'I have to help my brother!'

Boy, 5, rescues mother, infant

Ryan Lopez, 5, is a hero. He crawled through the window of the overturned car in which his mother and little brother were trapped, ran to a highway and flagged down passing motorists to get help.

The incident happened off Route 208 in Fair Lawn on the Friday after Thanksgiving.

Heather Meier Lopez, who was born and raised in Belleville, was driving to Oakland to pick up her husband, Ben, at 5:45 p.m.

With her, in car seats, were Ryan and his brother, Aaron, 10 months old.

"A black Pathfinder passed me on the left and cut me off," Mrs. Lopez said.

"I swerved to the right, and hit the curb."

The car, a 1990 Mercury Topaz, rolled over three times, landing on its roof on the lawn before the Kodak plant.

"I had a concussion. The children were hanging upside down in their car seats.

"Then I heard Ryan screaming for me. He began shouting, 'I have to get help! I have to help my brother!'"

"He couldn't get Aaron out of his straps, but he got loose, and he crawled through a window and walked to the shoulder. He started waving cars down."

When Ryan returned to his Kindergarten day care class at Harvest Christian Academy in Paterson, he was acclaimed as a hero.

"He did such a good thing, he

was so smart," his mother said. "He's getting so much praise I'm afraid he's getting a swelled head."

A visit to the classroom where Ryan stays with his friends, while his mother works in the business office of St. Joseph's Hospital, brought cheers from the kindergartners.

"He's a hero!" a little boy said.

The whole operation will cost Auriemma about \$20,000, but he does this for the kids.

Auriemma is keeping up the 56 year tradition that his father started and will continue to do so for some time, he said.

On Dec. 19 Santa will visit his home and will be greeting children of all ages for last minute gift requests.

Santa will be available to greet the kids from 6 p.m. till 10 p.m.

NJ Transit says man stepped in front of train to face death

A Bloomfield man died under the wheels of an NJ Transit commuter train, Monday morning.

The tragedy occurred in Belleville at 7:20 a.m., 500 feet east of Willet Street, Bloomfield.

The deceased was identified as Edward Hill, 57, of Willet Street.

A spokesperson for NJ Transit said that the train's engineer first saw Mr. Hill standing beside the track.

The engineer then saw Mr. Hill step on to the track, in the path of the oncoming train, according to the spokesperson.

The train was the 1070, out of

Hackettstown for Hoboken. The engineer sounded the warning horn and applied the train's emergency brakes. The spokesperson said it requires a half mile or more to stop the train, and the engineer was unable to halt the train in time.

The engineer informed the NJ Transit central dispatcher of the fatality. Belleville police came to the scene, as did NJ Transit police.

Officers said they were horrified at the sight of the severed body they found.

Service on the Boonton Line through Belleville was halted for two hours.

A train backed up from

Hoboken to pick up the passengers of the 1070. Trains coming behind it halted at Montclair to allow passengers to walk to the Bay Street station and take a train to New York. Altogether, nine trains were affected by the shutdown.

The spokesperson for NJ Transit said it was the second fatality this year on the Boonton line. On Aug. 8, a pedestrian was killed at the Park Street crossing.

There have been 21 fatalities this year on NJ Transit lines.

The Essex County Medical Examiner will rule on whether the death was suicide or an accident.

They help bring the color of the homeland into the house where the music and culture of her Castilian heritage mold the life of a talented young lady.

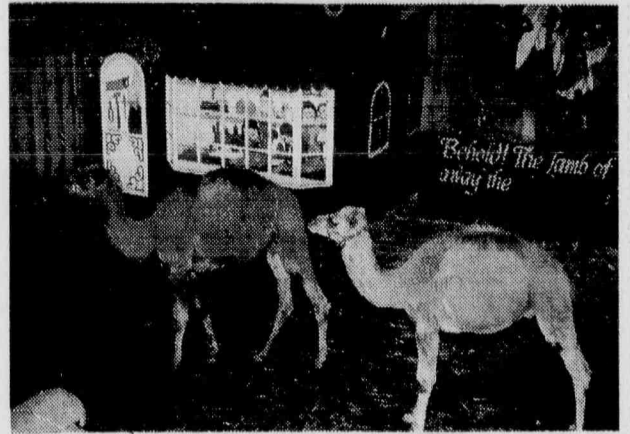

OUR OPINION

October 27, 1998

Next year will mark the 200th anniversary of the launching of a steamboat from Belleville down the Passaic River to Newark.

