## ■ POLICE BLOTTER

■ On June 7 at 12:45 p.m. police stopped a vehicle after noticing it disregard a red light at the Silver Lake intersection. Police discovered that the suspect was driving with a suspended license and was in the possession of 22 bags of white powder, identified as cocaine. The suspect was identified as Frank Monteiro, 43, of Bloomfield. Monteiro was charged with a motor vehicle summons and pos-

session of a controlled dangerous substance (CDS) with intent to distribute within a 1,000 ft. of a school zone. He is also wanted for warrants out of West Orange and Bloomfield and was held on bail for \$1500. A court date is still pending.

■ Police made a motor vehicle stop for no tail lights on Greylock Parkway and Washington Avenue on June 9 at 11:30 p.m. When the

vehicle was stopped at the intersection, police observed the suspect drop two bags of marijuana on the floor of the car. The suspect has been identified as a 17 year old, Newark male. The suspect was charged with a motor vehicle summons as well as possession of marijuana and was later released to his parents.

■ On June 9 at 12 p.m., officers were detailed to a Lake Street address where unknown persons were swimming in their pool. When exiting the pool, the suspect retrieved his clothes and cigarettes. In the cigarettes was a glass pipe used to smoke narcotics. The suspect was identified as Dominick Monochio, 40 years old from Newark. Monochio was charged with possession of a paraphernalia and wanted in Newark on a warrant for \$250.

## 'Click It or Ticket' campaign yielding results, say police

Local motorists are getting the message loud and clear: "Click It or Ticket."

That's why most of them buckled up during the state's zero tolerance seatbelt enforcement campaign over the past two weeks.

During the second annual Primary Seatbelt Law campaign — also known as "Click it or Ticket Seat Belt Mobilization," which ran from May 23 to June 5 — Belleville Police Department issued about 200 fewer tickets for seatbelt non-compliance than the year before. The number dropped to 332 tickets from 536 in 2004. The ticket costs a motorist \$46, with no points involved.

Lt. Gerard Campanella attributes the lower numbers to two factors: stronger seatbelt compliance from the motorists, but also fewer police resources than last year.

He said that drivers appeared to have taken the message to buckle up from last year; however there was one less officer on the street watching for compliance this year because The New Jersey Division of Highway Safety (NJHSD) only sent \$4000, instead of \$5,000 to

pay for overtime officers.

The U.S. Congress created the Section 157 Innovative Grant Program in an effort to raise seat belt usage rate throughout the country. In FY 2004, the NJDHTS utilized a large portion of Section 157 innovative grant funding to create Click It or Ticket.

The program's goal strives to increase the statewide safety belt usage rate from the current 82 percent to 84 percent.

This year in Belleville, prior to the enforcement period, seatbelt compliance was at 83 percent. That's 12 percent higher than last year.

At the intersection of Little and Main streets where traffic officers monitored vehicles, the percentage increased to 88.5 percent, compared to last year's 83.5 percent compliance rate.

"It's outstanding," said Campanella. "We did well for Belleville with seatbelt enforcement."

Before it became primary law, New Jersey was the lowest state for seatbelt compliance.

Nevertheless, some people have debated the true safety of seat belts, such as Belleville resident Eleanor

