# Resident questions validity of no tax hike

Questions were debated at a recent council meeting about whether a virtually zero tax increase budget is tainted because the council deferred \$2.3 in pension payments that will have to be paid for down the line.

The Belleville Township Council has introduced the 2009 municipal budget, at this point containing virtually no tax increase from

Resident Vincent Frantantoni said that by deferring the pension payment, "We will pay more in future years. It's like early retirement was years ago, a liability down the line."

At-Large Councilman Kevin Kennedy asked, "How many times did vou lower taxes?" a reference to Frantantoni's time as mayor and commissioner before the change in the form of government more than two decades ago.

Mayor Raymond Kimble took exception to Frantantoni's comparing the council to the school board, which did not defer pension payments and ended up with an average \$84 tax increase that led to a school budget defeat. The coun-

# What's next for the Friendly House site?

Two questions are at the forefront of the demolition of the Friendly House in Silver Lake. First, officials need to answer whether or not the facility could still have been used more effectively and completely if it had been properly maintained during the past two decades.

Secondly, something must be built to replace the structure for those who live in the Silver Lake section and for everyone in a township where there is not enough recreation space and facilities.

As for maintaining the more than three-quarters of a century old building, with asbestos and lead paint, the facility might be too antiquated to be saved over the long haul without throwing good money after bad. Still, for more than a year,

the building has languished, leaving youngsters without an important recreation option.

The fact that the swimming pool went about 20 years without being used is even more frustrating of a question. It seems that proper maintenance of the facility from bottom to top would have provided a higher quality level of recreation use up until the time that old furnaces and dangerous building materials made it's continued use ill-

Now, it is a moot point, and the new question of what to do to replace the structure comes to the forefront. First Ward Councilwoman Marie Strumolo Burke, a lifetime activist for the Silver Lake section, has some serious questions that

need answers.

First, is NJTransit ever going to make good on a promise to build a recreation center along with a new firehouse in Silver Lake? If so, how will they make sure that the fire engines do not put youngsters using a recreation facility in danger?

Rather than wait for a facility that may never come and has safety issues, Burke wants to solicit Essex County funding to build some kind of new structure on the site of the current Friendly House. This may be feasible, and is certainly worth pursuing. If NJTransit ever builds another recreation facility, then the township will have more for youngsters to use instead of having no where in Silver Lake to play.

### Clara Maass performs glaucoma surgery

America, it is estimated that more than 4 million Americans have glaucoma, one of the leading causes of blindness.

For the first time in New Jersey, patients with glaucoma have a surgical therapy option known as Trabectome. The minimally invasive procedure is available at Clara Maass Medical Center, an affiliate of the Saint Barnabas Health Care System, located in Belleville.

"The purpose of Trabectome surgery is to lower eye pressure by removing the obstruction of the flow of internal eye fluid thereby restoring the eye's natural drainage pathway." said Dr. Paul J. According to Prevent Blindness the eye. If untreated, it may damage the optic nerve, causing the loss of peripheral vision or blindness.

Vision loss caused by glaucoma cannot be restored. Treatments, such as Trabectome, aim to reduce eye pressure to prevent further damage to the optic nerve.

Trabectome is a FDA-cleared device for minimally invasive surgical treatment of glaucoma. 

Later, resident Diane Rothwell said she has researched the town.

They said there is to be a large and 365 homes are on the market, and some 195 are in some form of foreclosure, with 80 on the market at least 180 days, and prices have dropped anywhere from \$5,000 to \$100,000.

"You can't afford any more houses on the market," Rothwell said. She also said she was concerned about all of the proposed development and the effect it could have bringing children to already overcrowded schools.

Canning said the developments are designed not to attract families with children, and disagreed with Frantantoni that a ball field could successfully be placed at the site of the 55 and up development. Nicosia also said the developments are being done responsibly to mix commercial with less residential and not cause a major influx into schools.

The redevelopment plan supersedes all existing zoning regulations, according to the ordinance.

Canning has called it "shameful" that no housing exists for people 55 and over.

Florence Pentol, a senior citizen, has said previously that people can't afford to purchase the units. so they will be rented "to anybody, that age 55 and up "is not a senior," and that many will find it cheaper to stay in their residential homes.

Canning has said calling the project not for seniors "is a play of words," and if the units are properly subsidized the project will help a lot of residents who are not 65 but need help.

Canning has said the parking may become an issue because many who were prepared to retire may now have to keep working because of the economic downturn and their savings, so they may need a car to go to work. There have been assurances by the developer, however, that the tenants will not be permitted to park at the senior center, he said.



BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MUNICIPAL
COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF BELLEVILLE, NEW JERSEY:
The Township of Belleville Employee Handbook is hereby amended as follows:
Township Paid Cellular Phones:
Where job or business needs demand immediate access to an employee, the Township may provide a business cell phone to an
employee for work related communications. employee for work related communications.

To protect the employee from incurring tax liability for the personal use of this equipment, such phones are to be used for business reasons only. Cell phones are NOT to be used for text messages and/or internet access.

Each employee will be provided with a plan Each employee will be provided with a plan that allows a specific number of minutes on a monthly basis. If an employee exceeds the allowable monthly minutes, the employee will be responsible for reimbursing the Township for the overage charge. The employee may provide reimbursement through an authorized payroll deduction or via personal check. If the overage is due to business use, the employee should notify the township so alternative plans may be reviewed.

employee should notify the township so alternative plans may be reviewed.

Employees in possession of Township equipment such as a cellular phone is expected to protect the equipment from loss, damage or theft. Upon resignation or termination of employment, or at any time upon request, the employee may be asked to produce the phone for return or inspection. Employees unable to present the phone in good working condition within the time period requested, may be requested to bear the cost of a replacement.

Personal Cellular Phones
Employees should limit personal calls during
work time to no more than one per day as
needed. Excessive personal calls during the
workday, regardless of the phone used, can
interfere with employee productivity and may
be distracting to others. Flexibility will be
provided in circumstance demanding immediate attention.


