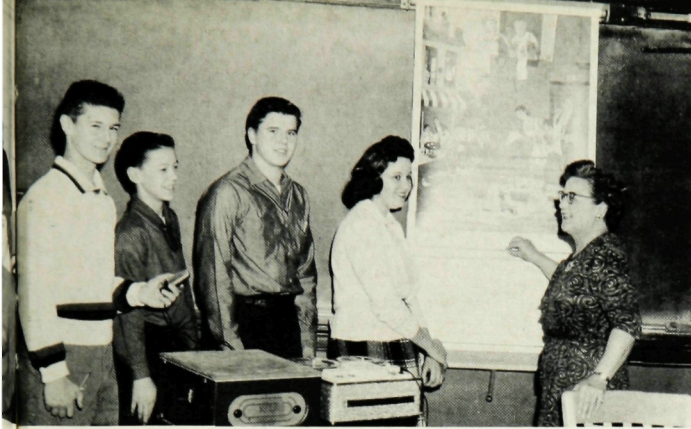
AUDIO-VISUAL EDUCATION

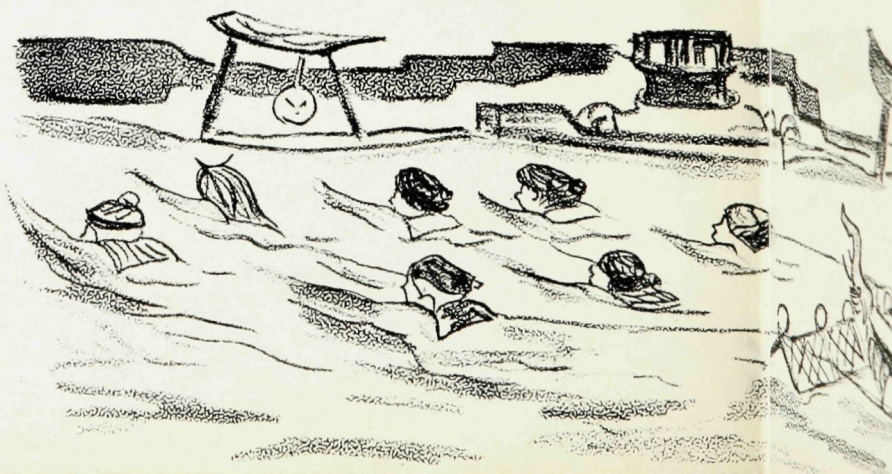
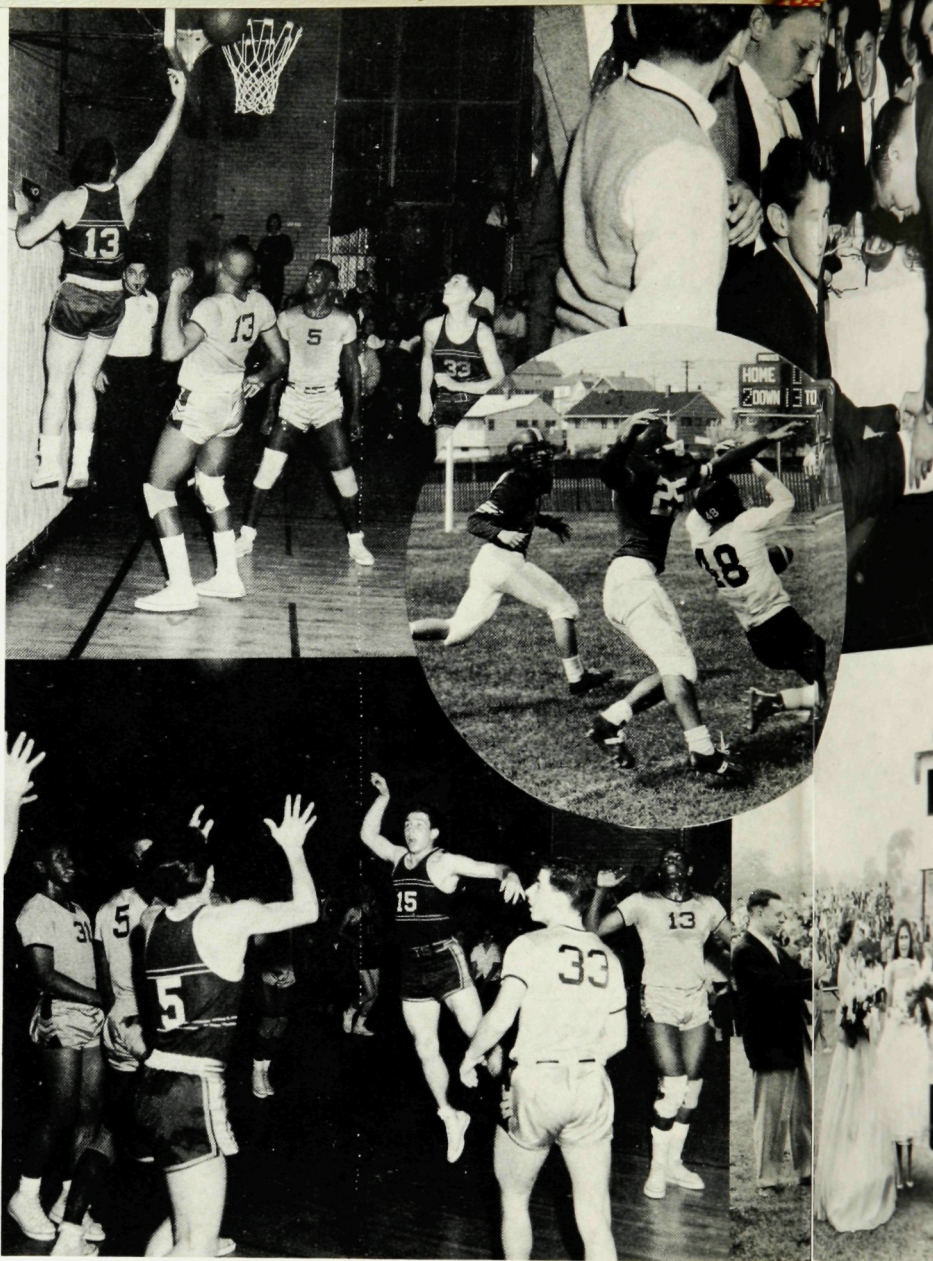


