

Sparks fly over wider use of senior building

Council members and residents went back and forth at the last Township Council meeting discussing possible scenarios for the usage of the Senior Center on Franklin Avenue.

The dialogue started when councilman Michael Nicosia, who has gone on the record before concerning this topic, stated that he had met with a group of seniors and requested they come in front of the council to discuss their concerns. "I have asked the seniors to form a committee themselves and bring their issues to us. There are policies in place concerning the usage of that building that are out of our control," said Nicosia.

Many senior citizens were present at the meeting and once the floor was opened to the public several of them spoke. "The picking on the seniors that is going on has made me sick. I have seen this place on New Years and I can tell you it is full of people that would otherwise be home alone with nothing to do. This building gives them a place to go, be with friends, dance and bring the new year in with the company of others," said one Belleville senior. "It is a senior citizen building, leave it to them. Just leave the senior citizens alone. There is nothing for them in this town, why can't we just leave them alone? I plead with you, just leave the senior citizens alone."

Nicosia responded by again saying that he was not picking on the seniors but was actually looking for a way to help them. "Nothing would make me happier than if our seniors could use that building

every night. If that is the case, that is great. My parents are senior citizens and I know how important this building is for them," said Nicosia. "The reality is though I don't have a good answer for our taxpayers as to why they can't use the building on nights when it is vacant."

Following Nicosia's response, a Belleville resident spoke out representing the other side of the argument. "We have nowhere to bring our kids and hold our tricky trays. The building is a great building and it is open many nights and I see no reason why we can't use it. It is our tax dollars that support that building and it could greatly help our kids. We are only asking for a couple nights out of the whole year," said one Belleville resident who was at the meeting with her children. "It would be a perfect place for us to hold our tricky trays and raise money for the kids. Not letting us use this building is hurting our children and I must say I am very disappointed with my elected officials over this."

The audience cheered back and forth in support of each argument as Councilman John Notari responded by saying he was still in favor of keeping the building exclusive to seniors. "This has been a senior building for as long as I can remember and now all the sudden everyone wants to use it. Once we open it up at night by law we will have to open it up to all outside visitors in the county and that is something I don't want to happen," said Notari. "I know outside committees have been using other buildings for years and the high school cafeteria has become an option."

We must make sure all votes count

Although New Jersey has not been plagued by the accusations of improper voter disenfranchisement seen in many other states in the last decade – Florida in 2000, Ohio in 2004 – this year's presidential election does promise a huge turnout, perhaps a record-breaker, by some estimates. With the economy tottering and two wars not going especially well, people everywhere are focused on this election in a way that has not been seen in a generation or more. This is good – democracy works best when as many people as possible participate. But it also presents a challenge to those local and county officials who are entrusted with making sure every eligible vote gets counted.

Clerks in Essex County recently held a meeting to discuss how best to handle the waves of residents expected to show up at the election booths Nov. 4. Given that voters sometimes lose their eligibility for failing to register after a move, that voters who attend college can sometimes be confused about how exactly they should register and given that election officials must also guard against fraud (the dead have "voted" in parts of this country in the past), the clerks' job is considerable. It's encouraging to see county election officials taking a proactive approach, instead of trying to mop up a mess afterwards.

Voters must do their part too. It only takes a quick

phone call to ensure that you are registered to vote (and some people who are sure may be surprised to find that they are not). The county has received thousands of such calls in recent weeks. For many people who may not yet be squared away, there could still be time to ensure that their vote gets counted next month. Voters should also be on the lookout for their sample ballots, which come in the mail. If everyone else on the block has gotten one and you haven't, it's definitely time to check.

Like any other machinery, the mechanism of democracy is only as good as its simplest, most basic components. Not only officials but citizens too must make sure it's in good working order.

Belleville resident set to challenge Caputo

Incumbent Ralph Caputo will be facing a familiar opponent in the upcoming freeholder election when he squares off against Republican Andrew Blosschak.