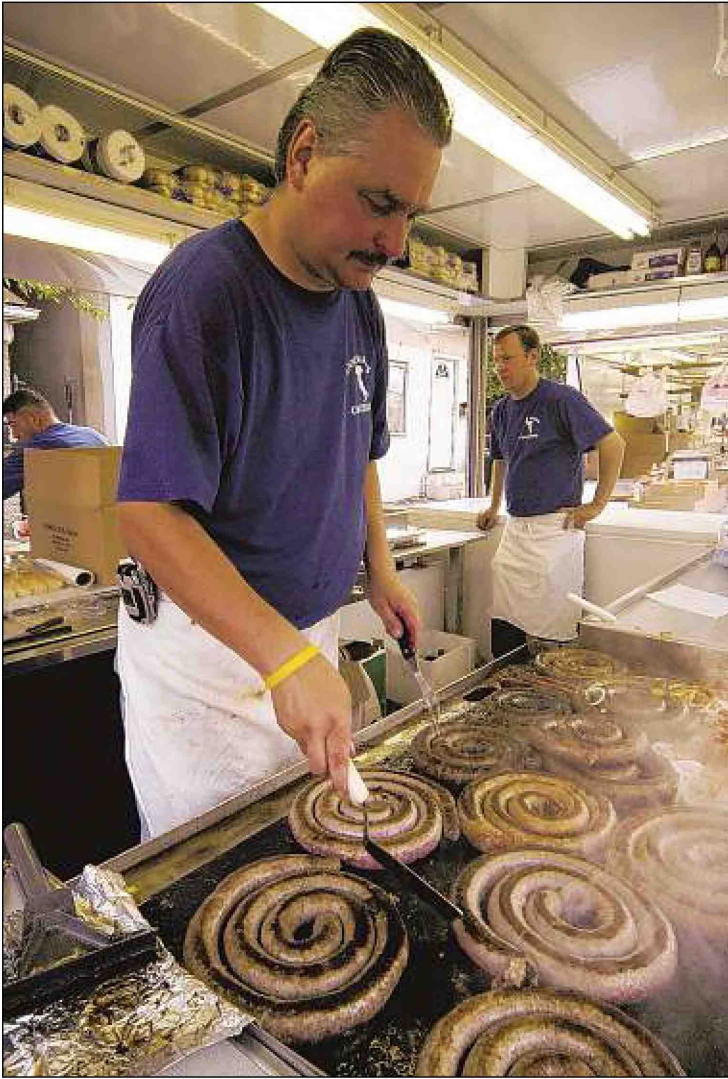

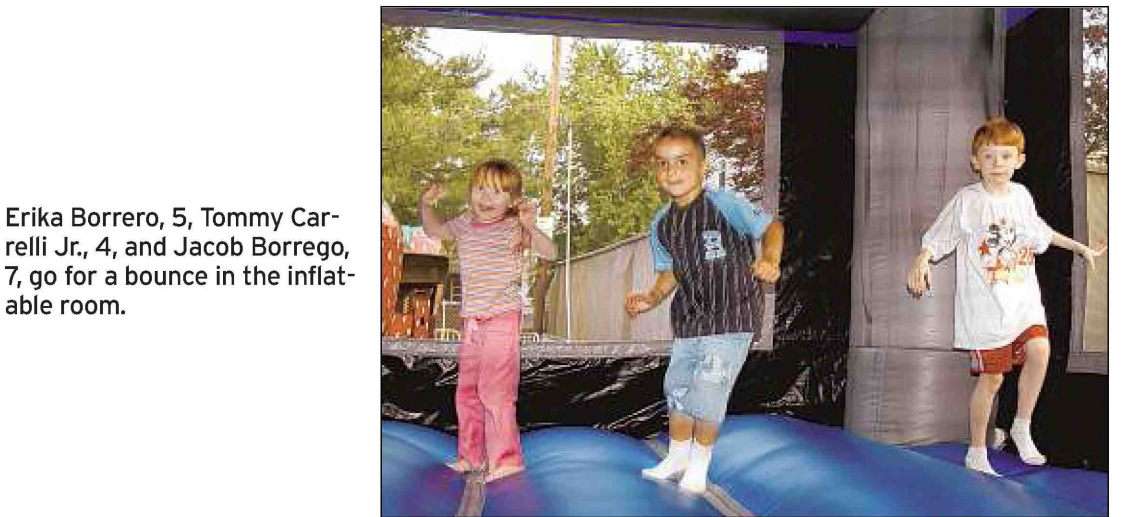

# Committee problems shouldn't be ignored

Imagine being a business owner trying to complete due diligence with the township so you can make money to pay your costs. However, you're told that you can't be cleared because the town can't fill its own committees and boards with voting members.

Frankly, it's not usually your concern whether or not people want to volunteer for local committees; but when you're told you can't operate without the assent of such bodies, it becomes a major issue of concern.

New businesses have startup costs to pay off, creditors who are

more than willing to strip them of their assets. To be told to wait a month or two while the town gets its own act together can be devastating. Established businesses that aren't able to run at their usual capacity risk losing customers to the competition.