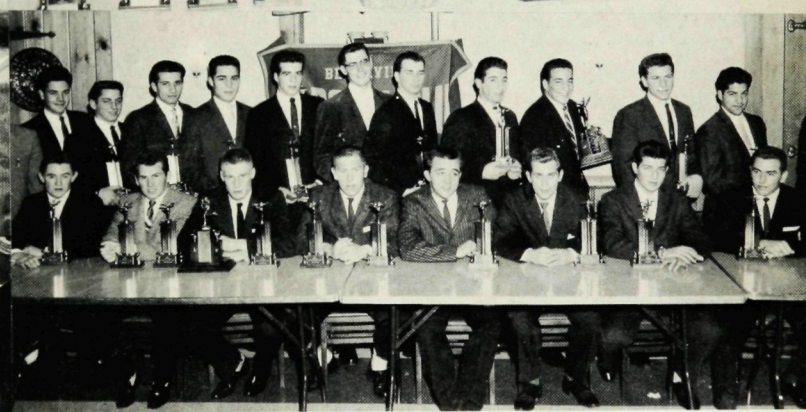
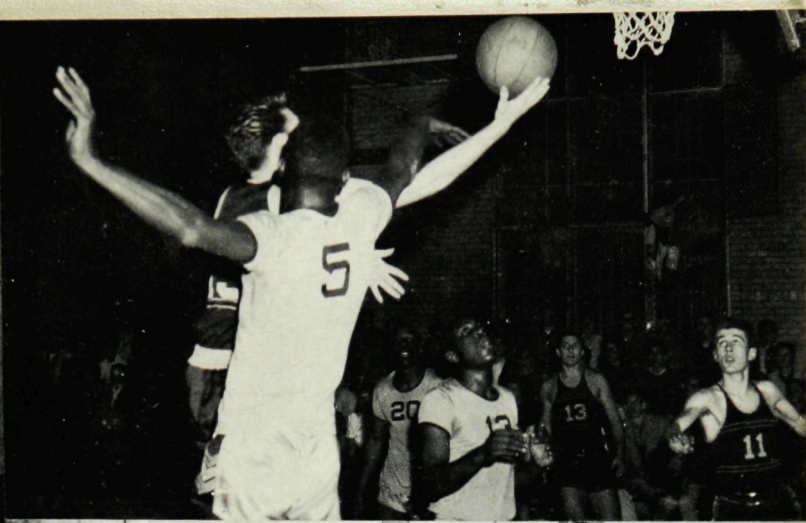
MATH CLASS

