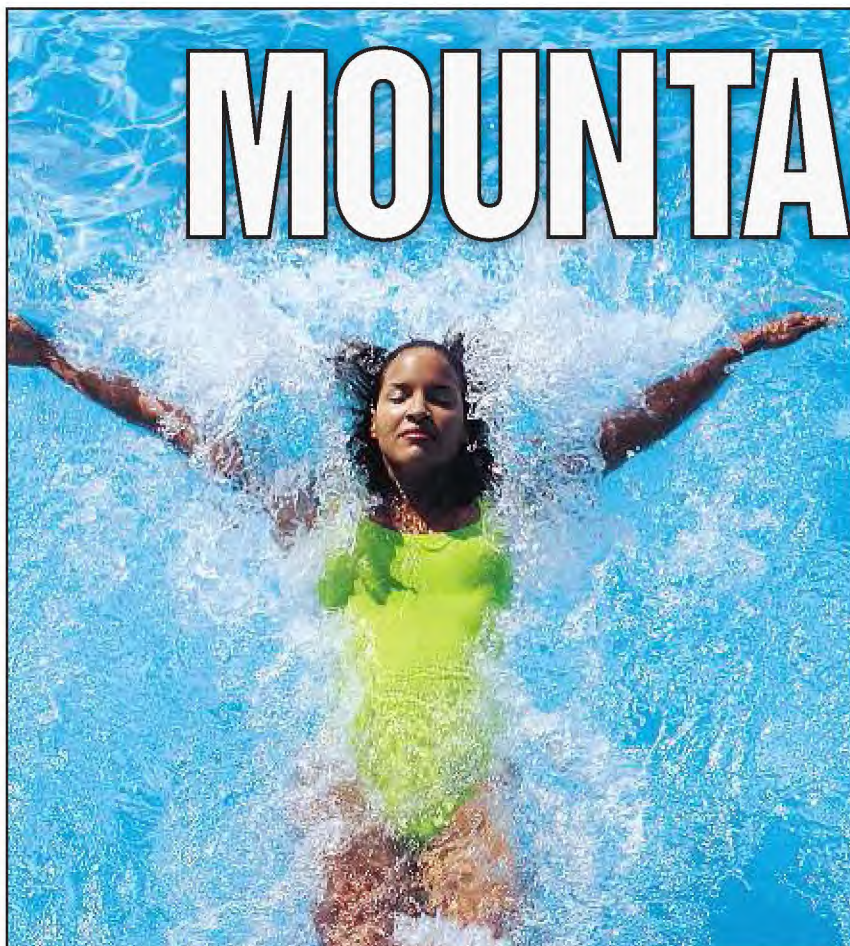

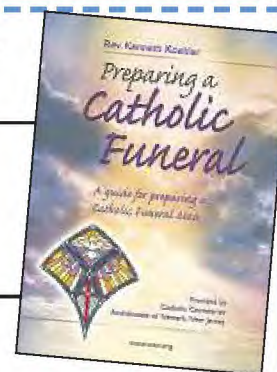

Playwright confronts his past in 'Happy Hour'

Family life is something almost everyone can relate to.

At least playwright John Wooten hopes as much. His autobiographical work, "Happy Hour," which centers on dysfunctional relationships between father and daughter – inspired by his own experience – is being brought to live stage from now through June 12 at 12 Miles West.

Set in the remote southwest desert, "Happy Hour" explores with disturbing precision one man's obsession with transforming a seedy topless bar into a reputable business. Unfolding during a September afternoon in 1979, the play depicts the harsh reality behind the American Dream and the high price paid by those determined to attain it.

Wooten describes the five-person, two-act drama as a compelling story that pushes boundaries to achieve goals.

"Whether people walk away liking it or disturbed, they will be affected," he predicts.

And Wooten should know.

Two-and-a-half years in the making, the play is based on Wooten's personal experiences 30 years ago, then a nine year-old child of divorced parents. Although Wooten lived in Maryland with his mother most of the year, he would visit his father in New Mexico that summer and the three years following. His father owned a bar halfway between Las Cruces, New Mexico, and El Paso, Texas, where "Happy Hour" is set.

"We were out there in the middle of the desert, so I would clean the bar and hang out with my father in the day, but never (was I) allowed there at night," Wooten said.

Years later, he realized why this was the case.

The bar's originally-intended

draw was legalized gambling. Once that venture failed, his father needed a quick switch in direction. Realizing no one would travel to El Paso just for a beer, Wooten's father transformed the establishment into a go-go bar. But even more shocking is that he would eventually ask one of his own daughters to become a dancer. This is how "Happy Hour" was conceived.