It's embarrassing for a township to pronounce the rules out of one side of its mouth and to have to admit with the other that it can't furnish the members to ensure compliance.

Such was the situation this week with the Transportation Committee. When one member didn't

show up to the last meeting, Gus Bessas, owner of Black and White Taxi, was told to return in a month to have two of his cars renewed for registration and to have a number of drivers licensed to work in Belleville.

Not only does it only have four of its seven openings filled, but the councilman who breathed life back into the committee wound up resigning from it in disgust. Kevin Kennedy called it quits after the Township Council voted down a nominee who appeared qualified. He called the rejection, "political" saying it smacked of ill will towards

the nominee's ties to former council members.

With Kennedy out and two other positions still open, the Transportation Committee hangs precariously on a ledge before every meeting. If just one of the active four members should fail to show to a meeting, then no votes can be taken that night. Business owners must wait another month to have their cases heard or settled, which can be beyond frustrating if you need the town's approval to make revenue.

If Kennedy was so concerned about the integrity of the commit-

tee, it's unclear why he quit, leaving it so vulnerable to dysfunction.

Then again, the Township Council isn't rushing to fill the vacancies either. It prefers to wait until July 1 to appoint new members, along with planning and zoning candidates, in one fell swoop. Deputy Mayor Louis Pallante said it makes more sense to do it that way.

But it probably doesn't to business owners like Bessas, who have to mind their bottom lines while the town stalls for its "ceremony" next month.

# An open letter to the Board of Education

#### TO THE BELLEVILLE BOARD OF EDUCATION:

When I was in college I took a philosophy course called Logic and one of the things I learned is that if two people disagree on the premise you are not going to change my mind and I am not going to change yours. My premise is that the school administration and board of education should be "looking out for all of the kids." So for those who share that premise, continue reading.

There seems to be some confusion about the music honor courses from Mr. Longo's letter to the Belleville Times. I was hoping someone from the administration would answer him but since they did not, I will. Before I start, let me say that I sent one letter to the administration and three to the Board of Education and no one refuted any of my details.

In 2003 when I did the study, Belleville showed 10 honor offerings in music. The 2005-06 program of study shows three descriptions of music honors courses and Mr. Kraemer stated that they have 12 honors offerings. So how do they get 12 from three? Unlike any other honors course in the school, the music students are allowed to take the course again and again. For example, a student can take choir over and over for four years. So three courses for four years, we get 12 music offerings.

In 2003 when I approached the administration I had two concerns. One was that there was not enough challenging courses and unnecessary music honor offerings. At the second meeting with the administration I was told that they needed to add more challenging courses because their school ranking went down to 288. Nothing was added that year and only one honors class was added the

next year. Now our school rank goes down to 340.

In 2003, I counted six AP classes. When Mr. Longo looks in the Program of Study for 2005-2006, he sees 12 AP classes, many of which will be offered for the first time next year. A correction has been made, giving credit to our staff for the improvements. But, we had the answer in 1999 when the study was made to include music honors. The conclusion then should have been, not to have music honors but add more challenging courses to the school. The assumption of the study was to add honors classes to raise the class rank of the music students not "looking out for all the kids." It would be interesting if someone did a study in two years to see how many music students benefit from the additional challenging courses that have been added to the curriculum.

Music honors courses do not belong in a high school setting. This is a direct conclusion from the study that I did and information that I was given. Plenty of schools are offering challenging music programs without honors music. Dr. Kliszus pointed out Union High School, which did away with its honors music and still has a great program. Dr. Kliszus stated he was going to study the local schools. We are waiting for his report. Belleville has bigger issues like spending its resources on raising the school ranking and improving test scores. Our premise needs to be "to look out for all the kids" and not special interest groups with their own objectives. Everyone will be better off.

Mr. Longo stated an interesting study about music majors test scores. But, this has nothing to do with music honors. The study was about students taking music classes

and at no time did I suggest getting rid of the music program.

Mr., Kraemer did tell me that honor classes were for the music majors and I am not the only one he has said it to. But, it did not work out that way and there are abuses of the program.

