Here's the scoop: neighborhood wins ice cream contest

For one early summer afternoon, all Silver Lake residents are invited to indulge in free ice cream, thanks to the local civic association.

The Silver Lake Civic Association was mailed a flier from Edy's Ice Cream asking that the group compose an essay of 350 words or less. The topic: "Why our neighborhood deserved an 'ice cream salute,'" according to Councilwoman Marie Strumolo Burke, president of the SLCA.

Silver Lake was among 1,500 sections of towns across America to earn a "salute," she said.

The gift includes 12 cartons of ice cream, plus all the ingredients for "a party in a box," including tablecloths and spoons, Burke said.

So Burke's Heckel Street block, between Lawrence and Jeraldo streets, will be closed off from noon until 2 p.m. on Saturday, July 19.

"You don't have to be a civic association member to join us," Burke said. "We have coupons in case we need to buy more ice cream or toppings if we need them. We hope to have our neighbors from all over the Silver Lake area join us."

Edy's, the summer block party prize package includes the "Party in a Box," with ice cream bowls, spoons, scoops, napkins, ice cream coupons and extra gift certificates. Plus there are nametags, two table covers, door hangers, a yard sign and stand, a permanent marker, a disposable camera, a metal scoop, apron and wipes for sticky fingers.

Edy's will deliver the 12 cartons of 1.5 quarts each and four boxes of ice cream bars. The official response letter calls the party "an

opportunity to gather with all of your neighbors and have fun!" Residents can pick up a copy of Burke and SLCA leader Angela Cuzzo-Zarro's prize-winning essay.

Kim Goeller-Johnson of Edy's captured the fun spirit of the contest, and what a hot summer Saturday can bring.

"Whether celebrating with a friend over a scoop of strawberry or serving up a hot fudge sundae to make someone's day a bit brighter, ice cream has a unique ability to bring people together," Goeller-Johnson said in the letter inviting Silver Lake's entry.

Now, Silver Lake residents will have a chance to enjoy a summer treat for free, and the SLCA members said they hope the experience spreads more community spirit around the neighborhoods.

FUN IN ANY LANGUAGE

On Thursday and Friday, May 22 and 23 School #5 students and faculty celebrated the 11th International Celebration of Games Around the World, which was coordinated by the English as a Second Language teacher, Ms. Lorna Blasco. Her objective was to achieve District Goal #16- to promote the understanding of and the ability to interact with people of diverse cultural characteristics. Life lessons from the baseball diamond

This week members of the Challenger baseball league, which consists of special needs kids from a number of towns but primarily Belleville, will get their chance to shine at one of baseball's most hallowed shrines – the soon-to-be demolished Yankee Stadium. It's a fitting venue for these athletes and the event should serve as an inspiration to everyone who has ever faced a seemingly insurmountable challenge. Meaning, pretty much, all of us.

The league was started more than a decade ago when Belleville parents Rich and Marge Franco tried unsuccessfully to get their daughter Nicole into a baseball program suitable for her abilities. Not having any luck, the parents lit a candle instead of cursing the darkness

and launched a local chapter of the Challenger League, a baseball organization catering to kids like Nicole. Soon, they found lots of help – from the township of Bloomfield to a woman who lost her husband in the Lockerbie airline disaster 20 years ago.

Pick the platitude of your choice: Nothing ventured, nothing gained, where there's a will there's a way, when the going gets tough, and so on. All basically say the same thing – if you encounter an obstacle, sit down and try to figure out a way to overcome it, don't just sulk or despair.

The kids served by the Challenger League may be regarded by some as "unfortunate" because their range of abilities are different – but not necessarily less than –

the "average" child's. In a less enlightened time such children were defined by what they couldn't do instead of what they could. But anyone can be defined that way, anyone can choose to see himself or herself as a collection of shortcomings instead of a collection of abilities. It all depends on how you choose to do the tallying.

The people who will be fortunate enough to see these children play this week will be treated to an unmistakable display of the power of positive thinking, a chance to observe firsthand what it means to live life to the fullest. The only "handicapped" people present will be those who are unable to grasp the significance of that lesson.

Sharp critique of BPD facilities, procedures

TO THE EDITOR:

The Belleville Police Department was kind enough to show this reader how they would operate in case a terrorist cell was found in Belleville. It appears it would ignore the rights we take for granted, such as the right to see a search warrant and observe a search in one's home. When arrests take place, the citizen would not be able to contact a lawyer nor make the cherished phone call. There would be no questioning of suspected lawbreaker. Arrests would be based on the word of others, some of whom might be lawbreakers themselves. Suspects would not be able to put on clothes nor shoes.