The date was Oct. 27, 1798. The 60-foot craft, the Polacca, was built by the Joralemon Shipyard. The engine was built in Belleville by a consortium that included Josiah Hornblower, Nicholas Roosevelt, Robert Livingston, Philip Schuyler and Robert Stevens.

It worked fine, for three miles, until the powerful engine began to shake the ship apart. Among the passengers was the Spanish Ambassador, who was so impressed by the feat that he ordered a similar engine for his country.

It also resulted in the starting of the first factory in America to make steam engines, 17 of which left the shop in Soho for points as far as Philadelphia and Manhattan.

This first application of American steam technology was to lead in several directions.

Stevens went on to found the American railroad industry. Roosevelt and Livingston went on to pioneer steamboating. Roosevelt went on to develop steam pumps for reser-

voirs, and steam was ultimately to become the driving force in American industrial development.

By 1895, America was declared to be the greatest industrial power in the world, outstripping Europe, where steam had first made its appearance.

Even electricity was based on steam power, because steam powered turbines generated most of the nation's electricity.

It was in Belleville that the modern steam engine was developed, making possible the transportation and manufacturing progress that created a new nation.

Belleville is where it started. Belleville is where the anniversary of the launching of the Polacca should be celebrated.

We urge the Congress to authorize a postage stamp honoring the event. We urge seminars on the event. We urge the Township Council to consider it a prime goal for the coming year.

It is not Belleville's only claim to fame. But it provides the occasion for a fresh look at our past, and a program for its future.

Burn, that's right, burn the leaves!

While our own highly unofficial public opinion survey indicates that we face real danger of violence for doing so, we hereby demand an end to the barbarous custom of blowing, bagging and bundling stupid leaves. Burn 'em!

Even if society does not permit us to just let them lie there - did the Native Americans ever bag leaves? - there is a more cost effective way of getting rid of them.

We literally spend hundreds of thousands of dollars to remove leaves, which are going to decay into mulch in any case, to say nothing of money for fines, inspectors, bags and backache remedy.

Stop it now! Never mind the nattering nabobs of nitwitty who paint pictures of air pollution, fires raging out of control and maniacal arsonists on the loose.

We recall the pungent odor of burning leaves that once heralded the closing days of Autumn. People did not fall gagging to the streets. Our parents somehow managed to control the fires they set. The leaves quietly went to glory as they would have wanted, in a

hero's pyre, not in a plastic bag. What kind of respect for leaves is that?

The deciduous leaf - we do not worry about the evergreen pine needle - bursts forth in Spring to announce the rebirth of our world, shelters us in Summer against the rays of a benevolent but unscientifically adjusted sun, converts the auto exhausts of a nation into carbon dioxide and oxygen and then prepares to rejoin its ancestors.

Perhaps it would prefer to return to the soil from whence it sprung, except that our real estate is running out, and the quicker we get rid of the leaf, the better.

The brilliance of this simple idea has left public officials thunderstruck, Fire Department officers mumbling and scavenger firms threatening to take steps.

What care we, when the public good is involved?

Look, we burned the leaves before, and the nation survived war and depression. Now, we burn our dollar bills to ashes to get rid of the leaves.

Which makes the more sense?

Keep the kids home?

The State Legislature, in the great tradition of the political posturer, is attempting to enact a bill that would prohibit minors from door-to-door selling, in the wake of the tragedy that took a boy's life in Jackson Township.

The legislators are well aware that the fault did not lie with fund-raising efforts that have been providing needed funds for school activities for generations. It lay with the state's failure to institutionalize the troubled youth who committed the crime.