Blosschak ran against Caputo 18 months ago when he tried to unseat Caputo as the county Assemblyman. Now he is running against him again, this time to obtain the seat as the Essex County 5th District Freeholder. "When I ran then I spent very little money on my campaign and I was still able to get 4,000-plus votes. This time around I have pumped a lot of my own time and money into this thing and am already seeing the results," said Blosschak. "Everything I do is out of my own pockets and my own timetable. I don't deal with donations or anything like that, I am my own person. When you start accepting donations people want something back when you get elected and that is not what I am about. I am about being my own person and doing what I think is right. No one will control or dictate my actions."

One of the main reasons Blosschak decided to run is the status of the American economy, which he acknowledged has a serious problem that may not end in the foreseeable future. "Essex County communities experienced a property tax increase of 17 percent. This is totally unacceptable, people in this area cannot afford tax raises like this and something needs to be done," said Blosschak. "Right now this county is controlled by a body entirely comprised of Democrats and they have become complacent and feel like they can do whatever they desire. I welcome the opportunity to be the lone Republican and offer a different view. I would not stand for what is going on now."

Blosschak believes that by being a Republican in a predominantly Democratic board, he could monitor any corruption or foul play going on. "This state has been plagued by corruption for years and it has to come to an end. I would love to blow the whistle on any of these guys if I saw something that wasn't right," said Blosschak. "Right now there have been 112 public officials in New Jersey that have been indicted, convicted and imprisoned for political corruption with some of them being Democrats from right here in Essex County. This nonsense has to end."

A longtime Belleville resident, Blosschak believes he can bring the view of the people into office because he is a middle class resident, like the majority of Essex County. "I worked for General Motors for 23 years, have been an electrician for 30 years and have four kids, all of whom have spent time in the Belleville school system. My wife works as a part time teacher, two of my kids are in college and two are in grammar school. I know what these rising taxes feel like and I want them to stop as much as anyone else and I will fight for the people of this county and I will be responsible and conservative with tax money," said Blosschak. "Mr. Caputo is out of touch with the working class, he does not know what it is like to be

in this situation. He has completely lost touch with reality."

Blosschak went on to say that he disagreed with Caputo holding two offices. "There are close to ten individuals who were grandfathered in when the law was made against this and Caputo was one of them. I was appalled by this. I took a look at his financial disclosure that he is required to give and I found out he is collecting Social Security, salaries from both offices and a teacher pension. He is getting money from all different corners that is coming to him from the taxpayers," said Blosschak. "He has no idea what it is like out there and it is time to get someone new in there who knows what is going on and has felt it."

While Blosschak admits that there is no clear-cut solution to the financial crisis, he believes he has a plan that can lessen the damage and steer the economy back in the right direction. "We have to have no more property tax increases for the next five years, we must freeze new job hiring and we have to eliminate all the phony jobs in politics that are nothing more than a title and a salary," said Blosschak. "I have been looking over some of the county ordinances and expen-

ditures and it is just crazy. This problem continues to grow and the spending just keeps on going. Business as usual while everyone else suffers. Businesses and more importantly people are leaving this state at an alarming rate and we have to do something to reverse this trend. This state is in big trouble and if we don't start doing something at the county level nothing will change."

Belleville takes part in annual Walk to School Day

A new event kicked off recently, designed to promote better health and safer passage by encouraging students and parents to leave cars and buses parked.

#4 Principal Paula) Mrs. Cummis had asked them to do. I saw a lot of mothers taking their kids into the schoolyard. It was really nice - something good."

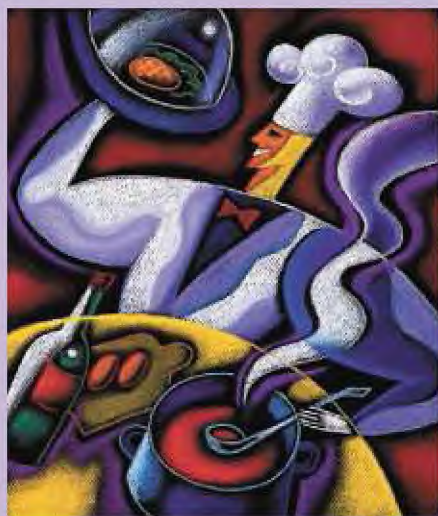
Kistner said the dignitaries were welcome to walk with parents, and the association sought parents to pledge to walk, so the students had some security in walking. Kistner said Belleville Police Capt. Anthony Romandetto was to provide a few extra police officers to ensure students' safety.