This reader learned that police facilities are woefully inadequate. The holding cell was difficult to

shut completely. The metal detector gave a positive response when the suspect was only dressed in swim trunks. The fingerprinting machine was difficult to operate and required several efforts to get good prints. The computer camera did not work. The camera used instead showed a completely black picture. The signature pad did not work, as the battery had not been replaced. The police often used garbage bag ties instead of handcuffs, which one suspect was able to get out of. Other suspects asked for ties to be loosened, as they were too tight. The officers could not do this. Suspects were not allowed to use

a bathroom.

It would seem the town council needs to adequately fund the police facility so that officers' time is not wasted booking suspects, lessening over time and not punishing suspects who may have done nothing wrong.

It might be mentioned that this reader, when passing through the metal detector in front of the town court with keys, coins, etc. in his pocket, observed that the machine did not react; he was told the machine often does not work. This could be a danger to the court and council. Our police

Boards mulls truck buy, notification system

The school board discussed summer school building repairs, a parent emergency notification system, curriculum changes, better communication with parents and working with the town to maintain playing fields, all at the June 23 Board of Education meeting.

School board member William Villano, the longest-tenured member, said the board's buildings and grounds committee went over the list of summer repairs and maintenance projects, along with the proposed replacement of an aging

maintenance vehicle, at its last meeting.

Vincent Fucella, who supervises all in-house buildings and grounds work for the district, told the committee "he started some things early, but others were delayed by power outages," according to Villano.

Each summer, the board committee meets at individual school buildings to assess the progress of the building's projects, Villano said.

The committee also approved the replacement of a maintenance truck originally purchased in 1982, which Villano said sorely needs to be retired. The full board will have to approve the purchase.

Next, Villano told the audience and board about the technology committee's plan for an emergency notification system. He said the committee has interviewed one vendor, and will see proposals from two other vendors before making a decision.

Villano said the system can utilize either "a text, phone or voice format. We hope to have it in place by September."

The notification plans are not tied to the current updating of the district's phone services.

"One doesn't have to happen for the other to be done," Villano said.

He said concerns over recent power outages and a water main break at School #5 underscore the need to notify parents in the event of an emergency.

Following Villano's reports, board member Arlene Schor updated changes in the curriculum, previewing a new history program.

"We approved an exciting new 'History Alive' program being piloted at School #9," Schor said, with more details forthcoming.

Board member Carmen Bucco spoke about plans for the board's community relations committee. He said he plans to meet with Lisa Kistner, Consolidated Home and

School Association president.

"We want to get the word out about better community relations," Bucco said.

Finally, board member Vincent Strumolo, Jr. revealed plans made by the board's athletics committee to join with the town on field maintenance projects.

"We want the town and the board to work together to get the fields done," Strumolo said. There will be separate school board and town council committees sitting down together to join forces, he said.

No timetable on introducing uniforms, super says

So exactly what is the future of school uniforms in Belleville Public Schools?

In a phone interview the day before the new school uniforms for elementary students were unveiled in May, Assistant Superintendent of Schools Dennis Villano said in an exclusive interview that it was possible that the uniforms could be phased in as soon as three years. That would occur with the uniforms following students into the middle school and eventually into the high school.

At the most recent school board meeting, Superintendent of Schools Dr. Edward Kliszus completely backed off discussions of a timetable, saying that the district

would take more of a wait and see approach to the first year of the uniforms next year. He told a resident questioning the ultimate resolution of the uniform issue, "I can't be responsible for what is said in the papers."

At the same meeting, Lisa Kistner, Consolidated Home and School Association president, said there was a concern that some children wear "hand-me-down" clothes, and their parents may not be able to afford to purchase new uniforms.

Kliszus said the district is "waiting for feedback" regarding children eligible for free or reduced school lunches, to help determine who might need help.

"It's in the works," he said.

Villano said the uniforms will be required for all students,

kindergarten through grade six.

He said the plan is to offer parents an opportunity to go to two or three different locations throughout the township to purchase the proper clothing, to accommodate people in all sections of town.

The district distributed a survey to parents regarding school uniforms, and officials said more than eight out of 10 parents favored the change.

Villano said a package of five, three-button collared shirts and three chino-style pants could be purchased for \$100 and would make for 10 different outfits, a huge cost savings for parents during tough economic times.

After a concerned parent brought up the subject in October,

school board members and the administration came up with the survey.