Yes, Mr. Longo I was told that "in 1999 the music parents requested that the music students' class rank be raised and in order to do so they wanted honors music added to the curriculum." I was told this by three administrators and when I questioned Mr. Kraemer about it he did not deny it. This is common knowledge at the high school.

The curriculum offerings have improved, unfortunately too late for some. It still needs some work. Dismantling the music honors is just a matter of not giving extra points for the classes. I am on record stating back in 2003 that Belleville should have AP music and AP art classes that everyone can take and my research shows that is the only honors class the music department should have. I refer you to Newsweek's article on "Building a better high school" in which they talk about the top 100 schools in the nation and mention number 15, which is the McNair High School in Jersey City. They do not have music honors but have an AP course in music. We need to learn from the schools that are getting it right and not re-invent the wheel.

Any recommendations other than removing the music honors and the extra points given cannot be justified.

No school in the State of New Jersey has this kind of music offering with 12 honors classes available.

You need to stop this practice. Stop calling those music classes

honors and remove the extra points you gave those students for the last three years so that you do not affect the class rank of the seniors and any other students.

Class rank and grade point average is a key measuring tool that is used by higher educational institutions for students going on for further schooling, and by raising up one group, you lower the others.

The first ranked student in the class of 2005 took a music honors course, the second student did not, and the third student took music honors classes. What about the fourth? How would you feel as a parent or a student not knowing if class rank was affected or how many kids missed the honor group because class ranks has been manipulated by music honor courses. What a shallow victory, not knowing. You let this go on for years and you are not willing to stop it. Shame on you. What do you think college admission people are going to think? Maybe you still do not understand what was done, but they will. Is Belleville going to lose all credibility or does a kid get an asterisk by his name because Belleville's standards are so different than any other school with music honors classes.

Someone should be held accountable and you need to fix it.

"Who's looking out for all of the kids?" Are you?

# Absence exposes flaw on town committee

Due to the absence of the required number of members on the board, the Transportation Committee adjourned its June 7 meeting, to the disappointment of one of its applicants.

Committee Chairman Judy Piscatowski called the meeting off since there were only three members present, out of the necessary four to vote. Lt. Gerard Campanella and Michael Gangeruso were present, and John Caruso was absent at the given time. He showed up 30 minutes late, after the meeting was adjourned.

While the meeting was put off, one of its applicants, who wasn't approved last month due to missing paperwork, was left in limbo.

"How am I going to continue to conduct business (until next month)," Gus Bessas of Black & White Taxi in Bloomfield, asked the chairman. "I'm in violation of 95 percent of the (transportation) ordinance."

This means a number of his drivers are unlicensed and his vehicles are unregistered, which is the requirement when heading a taxi-

cab business.

Councilman Kevin Kennedy reinstated the Transportation Committee in the township this year in order to regulate local taxicabs and livery services and keep the residents safe from any criminal drivers.

Ever since the majority of the council members voted against the appointment of Lois Servidio as one of its members, Kennedy resigned as a result of the vote, which he called "political." He indicated there is animosity because Servidio is friends with former council members who were known to butt heads with the current mayor and deputy mayor.

For this reason, there has been a shortage of members on the committee, which only carries four out of the required seven. The slight number requires each member to be present when a vote is taken and makes every one of the current members count. This was the case last week, when Caruso was late, coming after the meeting was adjourned.

Mayor Gerald Digori said in the past that there are a couple of interested members who want to be on the committee, but no one

has been appointed yet.

Caught in the middle of it all are business owners like Bessas, whose company has been doing pickups in Belleville for the past five years.

"What do I do for a month? I have two cars that are down (due to non-renewal of registration)," he said, adding that a number of his drivers are still unlicensed and can't work.

In the past, applicants could go to the Township Clerk Office to get an application for renewal or go to Code Enforcement to register a vehicle or license a driver, said Bessas. Now, applicants have to come before the Transportation Committee to renew anything.

Piscatowski apologized to Bessas, telling him to go to Code Enforcement and attend the council meeting on June 14 to address the issue. Both the chairman and Bessas said they will be at the council meeting to complain about the matter.