The event began at 8 a.m. with children, parents, and community leaders each walking from a designated meeting place located within one mile of the school. Kistner said previously that community wide participation in Walk to School events such as this one help to underscore the importance of issues such as increasing physical activity among children, pedestrian safety, traffic congestion and concern for the environment.

Board takes on school violence

With incidents of violence having more than doubled in the past year in district schools, Belleville's new interim Superintendent of Schools Melindo Persi outlined a series of initiatives to lower such acts in the future.

At Monday night's school board meeting, Persi reacted to a report that showed 56 incidents of violence for the 2007-2008 school year, up substantially from a number in the "high 20s" for the previous year, Persi said. There were also seven incidents involving weapons and three substance abuse incidents, the report states.

The breakdown of violent incidents shows 26 fights, 11 simple assaults, 11 instances of bullying, intimidation, harassment and threats and one criminal threat. With weapons, there were six instances of possession of other weapons and one incident of assault with other weapons.

The vandalism includes nine incidents of damage to property, one bomb threat, two burglary and theft cases and two instances of arson. Under substance abuse, there was one possession of marijuana, and two suspected use confirmed/possession of marijuana cases.

Persi began his comments by saying that while districts must track incidents and report them to the state, each year the numbers

vary for each district depending on the "level of intensity" of reporting.

"If we have a workshop on reporting incidents, the numbers go up," Persi said. "There are 4,400 students and 180 days, so do the multiplication. There are all kinds of possibilities."

He said that in the past when districts were not required to report, nothing was done.

"This is a wakeup call," Persi said. He said the district has started an analysis with the high school principal reviewing the situation in order to determine how to improve the situation.

In a more concrete proposal, Persi said Maurice Elias runs a social and emotional learning workshop and the superintendent intends to send two or three

administrators in November to learn how to implement a new program. The workshop is free, he said.

"We should be able to substantially reduce the number of inci-

dents and improve the social climate," Persi said.

There is also an educational resource center that the district can reach out to for grants to bring an additional psychologist, social worker and substance abuse coordinator to the district. The group could be housed in a central location and be available to assist both students and parents, starting the first year with the high school and bringing in the middle school in year two, Persi said.

For students that have trouble fitting in during regular school hours, Persi is proposing a 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. class schedule.

"It's a pay me now or pay me later situation," he said. "If students drop out of school, we end up paying a whole lot more."

School district to receive \$1 million in special ed funds

The district's special education department is in line for more \$1 million in federal grant money, while at the same time has completed a self-evaluation regarding what areas can be improved.

First, the Board of Education approved the submission of the IDEA Combined Grant, which covers the special education programs from this past Sept. 1 to Aug. 31, 2009.

The grant includes a request for \$1,024,291 for basic special education. Another \$23,076 is requested for pre-school, bringing the grant total to \$1,047,367.

The grant submission was approved at the Sept. 29 school board meeting.

School Board Administrator Edward Appleton said the IDEA grant is a special education grant aimed at special education districts with significant special education populations, such as Belleville.

"It's a staple, and one of the larger grants," Appleton said. "It's something we're due, and is anticipated in the 2008-2009 school budget."

He said the grant amount is based upon a report from the special education department completed in December 2007.

"The report contains all kinds of student information, and the grant

is allocated based upon that," Appleton said.

Dr. Joy Layng is the director of special services for the Belleville school district. She said the grant represents federal funding for special education.