One survey per parent was sent home, and they were numbered but anonymous. One side of the survey card was in English and the other side in Spanish.

The survey asked parents whether they favor uniforms, how many children they have, and in what grades their children currently are.

Specifically, the survey said the school uniform will consist of collared, three-button tops and chino bottoms, with several deviations allowed from the basics.

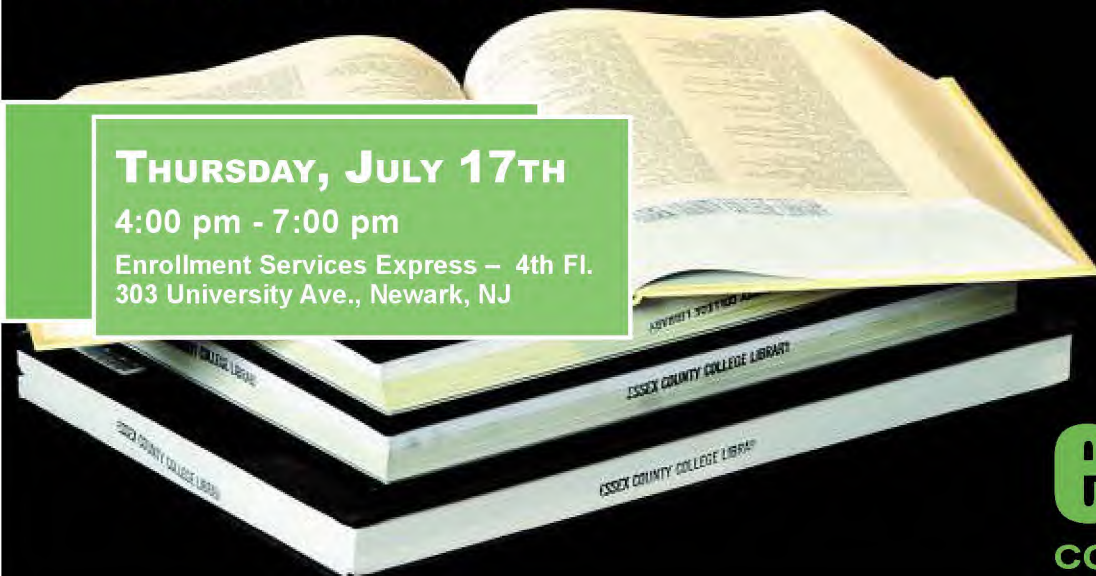

She has also reactivated her skin care and fragrance regimen.

Warwick has enjoyed a lifetime of successes while remaining dedicated to empowering and inspiring others. The City of East Orange and East Orange Board of Education paid tribute to Warwick by renaming her alma mater, Lincoln Elementary School, as "The Dionne Warwick Institute of Economics and Entrepreneurship."

Borgata shows them how it's done – if you can afford it

With the opening of the Borgata nearly five years ago, Atlantic City took on a brand new dimension. The first Las Vegas-calibre property brought a level of luxe and service that attracted a new breed of visitors to the resort. From day one, it was obvious that the exciting new property was creating a demand beyond Borgata's 2000 guest rooms and suites. As many AC casinos comped most of their guest accommodations on a regular basis, Borgata had tapped into a market where visitors were happy to pay for the world-class amenities, achieving a 90+ occupancy.

Within months, plans were underway for the construction of The Water Club, a non-casino boutique hotel adjacent to Borgata. Bob Boughner, the Boyd Gaming genius behind creation and launch of Borgata, muses that other casino execs would ask visitors what they wanted. Instead, Boughner sought out those who were NOT visiting AC to find out what it was that would attract them. He delivered, and they came! Immersion, the two-story spa occupying the 32nd and 33rd floors, is entered through an Asian river rock archway with more cascading water. There's an 80 foot infinity-edge lap pool, where floor-to-ceiling windows offering views of the AC skyline give visitors the feeling of being suspended in space. Private individual and couples facilities offer an amazing menu of spa treatments from skincare to massages and "body experiences" like the Moor Mud Body Float, to wraps, scrubs and reflexology. Unlike Borgata's Spa Tocare, Immersion is open only to registered guests at The Water Club, and the pool and workout facilities are made available to those guests who purchase Spa services. A number of the guest suites are also equipped with their own dedicated spa rooms ready for treatments in the privacy of the guests' own suites. (If you have to ask about prices, you can't afford it!) Guest room rates range from \$700+ to \$5,000 per night for a one-bedroom "Social Suite."