"I would pick it up, then put it down," Wooten said. "It is more difficult to write from personal experience than it is with pure fiction, so that was a big challenge."

Wooten wrote a full play but was unsatisfied with the final product. So he set it aside until 12 Miles West co-owner Lenny Bart encouraged him to keep working on it.

"The conflicts are universal themes," said Bart of what sparked his interest in the script. "Power and influence, being backed up against a wall, making bad choices. Although not everyone's daughter strips, they'll still understand."

Bart performed a first reading of "Happy Hour" in front of an audience, which made Wooten question whether he wanted to bring his life to live stage.

"I didn't want to write a play that couldn't do the actual events justice," he said. "So like an old car, I gutted the engine, replaced old parts and rebuilt it basically from scratch until I was happy with it."

Wooten revised the play, setting it in real time over a one-hour duration, rather the original four-year span. He also wrote himself out of it in an attempt to focus more on the father-daughter relationship. Since he was only at the bar from ages nine to 13, removing himself from the script allowed him to fictionalize certain aspects, rather than remember every detail.

"I thought it would be therapeutic, but it hasn't been," Wooten said. "I felt the need to re-explore

that world. I don't have a big relief from retelling this because the damage was done with this particular experience. But it was an opportunity for me to create my own window back into the bar one more time."

Although "Happy Hour's" themes may be enough to draw crowds, the play's lead character is being portrayed by someone many familiar with daytime television will recognize. Heather Tom, of ABC soap opera "One Life to Live" fame, is portraying Jennifer, who is based on Wooten's sister.

Wooten met Tom last August when he directed her in "Proof" at Montclair State University's TheatreFest. Wooten served as artistic director of MSU's theater until September, when he became a producing artistic director of Premiere Stages, a professional theater company at Kean University in Union.

Wooten, who now lives in Montclair with his wife, Andrea, and two-year-old son, Jack, is certainly in demand. After "Happy Hour" closes June 12, he is set to direct a workshop of Michael Hollinger's new play, "Opus," from

June 24 to 26. He will then return to Premiere Stages for the rest of the summer.

Wooten also plans to direct Susan Barsky's "Owed to My First Love" (which involves an actress whose first love is performance) and teach playwriting for two weeks at Kean.

"It's great what 12 Miles West has done for the arts here," said Wooten, who lived in Bloomfield for six years. "I'm certainly impressed at how committed they are to theatre and how positive that's been for the township."

RECIPES

Welsh Griddle Cakes

4 cups flour
1 tsp. baking powder
1 1/4 cups butter
3/4 cups sugar
Grated lemon rind
Pinch of salt
1 1/2 cups currants
1 egg, beaten
1/2 tsp. mixed spices
Milk

Mix together flour, baking powder, salt. Cut in butter. Add sugar, rind, spices, fruit. Add egg and enough milk to give consistency of short crust pastry. Turn out onto floured board and roll 1/4 inch thick. Cut into three inch rounds. Cook over medium heat in lightly greased, heavy skillet (or electric frypan) about four minutes each side. If they brown too fast, lower heat so insides cook to a sandy brittle texture. Makes five dozen. May be sprinkled with granulated sugar while still hot.

Crumb Coffee Cake

Batter:
3 cups flour
5 tsps. baking powder
2 eggs
1 1/2 cups granulated sugar
2/3 cup vegetable oil
1 cup milk
2 tsp. vanilla
Crumb Mixture:
8 oz. butter or margarine
2 cups flour
2/3 cup granulated sugar
1 tsp. vanilla
2 tsp. cinnamon

Grease and flour a 10 x 15 x 1-inch jelly roll pan. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Place all batter ingredients in a large bowl. Mix together with electric mixer until smooth (approximately five minutes). Spread in prepared jelly roll pan.

Prepare crumb topping. Mix together flour, sugar, vanilla and cinnamon. Cut in butter with pastry blender or two knives until crumbly. Sprinkle evenly over batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes. Cool. Dust heavily with confectioners sugar before serving.

Banana Nut Bread

1/2 cup shortening
1 cup sugar
2 eggs
3 bananas, crushed
2 cups flour
1 tsp. baking soda
1/2 cup walnuts

Cream together shortening and sugar. Beat in eggs and bananas. Sift together flour and baking soda. Add to above. Add walnuts. Mix all together. Bake 40 minutes at 350 degrees in a loaf pan. Bake 1 1/4 hours for well done.

