

Mayor Padula's Letter Concerning Air Route

Recently received at the office was a copy of a letter written by Mayor Isadore J. Padula, addressed to Air Transport Co-ordinated Committee, New York. Context of the letter was as follows:

"This is to call to your immediate attention a deplorable situation created by numerous planes flying low over this municipality.

"You will recall that under an agreement made in November of 1952 between the Belleville Town Officials and Mr. L. L. Barnes, Executive Secretary of the Air Transport Co-ordinated Committee, during the height of the Newark Airport dispute, planes were to have been routed over the Kearny Meadows at an altitude of not less than 2,000 feet and over a course designed to bypass much of Belleville. In the interest of progress, the citizens agreed to this plan, and over a period of several years, have withstood further complaints. However, the situation has grown continuously worse, until at present it is intolerable and as a result my office has been swamped with just justified complaints.

"Planes are not only flying dangerously low, but with almost highway traffic frequency, vibrations from which cause television sets to blink out, radios to run and house furnishings to rattle alarmingly. Worse still, the running noise constitutes a form of irritation highly destructive to the well being of the sick and aged.

"Frankly, this situation constitutes a health, peace and safety hazard which can no longer be accepted. Therefore, I am requesting that a representative from your office meet with a committee of

Mr. Hensinger will work with the advisory committee to make the adult school a more vital part of community life. Plans are now being made to make an intensive effort to acquaint the entire community with the offerings of the adult school. Working with the advisory committee, the new director will secure the services of the best instructors available in the Belleville area.

Plans are also being made to help adults complete the requirements for high school equivalent certificate issued by the State of New Jersey. The equivalent of four years of high school education can be established by means of passing academic examinations under the Division of Academic Credentials of the State of New Jersey Department of Education. Special courses will be offered in the adult school to help students prepare for these examinations. Plans are being made to offer courses in English and history in the fall term, beginning September 24. Counseling service will be available to all adults interested in completing the requirements for

the equivalency certificate. In cases where some high school work earned by the State Department of Education, information concerning where and when examinations will be given will also be made available at the adult school. A total of 28 additional courses will also be made available at the adult school.

A total of 28 additional courses will also be offered in the fall term. Registration dates are September 15, 17, and 20 at the high school. Registration may also be completed by mail. Brochures will be distributed to all residents of Belleville early in September. These brochures will give complete details concerning courses offered, instructors, and fees.

route Terry Street. Another ramp will connect the northbound freeway lanes with Main Street at the foot of Little Street.

Overpass bridges will be constructed at Rutgers Street and where the freeway will pass over the Terry Street ramp connection. As a flood control measure, the project includes deepening the existing channel of the Passaic River approximately 180 feet north of the Belleville Turnpike bridge to a point 1,100 feet upstream.

To protect the new roadway construction from the beginning point of the project to main highway, there will be approximately 2,500 linear feet of steel pile seawall constructed adjacent to the freeway. The balance of the project will be protected

by rip-rap slope protection at the river's westerly edge.

The entire project is to be completed within 360 working days after the contract has been awarded and fully executed. The bids are being reviewed by Highway Department and Bureau of Public Roads engineers before the contract is awarded.

The probable forecast is for cooler weather, as witnessed by yesterday's temperatures, and less humid, as the heat wave seems to be on its "last leg."

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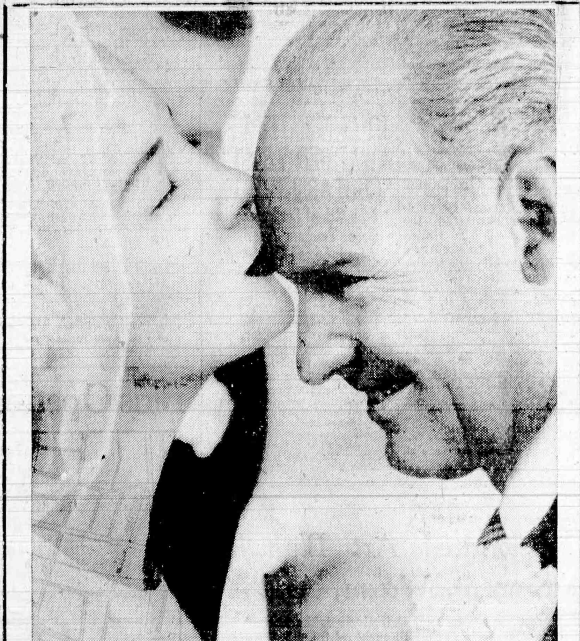