"It's just automatic, and the district has to accept," Layng said. "That particular grant is overseen by the business administrator. It has got to be used for special education and also for non-public schools, including parochial and private schools where students are classified for special education."

Next, the board of education also approved the District Special Education Self-Assessment Document and Improvement Plan, and

authorized its submission to the New Jersey Department of Education through the Office of Special Education Programs. That was also approved at the Sept. 29 school board meeting.

Appleton said the district has been working on the self-assessment plan since the last school year.

"We finished the process," he said. "It notes what we are doing well, and what we'd like to do better."

Layng the state provides a model for the district to use, and was changed in the past several years.

"A state monitor used to check our procedures, but it was changed several years ago to a much

friendlier model," Layng said. "It had been monitored by the feds for several years. Now, we do our own assessment. We report that here we're doing everything right, while we need a little improvement here and maybe a lot of improvement here."

She said the process "has become very labor-intensive. It used to be all special ed questions. Now it's general, about principals and assessment tests."

Layng said that for the latest version, the district was chosen at random, but the system will be for districts "that have major issues."

"We were just picked out of a hat," she said.



Robin Williams stops at Borgata, Regis reigns at Harrah's

To counter the bad news out of Washington and Wall Street, there's a lot going on to cheer up visitors to Atlantic City this weekend. There's nothing like a good laugh to help dispel those Dow Jones blues!

Miscues lead to 46-21 setback

Belleville football coach Chris Strumolo didn't have to look too deep into his team's performance last Saturday against Paterson Kennedy to get to the root of the Bucs' 46-21 loss in Paterson.

"Mistakes," Strumolo lamented. "Simple as that. Too many mistakes, and you can't expect to win games in this league when you turn the ball over that many times. No excuses. We need to correct it and get back to work."

Belleville fell to 3-2 with the loss, its first to Paterson Kennedy since 2005. Belleville hopes to get back on track tomorrow night when Paramus comes to town for a 7 p.m. kickoff. This is also a big game for Paramus, which will come to Doc Ellis Field with a 2-3 record.

The Bucs fell behind 14-0 in the first half as Paterson Kennedy (3-2) capitalized on three key Belleville errors. The Passaic school recovered a Belleville fumble in the Buc-caneer end zone for a 6-0 lead. It then sacked the quarterback in Belleville's end zone for a safety and an 8-0 advantage in the second quarter, followed by a 60-yard interception return for a score which made it 14-0 by halftime.

"Even with that, we were still in the game," Strumolo said. "Our kids knew they could get back in and to their credit, they really battled."

In the third quarter, Paterson

Kennedy extended its lead to 20-0 before Belleville got into gear as Nick Herrman led the way. Herrman, a junior, threw a touchdown pass to Vin Wolf off the option to make it 20-7 after Mike Girgis' conversion kick. Paterson Kennedy answered that score with a touchdown of its own to open a 26-7 lead, but Belleville came right back when Herrman intercepted a pass and returned it 45 yards for a score, making it 26-14 following a Girgis conversion.

The Bucs got as close as 26-21 in the fourth quarter when James Colson hauled in a 22-yard scoring pass from Herrman. After Kennedy scored to make it 32-21, Belleville drove as close as the Knight three yard line, but an errant exchange between the center and quarterback led to a key turnover and two plays later, Kennedy put the game away when Daquine McGuire ran 96 yards for a score.

"That was a huge play," Strumolo said. "We're within three yards

of perhaps making it 32-29 after a two-point conversion and instead, they go up 39-21. It was a 15-point swing.

"Obviously, we need to work on the mistakes and I think we'll do that. We know we have a lot to play for. We're 3-2 and we have to get ready for a very good Paramus team on Friday. They have some good sized linemen, as well as talented runners with good speed. It will be a good test for us."

NOTES: This Friday's game between Belleville and Paramus will mark the 23rd consecutive meeting between the schools and, most likely, the last contest between the two for a while. With the new alignment set to take place next fall, it's doubtful the teams will meet on the gridiron in 2009 as Belleville will play a predominately Essex County schedule starting next fall while Paramus' slate will feature mostly Bergen County schools.