"The council hasn't appointed anyone yet. Our hands are tied," said Gangeruso.

Deputy Mayor Louis Pallante

said at the July 1 reorganization meeting, they will reappoint both planning and zoning board members.

"It probably would make more sense if we do it all at one time," said Pallante.

The council will have to appoint two new members to the Transportation Committee plus a council liaison to replace Kennedy.

## Woman thrown from window when van rolls on Rte. 21 – condition is critical

A woman is in critical condition after the van she was riding in turned over on Route 21 South last week.

Police were called to the scene on Thursday, June 9 at 3:20 p.m. across from William Street.

The driver, Robert Barbella, 33, of Belleville was transporting a refrigerator in the van accompanied by two females. He and front seat passenger Yaja Maria Media, 26, of North Bergen, said they were wearing seatbelts. Maria Barbella, 30, of Belleville was sitting in the back, next to the refrigerator, where there was no seatbelt.

The driver told police he lost control due to mechanical problems.

"It appears that the car went on its side prior to hitting the center divider. When it hit the divider, it went upside down," said Lt. Gerald Campanella of the Belleville Police Department.

The woman in the back was thrown out of the vehicle through one of the windows, police said.

Maria Barbella had multiple injuries and was found unconscious and not breathing, police said. A physician who was driving by northbound stopped and started CPR on her. Shortly after, paramedics arrived and started doing advanced life support.

"Her entire body was outside of the vehicle," said Campanella. "We're treating this as a fatality because of the life threatening injuries."

Both females were transported to University Hospital in Newark.

Barbella was taken straight to the operating room and Media was treated for head and neck injuries and was released.

Robert Barbella refused any treatments.

This week, Maria Barbella was still in critical condition.

The incident is still under investigation by the Fatal Crash Unit. The vehicle will go through a mechanical exam as well, said

Campanella.

The Essex County Prosecutor's Office Vehicular Homicide Unit is assisting local police with the investigation.

Strollo.

"For the sake of Click It or Ticket, I click it," said Strollo. "Do I totally believe in it? No." She noted that she personally feels restrained and uncomfortable while driving with a seat belt.

Strollo contended that she read some editorials that state just as many people get killed with seat belts as without them.

"Why can't we have a personal choice, why all these laws?" asked Strollo. "It should be common sense."

But Campanella cited his 12 years of experience in traffic enforcement and research, stating that a seat belt could mean the difference between life and death.

Campanella was in charge of the Fatal Accident Unit for the town, and has witnessed a number of fatalities various injuries, which he said could have been reduced or prevented with seat belts.

According to the lieutenant, wearing a seat belt helps "ride down" a crash, meaning it slows down the body and internal organs during the trauma of the crash. When a vehicle experiences a crash, the body moves at 40 mph, and then a person's internal organs also go forward at 40 mph. The seatbelt helps make sure that a person's internal organs don't rip through the ribcage during the crash

According to statistics compiled by NJDHTS, more than 42,000 motor vehicle fatalities occurred in America in 2003, 474 of them in the Garden State. More than half of the motor vehicle occupants were not wearing a seatbelt.

"Air bags are a passive restraint, they're designed to supplement the seat belt, not take the place of," added Campanella.

# Man hangs himself in Nutley cell

A Belleville man hung himself inside a cell at the Nutley Police Department on Chestnut Street within an hour of being brought in on a number of charges, police said

David Jennings, 46, attempted to ride his bicycle off River Road onto Route 21 Southbound June 9 at 11:30 p.m., when police officers stopped him for safety reasons. He told police that he was riding his bike to his sister's house in Belleville, with whom he'd been staying. He appeared to be very nervous during the questioning, police said. During a field check, they noticed he had dried blood on his hands, which he explained came from a cut on his arm earlier in the day. Police also found three clear vials in his possession, known to be used for Controlled Dangerous Substance (CDS), with a powdery residue inside each one, said Nutley Lt. Steven Rogers. Police are still investigating what the substance was. They also found a straight edge razor in his possession.