Harrah's has recently opened a newly-completed guestroom tower, and later this year we look forward to the opening of the luxe new 800-room Chairman Tower at Trump Taj Mahal. The mavens are betting that there's a huge market out there among the very rich who will be happy to indulge in the pleasures of AC's new offerings.

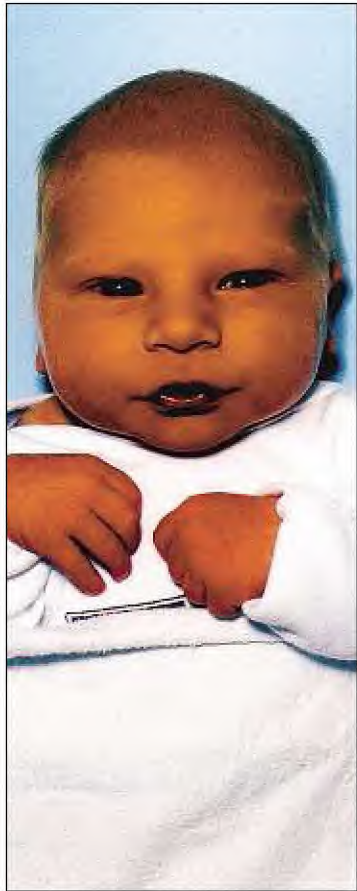

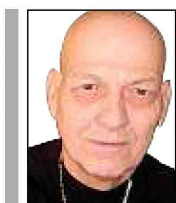

Mind safety practices on bikes, AAA advises

Warm weather and record-high gas prices are leading to an increase in motorcycle use. The AAA New Jersey Automobile Club reminds both motorcyclists and motorists to follow basic safety rules when sharing the road.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), 4,100 motorcyclists died and another estimated 70,000 were injured nationwide in traffic crashes in 2004. About 2,500 motorcycle crashes occur in New Jersey each year resulting in more than 50 fatalities and over 2,000 injuries, according to the Federal Highway Authority.

"Motorcyclists need to understand that motorists can't always see them; and motorists need to constantly be on the lookout for motorcyclists," said Hank Frank, Jr., the Club's external operations manager and a motorcycle-training instructor. "Since motorcycles are smaller than cars, it's hard for motorists to judge a motorcycle's speed or distance. It's important to always leave enough maneuvering space between and around vehicles."

AAA offers these tips for motorcyclists:

- Obey the laws and traffic signals. Don't ride after consuming alcohol, don't exceed the speed limit and communicate your intentions by using turn signals, hand signals and brake lights.

- Be visible to others. Wear reflective and/or bright colored clothing and use reflective materials on your bike and helmet, especially when riding at night or in bad weather. Always use your headlights - both day and night - and be sure to flash your brake

light when you're slowing down.

- Wear a helmet. According to NHTSA, head injury is the leading cause of death in motorcycle crashes. New Jersey law requires all motorcyclists to wear a helmet approved by the Department of Transportation. For more information on state requirements, log on to www.nhtsa.dot.gov.

- Wear additional protective clothing. Long pants, boots, gloves and a thick jacket all help to insulate and protect riders in the event of a crash.

AAA offers these tips for motorists:

- Look out for motorcycles. Pay

special attention when changing lanes, merging, turning or approaching an intersection or driveway. Since you can't always judge a motorcycle's speed, assume it's closer than it appears.

- Understand that motorcyclists may adjust their lane position for a reason. Debris in the road, wind or other factors affect two wheels differently than four. Don't assume that a motorcyclist who is moving around in the lane is trying to be aggressive - he's probably just being safe.

- Allow enough space. Even though a motorcycle is much smaller than a car, allow as much

space as you would for another car and never try driving beside a motorcycle in the same lane.

- Be respectful. Motorcycles may be more maneuverable than a car or truck, but they can't always stop or swerve out of your way, so treat them with the same respect as other vehicle operators.

A Field of Dreams for local Challenger players

Sometime around 11 a.m. this morning, a young boy, or girl, will step to the plate in one of baseball's most hallowed grounds. The youngster will wait for a pitch, swing, and begin a journey around the base paths that will be etched in the memory banks of family, friends and that particular youngster, long after the game ends.

It's not a matter of who wins, because every child is already a winner. And today, when members of the New Jersey District 8 Challenger Little League step onto the field at Yankee Stadium in the Bronx, it will mark an incredible accomplishment for children who have overcome more obstacles than most of us can ever comprehend.

"We are just so excited about this," said Marge Franco, the founder of the Essex County Chapter of the Challenger division. "When I told the kids in May that we were chosen to play at Yankee Stadium, there was excitement, tears and everything in between."