The terrible danger that lies in society, whether it is an Unruh committing wholesale murder, or a List who quietly massacres his own family, is something that no Legislature - least of all our Legislature - can reasonably be expected to foresee or prevent.

Perhaps the day may come when the loonies of this world will be detected and apprehended before they act.

The lawmakers would be better advised to insist on adult supervision of children who are fund raising door-to-door. But there is no guarantee that a maniac would not do harm to an adult who happens to ring the doorbell.

There is a sentiment among many who are displeased with the public school system as we know it to do anything to embarrass it.

One way to do that is to shackle the parent-teacher organizations which regularly raise money for good causes.

Belleville has benefited with everything from electric fans to school supplies, because of the parent-teacher organizations.

There are those who see these organizations as barriers to their own agendas.

Whatever the excuse, the elimination of door-to-door fund raising by school children is a grandstanding effort that typifies the politician but damages the school child.

gency response team, the Essex County freeholder board has exhausted all funds to purchase any new equipment within this year's fiscal budget.

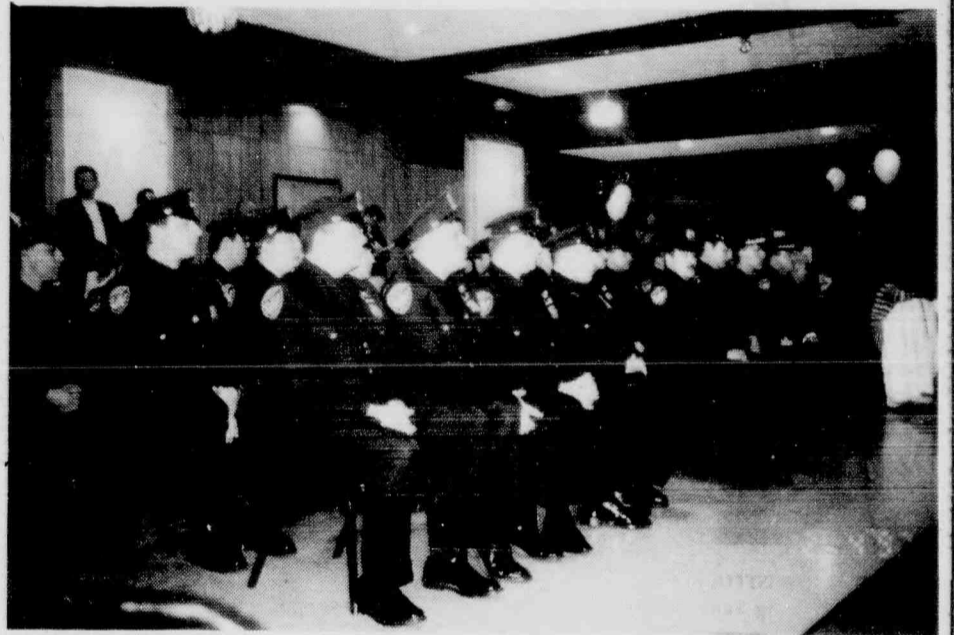
In order to perform our job effectively and safely, the officers are in need of bullet-proof tactical vests. These vests range between \$1,000 to \$1,200 each.