I was watching "The Today Show" the other morning and Matt Lauer was talking to all the apprentices who had been fired from the show during this recent series.

We got our first color set when cable came to town. Needed a new television anyway and "splurged" on the latest version.

I enjoy television. Don't get me wrong. But when the networks get hold of a story or a happening or an issue, they wring it dry, replay after replay. Overkill at its finest. Scrounging for the tiniest crumb of new news, even if it's not news at all. Interviewing the second cousin twice removed of the victim's former mother-in-law's great nephew who lives in another state or country but maybe once met the object of all the attention. Or the "expert" who is willing to suggest a solution to the problem or provide some background often without knowing any more than you or I.

Enough, already, about the tube. Let me say a few words about the media which pays my salary every week. Please remember, all you good people out there, that we survive on stories and news releases, many of which you bring to our door. But also please remember that we are weeklies, with very limited space. And while we would like to publish your news immediately, it is not always possible. We do the best we can, often turning into jugglers when it comes to what goes in and what can be held for a later edition. It's nothing personal. It's just the way it is. Nor are we always able to send someone out to cover your event. We'd like to but we can't.

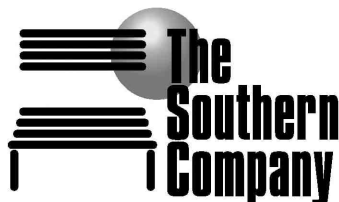

Warts are caused by a virus

Warts are benign growths on the surface of the skin, caused by a virus. Warts are contagious and can be spread from one person to another. You can get warts, by walking barefoot in damp places. Warts can spread by sharing washcloths, towels, brushes, combs and other personal items.

There are many different treatment options for warts including cryotherapy: the wart is frozen, using liquid nitrogen; electrodesiccation: the wart is burned, using an electric current.; curettage: the wart is excised out surgically; laser vaporization: the wart is destroyed by a laser beam that vaporizes it; pharmaceutical topical therapy: topical treatments include acid treatments that burn the wart; pulsed dye laser: this is the newest

The pulsed dye laser treatment works by selective absorption of laser energy by the blood supply that feeds the wart. The treated area then separates from the dermis and gradually sloughs off. Some conditions will respond to the very first treatment but most will require additional treatment sessions spaced two weeks apart.

Drunk driving done the safe and fun way

Belleville High School students were encouraged to get behind the wheel of an automobile to experience drunk driving first hand last week.

"Safety Bug," an actual car that simulates being driven while intoxicated, may just be the sauced up cousin of Herbie the Love Bug. Students took the car for a test drive in the high school parking lot on May 19.

Like the popular Disney Volkswagen Beetle, Safety Bug can wrest control away from the driver, but to produce an effect that is less slapstick and more of a reality slap. Instructor Mike Martin could program the car to demonstrate what it's like to have one or several drinks, which can slow reaction time.

The simulator Volkswagen is equipped with an on-board computer than can be programmed to simulate the delayed reactions of alcohol-impaired drivers by delaying the car's braking and steering reaction times, according to Patricia Guardino, the school's substance abuse awareness coordinator. Participants first drove one lap on the orange cone course with the car unaltered, then each driver tried it after it had been programmed to drunk driving. Each time, the change came without warning.

"It's like stepping off a small step when you're not expecting it," Martin said. "That's why there's so many deaths from drunk driving. I think the majority of students really get something out of it. It's more difficult than they thought it would be."

On average, about one in five teen drivers killed in car crashes were legally drunk. Young male drivers killed in crashes are twice as likely to have been drinking as their female counterparts (27 percent compared to 13 percent), according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

According to high school students who did not wish to be named, some of the locations where underage drinking and illegal drug use taking place in Belleville are the railroad tracks behind Pathmark on Washington Avenue. Other places include Clifton Commons, and the railroad tracks by the Clifton border, near an alleyway.

Guardino said, "The police do drive by, but the kids relocate."

As for the simulator, Police Det. Paul Auriemma said he thinks students learned that there is no way drive drunk. "It looks easy, but it's not," he said.

The experience made an impression on Senior Class President Kalindi Doshi.

"I took out a whole row of cones," she said. "When it comes to drinking and driving, don't do it at all."

Student Joseph Martinez walked away with a similar impression.

"It surprised me when I lost control of the car," he said. "You can't be that drunk, obviously. The car becomes a weapon when

you're drunk."

While licensed teenage drivers were able to experience the "Safety Bug" from behind the wheel, an equally valuable lesson was afforded to backseat passengers, who realized they were helpless as a passenger of an impaired driver, Guardino said.

