

Brewer's Cemetery

This cemetery is on Route 524 about one mile north of Route 195 between Farmingdale and Squankum New Jersey. It is a very old cemetery believed to be in use prior to 1768.

The cemetery probably includes many more unmarked graves, unidentified at present. The ground is very uneven and only the most prominent unmarked graves, mounds and hollows were recorded, a few trees were recorded for reference. All graves were recorded and pictures were made of selected graves and are on file at Monmouth County Historical Association, Freehold New Jersey.

This cemetery had been recorded many times in the past with various results. Therefore we decided to record the cemetery as it is today, and add other records we were aware of on the burials in this cemetery.

The cemetery was divided into 16 squares, 12 of which were 50' by 50' and 4 were 50' by 58.5', which were lettered. Each of these areas were then divided into 10' by 10' square feet blocks except 4 blocks in areas N thru Q which each have an additional square 10' by 8.5'. All graves were then recorded including fieldstones, wooden slabs, areas that were certainly graves. And the mounds and hollows as previously mentioned. The results for each grave were then recorded by area and the other records were added.

Codes were used in recording the cemetery as follows;

T= tree

H= Hollow

M= Mound

A Number= a grave

F.S.= Footstone

UNK= is used in most instances where a grave is present but not identifiable

W.S.= wooden slab marker on grave

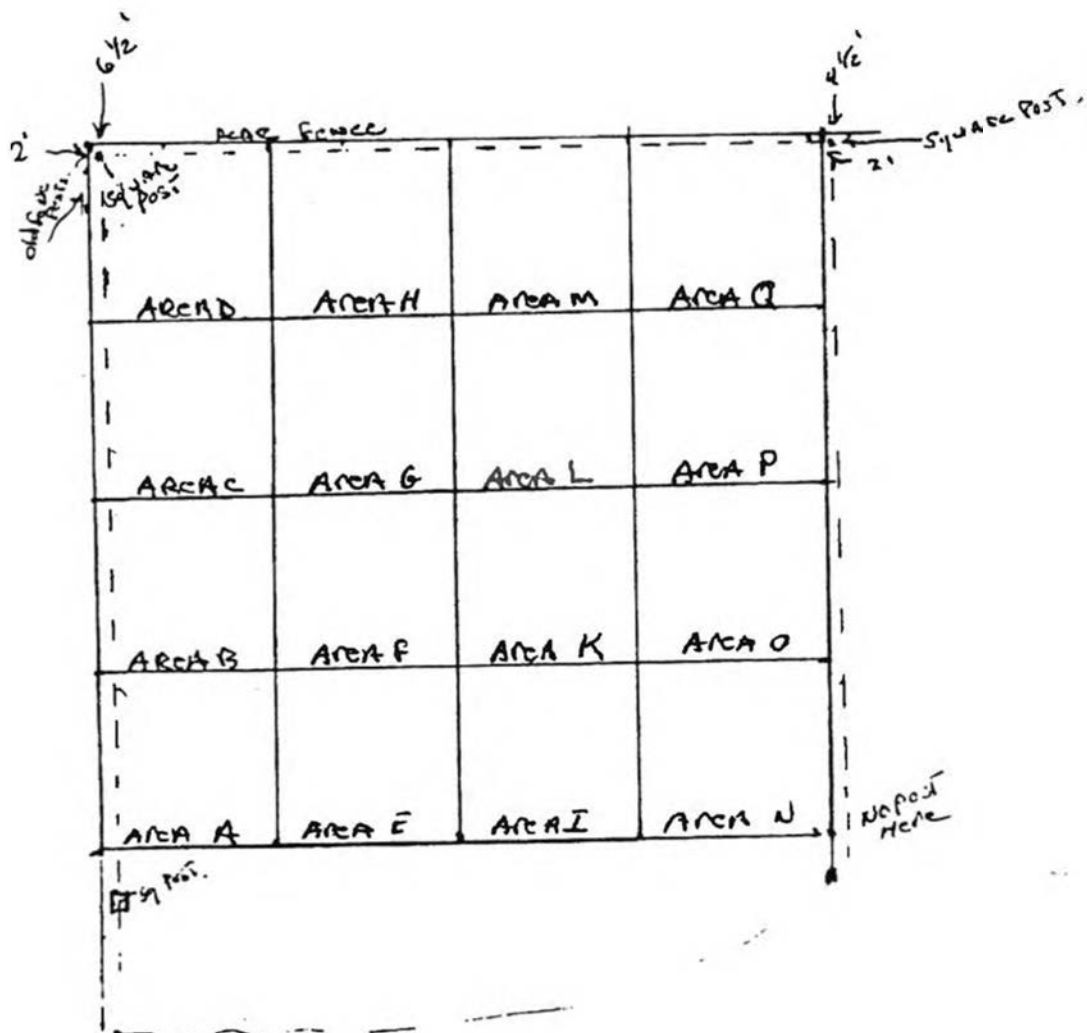
Coroner Inquest Monmouth county Archives Files.

Inquest June 30 1894: Revelle, Arthur, address; 528 County Street Portsmouth Va.

William Van Note an employee of Central RR of New Jersey, a trackwalker, on Saturday morning, June 30, 1894 at 6AM, found a body at Hendrickson's Switch about 2 ½ miles from Farmingdale N.J. The body was about 25 years old white.

William Van Note went to Jesse's Woolleys, a farmer at Squankum, father's house and had him stay with the body, then notified George W Fielder Jp. He called for an inquest and Notified the Coroner. The body was buried at Brewer's June 30 1894.

On July 6, 1894 the body was disinterred so that Arthurs brother W. Reville could view and identify the body. He did and the body was reinterred. [No stone now known to identify this Grave.