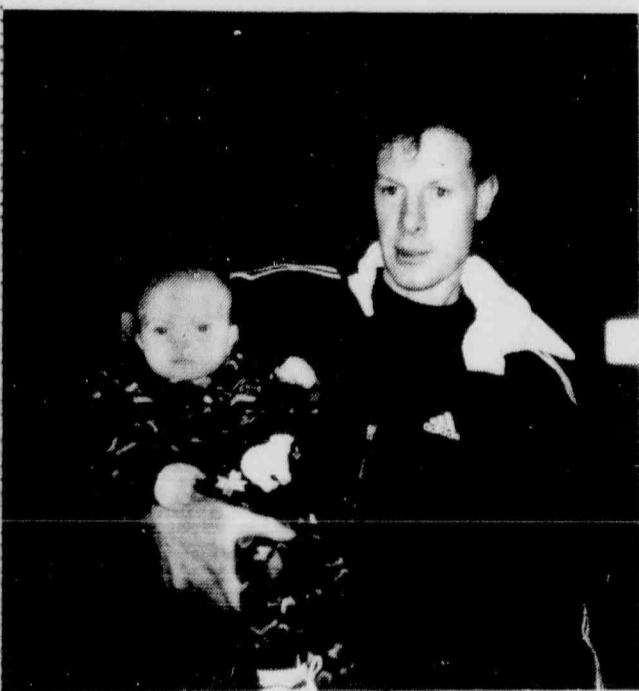

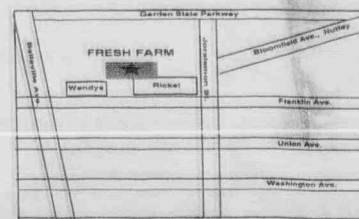

Four Bucs selected to quad-town football team

Seniors Farina, Abidelli and Sheridan go out in style

The area's high school football teams had some tough times this past season.

Nutley finished with a 4-5 record. Bloomfield was 3-6. And both Glen Ridge and Belleville didn't manage any wins.

But each team had its share of talented players on both sides of the ball, and with Bloomfield and Nutley leading the way, that is reflected in this year's Orechio Publications quad-town all-star football team.

The all-star squad is comprised of players from the high schools covered by The Nutley Sun, Belleville Times, Bloomfield Life and Glen Ridge Voice.

VonRoth finished the season averaging 5.3 yards per carry and seven touchdowns, and scored the game-winning touchdown against Belleville on Thanksgiving to give Nutley its fourth win of the season — slightly separating the two teams in terms of wins.

However, if Immersi played against Paramus, he could have made a difference when Bloomfield lost in overtime to Paramus. He may have helped against Montclair as well, despite the teams' apparent size and strength differences.

Because Nutley did improve on its dismal 2-7 record from last year, head coach Rich SanFillippo deserves some of the credit. With senior quarterback Anthony Greco out for the first four games, SanFillippo needed to make adjustments and received some fine play from a lot of players during that stretch.

The team may have not won much, but Bloomfield head coach Mike Carter also had a big task — keeping his players' attitudes high when the team was in shambles. Besides Immersi being out for the last three games, more than a handful of players played hurt throughout the season.

Lineman Jason Zichelli missed the first few games, and a number of other top players missed games during the season because of injuries. Just getting his players ready to play each week is enough to make Carter a Coach of the Year selection.

Again, it's a rarity but necessary in this case. SanFillippo and Carter have been selected as the Coaches of the Year.

Anthony Greco

Expecting to have another big season such as the one he had last year, Greco missed the first four games with an elbow injury. He came back and posted some good numbers — 31 completions for 486 yards and three touchdowns. The senior's skill and experience helped a lot during the last five games of the season.

Mark Gengaro

A big player with quite a bit of mobility, the junior quarterback

managed some big passes during the season. His numbers may not have been huge — 28 completions for 404 yards — but Gengaro also didn't hurt the offense with bad decisions. He threw four touchdown passes and ran in for two more.

Brent Vonroth

One half of the Player of the Year selection, Vonroth not only posted 469 yards on 89 carries and seven touchdowns, but also was one of the leaders of the team. He was an influence on defense as well and caught seven passes for 68 yards as a receiver out of the backfield.

Joe Immersi

The other end of the Player of the Year selection, Immersi was a consistent force in the Bloomfield backfield. He played with a lot of fire and also played well on the defensive side. He had 119 carries for 498 yards and seven touchdowns, and made 53 tackles and posted a sack.

John Quinn

One of the unsung heroes on a winless Glen Ridge team, Quinn managed 538 total yards between rushing, receiving and special teams. As one of the team captains, Quinn was an effective part of both the offense and defense, playing consistently on both sides.

Rich Jasnowitz

The other captain of the Nutley squad, Jasnowitz was the team's best receiver with 26 catches for 420 yards and five touchdowns. Jasnowitz made some tremendous catches this season, and was a major part of the team because of his passion and experience.