Paramus leads the series, 12-10, with Belleville's last win coming in 2006, a 28-26 thriller at Doc Ellis Field. Paramus has won 10 of the last 13 meetings between the schools.

Following tomorrow night's game, Belleville will face Paramus Catholic next Friday night, Oct. 31, at 7. Belleville's last game before the start of the post-season is on Nov. 7, when St. Anthony of Jersey City, a first-year program that is faring quite well, comes to Doc Ellis Field for a 7 p.m. contest.

D'Alessandro inducted into National Hall of Fame

It was June 1976 and the athletic program at Belleville High School was about to undergo some major changes. The long-time Athletic Director, Herman "Jitty" Wische, was going to retire and Jim Silvestri, the very popular wrestling coach at Belleville, was set to succeed him.

Silvestri had been a math teacher for a number of years and was well known to the students as an easygoing, very likable man. His legacy had already been cemented a few months earlier when he guided the varsity wrestling team to a 13-1 record, including a win for the ages over Pascack Hills, 29-25, in the final match of the '75-76 season. If you were in the gym that afternoon of Feb. 14, 1976, you'll remember it as an all time classic in which the Bellboys ended Pascack Hills' five-year mark of undefeated seasons in dual matches.

The Pascack Hills match was a fitting crescendo for Silvestri's coaching career. A year earlier, he had led Belleville to a 13-2 mark, including a 25-24 win over its most intense rival back then, Essex Catholic, and was later named the District 14 and Region 4 coach of the year.

I was a student at Belleville back

in those days and was already writing for this newspaper. I remember catching up with Jimmy in the hallway in June of '76 and asking him who would take over the wrestling program, now that he was being promoted to Athletic Director and would be giving up his coaching duties.

"We're very fortunate in that Gene D'Alessandro will be the new coach," Silvestri said to me that day.

I didn't know who D'Alessandro was and Jimmy was quick to provide me a few words about the new coach that I've never forgotten.

"He's a legend," Silvestri said of his successor. "One of the all time best coaches in New Jersey and we're lucky to get him. He'll put this program on another level."

As good a coach as Silvestri was, he also admitted to being somewhat a work-in-progress as he

learned how to coach wrestling. Silvestri had helped put Belleville wrestling on the map, now D'Alessandro would be the man to elevate it to a level never seen before in the land of Blue and Gold.

A fantastic wrestler during his high school days at St. Benedict's Prep in Newark and later at Rutgers University, D'Alessandro had built a juggernaut at Essex Catholic from 1962 through 1974 before enjoying success at Raritan for three years. Despite that, he was coming to a new school that had already found success under a popular coach and some wondered how he'd fare with a veteran team that had gone 26-3 the previous two seasons.

I'll never forget Dennis Villano, then a Belleville assistant wrestling coach, coming out of a practice early in that '76-77 season and just shaking his head.

"This guy is something else," Villano said of Belleville's new coach. "He's incredible. He has so much to offer and he teaches it really well."

And from there, D'Alessandro would go on to eight tremendous seasons as Belleville's coach, leading the Bellboys, and later the Buc-caneers, to a string of incredible

successes, including district and region championships. In 1980, Belleville crowned its first NJSIAA champion in Chris Musmanno.

D'Alessandro retired as coach in 1985 with an overall coaching mark of 212-67-2. He coached six state finalists, 15 regional and 92 district champions in his 23-year coaching career.

This past Sept. 21, D'Alessandro was inducted into the New Jersey Chapter of the National Wrestling Hall of Fame for his lifetime service to wrestling. A large contingent of former Belleville wrestlers were on hand at Rider University to pay homage to the man who taught them not only about wrestling, but about character and life in general. Among them were state champions Musmanno and 1988 gold medalist Armando Nardone, as well as standouts like George Ritacco, Ben Dominguez, Dominic Cerreto, Lou Pomponi, Gerard Minichini, Rob Villano, George D'Allesandro and Tom Graziano.

