





Some Friendly House good news: demolition may cost less

There has been little in the way of good news regarding the former recreation center known as the Friendly House in Silver Lake.

The closest thing to a positive may be accepted was much less than what the township manager had expected.

After a winter where the interior was not heated, paint is peeling everywhere, black mold is growing and a once thriving facility has been allowed to deteriorate to the point that the Belleville Township Council has voted to demolish the structure. But at least that may be done cheaper than first thought.

Interviews with two council ager reveal the frustration that more than 20 years of neglect and forced the demolition, with competing ideas about what to do next. One longtime critic of what he called "intentional neglect" said the facility could have been saved if proper maintenance had been done.

First Ward Councilwoman Marie Strumolo Burke, who represents the Silver Lake sections, said she wants another structure, even if only one floor, to be built in place of the existing Friendly House.

Cell phone rules meant to curb employee abuse

Some say talk is cheap, but in Belleville, that is not always true. In an ongoing effort to minimize waste in local government spend-

employees can and can't do with their cell phones.

'We're tracking things we never have before," Canning said. "We found some employees abusing texting and their town cell phones - nothing egregious."

So now there is a policy, which Canning called "a valuable tool."

"The phones are meant to be used for work only, not for personal use," he said.

With a policy in place, offending employees can be held responsible, Canning said.

"Now, if they're caught, they can't say I didn't know about it," he said. "I can say, 'Here, you signed for it? They knew what they were doing was improper."

The change is just part of making taxpayer money used more efficiently, Canning said.

"This was one thing we had to do," he said. "It's another thing to try and keep costs down."

The ordinance first explains that, "Where a job or business needs demand immediate access for an employee, the township may provide a business cell phone to an employee for work related communications."

The ordinance specifies that to protect the employee from incurring a tax liability for the personal use of a phone, the phones are to be used for business reasons only. Cell phones are not to be used for text messaging or Internet access, the ordinance states.

Each employee is to be provided with a plan that allows a specific number of minutes on a monthly basis, and if an employee exceeds the allowable monthly minutes, the employee is to be responsible for reimbursing the township for the overage charge, the ordinance states.

If the overage is because of business use, the employee should notify the township so alternative plans can be reviewed. Employees are expected to protect the equipment

from loss, damage or theft, and the employee may be asked to produce the phone for return or inspection at any time, upon request, or if the employee resigns or is terminated, according to the ordinance.

Employees should limit personal calls during work time to no more than one per day as needed. Excessive personal calls during the workday, regardless of the phone used, can interfere with employee productivity and may be distracting to others, according to the ordinance. Flexibility is to be provided circumstances demanding immediate attention.

The township will also not be liable for the loss of personal cell phones brought into the workplace, the ordinance states.

The ordinance will become official after a public hearing and publication in the newspaper.





As believers we have a blessed hope to which we look forward. It is the return of our Lord Jesus Christ to usher in his kingdom in all its fullness. When we read the word hope in the New Testament we forget that we have to go to the Greek to understand its meaning. When we say "hope" we generally mean something that might come to pass. For example; we hope to win the lottery. We certainly don't expect to win but we hope we might win. Although out chances of winning are remote yet we still "hope."

But there is a verse in the Bible in Titus 2:13 (New International Version) says, "While we wait for the blessed hope-the glorious appearing of our great God and savior, Jesus Christ."

The word "hope" in this verse in the original Greek means something that will, absolutely, positively come to pass. So when it refers to the return of Christ as our blessed hope, it is referring to something that we can count on coming to pass. It is an absolute certainty. Most people are not interested in studying Bible prophecy. Most do not realize that