John Farina

Belleville's best receiver, Farina was consistently productive throughout the season despite playing on a winless squad. He helped make the big plays during the team's annual Thanksgiving Day clash with Nutley, which went into overtime. On offense that didn't score much, Farina was a big-time player.

Ed Rochacewicz

A fine two-way player, Rochacewicz often managed to come up with big plays as a blocking tight end when his team needed a lift. As a tight end, he was partially responsible for opening holes for the Bengal running backs. On defense, he had 25 tackles.

Ryan MacAvery

A consistent performer on both offense and defense for Glen Ridge, MacAvery managed 18 receptions for 212 yards and a pair of touchdowns. He also made 40 tackles as a defensive lineman, and was an experienced player on a young team that didn't find a way to win.

Mike Debarbieri

One of three Bloomfield offensive linemen who made our all-star squad, Debarbieri also was very much responsible for opening holes for the running backs as well as protecting Gengaro from opposing defensive linemen. Carter referred to Debarbieri as a "hard worker who was dependable."

Peter Graziano

A two-way lineman, Graziano was very good on the offensive side when helping create holes for the Nutley running backs, especially Vonroth and George Duffy. The senior also was a solid defensive player and managed quite a number of really good plays in a few games.

Jason Martinello

Another Bloomfield offensive lineman, Martinello played both

sides of the line for the Bengals and was equally good. A tough player with quick feet, the senior also played a big part in opening holes for Immersi and the rest of the running backs.

Anthony Marcantuono

A junior offensive lineman, Marcantuono had a solid season helping protect the Belleville quarterbacks. And like every other lineman, he played an important role when opening holes for the running backs. Already with good size and strength, Marcantuono should be even better next season.

Eric Storm

One of only three juniors on the all-star squad's offensive team, Storm also was really good on both sides of the ball. The running game was productive because this big guy was part of a solid offensive line. He also played a little at tight end — catching four passes for 60 yards. On defense, he posted 37 tackles and three sacks.

Dan Rabbitt

When a senior is a place kicker on a winless squad, there may not be much to say for him. But that's not the case here, as Rabbitt was darn good on extra points and kicked an important field goal during one of Glen Ridge's more competitive games this season. He was one of just five kickers in Essex County to kick a field goal this season.

Mike Tesei

One of five juniors on the defensive squad, Tesei was a big player on the defensive line for the Raiders. He had four number of fumble recoveries and made some big hits during the season. Tesei had 47 tackles and three sacks.

Jason Zichelli

He missed half the season, and was sorely missed on defense during that time. The senior defensive lineman came up with a lot of big plays and was a positive influence on the sidelines during his hiatus. In the four games he played, Zichelli posted 27 tackles and two sacks.

Dan Munson

Also a productive running back, Munson excelled a bit more on defense for the Ridgers. The junior managed 68 tackles for a defense that received a lot of time on the field. Next season, he could be one of coach Jim Cowan's best players.

Robert Sikora

His name was mentioned a lot by the public address announcer because he seemed to be in on a lot of plays. The senior defensive end was very good against the run as well as a good pass rusher. Carter called Sikora a steady force on defense, and it showed. He posted 28 tackles and a sack.

Rich Hudnett

Here's a player that always seemed to be a force on defense. For the most part, if Hudnett wasn't in on a play or making one, he wasn't too far away. The senior was a good offensive lineman as well.

George Duffy

Also a fine running back, the junior posted 434 yards on 74 carries and five touchdowns. But Duffy also was a tremendous linebacker with 76 tackles, three fumble recoveries and a pair of interceptions.

Shamar Robinson

Another one of the juniors on the all-star cast, Robinson played very well as a linebacker for Glen Ridge. He made 80 tackles while recovering a fumble and intercepting two passes.