Jennings resisted arrest, struggling against the police officers on the highway. The police managed to subdue him and bring him into headquarters. He was placed under arrest for a disorderly per-

sons offense, second degree aggravated assault, third degree resisting arrest and third degree obstruction of administrative law. He was also charged with third degree possession of CDS and drug paraphernalia, and unlawful possession of a weapon.

There was no sign that Jennings was under the influence of drugs, but police did detect alcohol on his breath. He was not acting inebriated, explained Rogers.

Upon transporting him to the Nutley jail, authorities called the First Aid Squad to make sure Jennings hadn't sustained any injuries, which he had not, said Rogers.

Police took away his belt and shoe laces, as required by the attorney general and prosecutor's office guidelines, said Rogers.

Jennings would have been held

in the cell until bail was made, the amount of which police had not yet determined, added Rogers.

Within minutes, Jennings took off his trousers and hung himself with them. One of the officers found him. He tried to revive him through chest compressions and checks for pulse, but it was too late. Jennings was pronounced dead a short time later.

According to Rogers, Jennings gave no prior indication of suicide.

Rogers said that the police handled the entire situation in an exemplary matter, attempting to prevent any accidents on the highway by taking him off the streets.

The Essex County Prosecutor's Office along with the Nutley police are looking into his background and speaking with relatives to find out what could have pushed him to suicide, said Rogers.

The prosecutor's office is not releasing any additional information on Jennings' background, such as prior criminal record and

the like, while the investigation is ongoing, said spokesperson Charlotte Smith.

"This is a rare occurrence and it's traumatic for everyone," said Rogers. "It's traumatic for the police, the family members, no one wants to see someone die at any time."

Rogers said that Jennings' relatives were notified of his death and his body will be released to them.

This is the first time that someone succeeded in taking his own life in a Nutley jail cell, although there's been a number of attempts before, said Nutley Police Chief John Holland.

Someone died in custody back in the 1970s when Holland was a patrolman, but the cause of death was determined to be a combination of drugs and alcohol.

"It's just a sad and unfortunate incident," said Rogers.



# Arming veterans for the working world

For almost 18 years, Wayne Lowry has been placing Essex County war veterans back into the workplace.

As part of his task, he set up shop for a day at a Veterans Information Fair, held last month at Nutley's parks and recreation building.

The fair was designed to advise returning veterans of benefits they may be entitled to and employment programs geared solely towards them as they re-enter civilian life. And although turnout at the event was below organizers' expectations, groups statewide continue to help transition veterans back to the world they temporarily left behind.

After serving 18 months with

the Army Reserve's 10th Mountain Division in Kandahar, Afghanistan, Michael Sarno returned to Bloomfield in November. In a self-effacing style befitting almost all combat veterans, he dubbed his experience "for the most part fruitful" and "not all bad," while shrugging off his role in comparison to those played by "grunts" of the infantry division.

Upon Sarno's return, it was

almost inevitable his and Lowry's paths would cross.

Sarno had worked as a union accredited electrician prior to his departure. Upon returning he experienced a lull in work, typical of union patterns. Initially, however, this was a welcome respite.

"The first thing that I wanted to do was go on a vacation, lie by some tropical waters and drink some pina colodas," he said. "So that's what I did."

That was partly made possible by a parachute payment to all veterans. The military continues to pay former servicemen and women a month and a half after their service terms end, in an attempt to ease the return to civilian life.

Sarno described that process as time – and money – consuming.

"You have to get your life back in order," he said. "Your phone, your car, your insurance all have to be straightened out."

Before long, thoughts turn to funding these renewed expenses. Enter Lowry and his New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development (NJDOL) colleagues.

"After I came home I was collecting unemployment for a while, and that's when I went to the department of labor and where I was told all about the Helmets to Hardhats project," Sarno said.

A non-profit organization, Helmets to Hardhats helps reacquire military personnel, guardsmen and reservists into the workplace by offering resources geared to landing jobs, both manual and non-manual, in the construction industry.

Veterans can search jobs at the program's Web site, [helmetstohardhats.org](http://helmetstohardhats.org). Here they can also upload resumes and find answers to frequently asked questions.