Because the situation was obviously controlled, kids were able to laugh when they were unable to stop their driver from veering off the course.

Guardino said she isn't sure how much of an effect this will really have on students.

"Does the message last?" she said. "I don't know."

Guardino said between 400 to 500 students participated, either by driving, observing or helping out.

Students from Peers Educating Peers program (PEP) were on hand to sign others in for the ride. PEP goes to elementary schools and teaches students about what it will like when they are older, and to resist drugs, alcohol and gang influences.

The PEP students also help out with the simulator as part of a more general task of helping their fellow students.

Edwin Cotto, a PEP regular for the last school year, said he enjoyed "a lot of interacting with kids. They ask what high school is like."

Xue Tan called her PEP experience "very exciting."

"I got to teach children," she said. "I liked interacting with the children."

Facilitators also provided to students with "drunk goggles," which made it nearly impossible to walk a straight line.

For ninth grader Justin Rivera, wearing the goggles "felt weird. I was really, really off."

The final effect of the day was still a question, Guardino said.

"I hope they get the message of the intent of the assembly," she said. "I don't know if they do or don't, but said they were taken aback by the effects. The question is, does that effect last?"

The 2005 season has been a dream campaign for the Belleville boys' tennis team, according to coach Tony Salese.

"The kids are loving every minute of this season," Salese said. "It's really been something special. We've been playing very consistently and even in our losses last week (to Ridgewood and Paramus), we looked pretty good."

Belleville took a 12-7 record into a match with Paterson Eastside last Monday. The Bucs also played Montclair and Hackensack earlier this week. A day after the Ridgewood match, Belleville came back strong with a win over Nutley. DeJesus (6-4, 6-4), Santos (6-4, 6-1) and Sunico (6-1, 6-4) won at singles while the first doubles team of Manlapig and Cecilio won a pro set, 8-2 and the second doubles of Kang and Thai also won a pro set, 8-3.

The week ended with a 3-2 loss to Paramus. Sunico won at third singles, 6-1, 3-6, 7-6 (7-1) and the first doubles of Manlapig and Cecilio won 6-0, 6-4.

"That Paramus match was outstanding," Salese said. "They beat us 4-1 earlier this season and this time, we got a little closer. Mikko had a great match and I thought all the kids played well."

Two days later, the Bucs won a big game over Nutley in eight innings, 4-3. Belleville took a 2-0 lead in the first when Luzzi led off the game with his sixth homer of the season and Jonathan Serrano singled, stole second and third and scored on a James Rovell's ground out.

Nutley tied it with solo runs in the second and sixth innings before Belleville regained the lead in the bottom of the sixth when Rovell reached on an error and Matt Alfano pinch ran. Alfano stole second and scored on Roman's single. The Raiders tied the game in the seventh to force extra innings but Belleville won it in the last of the eighth. The Bucs are 9-2 in one-run games this year.

With one league game remaining on both of its schedules, Belleville and Nutley are tied for first in the NNJIL. While Belleville was finishing the league schedule against Don Bosco, Nutley was to face Bergen Catholic.

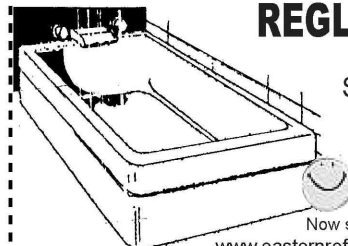

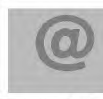

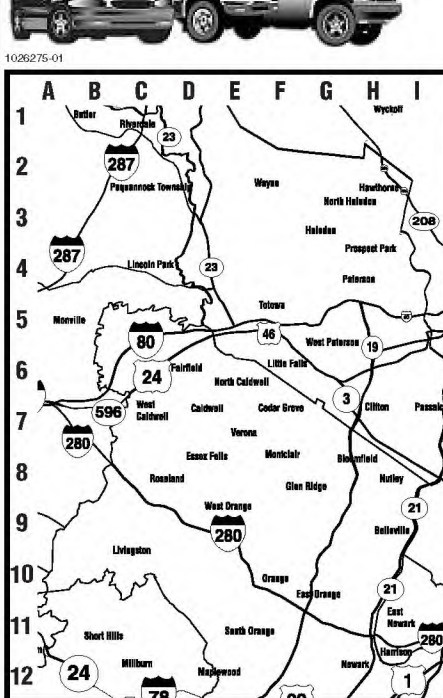