The Challenger Division accompanies children, ages 5 to 18, who have special needs. Whether those needs be neurological, physical, or mental, those children have a place to play baseball in Essex County. A majority of the players hail from Belleville, Bloomfield and Nutley, with Belleville having a large contingent of participants.

Twelve years ago, Franco and her husband, Rich, who reside in Belleville, were in the process of trying to get their daughter, Nicole, into a baseball program. Marge

Franco was aware of the Challenger concept, but knew there wasn't a league like that in the local area.

"It was either complain about the process, or do something about it," Franco said. "Rich and I decided to do something about it."

She began the process of looking for a field that could house the league, and found a willing participant from a field in Bloomfield.

"Basically, they said if we could build it, there would be a place for us to play," Franco recalled.

Once that was accomplished, it was a matter of raising funds for the league and Franco got a huge surprise from a most generous benefactor.

"I got a call from Wendy Giebler, who said she wanted to make a donation," Franco said. "I said I'd be more than happy to stop by and visit with her. I never

expected the donation that she gave us."

Wendy Giebler's husband, William, was onboard Pan Am Flight 103 on Dec. 21, 1988 when the plane, en route from London, to New York's JFK Airport, was destroyed by a bomb over Lockerbie, Scotland. All 259 on board were killed that day, as well as 11 on the ground.

Eight years after the tragedy, Wendy Giebler, who was residing in Essex Fells, had read about Franco's endeavor of bringing Challenger baseball to Essex County and presented Franco a check for \$20,000.

"Wendy told me that she and William loved baseball and wanted to have children one day," Franco said. "They were married less than a year when he died. Our field is named the J.R. Giebler Field, because everyone called him J.R.

Every year, Wendy still comes to our opening day ceremonies. She's remarried with three children. It's really special to see her every year."

For the last 12 years, Challenger baseball in Essex County has helped so many children gain self esteem and pride in their abilities.

"It's all about the kids," Franco said. "It's not political. We just want to see kids that are handicapped get the same chances that other kids get when it comes to playing baseball."

Franco credits Bloomfield Mayor Raymond McCarthy, as well as Bloomfield's Recreation Director, Anthony Nesto, and Glenn Dominic for their help in not only procuring the field, but this year helping to renovate it.

"They've done so much for us, and I can't thank them enough," Franco said. "There's something special about seeing these kids and

the way their eyes light up when they succeed in the sport. I can't tell you what that means to all of us."

And so today, the players from the Essex County Challenger league will take on the Bronx Challengers in a 1 1/2 inning game at Yankee Stadium. As everyone knows, this is the last season the New York Yankees will play at Yankee Stadium before moving to a new venue across the street in 2009. The Yankees have been playing there since 1923, with the exception of 1974 and 1975, when the stadium was being renovated and the team played its home games at Shea Stadium.

Yankee Stadium will host the 2008 All-Star game next Tuesday and today's Challenger game is one of the first activities planned for the All-Star celebration.

"We were invited a few months back by the official Little League representatives in Williamsport," Franco said. "I didn't want to tell the kids right away, in case something changed. But this past May, I told them. We're going to get there around 9:30 a.m. and get a tour of the stadium before we play. We can't wait. I can't imagine what it will be like to see those kids on that field."

The players from Belleville who will play at Yankee Stadium include Dawson Bloom, Daniel Boettinger, Jesse Bruno, Joseph Catalfamo and Donnie Chiappinelli. Players from Bloomfield, Nutley, Irvington, West Orange, Cedar Grove, Verona, East Orange, Glen Ridge, Newark and Livingston will also be on the field at Yankee Stadium.

Senior team faces big week

These kids are something special

They'll probably never be professional athletes, but for one day, the members of the New Jersey District 8 Challenger Little League will enjoy a moment in the sun that many established athletes will never savor.

Many of the players face live pitching, but some, who are vision impaired, can hit off a tee.

"Most of our kids face live pitching," Marge Franco said proudly. "The kids who hit off a tee do a great job, too. We don't keep stats. This isn't about anything other than the kids playing."

The players will wear specially made New York Yankees uniforms for their big day in the Bronx. While they'll be on the field for a short time, the memories will last a lifetime for those kids, their parents, friends and fans.

I'll be there today, and can't wait to see them play. In this world of high paid athletes and all the craziness of sports, it will be great to see a group of kids playing for the sheer joy of competition. And doing it in the greatest venue in professional baseball can only make it that much better.