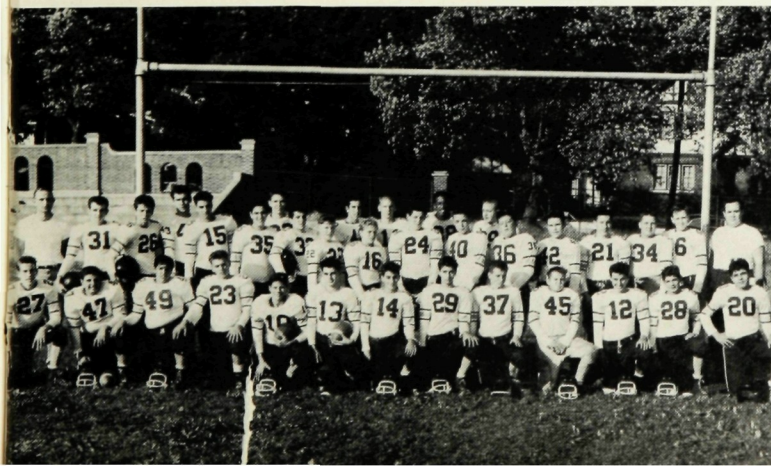

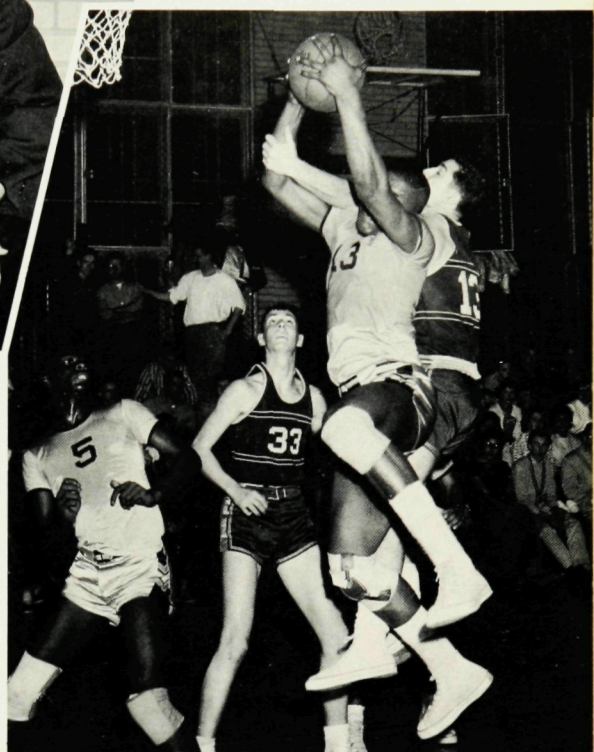

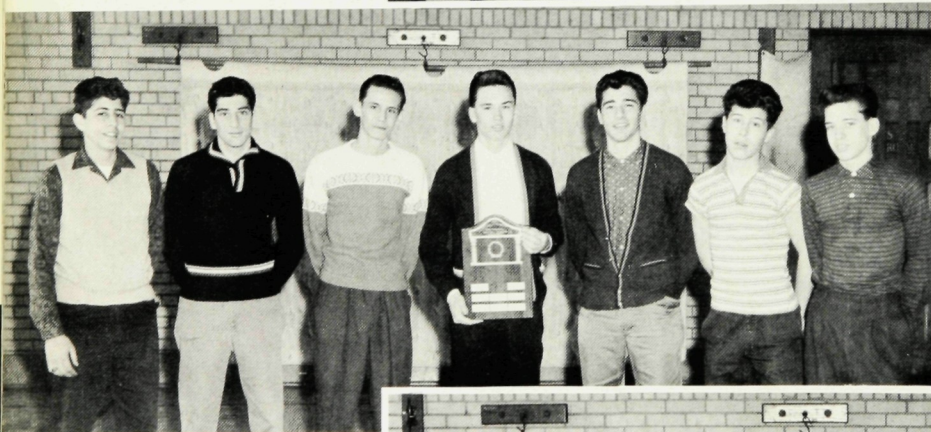
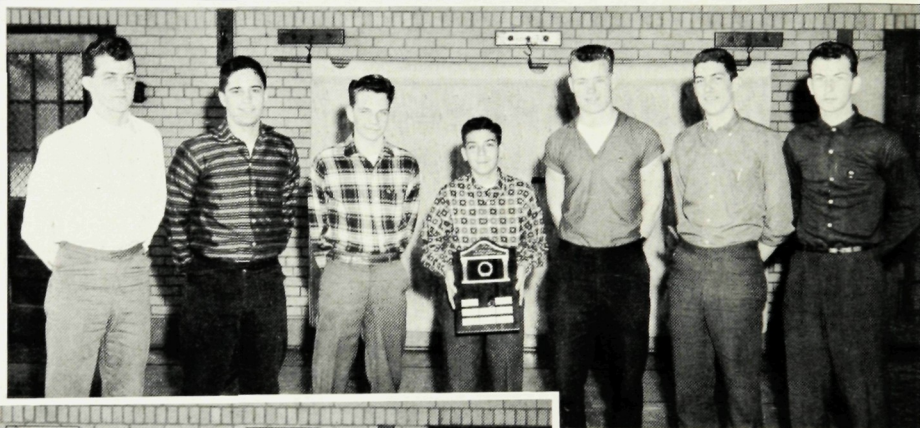


Boys' Intramural Leagues