"They had all these jobs that they could put me in contact with," said Sarno. "They were a perfect plan B should the union fall through."

But after three months of waiting, Sarno's union came through. His days are now split between construction sites in West New York and Whippany.

However, he has not forgotten the safety net that Lowry and his team put into place.

"They treated me so well," said Sarno. "When I went there I felt like royalty. If you go downstairs in

the regular unemployment it's not so nice but there they have coffee and donuts, and they treated me like a member of the family."

As supervisor for Veterans Services for Workforce New Jersey (a New Jersey Department of Labor [NJDOL] subdivision), Lowry currently has a caseload of 1,152 job-seeking veterans from the greater Essex area. While another office deals exclusively with Newark, Lowry and his staff are responsible for the rest of the county.

For returning veterans, many of whom were steadily employed prior to their tours of service, the help offered by Lowry's team is welcome but obsolete.

Job rights and benefits for returning combatants are protected under broad terms of the Uniformed Services Employment and Reemployment Rights Act (USERRA), which is built on the existing veterans reemployment rights statute. While enhancing employment protection for those disabled in the line of duty, USERRA has also expanded the time an individual may serve his country while retaining rights to return to the same job to five years.

Such a provision was vital for Alex Andeer.

After one year as an infantryman with the Army's Second 113th Division, Andeer (from Paterson) returned to the job he had left at Valley Hospital in Ridgewood. But upon looking for a temporary position to supplement his wage, he too found himself enlisting the help of the Bloomfield NJDOL branch.

For many men and women returning from overseas service, government programs' safety nets are in place, whether veterans come by them independently or

## Jazz Group's tour running through Bloomfield

The band is called the Industrial Jazz Group (IJG) but they're not to

be confused with industrial music. "That's one of the things that's been a little misleading," said pianist Andrew Durkin, regarding the name of his Los Angeles-based

jazz ensemble, which he describes as a mix of "lots of different styles." The word "industrial" refers to the complexity of what the band does. Durkin said, "We're definitely

based on the jazz idiom. The longer the group is together, the more we bring in other influences as well. We employ elements associated with classic American pop forms like classic R&B, soul, rock 'n' roll, salsa, doo-wop and international folk music styles. The trick is to try to bring together all the things that influence me as a composer but not sound like a patchwork. It still has to have the group identity."

Originally from New Jersey, Durkin is very excited to be coming back to perform at 12 Miles West in Bloomfield, on Friday, June 17. He said, "I've been in Los Angeles since 1995. I grew up in Morristown, had a pop-oriented group based in Montclair, my grandmother is from Nutley... This will be a homecoming tour for me."

The East Coast tour will support IJG's third album, "The Star Chamber," which was released in September 2004 by Innova Recordings. The band will also provide a pre-view of its current in-progress work, "Industrial Jazz-a-Go-Go."

There's a lot of planning involved around touring with a band as large as IJG, Durkin said.

"It's a complicated task, finding places to stay. But I've got a good group of people together. They're excited and I'm excited. It will be a lot of fun," he said.

The band starts its tour in Rochester, N.Y., and is playing places like CBGB's in New York City and the Hamilton Street Café in Bound Brook. But Durkin sees those places as warm-up gigs leading up to 12 Miles West and Knapuccino's in Wilmington, Del., where they won't be sharing a bill with anyone else.

Durkin said, "We have a lot of music and a lot of incarnations of the band. Special guests will also appear with us at 12 Miles West. There's a wide range of stuff we do. The gig will give us an opportunity to showcase all that we do."

"We're all jazz players primarily," he added. "We maintain a respect for that tradition, but we love a lot of other music as well. I'm really interested in reaching beyond just jazz fans - trying to get people into the group who aren't just hardcore fans of jazz."

# A sense of wonder and a sense of humour

I read the following humorous story and laughed. So I want to share with you. Once day Jesus went golfing with Peter. When Jesus got ready to tee off, he pulled out a nine iron. Peter said, "Lord,

excuse me but you don't use a nine iron to tee off. If you do the ball will go into the water hazard over there. Only Tiger Woods could use a nine iron and hope to get the ball over the water." Jesus said, "If Tiger Woods can do it, I can do it."