The senior defensive back quietly had a fine season, making a lot of tackles and was solid on pass coverage. At times, he broke up a number

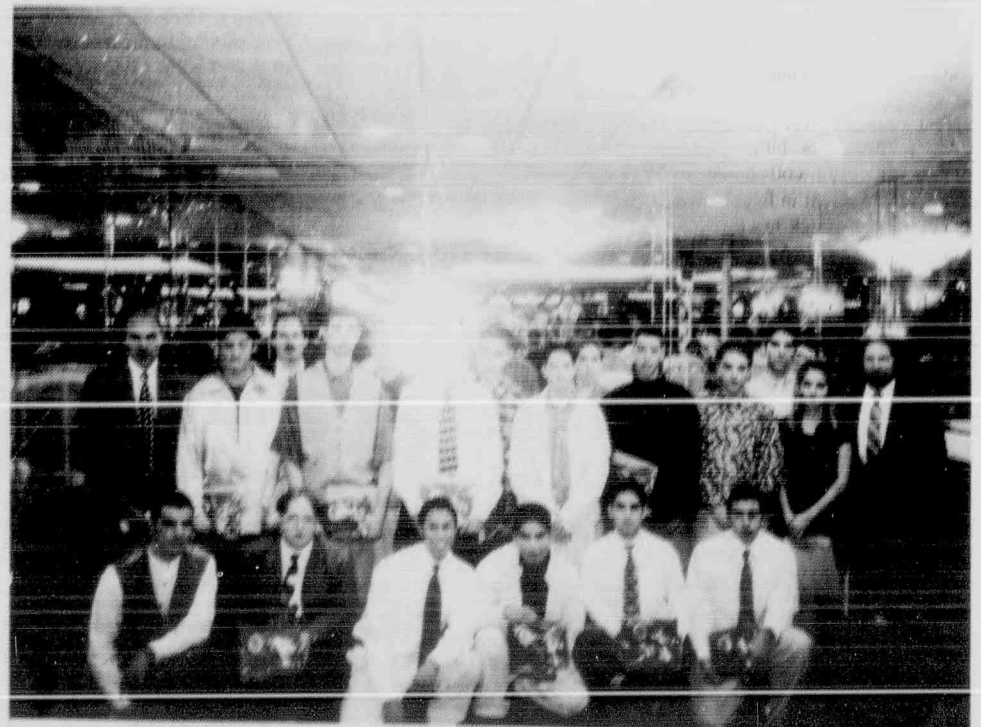
of potentially big gains, and had a lot of fun doing it. Disiena was aggressive and played up to every challenge. He had 24 tackles and recovered a fumble.

Typically, older people take thirteen different medications each year, up to four or five a day. Regardless of whether the mix of medications is over-the-counter varieties, prescription medications, or a combination of the two, the risk of adverse reactions rises with each new medication taken. According to Patient Care, taking fewer than five medications daily carries a four percent incidence of adverse reactions, such as kidney damage and internal bleeding. When six or more medications are taken daily, that risk more than doubles. To help check for the potential for adverse reactions, older patients are advised to enlist the aid of the pharmacist.

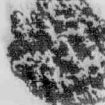

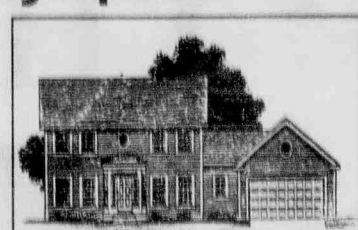

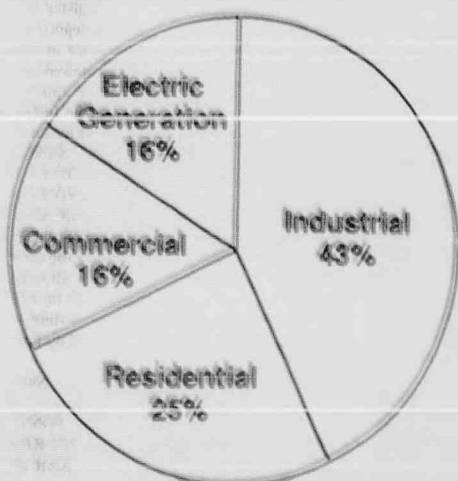