Colleagues of D'Alessandro were also on hand to congratulate their friend, including former Belleville baseball coach George Zanfini, former basketball coach Danny Grasso, current Belleville

wrestling coach Joe Nisivoccia, who joined D'Alessandro's staff as an assistant in 1979, Dennis Villano, who today is the Belleville Assistant Superintendent of Schools and Joe Zarra, a Belleville High School graduate and former assistant wrestling coach who is today the Nutley Superintendent of Schools. In addition, former Belleville teachers George Tortorello, Ralph Kobberger and Tony DeAquino, former Belleville recreation coach Gerard Rispoli and former Belleville assistant wrestling coach Mark Zarro were in attendance.

And, of course, Gene and his extended family were on hand to enjoy the festivities, as well as many coaches and wrestlers he molded at Essex Catholic and those he competed with while at student at St. Benedict's.

Gene D'Alessandro was always a man of humility who never spoke of his accomplishments but only those of the young men he coached. Well, Gene, this is all about you, because you deserve this wonderful accolade.

Thank you for what you did at Belleville High and best wishes for continued good health and happiness.

may result and lead to ulceration and possibly even amputation. Neuropathy can also cause deformities such as bunions, hammer toes, and charcot foot.

It is very important for diabetics to take the necessary precautions to prevent all foot related injuries. Due to the consequences of neuropathy, daily observation of the feet is critical. When a diabetic patient takes the necessary preventative footcare measures, it greatly reduces the risks of serious foot conditions.

Inspect your feet daily for blisters, cuts, and scratches. The use of a mirror can aid in seeing the bottom of your feet. Always check between your toes. Wash you feet daily. Dry carefully, especially between your toes. Avoid extreme temperatures. Test water with your hands or elbow before bathing. If your feet feel cold at night, wear socks. Inspect the insides of your shoes daily for foreign objects, nail points, torn linings, and rough areas.

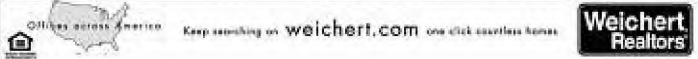



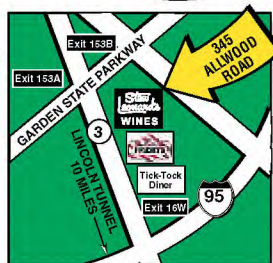

Could you lay down your life for Christ?

Recently I was made aware of a poster that shows the top half of the face of a lion. Above and below the lion's eyes, it reads, "It didn't end at the Roman Coliseum. Christians still die."

can count.

God's people have been persecuted ever since Cain killed Abel. That event set a pattern for the rest of history.

And, ever since the stoning of Stephen in Acts 7 and the great persecution that scattered the church in Acts 8, the church has endured great tribulation, distress and suffering.

Of the world's over six billion people: 151 million claim to be atheists, 2 billion are Christians, 1.2 billion are Muslims, 786 million are Hindus and 362 million are

Buddhists. Literally hundreds of thousands of people today are being killed, brutalized, sold as slaves, imprisoned, tortured, hands cut off so they cannot work, threatened, discriminated against and arrested solely because they are Christians.

Jesus said in Luke 18:8, "When the Son of Man comes, will He really find faith on the earth?" Note that He doesn't say 'if' He comes, but 'when' He comes. The Bible teaches that He will come "like a thief in the night," when we least expect Him. Therefore, we

should get to know our persecuted family. And through their example, learn anew how to cherish the gift of the Gospel above everything else and be willing to give up all we have in order to possess this gift and spread it to the ends of the earth.

We may forget our persecuted brothers and sisters worldwide; but God does not forget the blood of these martyrs!

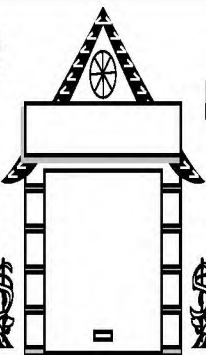