So Jesus used the nine iron anyway and the ball went into the water hazard just as Peter had said. Since Jesus had been so gracious to forgive his sins, Peter decided to show the same grace to Jesus. So they gave Jesus another chance. So

Jesus walked down to the pond to get his ball. When he got there he stepped out onto the pond, walked across the water until he saw the ball. Then Jesus reached down into the water for his ball. He put the ball back on the tee and started to use the nine iron again.

And the traveler said, "I will be coming back this way and your wife will have a son."

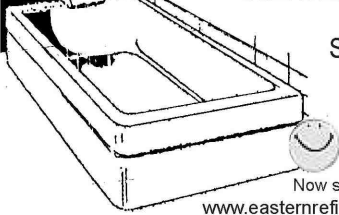

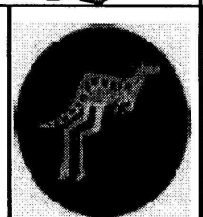

**SLEEP ON IT**

When stress keeps you awake at night, sleeping pills can be temporarily useful. The newest prescription sleeping pills, zaleplon (Sonata) and zolpidem (Ambien) are less likely than older drugs to cause side effects, disrupt deep sleep, and leave you feeling groggy the next day. They are also less likely than the main older option - benzodiazepines, such as flurazepam (Dalmene), temazepam (Restoral), and triazolam (Halcion) - to cause physical dependency. The older prescription drugs and even some non-prescription sleep aids can be useful in some cases. It's important to keep in mind, however, that all sleep drugs have adverse effects and can be psychologically addicting. Thus, sleeping pills should usually not be taken for more than about two weeks. ## Engineer touts NJ chemical industry

On May 12, James Connolly spent the day speaking to Pietro Doldi's chemistry classes at Belleville High School. Connolly visited the school as a representative of the New Jersey Chemistry Council Education Foundation. As a chemical engineer responsible for safety and environmental compliance at a large New Jersey pharmaceutical company, has visited BHS for the past several years.

He spoke to students about the economic and scientific importance of the chemical industry here in New Jersey, as well as the various types of jobs a person might do as a chemical engineer. He explained the educational background stu-

dents must have in order to enter the field, the starting salary for new chemical engineers, and some of the benefits and disadvantages of working in the field. He provided many anecdotes from his own career, and stressed the importance of learning as much as possible about the demands of a particular career before deciding to pursue it. 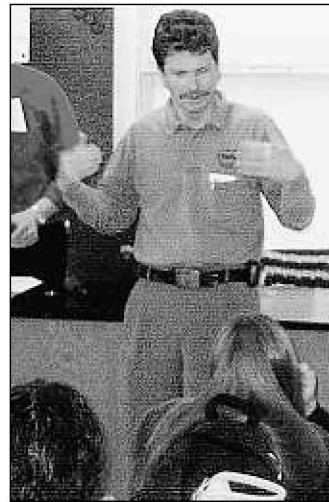

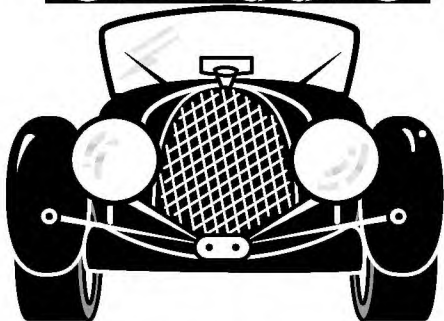

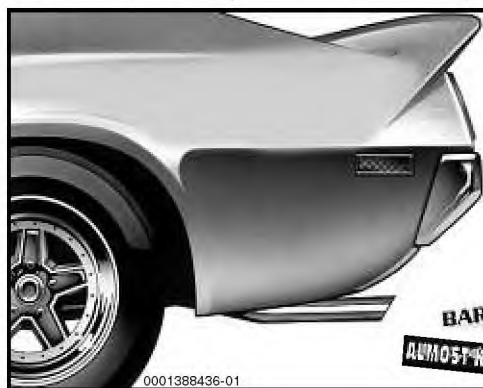
